NEW YORK (TIP): In a move likely to benefit Indian professionals, a pilot program allowing H-1B holders to renew visas without leaving the US, has cleared a review by the White House Office of Information and Regulatory Affairs.

To begin with, 20,000 H-1B specialty occupation workers will be able to renew their visas in the US beginning from January next year.

The Department of State is launching a pilot program for domestic renewal of H-1B visas, offering a significant development for qualified applicants. The program, active from January 29 to April 1, 2024, allows eligible H-1B visa holders to renew their visas within the United

Colorado Supreme Court bars former president Donald Trump from running for President over 2021 Capitol riots

Court ordered exclusion of his name from the state's Republican presidential primary ballot.

DECEMBER 20, 2023

WASHINGTON, D.C. (TIP): In a stunning verdict, the Colorado Supreme Court has barred Donald Trump from running for President next year in the state citing his role in the unprecedented attack on the US Capitol in 2021 and ordered exclusion of his name from the state's Republican presidential primary ballot.

The disqualification of the 77-year-old former President on Tuesday, December 19, was based on the Constitution's 14th Amendment, which says officials who take an oath to support the US Constitution are banned from future office if they "engaged in insurrection." The 4-3 ruling by the seven-member Colorado Supreme Court does not apply

outside the state.

Indian-American presidential candidates Nikki Haley and Vivek Ramaswamy on Wednesday, December 20, opposed the Supreme Court decision.

Haley said "the last thing we want" is judges deciding who can and cannot be on the presidential ballot.

Ramaswamy vowed to withdraw from Colorado Republican party primary ballot until Trump eligibility is restored.

Trump is currently the front-runner in the Republican Party's nomination process for the race for the White House in 2024. Trump's campaign has vowed to appeal against the "flawed" ruling by the Supreme Court of Colorado in the US Supreme Court.

This will also be the sixth time that a French head of state will attend the celebrations as chief guest since 1976. Rudy Giuliani files for bankruptcy after \$148m defamation verdict

DECEMBER 21, 2023

NEW YORK (TIP): Rudy Giuliani, once famous as "Mayor of America" and a longtime associate of former President Donald Trump, has filed for bankruptcy just days after he was ordered to pay \$148m (£116m) in a defamation case.


He was ordered to pay the sum after a judge found he defamed two Georgia election workers over false claims they tampered with votes in 2020.

The filing shows he owes millions of dollars in legal fees and unpaid taxes.

A spokesman said the move should "be a surprise to no-one".

In a statement, the spokesman for Mr Giuliani, Ted Goodman, said "no person could have reasonably believed that [Mr Giuliani] would be able to pay such a high punitive amount". He added that December 21 bankruptcy filing in New York would give Mr Giuliani the "opportunity and time to pursue an appeal, while providing transparency for

Revision sans vision: On the three Bills that replace the body of criminal laws in India

NEW LAWS HAVE POSITIVE FEATURES, BUT BRING NO PATH-BREAKING CHANGE IN SYSTEM

Law-making in the absence of a significant number of Opposition members does not reflect well on the legislature. The three Bills that replace the body of criminal laws in India were passed by Parliament in its ongoing session in the absence of more than 140 members. Even though the revised versions of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS, which will replace the IPC), the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (which will replace the CrPC) and the Bharatiya Sakshya Bill (instead of the Evidence Act) were introduced after scrutiny by a Parliamentary Standing Committee, they still required legislative deliberations in the full chambers, given their implications for the entire country. Many concerns that the Bills gave rise to could not be raised in Parliament as a result. A conspicuous aspect of the new codes is that barring reordering of the sections, much of the language and contents of the original laws have been retained. However, Union

Home Minister Amit Shah's claim that the colonial imprint of the IPC, CrPC and the Evidence Act has been replaced by a purely Indian legal framework may not be correct, as the new codes do not envisage any path-breaking change in the way the country is policed, crimes are investigated and protracted trials are conducted.

The improvements in the BNS include the removal of the outdated sedition section, as exciting disaffection against the government or bringing it into hatred and contempt is no more an offence, and the introduction of mob lynching (including hate crimes such as causing death or grievous hurt on the ground of a person's race, caste, community, sex, language or place of birth) as a separate offence. Another positive feature is the government ignoring the panel's recommendation to bring back adultery, struck down by the Supreme Court, as a gender-neutral offence. However, it is questionable

whether 'terrorism' should have been included in the general penal law when it is punishable under special legislation. Grave charges such as terrorism should not be lightly invoked. On the procedural side, some welcome features are the provision for FIRs to be registered by a police officer irrespective of where an offence took place and the boost sought to be given to use of forensics in investigation and videography of searches and seizures. A significant failure lies in not clarifying whether the new criminal procedure allows police custody beyond the 15-day limit, or it is just a provision that allows the 15-day period to spread across any days within the first 40 or 60 days of a person's arrest. Revisions in law cannot be made without a vision for a legal framework that addresses all the inadequacies of the criminal justice system.

Eight-year-old British Indian schoolgirl chess prodigy named Europe's best female player

LONDON (TIP): An eight-year-old British Indian schoolgirl has made chess history after being named the "super talented" best female player at a European championship.

Bodhana Sivanandan, from Harrow in north-west London, won the European Blitz Chess Championship in Zagreb, Croatia, over the weekend after a winning streak since she took up chess during the COVID pandemic lockdown.

In the European championship, she went head-to-head with some of the best players in the world and defeated an international master to win her crown.

