NEW DELHI (TIP): The CBI today conducted raids at the official residences of Delhi Deputy Chief Minister Manish Sisodia and IAS officer Arava Gopi Krishna, besides 29 other locations in seven states and union territories, after registering an FIR to probe alleged irregularities in formulating and executing the city government's excise policy, which was brought in November last year.

The agency has named 15 persons, including Sisodia, in its FIR, lodged on August 17.

Besides Sisodia, other public servants who have been named in the FIR as accused include then Excise Commissioner Arava Gopi Krishna, then Deputy Excise Commissioner Anand Kumar Tiwari and Assistant Excise Commissioner Pankaj Bhatnagar, besides nine businessmen and two companies. In a statement, the CBI said, "Searches are being conducted at 31 locations, including Delhi, Gurugram, Chandigarh, Mumbai, Hyderabad, Lucknow and Bengaluru, which have led to the recovery of incriminating documents, articles and digital records."

Remission to the convicts in the Bilkis Bano Gangrape case must be reviewed

The political battle over the decision of the state government in poll-bound Gujarat to prematurely release the 11 convicts in the 2002 Bilkis Bano gangrape case has intensified, with the Congress questioning the kind of message that was being sought to be conveyed to the women of the country in disregard of the Prime Minister's own commitment to the cause. Other parties like the TRS have asked for amendments to the IPC and CrPC to prevent those charged with rape from getting remission. Though the power of remission is subject to judicial review and the victim can approach the High Court or the Supreme Court, the process is fraught with concerns for the victim's safety because of fear of reprisal.

The Gujarat Government has held that a jail advisory committee was formed to look into the early release of the convicts following an appeal in the Supreme Court by one of the accused under the state's remission policy, which was in effect when they were pronounced guilty in the case. The 11 convicts who were

welcomed with garlands and sweets after they walked free, were sentenced to life not just for the gangrape of Bilkis Bano but also for the murder of 14 members of her family, including her three-year-old child. This case exemplified the rapes and murders that terrorized and brutalized the Muslims of Gujarat in 2002. And the conviction provided closure to the community and restoration of faith in the justice system. The remission has dealt a severe blow to all that.

The legal system has to assure justice to the victims and ensure faith in the due process of law. The overall aim should be to make sure that the punishment is just and proves to be a deterrent against repetition of crime. Gujarat witnessed some of the worst communal trouble that scarred not only the state, but also the psyche of the nation. It is the responsibility of the state to ensure that harmony prevails. Remission to the convicts in the Bilkis Bano case must be reviewed.



Immigrant Advocates Praise 'Project Open Arms,' Urge City To Leverage Existing LIFE Project Model to Ensure Student Success

NEW YORK, NY (TIP): New York City Mayor Eric Adams, New York City Department of Education (DOE) Chancellor David C. Banks, Mayor's Office of Immigrant Affairs Commissioner Manuel Castro, and New York City Department of Social Services (DSS) Commissioner Gary Jenkins, on August 19, announced "Project Open Arms" to provide support for asylum-seeking youth entering the school system and help enroll students as the school year quickly approaches.

The New York Immigration

Coalition (NYIC) has focused on addressing barriers that immigrant families face enrolling their children through our pioneering LIFE Project, which engages NYIC member organizations (immigrant-led community-based organizations) to help immigrant families with eligible children enroll in Pre-K and 3K programs. For the last five years, LIFE Project partners have worked one-on-one with families to understand what they're looking for, provide families with information about their options, and support them through the enrollment process in a

culturally and linguistically fluent manner.

Kim Sykes, Director of Education Policy, New York Immigration Coalition:

"The City is right to focus on cross-agency coordination and meeting families where they are - in person - to get youth into the right schools ahead of the first day of class on September 8th. The City must ensure that youth are enrolled at schools that are well-prepared to meet their needs, and that have deep expertise in supporting students learning English

for the first time. While this moment certainly demands a special response, newcomer families arriving in NYC and needing support enrolling their kids is something this city and community-based organizations have experience in and have been doing for a long time. There are best practice programs, such as our Linking Immigrant Families with Early Childhood Education (LIFE) Project, that have proven enormously successful, should be used in this moment, and be made a permanent part of the City's infrastructure."

Indian American Arun Agarwal named vice chairman of Texas economic development body

DALLAS, TX (TIP): Texas Governor Greg Abbott has named Indian American entrepreneur Arun Agarwal as vice chairman of a body tasked with marketing Texas, domestically and globally, as the best state for business.

The Texas Economic Development Corporation is the private side of a public-private partnership with the Governor's Office of Economic Development & Tourism set up for this purpose, according to a press release.

Dallas based Agarwal, 50, is the CEO of Nextt and has business interests in textiles, cotton trading, and real estate. He is chair of the Indian American CEO Council and president of the Dallas Parks & Recreation Board.

Additionally, he is a board member of the US India Friendship Council, the University of Texas at Dallas Executive Board, Texas Tech Innovation HUB at Research Park, Big Brothers Big Sisters International, and MD Anderson Board of Visitors. He is also a volunteer for Chetna, a non-profit organization to help victims of domestic violence, and the Living Dreams Foundation.



Arun Agarwal has been named as vice chairman of a body tasked with marketing Texas, domestically and globally, as the best state for business.

Agarwal, originally from Jaipur, India, attended school at Maharajas College for his bachelor's degree. He received a Master's in Business Administration from IMT - Ghaziabad, a Master's in Computer Information Systems from Southern New Hampshire University, and an Advanced Certificate in International Business from Harvard University.

Agarwal told The Dallas Morning News that he and Sanjiv Yajnik, president of financial services for bank holding firm Capital One, started the Indian American CEO Council in 2018, "to help bring business leaders together."

He said, "the council's mission is to facilitate alliances between India and the US, act as a catalyst for economic and trade opportunities and strengthen relationships."

"We are Indian Americans," Yajnik said. "We really wanted to give back to the wonderful land that has given us so much."

When they started the Indian American CEO Council, the pair didn't want it to feel like a chamber of commerce or a narrowly focused organization, Yajnik says. They wanted to find a way to bring together business leaders who shared an identity and heritage.

Yajnik and Agarwal say Indian-American leaders can help diversify and better the country. They want more underrepresented groups to hear their story and bring their families here, too. "We want this to be an inspiration for all, not only for Indian Americans," Agarwal told the news.

NEW YORK (TIP): Visibly frustrated, matchmaker Sima Taparia recounts her struggle to an "Indian Matchmaking" producer: She has been tasked with finding potential partners for a 30-something Indian man living in Nashik, a few hours outside of Mumbai, but women of his generation would rather live in a bustling metropolis than this quieter part of the country. Thirty years ago, Sima reminisces, she followed her husband to Nashik and fell in love with the warmth of its people. Why hasn't anyone done the same for Akshay Dhumal?

"Akshay's charming, handsome. Parents are good. He's loaded with

money. He has a good business, good education. Everything is there," she says. "But the girls, they do not want to go to Nashik."

Generational differences often pose challenges to Sima, whose downsized presence in the new season of the Netflix reality series hints at the evolving landscape of arranged marriage. When the show premiered two years ago, it set off a flurry of takes in South Asian communities: Some criticized how it painted the culture as "burdensome," while others described it as "telling it like it is." Sima's strong-willed client Aparna Shewakramani became a fan favorite for refusing to contort herself to fit other people's expectations.

The determined independence exhibited by Aparna - as well as by the women who refuse to abandon their big-city lives - is also a central component of two other recent South Asian-led projects on Netflix: the romantic comedy "Wedding Season" and the comedy series "Never Have I Ever," which released a new season Friday. All three were created by Indian Americans and explore the growing sense of autonomy exercised by the people for whom matches are sought, whether in India or as part of the diaspora. Ultimately, the power lies with them.

"In America, you feel tired of being asked about arranged marriage," said "Wedding Season" writer Shiwani Srivastava. "But on the flip side, you realize people have a gross misunderstanding of it."

Indian American Sanjay Gupta quits MSU amid allegations of sexual misconduct

MICHIGAN (TIP): Sanjay Gupta, Indian American dean of Michigan State University's Broad School of Business has resigned amid allegations of sexual misconduct or relationship harassment, or violence.

MSU officials confirmed that Sanjay Gupta resigned on Friday as the dean of the College of Business after serving in the position since June 2015 and working at MSU for the last 15 years, Lansing State Journal reported.

As of July of last year, Indian-born Gupta was the sixth-highest paid university official, with a salary of \$472,236.

In a statement provided to the Journal by Emily Guerrant, MSU spokesperson, officials cited concerns over Gupta's leadership of the College of Business and for "failure to report under our mandatory reporting policies" as reasons that led to his resignation.

"Those who take on leadership roles at MSU are expected to conduct themselves with careful and consistent attention to integrity and professionalism," according to the statement. "This leadership transition is the result of poor administrative oversight, including a failure to adhere to our mandatory reporting guidelines."

In an emailed statement, Gupta told the Journal he has been cooperating in an MSU investigation and refuted any claims he failed to follow mandatory reporting protocols.

"During the past few months, I've fully cooperated with the Office of Institutional Equity's investigation, which remains ongoing, and I've acted

accordingly with transparency to ensure a thorough and accurate report," he wrote.

"I've served MSU for 15 years, including the last seven as dean of the business school - and I'm confident the proper steps to initiate an investigation of alleged misconduct, which I took extremely seriously, had been taken and that mandatory reporting obligations had been met."

MSU policy put in place in August of 2020 only requires employees to report relationship violence and sexual misconduct if they became aware of it in their capacity as university employees, not in a personal capacity, according to the journal.

MSU officials pointed to the Larry Nassar scandal and other instances of sexual misconduct at MSU to highlight the importance of mandatory reporting.

WASHINGTON,D.C. (TIP): President Joe Biden intends to appoint Indian American educator, public health professional, and child health advocate Dipesh Navsaria as a member of the National Museum and Library Services Board.

The upcoming appointment of Navsaria, a pediatrician working in the public interest, was announced by the White House Friday with 10 others to key roles in various boards and commissions.

Navsaria blends the roles of physician, occasional children's librarian, educator, public health professional, and child health advocate, according to his White House profile. With graduate degrees in public health, children's librarianship, physician assistant studies, and medicine, he brings together a combination of interests and experience.

Navsaria is an associate professor of pediatrics at the School of Medicine and Public Health, as well as a clinical associate professor of Human Development and Family Studies at the School of Human Ecology, both at the University of Wisconsin-Madison.

He has practiced primary care pediatrics in a variety of settings with special interest in underserved populations and continues to practice in outpatient settings. He also works regionally and nationally with Reach Out and Read and the American Academy of Pediatrics.

Navsaria "is committed to understanding how basic science can translate into busy primary-care settings via population health concepts and policy initiatives and also be incorporated into transdisciplinary approaches across multiple sectors and schools of thought," the White House said.

As such he "aims to educate the next generation of those who work with children and families in realizing how their professional roles include being involved in larger concepts of social policy and how they may affect the cognitive and socioemotional development of children for their future benefit," it said.

Indian American Author 'Salman Rushdie is off ventilator, road to recovery has begun', says his agent Andrew Wylie

NEW YORK (TIP): Salman Rushdie, the acclaimed author who was stabbed repeatedly at a public appearance in New York state on Friday, August 12, 33 years after Iran's then-supreme leader called for him to be killed, is off a ventilator and his health is improving, his agent and a son said on Sunday.

"He's off the ventilator, so the road to recovery has begun," his agent, Andrew Wylie, wrote in an email to Reuters.

"It will be long; the injuries are severe, but his condition is headed in the right direction." Rushdie, 75, was set to deliver a lecture at the Chautauqua Institution in western New York on the importance of the United States as a haven for targeted artists when police say a 24-year-old man rushed the stage and stabbed him.

The Indian-born writer has lived with a bounty on his head following the publication of his 1988 novel "The Satanic Verses," which is viewed by some Muslims as containing blasphemous passages. In 1989 Iran's supreme leader Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini issued a fatwa, or edict, calling for his assassination.

Writers and politicians around the world have condemned the attack. U.S. Secretary of State Antony Blinken said on Sunday that Iranian state institutions had incited violence against Rushdie for generations, and state-affiliated media had gloated about the attempt on his life.

"This is despicable," Blinken said in a statement. "The United States and partners will not waver in our determination to stand up to these threats, using every

appropriate tool at our disposal."

The suspect in the stabbing, Hadi Matar of Fairview, New Jersey, pleaded not guilty to charges of attempted murder and assault at a court appearance on Saturday, his court-appointed lawyer, Nathaniel Barone, told Reuters.

Neither local nor federal authorities have offered any additional details on the investigation, including a possible motive.



Gandhi Statue Vandalized in New York

INDIAN CONSULATE AND COMMUNITY ORGANIZATIONS CONDEMN THE "DESPICABLE ACT"

AUGUST 19, 2022

RICHMOND HILL, NY (TIP): August 19: A statue of Mahatma Gandhi outside a Hindu temple in Queens, New York has been vandalized twice in less than two weeks. New York Police is investigating both incidents as possible hate crimes.

As Police search for a group of suspects the Indian consulate in New York took up the matter with US authorities to ensure those responsible for the "despicable action" are held accountable.

Surveillance video shows someone thrashing a statue of Mahatma Gandhi with a sledgehammer overnight Tuesday, according to CBS News. He smashes the head off, then topples it over. Minutes later, a group of six stomp on it and take turns hammering the statue before taking off.

"To see them coming after us like this is very painful," Lakhram Maharaj, the founder of Shri Tulsi Mandir, the Hindu temple in South Richmond Hill, told media.

He discovered the Gandhi statue outside in the morning, reduced to rubble. The word "dog" was spray painted both in front of the temple and down the block.

"For someone to do that, you can see the hatred," congregant Romeo Hitlall was quoted as saying. "We're definitely worried because a statue, we don't know what's next," he said.

That same statue was vandalized less than two weeks earlier, on Aug 3. Again, someone knocked it over in the night, breaking off the hands and nose.

"And when the Gandhi statue was vandalized, that really flew in the face of all of our beliefs and it's very disturbing for the community," Indian American Assembly member

Jenifer Rajkumar said.

"Hindu hate is on the rise," he stated. "We always knew that defeating hate would not be accomplished in one day, one week, or even one year."

"We are committed to this fight for the long term, and will use the Hindu principles of ahimsa (non-violence) and satyagraha (soul force) that guided Gandhi himself and later the great American civil rights hero Martin Luther King, Jr," Rajkumar added.

Many in the community are now afraid to go to temple, Maharaj said. "I cannot show the congregation that I am worried because if I show them that I'm worrying and I'm not strong, how will they be strong?"

The temple cannot afford to replace the statue right now. It was handcrafted for them and cost about \$4,000. "I wanna know why they did it," he said.

Meanwhile, the Consulate General of India in New York

has condemned the vandalism of the statue and taken up the matter with US authorities to ensure those responsible for the "despicable action" are held accountable.

The consulate "strongly condemns the vandalism of the Mahatma Gandhi statue outside a temple in Queens, New York," it stated. "We have taken up the matter with US authorities seeking thorough investigation so that those responsible for such despicable action are held accountable."

"We are deeply saddened to learn of the vandalism at the Tulsi Mandir last night," the Cityline Ozone Park Civilian Patrol tweeted. "This is not the first time something like this has happened, and it must stop. far-right to have one center of power. It was the role of the second parallel engine to be installed in every state to follow instructions.

He rightly pointed out that each state used to pride itself on its dedicated crime investigation unit and gained considerable satisfaction from difficult or sensational cases successfully solved. I can testify that my own experience in Mumbai's police is that the morale of the entire force would rise a notch or two when cases that attracted public attention were solved. That morale booster is slowly being extinguished by the ruling duo in Delhi.

Modi and Shah are least concerned about the health of the police. I do not envisage them giving such 'trivial' matters even a stray thought. They are determined to establish a 'united', 'one India' under the tutelage of one party that controls everything, even a citizen's innate thoughts and feelings! All decisions need to be taken by the PMO because only they know what is good for the country and its people.

Over half the voters who voted in the 2019 Lok Sabha elections did not vote for Modi and the BJP. His slogan of 'Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas, Sabka Vishwas' is not taken seriously by the minority community, nearly 14% of the total population. There are numerous members of the majority community


also who do not think that the BJP really wants every Indian's wellbeing. The Dalits, for instance, are aware that they are not accepted as equal in most parts of the country.

In Gujarat - Modi and Shah's happy hunting ground - even OBC children reportedly refuse food cooked by Dalits under the midday meal scheme in schools. Dalit grooms are thrashed if they dare ride a horse in wedding processions. Young Dalit boys try to achieve parity with 'forward' castes but get thrashed. This is not an uncommon occurrence in enlightened Gujarat. What does one expect in neighboring backward states that constitute the Hindi belt where the BJP dominates?

The real feeling among the minorities and the neglected among the majority is that the government is out to re-establish the Brahminical Chaturvarnya hierarchy. This may not be completely true, but mass perceptions are relevant. Among my many Hindu friends, most hailing from advanced castes, there is a feeling of triumph that the old social order is about to be restored in 'new India'.

Sivanandhan was right when he pronounced that the old elan in the police forces was now dying because of the new role being played by the Central investigating agencies. I, however, will go further and say that this was done

deliberately - a plan that is obviously working. All powers are sought to be concentrated in one supreme body, the PMO, which will think for citizens, tell them what is permitted and what is not. The state government's role in law-and-order management will be confined to implementing those policies. Their bulldozers, for instance, are to be used more frequently and only against those who oppose their policies.

It was always the dream of the Hindu far-right to have one center of power. It was the role of the second parallel engine that would be installed in every state to follow instructions. Money power and the threat of visits from the ED turned minority BJP governments into ruling dispensations riding double engines to power. Losing elections does not matter! There are dozens of venal politicians waiting to be compensated with money or power in return for their dignity and honor. Since the menace of the ED is visited only on opponents, crossing over is redeeming.

The Centre also had the wicked idea of using the Central Armed Forces, controlled by the Home Ministry, to the same end. Whenever BJP's MLAs in Opposition-controlled states, like West Bengal, feel threatened, CRPF or CISF personnel are dispatched to the state as a sign of the power wielded by the Centre.

This adversely affects the relations between the state police and the paramilitary. This never happened earlier. Whenever the paramilitary was deployed in a state, it always was with the consent, or even at the request of a state government. The local police would take decisions on the terms of deployment and would be in charge. It was the responsibility of the police to arrange for the accommodation of the visitors and to brief them. The arrangement worked. The Home Ministry is solely responsible for any misgivings and misunderstandings that may arise between what we used to think of as 'sister' forces.

The Shinde faction of the Shiv Sena in Maharashtra, presently in power, had requisitioned the CRPF or CISF to provide security for its revolting legislators. This was before the new government was formed in Mumbai. It is common for legislators to get enamored of their protectors and want them to continue. It is not uncommon for protegees to strike up a personal relationship with security officers! CRPF/CISF men lead very hard lives. An assignment away from their own officers is always welcomed.

The inroads made by the paramilitary and the Home Ministry into Opposition states in this new adversarial avatar only consolidates the ingress of the Centre into the law-and-order management in such states. It helps the unitary state to come into being.

Lincoln at Gettysburg - but not every POTUS is Lincoln. "We the people" must not forget that our Government is "for" the people, and not the politicians. Abraham Lincoln promised us that at Gettysburg - but not every president honors that. My Revolutionary hero, Thomas Jefferson gave us the key: Eternal Vigilance. He didn't say it, but I will: vigilance by the people of our government, not just the other way around. TRANSCRIPT: ATTORNEY GENERAL MERRICK GARLAND DELIVERS REMARKS ON F.B.I.'S SEARCH OF TRUMP'S MAR-A-LAGO ON MONDAY AUGUST 8, 2022

Washington, DC
Thursday, August 11, 2022
Remarks as Delivered

Good afternoon. Since I became Attorney General, I have made clear that the Department of Justice will speak through its court filings and its work.

Just now, the Justice Department has filed a motion in the Southern District of Florida to unseal a search warrant and property receipt relating to a court-approved search that the FBI conducted earlier this week.

That search was of premises located in Florida belonging to the former President. The Department did not make any public

statements on the day of the search. The former President publicly confirmed the search that evening, as is his right.

Copies of both the warrant and the FBI property receipt were provided on the day of the search to the former President's counsel, who was on site during the search.

The search warrant was authorized by a federal court upon the required finding of probable cause.

The "property receipt" is a document that federal law requires law enforcement agents to leave with the property owner.

The Department filed the motion to make public the warrant and receipt in light of the former President's public confirmation of the search, the surrounding circumstances, and the substantial public interest in this matter.

Faithful adherence to the rule of law is the bedrock principle of the Justice Department and of our democracy.

Upholding the rule of law means applying the law evenly, without fear or favor. Under my watch, that is precisely what the Justice Department is doing.

All Americans are entitled to the evenhanded application of the law, to due process of the law, and to the presumption of innocence.

Much of our work is by necessity conducted out of the public eye. We do that to protect the constitutional rights of all Americans and to protect the integrity of our investigations.

Federal law, longstanding Department rules, and our ethical obligations prevent me from providing further details as to the basis of the search at this time. There are, however, certain points I want you to know.

First, I personally approved the decision to seek a search warrant in this matter.

Second, the Department does not take such a decision lightly. Where possible, it is standard practice to seek less intrusive means as an alternative to a search, and to narrowly scope any search that is undertaken.

Third, let me address recent unfounded attacks on the professionalism of the FBI and Justice Department agents and prosecutors. I will not stand by silently when their integrity is unfairly attacked.

The men and women of the FBI and the Justice Department are dedicated, patriotic public servants.

Every day, they protect the American people from violent crime, terrorism, and other threats to their safety, while safeguarding our civil rights. They do so at great personal sacrifice and risk to themselves.

I am honored to work alongside them.

This is all I can say right now. More information will be made available in the appropriate way and at the appropriate time. Thank you.

Crime has changed. From local it has become global. Mafias, gangsters, smugglers and terrorists have grown beyond the jurisdictional controls of police.

Recent years have shown a rapidly growing graph of crime in Punjab or involving Punjabis worldwide. Gang wars in Canada involving Punjabi youth often hawk media headlines. Early this month when a police outfit came out with "avoid contact" notice, nine of 11 persons mentioned therein were Punjabis.

Cases of crime committed in Punjab at the instance overseas perpetrators or gangsters (Canada, UK and Australia) have been growing. Most of these cases are closed for lack of jurisdictional controls. Though there are extradition treaties between India and other countries, long and tardy procedures limit their benefits.

Assassination of a Punjabi folk singer Sidhu Moosewala got both Interpol and Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP) in active mode. Besides Punjab police, law and order enforcement agencies of other States, too, get into active mode. Even the central police and intelligence agencies in India and overseas have been involved in tracking down this infamous case.

Requisitions from provincial and federal governments for extraditing "wanted criminals" have been on the rise.

Interpol on a requisition from Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) notified Goldy Brar on Red Corner Notice (RCN) in the Sidhu Moosewala case.

Till the end of the last centennial, handling crime was considered a prerogative of the provincial or local administration. In many parts of the world, it still is.

Soon after the Sidhu Moosewala case, another homicide (murder) of a prominent Sikh leader of British Columbia, Ripudaman Singh Malik, hawked media headlines.

Two arrests made in the Malik case gave strong indications of third party involvement. Initial reports said that the victim and the suspects were not even remotely connected.

The growing face of crime has become a cause of concern for all governments.

Social scientists agree that crime, like all other social parameters, is continuously evolving.

The United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC) keeps coming out with its reports on the evolving crime patterns. In one of its reports, it said that in the past quarter century (namely, since the end of the Cold War), global governance has failed to keep pace with economic globalization. As such, unprecedented openness in trade, finance, travel and communication has created economic growth and well-being, it has also given rise to massive opportunities for criminals to make their business prosper.

Organized crime has diversified, gone global and reached macro-economic proportions. The illicit goods are sourced from one continent, trafficked across another, and marketed in a third. Mafias are today truly a transnational problem: a threat to security, especially in poor and conflict-ridden countries.

Crime is fueling corruption, infiltrating business and politics, and hindering development. And it is undermining governance by empowering those who operate outside the laws.

Drug cartels are spreading violence in Central America, the Caribbean and West Africa. The collusion between insurgents and criminal groups (in Central Africa, the Sahel and Southeast Asia) fuels terrorism and plunders natural resources.

The smuggling of migrants and modern slavery have spread in Eastern Europe as much as South-East Asia and Latin America. In so many urban centers authorities have lost control to organized gangs.

Cybercrime threatens vital infrastructure and state security, steals identities and commits fraud.

It was a while when the UNODC produced its first-ever Transnational Organized Crime Threat Assessment to fill a knowledge gap and pave the way for future world crime reports.