"Eight-year-old super talented Bodhana Sivanandan made an astonishing result in the Blitz competition. She scored 8.5/13 points to win the first women prize and earn 211.2 blitz ELO points," said the European Rapid and Blitz Chess Championships, which concluded in Croatia on Sunday.

Praise for the chess prodigy has since been pouring in on social media, with leading professionals highlighting her "unbelievable" performance.

"I always try my best to win, sometimes it happens and sometimes it doesn't," Bodhana told the media after her win.

Father, Siva Sivanandan said his daughter was "trying her best and it has worked in favor of her".

"She likes chess and she likes travelling. We keep trying and keep going," he said.

A few months ago, Sivanandan was among a group of young chess enthusiasts invited by British Prime Minister Rishi Sunak to 10 Downing Street to mark the government's major new GBP 1 million investment package for the game.

The package has since been put in place to support children attending schools in disadvantaged areas across England to learn and play chess, improve visibility and availability of the game and fund elite playing.

"I was struggling to support my son with the required chess tournaments and coaching instrumental to his development at such a young and crucial age," said Jitendra Singh, father of another British Indian chess prodigy nine-year-old Shreyas Royal.

London housing block named after British Indian spy Noor Inayat Khan

LONDON (TIP): A council housing block in north London has been named after British Indian spy and descendant of Tipu Sultan, Noor Inayat Khan, following a ballot of local residents to choose from a shortlist of the area's historic inhabitants.

Camden Council unveiled the "Noor Inayat Khan House" at a ceremony on Wednesday, December 20, attended by local Labour Party MP and Opposition leader Keir Starmer, Khan's biographer Shrabani Basu and Camden Council leaders and residents.

Camden was the borough where young Noor lived with her family before she left for Nazi-occupied France in 1943 after being recruited as an undercover radio operator for Britain's Special Operations Executive (SOE), becoming the first woman to be dropped behind enemy lines during the Second World War.

"It is wonderful that the residents of Camden voted to name the housing block after Noor Inayat Khan; the people of Camden have truly taken Noor to heart, and she is known and loved in the borough," said Basu, the London-based author of 'Spy Princess: The Life of Noor Inayat Khan'.

In her speech at the unveiling, she noted: "Today we remember Noor Inayat Khan as a heroine of the war, a young woman of Indian origin, who unhesitatingly gave her life in the fight against Fascism. But it is not just her bravery and loyalty that we remember. At a time when conflict is rife in the world, and countries and communities are divided by gunfire and walls, it is

important to remember the values that Noor stood for.

"She was a Sufi, she believed in religious tolerance, she believed in non-violence and peace between nations. Today, let us take away her message for peace and harmony."

In 2020, the English Heritage charity unveiled a Blue Plaque at 4 Taviton Street in Bloomsbury to commemorate Khan's home in Camden, following a memorial installed nearby at Gordon Square by the Noor Inayat Khan Memorial Trust in 2012.

The new housing block in the name of the war heroine shot dead aged just 30 at Dachau concentration camp in 1944 forms part of a social housing project to deliver more affordable homes in London.

"This isn't just about some bricks and some windows and a roof; this is about life chances, aspiration and equal opportunity for everyone. When I was growing up we didn't have a lot of money, but we did have a house. And that gave me the security to go on and do some of the things that I've done in my life. I want every child to have that chance," said Starmer, member of Parliament for Holborn and St. Pancras in Camden.

Each of the three new residential buildings at the Maitland Park redevelopment has been named after prominent local figures as part of Camden Council's strategy for diversity in the public spaces.

Besides Noor Inayat Khan, a second block commemorates Mary Prince - the first black woman to have an autobiography published in Britain and a third is named after Antony Grey - an LGBTQ+ activist whose work led to decriminalization of homosexuality for men.

"Residents have shaped the legacy of where they live by helping to choose three remarkable figures from our local community to name their new buildings after," said Councillor Danny Beales, Camden Council Cabinet Member for New Homes, Jobs, and Community Investment.

The council said the redevelopment at the Maitland Park Estate in Haverstock is the latest social housing project to reach completion in Camden since the council announced the expansion of its house-building programme by committing an extra GBP 1.3 billion investment towards building new homes for residents.

Indian-origin undercover reporter Balakrishnan Balagopal finds exploitation of care workers in UK

Balakrishnan Balagopal's report for the 'BBC Panorama' investigation, which will be telecast here on Monday, December 18 evening, found care givers being charged thousands of pounds.

LONDON (TIP): An Indian national arrested in London on a provisional American warrant as part of a US-UK coordinated action targeting terrorism financing has been extradited to the US after consenting to face trial in America, the British authorities said on Tuesday, December 19. Madurai-born Sundar Nagarajan (65) was arrested from Hayes in west London on April 18. The UK's Crown Prosecution Service (CPS) told Westminster Magistrates' Court at the time that Nagarajan, linked to the Hizballah terrorist organization, was a "requested person" (RP) by the US authorities for fraud and money laundering offences. Indian American AAG Vanita Gupta to step down from DOJ

WASHINGTON, D.C. (TIP): Associated Attorney General Vanita Gupta will leave the Department of Justice at the beginning of February, Attorney General Merrick B. Garland announced on Thursday, December 21.

"I am deeply grateful to Vanita for her extraordinary service as Associate Attorney General. Vanita's commitment to the pursuit of justice, and her relentless focus on bringing people together to find common ground, has made her an incredibly effective leader in dealing with some of the most complex challenges facing the American people," Garland said in a press release. "She has distinguished herself as the kind of leader who is also a partner to the career and non-career employees who work for her, to the stakeholders the Department works with, and to the public we all work for."