Growing global crime patterns have also triggered debates over jurisdictional controls.

Drugs, Mafias, Gangsters and Terrorist groups have grown beyond the laws. Operations are carried out on far off territories through social media channels.

Going by the investigations in Sidhu Moosewala case, the crime was executed at the instance of those who were far away from the actual spot of commission.

Homicides, extortions, kidnappings and even strikes at innocent people and vulnerable places are carried out on directions given through social media channels.

Honor killings are one of the recent additions to the list. A young girl who defied her parents to marry a boy of her choice, was done to death by hired killers.

Another grey area of international crime has been human trafficking. It is one of the oldest crimes that extends beyond jurisdictional control of local, provincial or national police organizations.

Last month, when Statistics Canada came out with its report, it found that

between 2010 and 2020, 2,977 incidents of human trafficking have been reported by police services in Canada; at least three in ten (30%) of which involved an international border crossing.

The number of incidents increased over time before declining in 2018, peaking in 2019, and declining once again in 2020. The highest provincial rates of police-reported human trafficking in 2020 were documented in Nova Scotia and Ontario, a finding that has generally remained consistent over time.

Police-reported human trafficking in Canada affected women and girls disproportionately, and they represented the vast majority of detected victims. The large majority of accused persons were men and boys, and most victims knew their trafficker.

Just under half of all police-reported human trafficking incidents have been cleared either by charge (44%) or by another means (4%). An accused person has not been identified by police in the remaining incidents.

Between 2009 and 2020, there were 1,793 unique persons accused of police-reported human trafficking, including Criminal Code and Immigrant and Refugee Protection Act violations; about eight in ten of whom were male. The large majority (87%) of accused were identified by police in multiple criminal incidents-both related and unrelated to human trafficking.

According to a data linkage for 2009 to 2020, most accused had been in contact with police either before (75%) or after (66%) being accused of a human trafficking offence.

Among prior contacts, accused were most often implicated in property crimes (67%), offences under the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act (58%), physical assault-related offences (57%) and the administration of justice offence failure to comply (56%). Following their initial human trafficking contact with police, around one in nine individuals had been accused of human trafficking again during the reference period, the Statistics Canada said.

Similar reports suggest how Mafias dealing with human smuggling are operating out of Punjab with their links in Malaysia, Australia, Greece, Italy and other countries. Same is the case with those engaged in money laundering. The list is growing by day while the law enforcement agencies are lagging behind.

They say law has a long arm. How long? Only time will tell.

New UTD Study by IACEO Council Reveals Economic, Political & Social Characteristics of Indian Americans in North Texas

AUGUST 16, 2022

DALLAS, TX (TIP): To commemorate India's 75th year of independence this week, the Indian American CEO (IACEO) Council, in partnership with the Institute for Urban Policy Research at the University of Texas at Dallas, released a new report called "A Profile of the Indian American Population in North Texas."

The study uses both quantitative and qualitative analyses to examine the economic, political, and social characteristics of the Indian American community in the North Texas region. Using data collected and provided by various government agencies, the report analyzes the demographic, market, education, and workforce characteristics of the Indian American population in the North Texas region and conducts further analysis in the context of the state and the nation. The study also highlights individual and group examples of successful engagement within the Indian American community and the opportunities those successes highlight for other racial groups.

HERE'S WHAT WE KNOW ABOUT INDIAN AMERICANS IN THE U.S. BEFORE THE STUDY:

- Indian Americans, numbering more than 4.16 million, have appeared as a significant political constituency in the U.S.
- Indian Americans constitute a total voter population of 1.9 million, or 0.82 percent of the total voter population.
- Indian Americans constitute a relatively young population with a median age of 40 compared to 46 for all other immigrants.
- About two-thirds of Indian Americans reached the United States after 2000. Because of their relatively young status and recent arrival, it is possible that the full political impact of the Indian American community has not been fully realized.
- Indian Americans are among the highest median-income earners of all immigrants. In 2019, the annual median household income of Indian Americans was \$119,000, significantly higher than that of all Asian groups combined at \$85,800.
- Besides high-income status, Indian Americans are also the highest educated and fastest growing racial group in the United States.

INDIAN AMERICANS IN NORTH TEXAS (DALLAS, COLLIN, TARRANT AND DENTON COUNTIES):

WAGE: The average wage for Indian Americans in the DFW region in 2019 was USD 58,879 compared to USD 36,301 for other Asians and USD 39,895 for White persons. The average wage for all other racial groups was reported at USD 27,986. In other words, Indian Americans earn about 48 percent more than their white counterparts and 62 percent more than other Asians.

EDUCATION: Indian Americans have the highest proportion of population with a 4-year college degree or a graduate degree. Specifically, more than one-in-four Indian Americans has a 4-year college degree, compared to about one-in-five whites. More than 60 percent of Indian Americans in North Texas have a four-year or graduate degree. One-in-three Indian Americans in the Dallas-Fort Worth area have a graduate degree, compared to about one-in-ten whites and one-in-five other Asians. Overall, about 60 percent of Indian Americans have a college degree of some sort.

OCCUPATION: Compared to their overall number in the workforce, Indian Americans are over-represented in the science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) occupations in North Texas. More

only three industries: computer and mathematical, management, and healthcare practitioners. No other group shows such a prevalent clustering.

IMMIGRATION: According to data from the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS), in 2020, immigrants from India comprised 6 percent of new arrivals in the United States, behind Mexico, Vietnam, the Dominican Republic, and China. In 2019, 2,050 individuals from India obtained lawful permanent resident status in the Dallas-Fort Worth area, comprising 6 percent of Dallas-Fort Worth's lawful permanent resident approvals. These 2,050 individuals represent 4 percent of everyone of Indian descent who were awarded lawful permanent resident status in the United States. Dallas-Fort Worth received the 4th-highest number of individuals of Indian descent, behind New York City (8,221), Chicago (3,344), and San Francisco (2,972).

ENTREPRENEURSHIP: According to the US Census Bureau Survey of Business Owners and Self-Employed Persons in 2012 (the latest version), Indian Americans owned 5.3 percent of all businesses in Collin, Denton, Dallas, and Tarrant counties, representing more than one-third of all Asian American businesses. The combined sales receipts of all Indian American businesses was just over \$10 billion, or 2.27 percent of all business receipts (and 43 percent of all Asian-owned business receipts). Indian American businesses were most prevalent in Collin County, representing 7.5 percent of all businesses and 4.4 percent of all sales receipts.

KEY FINDINGS & CONCLUSIONS:

Demographically, Indian Americans represent the fastest-growing immigrant group in the United States. Economically, they are among the highest median-income earners of all immigrants. And sociologically, they are the best-educated ethnic group in the country.

The study highlights the disparity in political participation between the first and second-generation Indian Americans. This calls for a strategy that differentially impacts the civic participation rates of the two generations.

Politically, the population reflects the same polarization of the broader American population, and civic and political engagement is much higher among US-born Indian Americans than those who have naturalized.

Overall, civic engagement efforts, such as voting, volunteering, and community activities, can help build trust and promote social cohesion. Civic participation also can be increased through mentoring and participation in group activities such as sports. Providing avenues for members to conduct formal group activities, including through established organizations and associations, and informal group activities-book clubs, bike rider clubs, and the like-is essential to facilitate social capital formation and decrease social isolation among community participants.

With the onset of COVID-19, many members of the Indian American community face new challenges that threaten their health and economic status. A skills-employment strategy might need to be deployed to retrain Indian American workers whose employment has been affected by the pandemic to find new jobs and possibly new occupations. A public health strategy might facilitate combatting vaccine hesitancy and ensuring continued health coverage for affected members whose employment has been lost.

3 US states proclaim August 15 as India Independence Day

WASHINGTON, D.C. (TIP): Three US States - Massachusetts, Rhode Island, and New Hampshire - have proclaimed August 15 as India's Independence Day.

Proclaiming August 15 as India Day, Massachusetts Governor C Baker said a youthful country celebrating its 76th Independence Day, modern India has shown an unsurpassed growth in education, health, agriculture, and technology since its independence.

Rhode Island Governor Daniel McKee proclaimed August 15, as "Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav 76th Independence Day of Bharat (India)" in the state and encouraged all residents to join him in recognizing the importance of this day.

"The Bhartiya heritage, culture, traditions, and values provide invaluable solutions to many of life's



problems and often serve as a source of inspiration, reflection, and contemplation for the millions of individuals who look to the teachings of Bhartiya ancient knowledge, such as Yoga and Ayurveda for

guidance," he wrote in the proclamation.

New Hampshire Governor Christopher T Sununu said that India is a composite civilization, a nation unique as a cultural mosaic of people embracing a prodigious diversity of ethnic groups, religions, languages, customs, traditions, clothing, manners, food habits, climatic conditions, and natural resources, and yet presenting an underlying unity.

"India has the largest diaspora in the world, with around 32 million Indians living in other countries, and over 5 million Indian immigrants residing in the United States, who contribute greatly to the social, economic, and civic health of the nation," the New Hampshire Governor wrote in his proclamation. Earlier this month, the Texas Governor also issued a proclamation to celebrate India's Independence Day.

COINS WORTH RS 11 CR MISSING FROM SBI VAULTS; CBI BEGINS PROBE

The Central Bureau of Investigation conducted searches at 25 locations in connection with a case of coins worth Rs 11 crore going missing from the vaults of an SBI branch in Karauli in Rajasthan.

The searches were spread across Delhi, Jaipur, Dausa, Karauli, Sawai Madhopur, Alwar, Udaipur and Bhilwara at the premises of around 15 former bank officials and others, officials informed PTI.

The issue came to light after the State Bank of India (SBI) branch decided to carry out counting of money after a preliminary enquiry indicated discrepancy in its cash reserve at Mehandipur branch in Karauli district in August 2021.

Alarmed bank officials had roped in a Jaipur-based private vendor to do counting of coins supposed to be Rs 13 crore according to account books.

To their shock, the vendor found only 3,000 bags carrying coins worth about Rs 2 crore coins while over coins of Rs 11 crore were missing from the branch.

It is also alleged that the employees of the private vendor who were doing the counting were threatened in the night on August 10, 2021 at the guesthouse where they were staying and were asked to refrain from the counting, the FIR has alleged SBI had approached the Rajasthan High Court seeking a CBI probe into the matter as the missing amount was higher than Rs 3 crore, the threshold for seeking a probe by the agency.

AS VISA-SEEKERS WAIT, US VOWS FASTER PROCESSING

The US State Department has said it is working to reduce wait time for visas in several countries following complaints that processing of some visa classes is taking as much as 500 days in India and 300 in Turkey.

Apart from the US, visa application and processing are taking a long time for other countries like the UK, Schengen states and Canada.

"Unfortunately, this is a challenge that we've faced around the world, and it's a challenge that owes primarily to Covid and some of the lingering effects in places where those restrictions have only recently been lifted," said US State Department spokesperson Ned Price. He said the problem also arose due to some of the limitations on the workforce. "It's something we're addressing with urgency. I know there are countries around the world where we've been able to shrink that wait time significantly, in some cases in half or more," said Price. The average waiting time for new US visitor visas in India is over 500 days. In Hyderabad, the average wait time for a US visa appointment is 518 calendar days for a visitor visa and 479 days for a student visa. In Kolkata, the average wait time for a US visa appointment is 587 calendar days for a visitor visa and two days for a student visa.

Uproar in Kashmir as govt allows voting rights to non-locals

JAMMU (TIP)

In a major decision, Jammu and Kashmir's Chief Electoral Officer (CEO) Hirdesh Kumar has announced that non-locals, including employees, students, labourers or anyone from outside who is living ordinarily in Jammu and Kashmir, can register their names in the voting list, and vote in the J&K elections.

He said that the requirement of domicile is not necessary for outsiders to get enlisted as voters. He has also said that armed forces personnel from other states who are posted at peace stations in J&K can also get their names added in the voter list.

Kumar said around 25 lakh new voters are expected to be enrolled in the Union Territory as the special summary revision of electoral rolls is being held for the first time after abrogation of Article 370 in 2019.

Describing the ongoing exercise as a challenging task, he said the special summary revision of electoral rolls will be completed by 25 November.


"The massive exercise to complete the process in time is going on to ensure that all the eligible voters including those who have attained the age of 18 years on 1 October, 2022 or earlier are enrolled to provide an error-free final list," ABP report quoted Kumar as saying.

The Voter ID will be linked to AADHAR and new cards will be issued with many more security features, however, furnishing of Aadhaar number is purely voluntary, the report added.

Reacting to the development, Former chief ministers Omar Abdullah accused the BJP of seeking backdoor entry into J&K by bringing in non-local voters. "Is the BJP so insecure about support from genuine voters of J&K that it needs to import temporary voters to win seats? None of these things will help the BJP when the people of J&K are given a chance to exercise their franchise," he tweeted.

PDP chief Mehbooba Mufti said the real aim behind the move is to tilt the balance in BJP's favour. "GOIs decision to defer polls in J&K preceded by egregious gerrymandering tilting the balance in BJPs favour & now allowing non locals to vote is obviously to influence election results. Real aim is to continue ruling J&K with an iron fist to disempower locals," she wrote.

J&K Peoples Conference president Sajad Gani Lone, however, warned that the step would be a replay of 1987 – implying alleged rigging in the polls that led to the outbreak

of insurgency a year later.

"This is dangerous. I don't know what they want to achieve. This is much more than a mischief. Democracy is a relic especially in the context of Kashmir. Please remember 1987. We are yet to come out of that. Don't replay 1987. It will be as disastrous," Lone said.

Key points

- 25 lakh new voters are likely to be registered for the first time in Jammu and Kashmir with the new special revision of electoral rolls.
- Anybody living ordinarily in Jammu and Kashmir for job, education, labour or business can register as a voter and cast vote in the Assembly elections
- With this provision after the abrogation of Article 370, there is now no requirement of Permanent Resident Certificate or domicile certificate of Jammu and Kashmir to become a voter.
- Jammu and Kashmir residents, who work in a different state, also have the option to enroll themselves as service voters.

Dialogue is effective: China backs Jaishankar's remarks on Asian Century

BEIJING (TIP)

Beijing on Friday concurred with External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar's observation that an Asian Century cannot happen if India and China don't join hands and said dialogue between the two countries to resolve the eastern Ladakh border standoff is "effective".

Chinese and Indian troops are engaged in a prolonged standoff in eastern Ladakh. The two sides have so far held 16 rounds of Corps Commander Level talks to resolve the standoff which erupted on May 5, 2020, following a violent clash in the Pangong Lake areas.

Asked for his reaction to Jaishankar's comments, Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesman Wang Wenbin told a media briefing here that "a Chinese leader said once that if China and India cannot achieve sound development, then an Asian Century cannot happen". "A true Asia Pacific Century or Asian Century can happen only when China and India and other countries can achieve sound development. China and India are two ancient civilisations, two emerging economies and two big neighbours," he noted.

Wang said China and India have far more common interests than differences and the two neighbours have the wisdom and capability to reinforce each other better than pose a threat to each other. "It is hoped that Indian side can work with China in the same direction to follow through on the common



understanding between our two leaders on being each other's cooperative partners, not causing threats to each other and presenting each other with development opportunities, so that China-India relations can come back to the right track of sound and steady development at an early date and uphold common interest of China, India and the developing world," he said. To a question on whether China will hold talks with India on the disengagement at the remaining friction points in eastern Ladakh, Wang said, "I would like to stress that China and India maintain smooth communication over the border issues. The dialogue is effective."

UGC RULES EXEMPTING PHD HOLDERS FROM NET APPLY RETROSPICIENTLY: APEX COURT

The UGC (Minimum Qualifications for Appointment and Career Advancement of Teachers in Universities and Institutions Affiliated to It) Regulations, 2016, which exempted PhD holders from NET, would operate retrospectively, the Supreme Court has ruled.

"When an enactment or an amendment is declaratory, curative or clarificatory, impelled by a felt need to make clear what was always intended, such amendment is usually meant to operate from an antecedent date, or to cover antecedent events," a Bench of Justice UU Lalit, Justice S Ravindra Bhat and Justice Sudhanshu Dhulia said in its August 17 verdict.

Justice Bhat sought to emphasise that the UGC had the power to give retrospective effect to the UGCR-2016 under Section 26(3) of the UGC Act. The court took note of the fact that the UGC Rules were subsequently amended in 2016 and 2018 to clarify that both pre-2009 and post-2009 PhD holders would be exempted from qualifying NET. Allowing the appeals filed by the University of Kerala and one Dr MS Jayakumar, the SC set aside a Kerala HC verdict quashing his appointment as a Lecturer in Sociology.

AJIT DOVAL'S RUSSIA VISIT TO SET TONE FOR SCO MEET

The ongoing intensive engagement with Russia and Central Asia may set the tone for the first post-Covid in-person summit of the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) countries next month in Uzbekistan.

The latest in the engagement was Deputy NSA Vikram Misri's visit to Uzbekistan, where he engaged in bilateral talks as well as participated in the SCO NSAs meeting in Tashkent. "We discussed a wide range of issues on the Uzbek-Indian agenda as well as interaction within the framework of multilateral structures, in particular the SCO," tweeted Acting Uzbek Foreign Minister and former SCO Secretary General Vladimir Norov after meeting Misri.

The Indian embassy in Tashkent said Misri and Norov discussed advancing bilateral security and defence cooperation. At the SCO NSAs' meeting, Misri called for combating terrorism, terror-financing, transnational organised crime, illicit drug trafficking and strengthening information security.

His visit to Uzbekistan was preceded by trip to Moscow by Doval, where he met his Russian counterpart Nikolai Patrushev to discuss Afghanistan as well as transnational terrorism. His other meeting with Russian Deputy PM Denis Manturov was equally significant as he is the minister in charge of the futuristic weapons industry.

100 million houses now have tap water: Modi hails landmark

NEW DELHI (TIP)

The Union government has achieved the milestone of providing piped water connection to 100 million houses in villages under the Jal Jeevan Mission, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said on Friday, August 19, adding that at least 70 million houses were provided such connections over the last three years.

"Seven crore (70 million) rural households have been connected with piped water in just three years compared to just three crore (30 million) in seven decades. This is an example of the same human-centered development, which I talked about this time (in the Independence Day speech)...," Modi said.

"The achievement of the 10 crore (100 million) milestone reflects the Centre's commitment towards provision of water and preservation of the environment," he added.

According to Census 2011, fewer than 14% of rural households had access to 'on premise' tap drinking water supply.



The Jal Jeevan Mission aims to link all of India's 192 million households with tap water. As on August 19, the Jal Jeevan mission has covered 52% of all rural homes. At the launch of the mission in 2009, only 17% of rural households had tap water access.

In a country where nearly 800 million people live under extreme water stress, the Jal Jeevan Mission carries huge political significance for the Bharatiya

Janata Party and PM Modi, whose focus on providing poorer Indians with benefits such as cooking gas, toilets and subsidised housing is said to be one of the key reasons for the ruling party's electoral successes.

"The real test of Jal Jeevan Mission is in its long-term sustainability because the water sources connecting each area should be sufficient to last 30 years as per guidelines, so conservation and replenishment of sources is equally important," said Narendra Patel, a water expert with Samaj Pragati Sahayog, a water-conservation NGO based in Dewas, Madhya Pradesh.

The Prime Minister was virtually addressing the Har Ghar Jal Utsav event under the Jal Jeevan Mission in Goa when he made the statement. The event was held to celebrate Goa's certification as a state that connected all rural households with piped water, along with the Union territories of Dadra Nagar Haveli and Daman and Diu. US Treasury official to visit India amid Ukraine tensions

WASHINGTON (TIP)

A top Treasury Department official is set next week to make his first official trip to India since the start of Russia's invasion of Ukraine.

Amid tensions over India's neutral stance on the invasion that began in late February, the US wants the meetings to focus on how to deepen ties with the South Asian nation.

Treasury Deputy Secretary Wally Adeyemo will travel to Mumbai and New Delhi for meetings that include Prime Minister Narendra Modi's office, the finance ministry, the Reserve Bank of India, and the Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Gas.

And as India is set to lead the Group of 20 intergovernmental forum in 2023, Treasury says Adeyemo will "discuss key shared priorities such as bolstering energy security, addressing food insecurity globally, and combatting illicit financial flows".

India hasn't shunned Russia despite its membership in the regional Quad alliance with the US, Australia and Japan. Instead, it has maintained its business ties with Russia, depending on the Kremlin for energy and other exports.

The nation has boosted its purchase of Russian oil, buying roughly 60 million barrels in 2022 so far, compared with only 12 million barrels in all of 2021, according to commodity data firm Kpler.

The US and Europe, however, are moving away from Russian energy — with Treasury officials promoting a price cap on Russian oil.

A Treasury statement says Adeyemo will meet with financial services and energy sectors executives in Mumbai and will speak about strengthening economic ties between the US and India.

He will also underscore "our two countries' deep economic, security, and cultural ties" and discuss ways to build "more resilient supply chains" through the Indo-Pacific Economic Framework that India joined as a founding member in May.

India is the world's second-most populous country and largest democracy based on a population of 1.4 billion.

New privacy law may cover only digital data at first

NEW DELHI (TIP)

The data protection bill that is being redrawn after being withdrawn in Parliament by the government earlier this month will initially only cover digital personal data and not records on paper, people aware of the matter said, adding that possible legacy provisions will be included to cover any data that is subsequently digitised.

The move will include making a distinction between digitised and non-digitised data, according to internal discussions held at the ministry of electronics and information technology. "The government is still working on how to segregate the two, with a special focus on ensuring safety of sensitive personal data," said one official, asking not to be named.

"The ultimate aim will be to digitise all data, but the bill, as it is shaping up, is likely to only apply to digital data initially," the official added.

But, this person said, a legacy provision will be included to cover any data later digitised. "Think of birth certificates that are old, and so far, only maintained as physical records. Over time, they will be digitised and all forms of personal data will be protected under the bill," the official added.

A second official said that the Bill will be a truncated version as compared to the report that was tabled by the Joint Committee of Parliament in December 2021. "The idea is to make the bill less complicated and more easily accessible," the second official said.

The first official added that the problems remain the same, and will have to be addressed in the new bill. The bill will be put for public consultation once it is finalised. "To try and apply the laws to data that is on paper will take extensive time. Right now the need is to prioritise privacy of citizens and provide a mechanism to ensure it," the official said.

"There are other recourses that citizens can take if data which is on paper is missed." "Sensitive personal data will have to be tackled with great care and the government is taking all necessary steps to ensure its safety," the official reiterated.

Experts, however, raised some concerns over the delay. Source: HT



20 people died in bus-oil tanker crash in Pakistan's Punjab province

AUGUST 16

LAHORE (TIP): At least 20 people were burnt alive in a collision between a passenger bus and an oil tanker in the Punjab province of Pakistan on August 15.

The accident occurred on a motorway in Multan, some 350kms from Lahore reportedly because of overspeeding.

Traffic remained suspended on the motorway for several hours after the accident.

"Twenty people have perished in a collision between a bus which was going to Karachi from Lahore and an oil tanker. After the collision, both the bus and tanker caught fire and the passengers were burnt alive," a Rescue 1122 spokesperson added that six passengers who suffered burn injuries were shifted to Nishtar Hospital in Multan where their condition is stated to be critical.

"Most bodies of the perished passengers are burnt completely and beyond recognition. These bodies will be handed over to the families after a DNA test," he said. He further said after the accident the fire engulfed both vehicles and the rescue operation was very difficult for the rescue and firefighter



teams. Punjab Chief Minister Parvez Elahi has expressed grief over the loss of precious lives in the accident and directed the health authorities concerned to provide better treatment to the injured. He also directed the administration to cooperate with the families of the deceased to identify them.

On Saturday, at least 13 people were

killed after a loaded truck collided with a passenger bus in Pakistan's Punjab province.

Road accidents have become all too frequent in Pakistan, pointing to the fact that shoddy infrastructure, dilapidated vehicles and lack of compliance with traffic rules add to the overall situation. (PTI)





The CEO said: "I was like, 'What's this show with the short, dumpy girl walking into the fire?'" Delany was referencing Emilia Clarke's character, Daenerys Targaryen, who famously walks through fire during the series.

An attendee at the Sydney premiere told Crikey that "there was a bit of a gasp" after Delany made the comment.

A Foxtel spokesperson told Crikey after the event that Delany's remark was "meant to be self-deprecating."

Angelina Jolie filed anonymous lawsuit against Brad Pitt

Actor Angelina Jolie has been identified as the plaintiff in an anonymous 2016 lawsuit where she had alleged being assaulted on a private plane by her then-husband, Brad Pitt. The couple filed for divorce in 2016 and had six children together.