Gupta, 49, has been serving in the number three position at the Justice Department since April 2021.

The seasoned civil rights lawyer is responsible for managing civil litigation under the guidance of

Garland. Her portfolio encompasses various areas within the Justice Department, including civil rights, antitrust, environmental divisions, and the administration of over \$5 billion in federal grants for public safety and criminal justice.

In 2022, in the aftermath of the Supreme Court's decision to strike down federal protections for abortion access, Garland entrusted Gupta with the leadership of a Justice Department reproductive rights task force. Under her leadership, federal authorities took legal action against Idaho for a restrictive abortion law and intensified prosecutions of anti-abortion activists accused of impeding access to reproductive clinics.

"As a trusted advisor and key member of the Department's leadership team charged with overseeing all of our civil litigating components and grantmaking entities, Vanita has played an essential role in our work to fulfill DOJ's mission to uphold the rule of law, keep our country safe, and protect civil rights," a report said on Thursday. "Among her

many accomplishments during her tenure, Vanita stood up and has led the Department's Reproductive Rights Taskforce to defend the reproductive freedoms that are protected by federal law."

The attorney general said Gupta has "played an integral role" in the department's "efforts to combat violent crime and gun violence and to support the victims of crime" and has facilitated its "efforts to advance a criminal justice system that keeps people safe and reflects our values."

A report said that the Indian American "has prioritized work that centers its impact on people." He added, "We at the Justice Department will dearly miss our colleague and friend, but I am confident that her enormous contributions to the Department will continue to be felt long after her departure."

An alumnus of Yale University and New York University School of Law, Gupta has had a stellar career as a civil rights attorney and Justice Department official. Commencing her journey with two prominent civil and human rights organizations, the

National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) Legal Defense & Educational Fund and the American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU), she tackled significant cases. Notably, one of her initial victories involved arguing against the wrongful drug convictions of 38 African American individuals in Tulsa, Texas, by all-white juries.

During her tenure at the ACLU, Gupta spearheaded the Smart Justice Campaign, dedicated to ending mass incarceration.



BOSTON (TIP): Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) engineers, including an Indian American, have developed a robotic replica of the heart's right ventricle, which mimics the beating and blood-pumping action of live hearts.

The robo-ventricle combines real heart tissue with synthetic, balloon-like artificial muscles that enable scientists to control the ventricle's contractions while observing how its natural valves and other intricate structures function, according to a report.

The artificial ventricle can be tuned to mimic healthy and diseased states. The team manipulated the model to simulate conditions of right ventricular dysfunction, including pulmonary hypertension and myocardial infarction.

"NYC Health + Hospitals has so much to be proud of this year, and I want to thank our staff across the health system for the hard work they do every day to serve our patients and New Yorkers," said NYC Health + Hospitals President and CEO Mitchell Katz, MD. "We joined our sister agencies in the response to the asylum seeker crisis. In the face of a neighborhood power outage, we safely evacuated all of our patients from NYC Health + Hospitals/Woodhull and brought them back when it was safe. We opened a beautiful new hospital, the Ruth Bader Ginsburg Hospital at NYC Health + Hospitals/South Brooklyn Health. And we made deep investments in our staff, with a salary increase for our nurses and loan repayment for some of our behavioral health staff."

A LIST OF THE HEALTH SYSTEM'S ACCOMPLISHMENTS FOR 2023 ARE BELOW:

DELIVERING AWARD-WINNING, HIGH-QUALITY CARE

- Newsweek ranked Seaview the #1 Nursing Home in New York State. Three of the health system's other skilled nursing facilities ranked in the top ten, and the fifth was ranked in the top 30 out of 600 nursing homes statewide.
- NYC Health + Hospitals was once again recognized by the American Heart Association and American Medical Association for providing high quality care in several areas, including type 2 diabetes, high blood pressure, heart failure, stroke, and resuscitation.
- For the first time, nine NYC Health + Hospitals sites were recognized by Planetree International for excellence in person-centered care.
- NYC Health + Hospitals' Accountable Care Organization earned \$8M from the federal government for reducing avoidable costs and meeting high standards of quality care for patients - \$4M more than last year's shared savings. NYC Health + Hospitals is the only health system in New York State to achieve savings for ten years in a row.
- NYC Health + Hospitals expanded its DaVinci Surgical Robot program. To offer equitable access to all patients, the health system added nine surgical robots for a total of 12 across the system.
- A new Lung Cancer Screening Program launched at three pilot hospital sites. To date 3,961 patients have been screened. The health system's screening rate for patients is 24% of all those eligible, which is significantly higher than the national rate of 6%. Of those screened, 23% were Black; 25% were Hispanic; 24% were White; and 26% were Asian, Native Hawaiian, Pacific Islander.

NEW SPACES AND SERVICES

NYC Health + Hospitals opened a new hospital. The \$923 million Ruth Bader Ginsburg Hospital on the campus of NYC Health + Hospitals/South Brooklyn Health is a bright, beautiful space for patients to receive care. The 11-story building was designed to withstand the next 500-year storm. Hospital staff successfully transferred over 170 patients in an operation that began at 1am on a Sunday morning.

NYC Health + Hospitals/Correctional Health Services opened the first-ever reentry service center on Rikers Island, a resource hub for the hundreds of people who are released from Rikers each year as well as members of the public and staff. Correctional health is also providing free smartphones and wireless plans to clinically vulnerable patients upon their release from jail to help them remain engaged in care as they return to the community.