According to a report several years ago Angelina told an FBI agent that Brad Pitt 'physically and verbally assaulted' her and their children when they were aboard the plane. An FBI agent's notes reveal that at the time, Brad allegedly took Angelina to the back of the plane, grabbed her shoulders and shouted things like, "You're f***** up this family."


Angelina had alleged that another physical altercation occurred on that same flight. It caused her to sustain injuries, including on her elbow. Angelina also said that Brad had poured beer on her as he had been drinking at the time. However, Brad's team has denied all allegations, as per reports.

After a special agent met with the assistant US attorney and concluded that they would not pursue criminal charges, Angelina, in order to obtain documents related to the federal investigation against Brad, anonymously filed a Freedom of Information Act suit against the FBI (Federal Bureau of Investigation), reported Variety.

Previously, Brad was reportedly under investigation in 2016 for child abuse by both the FBI and the Los Angeles Department of Child and Family Services after an incident occurred on his family's private plane. Allegedly, he got physical with their son, Maddox, after the then 15-year-old intervened in a fight between Brad and Angelina.

At the time, Brad's team issued a statement to People magazine, denying that he hurt his son. The statement read, "He is emphatic that it did not reach the level of physical abuse, that no one was physically harmed. He did not hit his child in the face in any way. He did not do that; he is emphatic about that. He put his hands on him, yes, because the confrontation was spiralling out of control." As per Variety, following this incident the Hollywood couple split and Brad publicly gave up drinking. No charges have been filed against him.

AT LEAST 14 KILLED IN SHELLING ON NORTH SYRIA MARKET, RESCUERS SAY

AUGUST 19

AL-BAB (TIP): Fourteen people were killed including at least five children in a rocket attack on a market in the northern Syrian city of Al-Bab on August 19, according to emergency responders working in rebel-held areas.

The White Helmets rescue group earlier put the death toll at nine.

It said that figure might rise further as rescue and search operations continued, adding that children were also among at least 30 people wounded in the attack.

The warring factions in Syria's 11-year conflict have carved up the north into a patchwork of zones of control.

Al-Bab falls within the areas of Aleppo province held by Turkish-backed rebels. Other parts are held by Syrian government troops backed by Russia.

The U.S.-backed Syrian Democratic Forces (SDF), spearheaded by Kurdish groups who have opened a dialogue with the Damascus-based government, also control parts of the north and northeast.

The head of the SDF's media centre, Farhad Shami, said the group had nothing to do with Friday's attack.

Activists in Al-Bab had been planning a protest after Muslim midday prayers on Friday to denounce comments by Turkey calling for reconciliation between the Syrian government and the opposition.

In a statement after Friday's attack, they cancelled the demonstration over fears of further violence. Reuters

Rishi Sunak takes time out of campaign for Janmashtami temple visit in UK

LONDON (TIP): Britain's prime ministerial candidate, Rishi Sunak, took some time out of a hectic campaign schedule to make a visit to a Hare Krishna temple on the outskirts of London to celebrate Janmashtami.

Sunak, 42, who swore his oath of allegiance on being elected member of Parliament in the House of Commons on the 'Bhagavad Gita', has often spoken about his Hindu faith giving him strength.

On Thursday, he was accompanied by wife Akshata Murty, daughter of Infosys co-founder Narayana Murthy and author-philanthropist Sudha Murty, for darshan at Bhaktivedanta Manor in Watford, Hertfordshire.

"Today I visited the Bhaktivedanta Manor temple with my wife Akshata to celebrate Janmashtami, in advance of the popular Hindu festival celebrating Lord

BEIJING (TIP): A Chinese-born Canadian tycoon who disappeared from Hong Kong in 2017 was sentenced on August 19 to 13 years in prison for a multibillion-dollar string of financial offences and his company was fined USD 8.1 billion, a court announced.

Xiao Jianhua was convicted of misusing billions of dollars of deposits from banks and insurers controlled by his Tomorrow Group and offering bribes to officials, the Shanghai No. 1 Intermediate People's Court said on its social media account.

Xiao was fined 6.5 million yuan (USD 950,000) and his company was fined 55 billion yuan (USD 8.1 billion), the court said.


Xiao was last seen at a Hong Kong hotel in January 2017 and was believed to have been taken to the mainland by Chinese authorities. News reports later said he was under investigation by anti-graft authorities, but no details were released.

The Canadian government said diplomats were blocked from attending his July 5 trial.

"The lack of transparency in Xiao's legal process is very concerning, as is the ongoing lack of consular access which prevents us from being able to assess his wellbeing," said Patricia Skinner, spokeswoman for Global Affairs Canada.

Xiao was deemed to be a Chinese citizen, which meant he wasn't entitled to see Canadian diplomats under a consular treaty between the two governments, Foreign Ministry spokesperson Wang Wenbin said.

That suggested Xiao might have



entered the mainland using a Chinese travel document instead of his Canadian passport. Beijing has in other cases refused diplomats access to citizens of their countries who entered using Chinese identity documents.

"China does not recognise Chinese citizens with dual nationality. Xiao Jianhua has Chinese nationality," Wang said. "He does not enjoy the right to consular protection of other countries."

The Canadian Embassy in Beijing referred a request for comment to the Canadian government in Ottawa.

Tomorrow Group has been linked to a series of anti-corruption prosecutions and seizures of financial companies by regulators.

Friday's announcement said Xiao and Tomorrow Group were convicted of improperly taking more than 311.6 billion yuan (USD 46 billion) from the public and misused entrusted property and money totalling 148.6 billion yuan (USD 21.8 billion).

Xiao vanished amid a flurry of prosecutions of Chinese businesspeople

accused of misconduct.

That fuelled speculation the ruling Communist Party might be abducting people outside the mainland. Hong Kong at that time prohibited Chinese police from operating in the former British colony, which has a separate legal system.

Since then, Beijing has tightened control over Hong Kong, prompting complaints it is violating the autonomy promised when the territory returned to China in 1997. The Communist Party imposed a national security law in Hong Kong in 2020 and has imprisoned pro-democracy activists.

Hong Kong police investigated Xiao's disappearance and said he crossed the border into the mainland. An advertisement in the Ming Pao newspaper in Xiao's name the same week denied he was taken against his will.


At the time of his disappearance, Xiao was worth nearly USD 6 billion, making him China's 32nd wealthiest person, according to the Hurun Report, which follows the country's wealthy.

In 2020, regulators seized nine companies controlled by Xiao.

These were four insurers, two securities firms, two trust firms and a company involved in financial futures.

The business magazine Caixin reported at the time that the seized assets totalled almost 1 billion yuan (USD 150 million).

A retired bank regulator, Xue Jining, admitted taking 400 million yuan (USD 62 million) in bribes in a corruption case linked to Baoshang Bank Ltd in the northern region of Inner Mongolia, which regulators seized from Tomorrow in 2019. (AP)

Sunak, the UK-born son of NHS doctor Yashveer and pharmacist Usha Sunak, is a devout Hindu who counts lighting

Diwali diyaas outside No. 11 Downing Street as Britain's first Indian-origin Chancellor among one of his "proudest moments" in life.

The former finance minister is on a busy campaign trail across the UK in an effort to win over the votes of Tory members, who are in the process of casting their postal and online ballots in the election.

Sunak's rival, Foreign Secretary Liz Truss, is currently holding a firm lead in most recent surveys of the party membership. However, he has insisted that he "definitely" still has a shot at victory and is excited to keep going as he thinks his "ideas are the right ones" for the country.

The election is set to close on the evening of September 2, with the new Tory leader and British Prime Minister to succeed Boris Johnson confirmed on September 5. (PTI)

No Tube: London subway hit by strike day after rail walkout

LONDON (TIP): A strike by London Underground workers brought the British capital's transit network to a grinding halt on August 19, a day after a nationwide walkout by railway staff.

Another rail strike is scheduled for Saturday as the UK endures a summer of action by workers demanding pay increases to offset soaring food and energy price hikes.

No subway trains were running on most of London's Tube lines because of the strike over jobs, pay and pensions by members of the Rail, Maritime and Transport Union, operator Transport for London said.

"It is going to be a difficult day," said Nick Dent, TFL's director of customer operations. "We're advising customers not to travel on the Tube at all." There was also continuing disruption above ground as trains started to run again following Thursday's strike by thousands of railway cleaners, signallers, maintenance workers and other staff.

Only about a fifth of trains ran during the 24-hour walkout, the latest in a series of strikes on Britain's railways.

"We're very sorry that people are inconvenienced," said RMT union General Secretary Mick Lynch.

"We're ordinary men and women that want to do our jobs and provide a service, but when you're being cut to pieces by an employer, and by the government, you've got to make a stand." Transit unions accuse Britain's Conservative government of preventing train companies — which



are privately owned but heavily regulated — from making a better offer.

The government denies meddling, but says rail companies need to cut costs and staffing after two years in which emergency government funding kept them afloat.

Transport Secretary Grant Shapps told Times Radio that "it's a kick in the teeth" to the public for unions "to turn round after we provided 16 billion pounds of support for the railways and go Right, well, the next thing we're going to do is go on strike." More public- and private-sector unions are planning strikes as Britain faces its worst cost-of-living crisis in decades.

Postal workers, lawyers, British Telecom staff, and port workers have all announced walkouts for later this

month.

Garbage collectors and recycling workers in Edinburgh, Scotland, began an 11-day strike on Thursday, warning that trash will pile up in the streets as tourists flock to the city for the Edinburgh Fringe and other arts festivals.

UK inflation hit a new 40-year high of 10.1 per cent in July, and the Bank of England says it could rise to 13 per cent amid a recession later this year.

The average UK household fuel bill has risen more than 50 per cent so far in 2022 as Russia's war in Ukraine squeezes global oil and natural gas supplies.

Another increase is due in October, when the average bill is forecast to hit 3,500 pounds (USD 4,300) a year. (AP)

Sunken World War 2 German warships emerge amid low water levels of Danube river in Serbia

PRAHOVO (SERBIA) (TIP): Europe's worst drought in years has pushed the mighty river Danube to one of its lowest levels in almost a century, exposing the hulls of dozens of explosives-laden German warships sunk during World War Two near Serbia's river port town of Prahovo.

The vessels were among hundreds scuttled along the Danube by Nazi Germany's Black Sea fleet in 1944 as they retreated from advancing Soviet forces, and still hamper river traffic during low water levels.

However, this year's drought - viewed by scientists as a consequence of global warming - has exposed more than 20 hulls on a stretch of the Danube near Prahovo in eastern Serbia, many of which still contain tonnes of ammunition and explosives and pose a



danger to shipping.

"The German flotilla has left behind a big ecological disaster that threatens us, people of Prahovo," said Velimir Trajilovic, 74, a pensioner from Prahovo who wrote a book about the German ships.

Workers in the local fishing industry are also at risk, including from Romania which lies just across the river.

Months of drought and record-high temperatures have snarled river traffic

on vital arteries in other parts of Europe, including Germany, Italy and France. In Serbia, the authorities have resorted to dredging to keep navigation lanes on the Danube open.

By Prahovo, some of the hulls have narrowed the navigable section on this stretch of the Danube to just 100 metres (330 feet) from 180 metres.

Strewn across the riverbed, some of the ships still boast turrets, command bridges, broken masts and twisted hulls, while others lie mostly submerged under sand banks.

In March, the Serbian government invited a tender for the salvage of the hulls and removal of ammunition and explosives.

The cost of the operation was estimated at 29 million euros (\$30 million). (Reuters)

KIM JONG UN'S SISTER REJECTS SOUTH KOREAN LEADER'S 'ABSURD DREAM'

AUGUST 19

SEOUL (TIP): The influential sister of North Korea's leader Kim Jong Un has slammed South Korea's recent offer of economic assistance to Pyongyang in exchange for denuclearisation as an "absurd dream".

South Korean President Yoon Suk Yeol, who has been in office for three months, said on August 18 that South Korea was ready to help its neighbour as long as North Korea showed determination to disarm.

He added that Seoul would not require "complete denuclearisation before we do anything".

Kim Jong Un's sister Kim Yo Jong called Yoon's speech "nonsense," "ridiculous" and "pipedream-like remarks" in a press statement titled "Don't have an absurd dream" published by state media on Friday.

"The 'plan' he had laid down this time is truly absurd," said the senior official of the ruling Workers' Party in a remark on Thursday, dpa news agency reported.

"No one barters its destiny for corn cake." Kim Yo Jong also acknowledged a Wednesday missile test, though she said South Korean and US information about its location was wrong.