- The health system launched telehealth abortion access through Virtual ExpressCare - becoming the first public health system in the nation to do so.
- Seven new murals can be found around NYC Health + Hospitals thanks to the Arts in Medicine department's Community Mural Project at NYC Health + Hospitals/Kings County; NYC Health + Hospitals/Gotham Health, Sydenham; NYC Health + Hospitals/Queens; NYC Health + Hospitals/Coler; NYC Health + Hospitals/Carter; and NYC Health + Hospitals/Gotham Health, Morrisania. There is no alternative to green industrial strategy

INCLUSIVE GREEN INDUSTRIAL STRATEGIES BELONG NEITHER TO THE LEFT NOR THE RIGHT. THEY ARE ABOUT CREATING AN ECONOMY THAT SERVES PEOPLE AND CONSERVES THE NATURAL WORLD ON WHICH WE ALL DEPEND

"Equally important, the green transition will succeed only if it is also a "just transition." To support the necessary shift of workers from brown to green jobs, governments can require businesses that receive public benefits to align their operations with climate goals, adopt fair labor policies, and reinvest profits in worker training and research and development. Moreover, policymakers should incentivize brown sectors to reduce their environmental footprint, and to mitigate the risk of stranded assets."

With the COP28 climate summit now wrapped up, the spotlight remains firmly on the global financing gap. It is estimated that achieving the 2030 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) will require a staggering \$5.7 trillion per year. But not only must we urgently secure the necessary capital; we also must ensure that long-term patient investments are strategically directed toward ambitious goals. That means coordinating inter-sectoral responses across different supply chains, which in turn requires a robust industrial strategy.

Countries around the world are doubling down on plans to revitalize their industrial sectors. It is critical that Britain does not lose ground to them. Earlier this year, Chancellor of the Exchequer Jeremy Hunt outlined an ambitious plan to position green industries as the engines of long-term growth. Strongly encouraging green businesses to ramp up their investments, he set an optimistic tone. Conservatives and Labour must act to ensure investors' confidence in the stability of UK policy, so that projects with a life of decades are not vulnerable to uncertainty.

The United Kingdom will need a clear, comprehensive vision for sustainable industrial development if it is to reap the economic opportunities presented by a world that is increasingly committed to achieving net-zero emissions. As the Independent Review of Net Zero warns, inconsistent policy approaches are bad

not only for the planet, but also for business. After all, green industries could be worth more than \$10 trillion globally by 2050.

Industrial strategy thus holds a dual promise: helping to address climate change and revitalizing industry so that it can compete in the twenty-first century. We need not accept environmental protection as a trade-off against economic progress. The two can go hand in hand if green policies are deployed to fuel growth and innovation, and if sustainable practices are woven into the fabric of how we consume, move, invest, and build.

We had the honor of working together on a UK industrial-strategy blueprint back in 2018, when one of us (Clark) was Secretary of State and the other (Mazzucato) was co-chair of University College London's Commission for Mission-Oriented Innovation and Industrial Strategy. That work took a sector-based strategy (focused on automobiles, aerospace, finance, life sciences, and creative industries) and applied it to outcomes such as clean growth, healthy ageing, sustainable mobility, and an inclusive data economy.

The point is not to pick winners or only to fix market failures, but to work with firms (from whatever sector) that are willing to join forces to solve problems and to create and shape new markets. Just as the original moon landing required innovation in domains ranging from aerospace to nutrition, electronics, materials, and software, today's climate-related challenges call for innovation in multiple sectors - not just renewable energy.

A mission-oriented approach leads to more than just completing the mission. The innovations it catalyzes can lead to a multiplier effect - with initial investments crowding in private investment and generating spillovers that amplify the impact on GDP. Through the process of solving smaller problems on the way to the moon, we created the technologies for today's camera phones, foil blankets, baby formula, and a broad range of software applications.

Public and private actors need to work well together. Reorienting public agencies around ambitious missions requires evaluation metrics to capture dynamic economy-wide spillovers. It will not do to continue obsessing over often spuriously precise cost-benefit calculations (which would have stopped the moon mission from ever getting off the ground).

Equally important, partnerships between the public and private sectors should be symbiotic, and public funding should come with conditions to maximize public value by steering investments in an inclusive and sustainable direction. For example, conditionalities can require recipients to reduce the material content of their products and create greener supply chains.

We know that such measures work. The German steel industry's progress in adopting a climate-friendly circular-economy model owes much to that country's industrial strategy. Public policies encouraged low-carbon processes among steel manufacturers and established markets for carbon-efficient steel, materials, and green hydrogen. All countries need broad,



Questions aplenty over security breach

A media report states that leaflets carried by the intruders and thrown in the well of the House were also hidden in the shoes. How many leaflets can be carried in this fashion? The 'modified' shoes would have been spotted by other visitors to the Lok Sabha gallery, even if the security men were inattentive. There is a lot of explanation to do.

The other sensational news in the past week was that the family of Nikhil Gupta, the man arrested in the Czech Republic at the behest of the US government for being involved in a conspiracy with an Indian government official to assassinate a US citizen (Pannun), has moved India's Supreme Court. The family has pleaded that he should not be extradited to the US as he has not committed the crime in question. The Czechs are more likely to pay heed to the US government's demand than submit themselves to the jurisdiction of an Indian court.

I mentioned this ticklish matter in my column last week. I had wondered how our powerful and astute Prime Minister would pull India out of this mess. After the G20 summit, he is a global figure with clout on the world stage, but it is not enough to defy edicts or demands of a powerful country like the US. That country's judicial system rotates on a different plane from ours. The judges there are presumably independent of the political executive. Gupta may run out of options if the facts disclosed by the Americans have a leg to stand on.

Pannun has a following among some expatriate Sikhs. His views have cut no ice with Sikhs in India, particularly Punjab. But with this narrative of being targeted, he may gain some adherents among unemployed Sikhs.

Prime Minister Modi's economic policies have greatly benefited the 'haves' in our land. Since his party's well-oiled propaganda machine and the absence of a credible Opposition leader have made a third term for him a near certainty, he can afford to reduce his own role in electioneering to concentrate on the economic needs of those at the bottom of the ladder. There are many states in the country over which unemployment looms large.

Sense of consensus eludes INDIA

AT CORE OF PREDICAMENT IS CONGRESS'S INABILITY TO MOLD ITSELF INTO A LEADER OF A HETEROGENEOUS BLOC

To see the glass as half full or half empty depends on how buoyant or cynical an observer is. Since its inception in June, the Indian National Developmental Inclusive Alliance (INDIA), comprising 28 parties, has envisaged roping in as many Opposition forces as it can mobilize in a joint front to fight the BJP in the 2024 General Election. The formation of the bloc, in which the Congress is as important an investor as the regional parties, was an admission on the part of the Gandhis that their political legacy was no longer remarkable enough to take on the BJP single-handedly. The series of meetings INDIA held iterated the Congress's position as an equal and not a first among equals.

It still isn't clear if the participants were out to score an own-goal by flagging issues that were earlier deemed as

has reasserted its near-hegemonic position amid projections of a comeback in 2024. It has pulverized the Opposition, which had sought a statement from the government regarding the security breach in Parliament but was rebuffed. Not only did the government reject the suggestion of being accountable to elected MPs, it also passed Bills with far-reaching implications for data security and amendments in the criminal laws without debate and discussion. After the mass suspension of MPs, the Opposition's presence in the Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha has shrunk alarmingly. as if they had only discussed the matter among themselves, believing they could persuade their associates that the time was ripe to raise the pitch for India's first Dalit PM and counterbalance the BJP's strategy of consolidating the Other Backward Classes (OBCs). Although JD(U) leader and Bihar CM Nitish Kumar consistently maintained that he did not aspire for the PM's post, his latent ambitions surfaced through statements by his colleagues in the past. A structured discussion on the PM candidate never took off, especially after Kharge scotched the idea, although some reports quoted him talking about his long years in public service and his conduct as a 'fighter' to mean that he was not averse to handling the Mamata-Kejriwal goony. Uddhav stressed that the question of electing a PM arose only if the coalition brought in enough MPs and what INDIA needed immediately was a convener to hold the grouping together.

Certain red lines, accentuating the existence of a regional cleave and intra-state pinpricks, were drawn. When TR Baalu, a senior DMK representative, sought a translation of Nitish's speech, he was snubbed by the Bihar CM, who demanded that Baalu should learn Hindi, a 'national' language. By juxtaposing the north-south divide that was displayed in Tuesday's meeting with the BJP's persistent attempts to shed the tag of being a Hindi-belt party, visible in Prime Minister Narendra Modi's overtures to Tamil Nadu and Kerala, it becomes clear who - the NDA or INDIA - has the big picture in front and what correctives need to be made.

While there was a general agreement that the seat-sharing process should be completed by the year-end, where do things stand now? Samajwadi leader Ram Gopal Yadav made it clear that his party would quit INDIA if there was a proposal to accommodate the Bahujan Samaj Party. As Mamata pitched for a year-end deadline, there was no indication from her of wanting to forge a broader alliance involving the TMC, the Left Front and the Congress. Given the mutual antagonism on the ground, it seems unlikely the idea would take off. In Maharashtra, it appears that while Uddhav's Sena and Sharad Pawar's Nationalist Congress Party have their terrain mapped out, the Congress is in a quandary over its strong areas, if indeed there are any.

At the core of the predicament faced by INDIA is the Congress' inability to mold itself into the leader of an admittedly heterogeneous formation, struggling for a helmsman and a narrative. While everybody conceded the need for a shared agenda and holding collective meetings that didn't seem unwieldy, the question is: Who will hold the baton for INDIA?

IRS New Voluntary Disclosure Program lets employers who received questionable Employee Retention Credits pay them back at discounted rate; interested taxpayers must apply by March 22

DECEMBER 21, 2023

WASHINGTON, D.C. (TIP): As part of an ongoing initiative aimed at combating dubious Employee Retention Credit (ERC) claims, the Internal Revenue Service, on December 21, launched a new Voluntary Disclosure Program to help businesses who want to pay back the money they received after filing ERC claims in error.

The new disclosure program, which has been in the works for several months, is part of a larger effort at the IRS to stop aggressive marketing around ERC that misled some employers into filing claims. The special disclosure program runs through March 22, 2024, and the IRS added provisions allowing repayment of 80% of the claim received.

The IRS also continues to urge employers with pending ERC claims to consider a separate withdrawal program that allows them to remove a pending ERC claim with no interest or penalty. The IRS has already received more than \$100 million in withdrawals as the agency continues intensifying audits and criminal investigation work in this area.