Seoul said North Korea launched two suspected guided missiles in the direction of the Yellow Sea as Yoon made his remarks.

UN resolutions prohibit North Korea from testing ballistic missiles, which, depending on the design, can also carry nuclear warheads.

Tests of cruise missiles, however, are not subject to sanctions against the largely isolated country.

Pyongyang is subject to tough international sanctions because of its nuclear weapons programme. (IANS)

INDIA, CHINA PART OF MILITARY DRILL TO BE HOSTED BY RUSSIA

VLADIVOSTOK (TIP): At the end of this month, a military exercise in Vladivostok in far-eastern Russia will be an event watched by countries. Russia is conducting its first major war game after being locked in a conflict with Ukraine for six months now. The world will be watching not just the nature of the military exercises, but also the participating countries. India and China are among the invitees to the exercise. While China has confirmed its participation, the Indian participation has not yet been officially announced though sources indicated that a contingent was expected to go to Vladivostok for "Vostok-22". The military exercises will be held from August 30 to September 5. (TNS)

Beet dye

1 cup yogurt
2 onions (fried, puree this with the yogurt), sliced
1 tsp garam masala
Few strands of saffron (mixed in 3 tsp of water)
For garnishing coriander leaves, chopped

Method

- Heat the vegetable oil into the pan, then put a dollop of ghee.
- Put cardamom, cloves, garlic and fry the mix properly.
- Then add the chicken and let it cook for about 2-3 minutes. Keep stirring it.
- Once it becomes brown, add coriander and chili powder.
- Add salt to taste.
- Add ginger paste, mixture of fried onions and yogurt, let it cook for a minute.
- Then put garam masala and saffron for flavor.
- If the gravy is too thick add little bit of water before covering it. The masala should fuse well with the chicken.
- Cover it and give it some time to cook on slow fire. Let it simmer for about 10-15 minutes.
- Keep stirring occasionally.
- Serve hot, garnished with coriander leaves.

Smart contact lenses can diagnose cancer from tears

US scientists have developed a contact lens that can help in the early detection of cancer using tears and help in the treatment.

The novel lens, developed by the team at the Terasaki Institute for Biomedical Innovation (TIBI) in California, is able to capture and detect exosomes, the nanometer-sized vesicles found in bodily secretions that have the potential for being diagnostic cancer biomarkers.

The lens was designed with microchambers bound to antibodies that can capture exosomes found in tears. This antibody-conjugated signalling microchamber contact lens (ACSM-CL) can be stained for detection with nanoparticle-tagged specific antibodies for selective visualisation.

This offers a potential platform for cancer pre-screening and a supportive diagnostic tool that is easy, rapid, sensitive, cost-effective, and non-invasive.

Exosomes are formed within most cells and secreted into many bodily fluids, such as plasma, saliva, urine, and tears. Once thought to be the dumping grounds for unwanted materials from their cells of origin, it is now known that exosomes can transport different biomolecules between cells.

But, the TIBI team devised their ACSM-CL for capturing exosomes from tears, an optimum and cleaner source of exosomes than blood, urine, and saliva.

"Exosomes are a rich source of markers and biomolecules which can be targeted for several biomedical applications," said Ali Khademhosseini, TIBI's Director and CEO.

"The methodology that our team has developed greatly facilitates our ability to tap into this source." In an initial validation experiment, the ACSM-CL was tested against exosomes secreted into supernatants from ten different tissue and cancer cell lines. The



ability to capture and detect exosomes was validated by the spectroscopic shifts observed in all the test samples, in comparison with the negative controls.

Similar results were obtained when the ACSM-CL was tested against ten different tear samples collected from volunteers.

In final experiments, exosomes in supernatants collected from three different cell lines with different surface marker expressions were tested against the ACSM-CL, along with different combinations of marker-specific detection antibodies.

The resultant patterns of detection and non-detection of exosomes from the three different cell lines were as expected, thus validating the ACSM-CL's ability to accurately capture and detect exosomes with different surface markers.

Daily exercise is more beneficial than lengthier workout sessions: Research

New research indicates a little bit of daily activity is more beneficial than longer periods of exercise spread out across the week and happily, it also suggests you don't have to put in a mountain of work every day. It's a dilemma faced by many health-conscious people and new research from Edith Cowan University (ECU) is answering the question. This latest research indicates a little bit of daily activity could well be the most beneficial approach, at least for muscle strength. And happily, it also suggests you don't have to put in a mountain of work every day.

In collaboration with Niigata University and Nishi Kyushu University in Japan, the four-week training study had three groups of participants performing an arm resistance exercise and changes in muscle strength and muscle thickness were measured and compared.

The exercise consisted of 'maximal voluntary eccentric bicep contractions' performed on a machine which measures muscle strength in each muscle contraction you would do at the gym.

An eccentric contraction is when the muscle is lengthening; in this case, like lowering a heavy dumbbell in a bicep curl.

Two groups performed 30 contractions per week, with one group doing six contractions a day for five days a week (6x5 group), while the other crammed all 30 into a single day, once a week (30x1 group).

Another group only performed six contractions one day a week.

After four weeks, the group doing 30 contractions in a



single day did not show any increase in muscle strength, although muscle thickness (an indicator of increase in muscle size) increased 5.8 per cent.

The group doing six contractions once a week did not show any changes in muscle strength and muscle thickness.

However, the 6x5 group saw significant increases in muscle strength -- more than 10 per cent -- with an increase in muscle thickness similar to the 30x1 group.

Lack of treatment guidelines hampering monkeypox care globally

A dearth of high quality, up to date clinical guidance on monkeypox may be hampering effective and safe treatment of the infection around the world, according to a review led by an international team of researchers.

Existing guidance, such as it is, too often lacks sufficient detail, fails to include different groups, and is contradictory, said the researchers from universities of Oxford in the UK, Bristol in Australia, and Liverpool School of Tropical Medicine, among others.

They said that "the lack of clarity between guidelines creates uncertainty for clinicians treating patients with [monkeypox] which may impact patient care." The "study highlights a need for a rigorous framework for producing guidelines ahead of epidemics and a recognised platform for rapidly reviewing and updating guidance during outbreaks, as new evidence emerges."

"Human [monkeypox] is providing a challenge even in high-resource settings with well-resourced healthcare systems. The lack of guidelines may especially impact clinics with limited previous experience in managing patients with [monkeypox]," the researchers wrote in the paper published in the open access journal BMJ Global Health.

The team searched six major research databases for relevant content published up to mid October 2021, plus the "gray literature" -- policy documents, newsletters, reports, for example, published up to May 2022 -- in several languages.

They found 14 relevant guidelines. Most were of low quality according to the Appraisal of Guidelines for Research and Evaluation II (AGREE) system, scoring an average of two out of a possible seven. And most lacked detail and covered only a narrow range of topics. There was little provision for different risk groups: only five (36 per cent) provided any advice for children; and only 3 (21 per cent) provided advice for pregnant women or for people living with HIV.

Treatment guidance was mostly limited to advice on antivirals and wasn't consistent: seven guidelines advised cidofovir, four of which specified this only for severe infection; just four (29 per cent) advised tecovirimat, and one (seven per cent) brincidofovir.

Asteroid with its own Moon found

Days after Nasa fixed the faulty solar panels on the Lucy spacecraft headed to eight different asteroids in space, the probe's team has already detected a unique system — an asteroid with its own moon. Astronomers have found that the smallest of the mission's Trojan asteroid targets, Polymele, has its own satellite.

The latest finding adds one more target to Lucy's mission, which is journeying into deep space to study the primordial remnants of the formation of our solar system, which could give deep insights into the formation of Earth and other planets around the Sun.

"Asteroids hold vital clues to deciphering the history of the solar system perhaps even the origins of life and solving these mysteries is a high priority. The Lucy team originally planned to visit one main belt asteroid and six Trojan asteroids, a previously unexplored population of asteroids that lead and follow Jupiter in its orbit around the Sun," Nasa said in a statement.

Astronomers were studying Polymele for a while when, on March 27, they discovered its own moonlet. The discovery was made when the asteroid passed in front of a star, allowing the team to observe the star blink out as the asteroid briefly blocked the light in a process known as occultation.

Android 13 officially arrives for Google Pixels, Samsung

Android 13 has officially started rolling out on Google Pixel devices. The company has announced that the latest Android iteration will reach devices from Samsung Galaxy, Asus, HMD (Nokia phones), iQOO, Motorola, OnePlus, Oppo, Realme, Sharp, Sony, Tecno, Vivo, Xiaomi and more later this year. This year, Google is well ahead of schedule to roll out the Android 13 since the Android 12 started reaching Pixel phones in October. As you'll expect, the latest iteration comes with a variety of new features to offer users more personalisation options.

Google says that Android 13 comes with an evolved look that builds on Material You -- the company's standard design language across the Android ecosystem. Now, users will be able to customise non-Google apps to match the phone's wallpaper and theme. The latest UI basically blends the app icons with the wallpaper for a universal look. Android 13 also allows users to assign specific languages to individual apps. Earlier, the entire phone's language setting needed to be changed.

Apple, on the other hand, lets users change the font size for each app.

Google is also improving a feature to help users sleep better. Android 13 brings a customised Bedtime mode with wallpaper dimming and a dark theme. These screen options will help users' eyes adjust to the dark when they are about to go to bed.

In terms of privacy, Android 13 now lets users offer only select photos instead of the entire library for an app to function. A similar feature is already available on iPhones since iOS 14. Another nifty addition is the automatic deletion of personal information on the clipboard. The company says, "If you copy sensitive data like your email address, phone number or login credentials on your device, Android will automatically clear your clipboard history after a period of time."



Amazon testing TikTok-style feed called Inspire on its App, AI firm confirms

Amazon appears to be getting the TikTok bug, joining other companies seeking to hold consumers' attention by introducing replicas of the popular social platform.

The e-commerce giant has been testing a feed on its app that enables shoppers to scroll through TikTok-like photos and videos of products posted by other users.

Using the feature, called Inspire, customers can like, save and share posts of products, and purchase items directly from the feed, according to Watchful Technologies, an Israeli-based artificial-intelligence firm that analyzes apps and has tracked the feature.

The test doesn't mean Amazon will roll out the widget to the public in its current form — or at all. Alyssa Bronikowski, an Amazon spokesperson, declined to say if the company has plans to introduce the feature to all its customers. In a statement, Bronikowski said the company is "constantly testing new features to help make customers' lives a little easier."

The Wall Street Journal first reported on the test. Citing an anonymous source, the Journal also said the company is testing the feature among a small number of Amazon employees.

Amazon often experiments with new features, sometimes even targeting its tests to specific regions. Amid regulatory pressure about its private-label business, the company had been testing how to identify its brands in search results by tagging them with badges such as "Amazon brand" or "Exclusive to Amazon," the research firm Marketplace Pulse discovered earlier this year.

In its current form, the experimental TikTok-like feed mostly shows photos, said Daniel Buchuk, a researcher with Watchful Technologies. But if the feature is rolled out, Buchuk suspects the feed will be



video-heavy as Amazon sellers create content to make it more engaging for customers.

The corporate parents of Google and Facebook, the two biggest sellers in digital advertising, already have been pushing their own TikTok clones in bids to keep eyeballs glued to their services so they can continue to boost their revenue.

Google's YouTube video service rolled a "Shorts" feature limited to clips of a minute or less last year in the US after initially testing it in India during 2020. By June of this year, Google said YouTube Shorts was attracting more than 1.5 billion logged-in users each month, although analysts believe TikTok's popularity is undercutting ad sales at the video site.

Those concerns were elevated by Google's latest quarterly results, which revealed YouTube's year-over-year growth in ad sales had slowed to its slowest pace since public disclosures of the site's revenue began.

Apple warns of security flaw for iPhones, iPads and Macs

Apple disclosed serious security vulnerabilities for iPhones, iPads and Macs that could potentially allow attackers to take complete control of these devices.

Apple released two security reports about the issue on Wednesday, although they didn't receive wide attention outside of tech publications.

Apple's explanation of the vulnerability means a hacker could get "full admin access" to the device. That would allow intruders to impersonate the device's owner and subsequently run any software in their name, said Rachel Tobac, CEO of SocialProof Security.

Security experts have advised users to update affected devices — the iPhone6S and later models; several models of the iPad, including the 5th generation and later, all iPad Pro models and the iPad Air 2; and Mac computers running MacOS Monterey. The flaw also affects some iPod models.