As these special initiatives for ERC continue, the IRS will provide an update in the new year on the status of the moratorium. Additionally, the IRS mailed out 20,000 denial letters to ERC claimants earlier this month.

"The disclosure program provides a much-needed option for employers who were pulled into these claims and now realize they shouldn't have applied," said IRS Commissioner Danny Werfel. "From discussions we have had with taxpayers and tax professionals around the country, we understand that there are many employers eager to correct their error, but who remain concerned about their ability to pay back the portion of the credit that has been lost to the promoter that brought them into this mess. This new option, with an opportunity to get right with a lower financial cost, provides the relief these taxpayers requested. The new initiative will also help with our ongoing efforts to gather information on promoters who created this situation by aggressively pushing people to apply for the credit."

Interested employers must apply to the ERC Voluntary Disclosure Program by March 22, 2024. Those that the IRS accepts into the program will need to repay only 80% of the credit they received. If the IRS paid interest on the employer's ERC refund claim, the employer doesn't need to repay that interest. Employers who are unable to repay the required 80% of the credit may be considered for an installment agreement on a case-by-case basis, pending submission and review of a Form 433-B, Collection Information Statement for Businesses, available on IRS.gov, and all required supporting documentation.

The IRS will not charge program participants interest or penalties on any credits they repay. However, if the employer is unable to repay the required 80% of the credit at the time of signing their closing agreement, then the employer will be required to pay penalties and interest in connection with entering into an installment agreement.

The IRS selected an 80% repayment because many of the ERC promoters charged a percentage fee that they collected at the time of payment or in advance of the payment, and the recipients never received the full amount.

To qualify for this program, the employer must provide the IRS with the names, addresses and telephone numbers of any advisors or tax preparers who advised or assisted them with their claim and details about the services provided. Further qualifications and program details are in

As part of this expanding effort for employers that claimed an erroneous or excessive ERC, the IRS also announced today it has started sending up to 20,000 letters with proposed tax adjustments that will recapture the erroneously claimed ERC. These mailings - which are on top of the 20,000 denial letters announced earlier in December - are currently just for tax year 2020, and work continues for tax year 2021, with additional mailings planned. If the IRS identifies an employer that has received excessive or erroneous ERC, the agency will reclaim that ERC through normal tax assessment and collection procedures.

"These letters are another incentive for businesses that believe they received an erroneous Employee Retention Credit payment to come forward and participate in the disclosure program," Werfel said. "Our compliance activities involving these payments continue to accelerate, and the disclosure program's 80% repayment figure is much more generous than later IRS action, which includes steeper costs and greater risk. We hope these taxpayers take advantage of this window now."

ERC VOLUNTARY DISCLOSURE PROGRAM: WHO CAN APPLY?

A variety of ERC recipients can apply. Any employer who already received the ERC for a tax period but isn't entitled to it can apply if the following are also true:

The employer is not under criminal investigation and has not been notified that they are under criminal investigation.

The employer is not under an IRS employment tax examination for the tax period for which they're applying to the Voluntary Disclosure Program.

The employer has not received an IRS notice and demand for repayment of part or all of the ERC.

The IRS has not received information from a third party that the taxpayer is not in compliance or has not acquired information directly related to the noncompliance from an enforcement action.

HOW TO APPLY

To apply, the employer must first file Form 15434, Application for Employee Retention Credit Voluntary Disclosure Program, available on IRS.gov. This form must be submitted using the IRS Document Upload Tool. Employers will be expected to repay their full ERC, minus the 20% reduction allowed through the Voluntary Disclosure Program. Employers who are not able to pay the amount in full will have the option to set up an installment agreement under certain conditions.

Employers who outsource their payroll must apply through the third party.

Many employers outsource their payroll obligations to a third party who reports, collects and pays employment taxes on the employer's behalf using the third party's Employer Identification Number. In this situation, the third-party, not the employer, must file Form 15434. See the form and its instructions for details.

HELP OPTIONS FOR THOSE CONSIDERING APPLYING

As part of a larger set of information on ERC, the IRS has provided a set of Frequently Asked Questions to help employers understand the terms of the program.

Once the employer has applied to the program and submitted their Form 15434, an IRS employee will contact them to go over the application and answer any questions.

NEXT STEPS AFTER AN APPLICATION IS APPROVED

If the IRS approves the employer's application, they will mail the employer a closing agreement. The employer must then repay 80% of the ERC they received, either online or by phone, using the Electronic Federal Tax Payment System (EFTPS). EFTPS is the Treasury Department system that most businesses already use to pay various federal tax obligations.

If the taxpayer is unable to pay the amount in full, they may enter into an installment agreement with the IRS to pay overtime. However, under the standard installment agreement policy, penalties and interest will apply, so the IRS encourages those who cannot pay in full to consider obtaining a loan from a financial institution to avoid the costs of an installment agreement with the IRS. Once payment has been made, the employer must return the signed closing agreement to the IRS.

ONGOING ERC INITIATIVES

The new Voluntary Disclosure Program is just the latest step taken by the IRS in its ongoing fight against ERC fraud.

In July, the IRS said it was shifting its focus to review ERC claims for compliance concerns, including intensifying audit work and criminal investigations on promoters and businesses filing dubious claims. The IRS has hundreds of criminal cases being worked, and thousands of ERC claims have been referred for audit.

Following concerns about aggressive ERC marketing from tax professionals and others, the IRS announced Sept. 14 a moratorium on processing new ERC claims. Enhanced compliance reviews of existing claims submitted before the moratorium is critical to protect against fraud and also to protect businesses and organizations from facing penalties or interest payments stemming from bad claims pushed by promoters.

Then, earlier this month, the IRS began sending an initial round of more than 20,000 letters to employers disallowing their ERC claims either because their business did not exist, or they didn't have employees for the period covered by their claim.

As mentioned earlier, the IRS also announced today it has started sending letters to up to 20,000 employers that claimed an erroneous or excessive ERC that propose tax adjustments that will remove the ERC.

In addition to these efforts, IRS audit and Criminal Investigation work involving ERC continues to expand involving dubious claims. The IRS has more than 300 criminal cases being worked with claims worth almost \$3 billion, and thousands of ERC claims have been referred for audit.

IRS REMINDER: STILL TIME TO WITHDRAW PENDING ERC CLAIMS

The IRS is also continuing to accept and process requests to withdraw an employer's full ERC claim under the special withdrawal process. Employers have until at least the end of the year to request a withdrawal.

IRS expands Business Tax Account access to S corporations, partnerships; adds ability to view business tax transcripts

DECEMBER 18, 2023

WASHINGTON, D.C. (TIP): As part of continuing transformation work, the Internal Revenue Service, on December 18, announced the launch of the second phase of a new online self-service tool for businesses that expands the business tax account capabilities and eligible entity types.

As a result, individual partners of partnerships and individual shareholders of S corporation businesses are now eligible for a



Business Tax Account in addition to sole proprietors.

Available at IRS.gov/businessaccount, the new business tax account is a key part of the agency's continuing service improvement initiative. This is part of the larger effort under last year's Inflation Reduction Act (IRA) and described in the multi-year Strategic Operating Plan released this spring.

IRS issues guidance on the incremental cost for the Commercial Clean Vehicle Credit

WASHINGTON, D.C.

(TIP): The Treasury Department and Internal Revenue Service, on December 20, issued Notice 2024-05 regarding the commercial clean vehicle credit for commercial vehicles placed in service in 2024.

The guidance provides a safe harbor for certain qualified commercial clean vehicles placed in service in calendar year 2024, which allows for reliance on the Department of Energy ("DOE") analysis of incremental costs. The analysis shows that the incremental cost of all street electric vehicles (other than in the case of compact car PHEVs) that have a gross vehicle weight rating of less than 14,000 pounds

will be greater than \$7,500 in calendar year 2024.

Accordingly, the incremental cost will not limit the available credit amount for street electric vehicles that have a gross vehicle weight rating of less than 14,000 pounds and are placed in service in calendar year 2024.

For compact car plug-in electric hybrids placed in service during calendar year 2024, for which the incremental cost was calculated to be less than \$7,500, the IRS will accept a taxpayer's use, when calculating the credit amount, of the incremental cost published by the DOE.

One person dies in Kerala as state records 265 new Covid-19 cases

Kerala reported 265 fresh Covid-19 infections and one death due to the disease in the last 24 hours, according to data on the Union Health Ministry website on Friday, December 22.

Of the 328 coronavirus infections reported nationwide till 8 am on Friday, 265 were from Kerala, taking the active cases in the state to 2,606, as per the website.

With one death reported in the state, the total number of people who have died due to coronavirus in Kerala since its outbreak three years ago reached 72,060.

The number of people who were cured, discharged, or migrated in the last 24 hours after being diagnosed with the infection stood at 275. With that, the total number of cases under this category rose to 68,37,689 till date. The state reported 300 new Covid infections and three deaths due to the disease on Thursday. On Tuesday, Health Minister Veena George reassured the people of the state that despite the rise in Covid cases in Kerala, there is no cause for alarm. The hospitals are adequately equipped to manage virus infections, she said.

India on December 21 reported six Covid deaths – three from Kerala, two from Karnataka and one from Punjab – and 594 new cases. This is the highest daily count in seven months since May. Top officials in the health ministry said the Covid deaths are being reported mostly among people suffering from serious illness. "Covid-19 isn't causing severe symptoms or deaths, as per the available data. Most people who are testing positive for the disease have mild symptoms only," said an official.

1984 anti-Sikh riots: Court asks Tytler's counsel to file details of previous FIRs filed in Pul Bangash case

NEW DELHI (TIP)

The Rouse Avenue court has asked the counsel for Congress leader Jagdish Tytler to file a list of FIRs lodged by Delhi Police and Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) in the Pul Bangash gurdwara Sikh riots case and the outcome of the investigation and trials thereof. Tytler appeared through video conferencing (VC).

The case is related to the killing of three Sikhs - Sardar Thakur Singh, Badal Singh and Gurcharan Singh -- in Pul Bangash gurdwara in November 1, 1984. Congress leader Jagdish Tytler is named as an accused in the case. The CBI had filed a supplementary chargesheet against him in May 2023. Special judge Rakesh Syal adjourned the matter till January 9, 2024, after hearing the submission of defence counsel that the certified copies of previous chargesheets have not been received.



Advocate Manu Sharma appeared for Tytler and urged the court to adjourn the matter as the certified copies of previous chargesheets and documents have not been received from the copying agency.

He also submitted that as per the agency, they will start to prepare the copies post-winter vacations.

Earlier, special judge Vikas Dhull was hearing the case before he was transferred.