Apple did not say in the reports how, where or by whom the vulnerabilities were discovered. In all cases, it cited an anonymous researcher.

Commercial spyware companies such as Israel's NSO Group are known for identifying and taking advantage of such flaws, exploiting them in malware that surreptitiously infects targets' smartphones, siphons their contents and surveils the targets in real time.

DOT ALLOCATES SPECTRUM, TEL COS TOLD TO GEAR UP FOR 5G LAUNCH

The Department of Telecommunications (DoT) has allocated spectrum to telecom operators, paving the way for the launch of 5G services. The letters for spectrum assignment were issued within hours of telecom operators making payments.

"Spectrum assignment letters issued. Requesting telecom service providers to prepare for 5G launch," Communications Minister Ashwini Vaishnav said in a post on social media. The speed at which the DoT has processed the matters related to spectrum auction has drawn praise from Bharti Enterprises chairman Sunil Mittal too. In a statement, he said: "Yesterday, Airtel paid Rs 8,312.4 crore towards spectrum dues and was provided the allocation letter for the designated frequency bands within hours. E-band allocation was given along with spectrum as promised. No fuss, no follow-up, no running around the corridors and no tall claims. This is ease of doing business at work in its full glory. In my over 30 years of first-hand experience with DoT, this is a first." With the assignment of frequencies, telecom operators can start the work of rolling out 5G networks. Telcos have already placed orders for buying telecom equipment and will now start distributing radios to the identified sites for 5G. The government as well as telecom operators are rushing to launch 5G services as early as next month. The Centre netted Rs 1,50,173 crore from the sale of 51,236 MHz in the seven-day auction. In all, it had put 72,098 MHz of airwaves on sale.

ELON MUSK TARGETS AD TECH FIRMS IN TWITTER SUIT OVER TAKEOVER DEAL

Billionaire entrepreneur Elon Musk, who is attempting to walk away from his deal to acquire Twitter Inc., is seeking documents from advertising technology firms as part of his quest to gain more information on bot and spam accounts on Twitter, according to filings in a Delaware court on Thursday. Twitter has sued the Tesla chief executive, who has accused Twitter of hiding information about how it calculates the percentage of bots on the service, for attempting to walk away from the \$44 billion agreement. A trial is scheduled for October 17. Musk's lawyers have subpoenaed both Integral Ad Science (IAS) and DoubleVerify for any documents or communications on their involvement in reviewing accounts or participation in any audit of Twitter's user base.

UK inflation hits 10.1% as cost of living continues to soar

In Britain, the cost of living soared again in July, putting further strain on under-pressure families across the UK. Consumer Prices Index inflation (CPI) reached 10.1 percent last month, beating expectations, the Office for National Statistics (ONS) revealed. The increase was largely down to food prices and staples including toilet rolls and toothbrushes, the ONS said.

The measure had been expected to reach 9.8 percent, according to an average of analysts' estimates calculated by Pantheon Macroeconomics, reports said. It is the biggest jump in the cost of living since February 1982, when CPI reached 10.4 percent, according to ONS estimates.

It is also a massive jump from the 9.4 percent inflation in June. ONS chief economist Grant Fitzner said: "A wide range of price rises drove inflation up again this month. Food prices rose notably, particularly bakery products, dairy, meat, and vegetables, which was also reflected in higher takeaway prices.

"Price rises in other staple items, such as pet food, toilet rolls, toothbrushes, and deodorants also pushed up inflation in July. "Driven by higher demand, the price for package holidays rose, after falling at the same time last year, while airfares also increased.

"The cost of both raw materials and goods leaving factories continued to rise, driven by the price of metals and food respectively." Inflation is expected to fall back a little in August; however, according to estimates, it could soar to 13.3 percent in October when the energy price cap rises again.

The Bank of England thinks this could push the UK into a recession. According to the most recent estimates by experts, the price cap will reach close to 3,640 pounds in October, up from 1,971 pounds at the moment. Then energy prices are expected to rise even further, topping well above 5,000 next year pounds, although these forecasts for further ahead are more unsure.

Chancellor Nadhim Zahawi said: "I understand that times are tough, and people are worried about increases in prices that countries around the world are facing. "Although there are no easy solutions, we are helping where we can through a £37 billion support package, with further payments for those on the lowest incomes, pensioners and the disabled, and £400 off energy bills for everyone in the coming months.

"Getting inflation under control is my top priority, and we are taking action through strong, independent monetary policy, responsible tax and spending decisions, and reforms to boost productivity and growth." Meanwhile, the official data showed that Retail Price Index (RPI) inflation reached 12.3 percent in



July. In the past, this measure has been used to cap the following year's price increases on some train tickets in England, Scotland, and Wales. With inflation running away, the UK government will keep the 2023 rises below RPI. However, it did not reveal how it plans to calculate the rises. The Consumer Prices Index including owner occupiers' housing costs (CPIH) rose by 8.8 percent in July, up from 8.2 percent.

Indian inflation still elevated, may warrant policy response: RBI

Inflation in India may still require a monetary policy response going forward as it remains above the target range even though it has eased in recent months, the Reserve Bank of India said on Thursday, August 18.

"In India, supply conditions are improving, with the recent monsoon pick-up, strong momentum in manufacturing and a rebound in services," the central bank said in an article on the state of the economy, published in its monthly bulletin.

"Inflation has edged down, but its persistence at elevated levels warrants appropriate policy responses to anchor expectations going forward," RBI added.

India's consumer inflation dipped to 6.71% in July, easing for the third month in a row and helped by a slower increase in food and fuel prices but it remained above the RBI's 2% to 6% tolerance band for a seventh straight month.

"Imported inflation pressure points remain the overarching risk, followed by pending pass-through of input costs if producers regain pricing power, and wages," RBI wrote.

Oil at 6-month low, petrol at breakeven

International oil prices have hit a six-month low, helping Indian fuel retailers breakeven on petrol but they continue to lose money on diesel - the most used fuel in the country, officials said.

The world's best-known crude benchmark, Brent was trading at USD 94.91 per barrel on Thursday after concerns of a global recession led to it slipping to a six-month low of USD 91.51 on the previous day.

The current rates are a relief to India, which is 85 per cent dependent on imports for meeting its oil needs.

The fall in prices has meant that fuel retailers such as Indian Oil Corporation are now breaking even on petrol but there are some losses on diesel, officials with knowledge of the matter said.

State-owned fuel retailers IOC, Bharat Petroleum Corporation Ltd (BPCL) and Hindustan Petroleum Corporation Ltd



(HPCL) have not exercised their right to adjust the retail selling price of petrol and diesel in line with the international costs for four and half months now to help the government manage runaway inflation.

At one point, they were losing ₹20-25 per litre on diesel and ₹14-18 a litre on petrol as international oil prices soared. These losses have been trimmed with the fall in oil prices.

"There are no under-recovery (losses) on petrol now. For diesel, it will take some time to reach that level," an official said.

But this is unlikely to translate into an immediate reduction in rates as oil companies will be allowed to recoup losses they had accumulated on selling fuel at below cost in the last five months, another official said.

Under-recovery on diesel is now down to Rs 4-5 a litre.

IOC, BPCL and HPCL are supposed to revise the retail price of petrol and diesel daily in line with cost. But they froze rates for a record 137 days beginning November 4, 2021, just as states like Uttar Pradesh went to polls.

Krishna Janmashtami

Krishna Janmashtami also known as Krishnashtami, Srikrishna Jayanti or sometimes merely as Janmashtami, is an annual celebration of the birth of the Hindu deity Krishna, the eighth avatar of Lord Vishnu. Krishna belonged to the Vrishni clan of Yadavas from Mathura (Uttar Pradesh) and was the eighth son born to the princess Devaki and her husband Vasudeva. Lord Krishna reciprocates in unique, personal ways with every devotee who offers Him love. He is the most adorable, mischievous son, the most romantic lover, the most compassionate friend as described in ancient scriptures.

The festival is celebrated on the eighth day (Ashtami) of the Krishna Paksha (dark fortnight) of the month of Shraavana (August-September) in the Hindu calendar. The dramatic enactments of the life of Krishna, Rasa lila, are organised in different regions of Mathura, Vrindavan, and regions following Vaishnavism in Manipur and many other places across the world. The Dahi Handi event also celebrate God's playful and mischievous side, where teams of young men form human towers to reach a high-hanging pot of butter and break it.

Legend

The legend behind Krishna's birth is as intriguing as the occurrences during his lifetime. As per Hindu mythology, when sinful and unscrupulous forces unleashed havoc over the world, Mother Earth requested Lord Brahma to put an end to the rampant conditions. Lord Brahma took this concern of Mother Earth to Lord Vishnu, who in turn reassured him of his birth on earth to purge it from all prevailing evils.

As promised, Lord Vishnu took birth as Krishna on Earth at midnight on the 8th day (Ashtami) of the month of Shravan. Krishna, the eighth avatar of Lord Vishnu, was born to Devaki and Vasudev in Mathura in a prison. Krishna was born at a time of turmoil, raging persecution, lack of freedom, and when evil forces were reigning on the earth. His own life was at risk from his uncle King Kansa due to the prophecy that proclaimed his death at the hands of his nephew, Krishna. Knowing of the dangers that hovered over the life of Krishna, his father, Vasudeva, immediately handed him over to Yashoda and Nanda in Gokul to keep him away from King Kansa. This folklore is celebrated as the festival of Janmashtami by the devotees who keep fast, sing devotional songs of Krishna, and visit Krishna temples.

Significance

The festival of Janmashtami is celebrated with great fun and gaiety all over the world by the Hindus owing to the fact that Sri Krishna was one of the most forceful human incarnations of the Lord Vishnu. Krishna is one such God in Hindu mythology, about whose birth and death, a lot has been written. Ever since he took birth on earth in human form, he is worshipped by the people as a god-child, an adorable prankster, a charming lover, a spiritual guide, and the principal power. The prime motive of his birth on Earth is to end all the darkness prevailing at that time, eliminate all the evil forces from Earth, and restore 'Dharma' in times when his uncle, Kansa, was making the lives of the people miserable.

There is a popular saying in Bhagavad Gita—“Whenever there will be a predominance of evil and decline of religion, I will reincarnate to kill the evil and to save the good.” The festival of Janmashtami encourages goodwill and dissuades malice. The day is observed as a sacred occasion that celebrates togetherness and faith.

Celebrations across India

The birth of Krishna is celebrated with great enthusiasm, devotion, and warmth by everyone in the country. The cities across the country get overwhelmed with a feeling of exaltation. The devotees keep fast for the whole day. The folklore of Krishna's birth is narrated in temples and households. The energetic youth of the country, completely immersed in exhilaration, actively participate in the Dahi handi festival. At some places, people perform raslillas to recreate occurrences from the life of Lord Krishna. Plays and dance performances based on Krishna's life

Celebrations in Mathura and Vrindavan

The Janmashtami celebrations in the Mathura and Brindavan is often praised by everyone. The festival is celebrated with great pomp and show in these places where Lord Krishna spent most of his life. The temples of Mathura and Vrindavan come to life at night with jagrans, plays, dance performances, all based on Krishna's childhood.

Last month, Delhi Lieutenant Governor VK Saxena had recommended a CBI probe into the Arvind Kejriwal-led AAP government's Excise Policy (2021-22) over alleged violations of rules and procedural lapses.

Officials in the CBI said the deputy Chief minister and other accused in the case would soon be summoned for questioning and those who failed to cooperate in the investigation might be arrested.

In his first reaction to the raids, Sisodia took to Twitter and wrote saying that he welcomed the CBI and asserted that the truth would come out. He said these people were troubled because of the excellent work done by the Delhi Government in the health and education sectors.

"That is why ministers of both departments are targeted to stop us from the good work in the health and education sectors," he said referring to the arrest of Health Minister Satyendra Jain under criminal provisions of the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA).

Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal said the CBI raid at his junior colleague's house was the result of his good performance, which is being appreciated globally. "The day Delhi's education model was appreciated and Manish Sisodia's photo appeared on the front page of the New York Times, the Centre sent the CBI at the residence of Manish. The CBI is welcome. Will extend full cooperation. Earlier also there were raids and a probe. Nothing came out. Nothing will come out now also," Arvind Kejriwal said.

AAP Rajya Sabha member Raghav Chadha said, "Earlier it was "Modi vs who", today it is "Modi vs Kejriwal", Kejriwal is an alternative to Prime Minister Modi."

Delhi Congress leader Alka Lamba said Manish Sisodia should face the action by the probe agency instead of "running away" to the cool climes of Himachal Pradesh. She also claimed that the "corrupt face" of the self-acclaimed "truly honest" minister of AAP today stood exposed.

Allegations against Sisodia and 14 others are:

- Irregularities in formulation of excise policy, 2021-22
- Liquor trader paid Rs 1 cr to firm managed by Sisodia's associate
- Sisodia and public servants took decisions without approval
- Intention was to extend undue favors to licensees post tender
- Sisodia aides Amit Arora, Dinesh Arora, Arjun Pandey involved
- Collected money from licensees, also gave it to public servants
- Excise Dept gave a waiver of Rs 144 cr to licensees on Covid excuse

Much of this is rooted in India and we have a long tradition. Therefore, I will continue to officially proclaim August 15th, 2022 as India Independence Day", Hochul said.

HERE IS THE FULL TEXT OF GOVERNOR HOCHUL'S REMARKS.

"In the United States, we stand firm with that same shared understanding of what it's like to reject colonial rule, to embrace democracy and to foster our shared democratic values of inclusion, pluralism equality, freedom of speech, and of course, freedom of religion. So, these are the values that bind us together. India, United States of America, it is shared, and we learned from each other."

"We're here to celebrate Indian Independence Day. I know you know that, but I also know that this is a chance for us to acknowledge the incredible diversity of our city overall. And our state, and the many, many contributions of the Indian American community here. And we're so lucky here in New York to have so many Indian Americans representing our levels of

government. There are many firsts, and to the community that was long underrepresented in our society, that those barriers have been broken. And so, they're making incredible contributions to our civic life.

"So, I want to thank again, as I mentioned, the trailblazing Indian Americans in this room. We are proud that nearly 400,000 Indian Americans call New York home. More than half of them are in New York City. New York State, they're spread all over from my hometown upstate to this borough of Queens. But most of them are right here in New York City. And these are the leaders, the doctors, the scientists, the engineers, the business people, the attorneys, the artists, the writers, the restaurateurs, the shop owners. They really do create this beautiful fabric and so many contributions. It really makes New York fabulous and so vibrant.

"And as I mentioned, we think about the pandemic, so many Indian American healthcare professionals from doctors down to those frontline nurses. They showed up, they displayed courage, they were there and we needed them and they literally saved lives. So, let's recognize those as well. And of course, you keep us well fed with amazing food. I have to admit - I'm happy to admit, I have a husband who lives far away. He lives on the other side of the state. I see him on weekends and whenever I come home, he gets Indian food takeout because he knows it makes me happy. We have wonderful food, and we just break bread together and we're always thinking of how significant this culture is.

"Also, this gives us a chance to reflect on history, a chance to talk about and celebrate the celebrations of life, but also the struggle. The journey to America had many struggles and many came back as far as the 1800s, Indian Americans discovering this world, but it really wasn't until a century later when America got rid of those national origin quotas, and we could really open up the doors. You know, the quotas in place to the sixties. So, the real opportunities came in the seventies, eighties and nineties. And that's why we're so excited to see so many new, new Americans coming here from India. And also, we are just not celebrating the American dream, people then turned to the American dream. Many came here, like my grandparents, who left great poverty in a small island called Ireland. And they had to leave. Their parents told them there's no life for you here, we cannot afford to literally feed you and they had to come to this country. So, like so many came here in search of, yes, the American dream, but it's what I call the New York dream. It's even sweeter. It's more beautiful. It's more diverse.

"And this community, the Indian community, has become such an important part of that fabric. And as your Governor, I wear that diversity with great pride. I've been to many, many Diwali celebrations and India Republic Day celebrations, but I'm very proud to be the first Governor of the State of New York to officially celebrate Indian Independence. Very first. And so, this marks 75 years since India freed itself from the colonial yolk and people were able to start on that path toward true democracy. And as I mentioned from the very beginning, it was difficult. And I don't think the history books correctly tell the story of the over a million deaths and the forced displacement of over 12 million people. It was the largest mass migration in modern history at the time. And we don't talk about that. We don't talk about the pain and the loss that was endured to create the world's largest democracy. So, I know for some, the wounds are still fresh. You know, the realization that what their parents and grandparents had to endure to have that elusive concept known as freedom and democracy, but they never stop persevering and fighting. Pak PM Shehzad Sharif expresses...

Sharif expressed these views during a meeting with the newly appointed Australian High Commissioner to Pakistan, Neil Hawkins, on Thursday, August 18, the Dawn Newspaper quoted the Prime Minister's Office

(PMO) as saying.

"Pakistan desires peaceful ties with India, based on the principles of equity, justice and mutual respect. In this context, a just and peaceful resolution of the Jammu and Kashmir dispute in accordance with the relevant UNSC resolutions and the wishes of the Kashmiri people, was indispensable," Sharif said.

"The international community has to play a facilitative role in this regard, as it was essential for durable peace and stability in South Asia," he said.

India has repeatedly told Pakistan that it desires normal unneighborly relations with Islamabad in an environment free of terror, hostility, and violence. India has said the onus is on Pakistan to create an environment free of terror and hostility.

Sharif's remarks came days after India decided to allow non-locals who are living ordinarily in Jammu and Kashmir to be able to register their names in the voting list and cast their ballot in the elections in the union territory.

Before the abrogation of Article 370, only the permanent residents of Jammu and Kashmir as defined by the state subject law were entitled to get voting rights.

In a related development, the Foreign Office on Friday said it categorically rejects India's announcement of permitting even temporary residents, including outside workforce and security personnel, to register as 'voters' in Jammu and Kashmir.

It is an "Indian design to influence the outcome of 'so-called' elections" in Jammu and Kashmir and deliberate attempts "of pre-poll rigging and overt manipulation", the Pakistan Foreign Office said in a statement.

It also asked the international community to take immediate cognizance of the Indian attempts at effecting "illegal demographic changes" in Kashmir.

Jammu and Kashmir Chief Electoral Officer Hirdesh Kumar on Wednesday, August 17, had announced that the Union Territory is likely to get around 25 lakh additional voters, including outsiders, after the special summary revision of electoral rolls being held for the first time after the abrogation of Article 370.

The bilateral ties between the two neighbors deteriorated further after India announced withdrawing the special powers of Jammu and Kashmir and bifurcation of the state into two union territories in August 2019.

India has repeatedly told Pakistan that Jammu and Kashmir "was, is and shall forever" remain an integral part of the country. It also advised Pakistan to accept the reality and stop all anti-India propaganda.

imprisonment for the 2002 Bilkis Bano gangrape case. For one, on April 23, 2019, the court, while awarding her 750 lakh in compensation, described how the "brutal, diabolic, gruesome, horrific acts of violence" committed on her has left an "indelible imprint on her mind which will continue to torment and cripple her".

The apex court had noted that the then 21-year-old and pregnant Ms. Bilkis was "repeatedly gangraped". She was a "mute and helpless witness to her three-and-a-half-year-old daughter butchered to death". She had lost all the members of her family while fleeing the mayhem and violence of the 2002 riots. The court said she had lived the life of a nomad, an orphan.

The State government's decision to remit the sentence of the 11 convicts has raised a furious public outcry. Civil rights groups have urged the Supreme Court to revoke the remission. Ms. Bilkis's family has told the media that they are scared of what may happen to them in the future.

The fact that the crimes were committed on Ms. Bilkis in the background of violence which affected the entire State; the apprehensions voiced by her family following the release of the convicts, and the warm welcome reported to have been accorded to the 11 men when they came out of jail, make the Laxman Naskar judgment relevant in this case. S. AFRICA GIVES ENGLAND BIG REALITY CHECK WITH INNINGS DEFEAT

England was given a reality check in its new era under Ben Stokes as the team fell to defeat by South Africa by an innings and 12 runs inside three days in the first Test at Lord's on Friday, August 19.

After taking a lead of 161 runs into the second innings, the Proteas dismissed England for 149 in 37.4 overs before tea on Day 3 and went 1-0 ahead in the three-test series.

Under new captain Stokes and new coach Brendon McCullum, England had swept a series 3-0 against New Zealand in June and also beaten India in a test in July by taking an aggressive approach to its batting.

That didn't work against South Africa and its hostile pace attack. England lost its 20 wickets in the match in a total of 82.4 overs.

Stokes said the heavy loss hadn't dented his confidence in England's new style of play.

"Absolutely not," Stokes said. "You look at captains before me, captains after me, they're always going to get criticized at certain times about the way they want to go out and play."

"That's just part and parcel of life. We know when we perform to how we are capable of, we can go out and put some incredible performances like everybody has seen in the four games before this."

The South Africans resumed on 289-7 on Day 3 and were bowled out for 326 after an hour's play.

England didn't even make it to tea.

The second test starts Thursday in Manchester, where the Proteas will look to wrap up the series.

Skipper Rahul needs game time; team new challenge in remaining ODIs

HARARE (TIP)

Skipper KL Rahul would hope to get some valuable batting time as the Indian team is expected to recalibrate its goals to create some challenge for itself in the remaining two ODIs against Zimbabwe.

The gulf between the two teams would always make these kind of bilateral contests lopsided but bigger goal for the 'Men In Blue' would be to push the limits.

The immediate target for the side would be to try and bat first in case Rahul wins the toss in Saturday's second ODI.

The early start on a bouncy track and sufficient nip in the air would pose some challenge for the batters. There won't be any Jimmy Anderson or Josh Hazlewood in operation but even then battling the conditions would be a good test for Rahul and his players.

Deepak Chahar had pointed out after the first game that there is little help for the bowlers during the second session and the only time there's some challenge for batters is the first hour of the match.

Before facing the might of Shaheen Shah Afridi in Asia Cup, a morning session with deliveries moving both sides, albeit with a gentle pace, would be decent enough extended net session for Rahul.

While 'Captain Rahul' showed his elder statesman like qualities by letting Shikhar Dhawan and Shubman Gill open in the first game, the 'Batter Rahul' also needs to get his priorities right before the Asia Cup.

He needs to quickly adapt to Team India's "attack at all costs from the onset" philosophy and that can't just happen overnight.



Against a side like Zimbabwe, which is not good enough to even challenge a top Indian domestic side, Rahul would get an ideal opportunity to experiment with his batting.

Similarly Deepak Hooda, if given a chance to bat up the order, can also build his confidence.

Then there is Sanju Samson. If he plays at No.4, it gives him ample scope to build an innings of significance.

For acting head coach VVS Laxman, as much as he would like to experiment, he wouldn't mind winning the series first before giving some of the reserves a chance to test themselves.

Therefore a left-right combination of Ishan Kishan and KL Rahul won't be a bad option in case Shikhar Dhawan's forearm injury sustained towards the end of the match turns out to be serious.

Winning the series is important but creating different kind of situations and testing the game awareness of the younger lot in pressure cooker scenario should be on the checklist.

Deepak Chahar bowling seven overs at one stretch is a good sign and indicator that he is gradually building up his workload.

Similarly Prasidh Krishna would like to try a few more variations than his back of the length stuff while Mohammed Siraj won't mind a few more wickets.

Just like batting in morning could be a challenge for Rahul and Co. bowling in the warm afternoon conditions with no lateral movement on offer would test the character of pacers and their improvisation skills.

The T20I squad saw the return of Richa Ghosh in the main squad after being questionably left out of the CWG team at the expense of Taniyaa Bhatia, who has once again regained her place in both squad.

While Richa is in T20I squad, Yastika Bhatia has managed to retain her place in the ODI team.

But the biggest pick was the burly Kiran Navgire, a Maharashtra native, who plays domestic cricket for Nagaland. Her 34-ball-69 which had five towering sixes for Velocity during a Women's T20 Challenge game against

Trailblazers gave a glimpse of his power-hitting and alongside Shafali and Richa would add impact to the team.

Among those who once again missed out are veteran seamer Shikha Pandey, who has been repeatedly ignored and leg-spinner Poonam Yadav, who perhaps needs to reinvent her bowling to make a comeback.





AUGUST 23

August 23, 1927 - Italian immigrants Nicola Sacco and Bartolomeo Vanzetti were electrocuted inside a prison at Charlestown, Massachusetts. They had been convicted of a shoe factory payroll robbery during which the paymaster and a guard had been killed. Following their convictions, all appeals for a new trial had failed, despite the lack of hard evidence and a later admission by a known criminal that he had participated in the robbery with an organized criminal gang. The days and weeks leading up to their execution aroused worldwide protests amid accusations of unfair treatment because they had radical political views and were Italian.

AUGUST 24**Vesuvius**