To court's question on how many FIRs were lodged and how many chargesheets were filed, advocate Manu Sharma

submitted that three FIRs were lodged by Delhi police. He also submitted that the Delhi police and CBI filed a total of four chargesheets. The counsel further submitted that initially the case was investigated by Delhi Police. In 2005, on the recommendation of Justice Nanavati Commission, the CBI registered a new case clubbing all three FIRs of Delhi police. Thereafter, the CBI filed a chargesheet against the other accused who was acquitted. CBI had filed a closure report for Tytler, however, in May this year, a chargesheet was filed against him, the counsel submitted. The CBI mentioned that during investigation, evidence came on record that on November 1, 1984, the accused instigated, incited and provoked the mob assembled at the gurdwara resulting in the killing of three Sikhs, apart from burning & looting of shops.

3 more MPs suspended; total count 146 as winter session ends day before schedule

NEW DELHI (TIP)

Three more Congress MPs, including DK Suresh, Nakul Nath and Deepak Baij, were suspended from the Lok Sabha on Thursday, December 21, for the "remainder" of the winter session that was incidentally adjourned sine die later, a day ahead of its scheduled culmination.

With this, the total number of MPs suspended from the Lok Sabha reached 100 while the count stood at 46 for the Rajya Sabha, taking the total of suspended parliamentarians in both Houses to an unprecedented 146. Of the total 545 seats in the Lower House, 23 are vacant. After the 100 suspensions, the Lok Sabha strength stood at 422 as 23 of the 545 seats are vacant. In the Rajya Sabha, where seven of the 245 seats are vacant, the strength of the House after the 46 suspensions was reduced to 192.

Of the 100 MPs suspended from the Lok Sabha during the winter session, 13 faced action last week, 33 on December 18, 49 on December 19, two on Wednesday and three on Thursday. Of the 46 MPs suspended from the Rajya Sabha, one faced action last week and 45 on December 18.

"The Lok Sabha has taken a serious note of the misconduct of Deepak Baij, DK Suresh and Nakul Nath for showing utter disregard to the authority of the Chair by displaying placards and entering the well of the House. Therefore, they may be suspended from the House for the remaining session," Parliamentary Affairs Minister Pralhad Joshi said as he moved a motion for the suspension of the MPs. Speaker Birla had earlier warned the MPs, who were protesting the suspension of a large number of MPs and demanding a discussion on the Parliament security breach issue and a statement by Home Minister Amit Shah.

Despite the suspensions, the Lok Sabha achieved 74 per cent productivity while the count stood at 79 per cent for the Rajya Sabha.

The fourteenth session of the 17th Lok Sabha, which commenced on December 4, comprised of 14 sittings and lasted for 61 hours 50 minutes.

'Weaponizing disruptions as political strategy': V-P Dhankhar hits out at Opposition MPs

Rajya Sabha chairman Jagdeep Dhankhar on Thursday said the Upper House lost nearly 22 hours of business due to "avoidable disruptions" during the winter session, which was adjourned sine die a day ahead of schedule.

In his remarks on the conclusion of the winter session, Dhankhar criticised the members for "weaponizing

disruptions and disturbance as a political strategy", which he said doesn't resonate with the constitutional obligation of keeping the interest of people at large above any other political considerations.

The winter session of Parliament was marred with the opposition's protest demanding a statement from Union home minister Amit Shah on the security breach and the subsequent mass suspensions of MPs.

Despite the absence of the majority of opposition lawmakers owing to the large-scale suspensions, the government tabled and passed some crucial bills, including the ones replacing the British-era criminal code and regulating the appointment of top election officials.

"A total of 17 Bills including important path breaking bills related to Jammu & Kashmir, Appointment of Election Commissioners, the Post Office Bill, The Telecommunications Bill and the three Bills namely Bharatiya Sakshya Bill, Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita were passed during this session," the chairman said, adding that the three bills "unshackled colonial legacy of criminal jurisprudence that was hurtful to the citizens of this country and favouring alien rulers."

Taking note of the passage of the Bill to repeal the Indian Post Office Act, 1898 and to consolidate and amend the law relating to the post offices in India, Dhankhar said, "The Post Office Bill revamped the old colonial structure to set up the stage for fulfillment of the aspirations of the people of the country."

Now, foreign dailies can have India edition

The Lok Sabha on December 21 passed the Press and Registration of Periodicals Bill, 2023, repealing the colonial era law of the Press and Registration of Books Act, 1867.

The Bill has already been passed by the Rajya Sabha in the monsoon session and will now go for the Presidential assent before it becomes a law.

The new Bill allows facsimile editions of a foreign periodical to be printed in India with prior approval of the Central government and its registration with the Press Registrar General. Books which were part of the British-era PRB Act, 1867, have been taken away from the purview of the new Bill.

Introducing the Bill in the Lok Sabha, Minister for Information & Broadcasting Anurag Thakur said: "The Bill reflects yet another step of the Modi Government towards jettisoning mentality of slavery and bringing new laws for new India."

Punjab minister Aman Arora gets 2-year rigorous imprisonment for assault

A Sunam court on December 21 convicted and sentenced Punjab minister Aman Arora along with eight others to two years' rigorous imprisonment for allegedly assaulting his brother-in-law Rajinder Deepa. However, the minister, who said he would now approach a higher court, was granted bail by the court.

The court of Sunam Sub-Divisional Judicial Magistrate Gurbhinder Singh Johal held Arora and others guilty under Sections 323, 452 and 148 of the IPC. Under Section 323, he was sentenced to one-year RI along with Rs 1,000 fine, for the offence under Section 452 (read with 149), he was awarded two-year RI and Rs 5,000 fine. Under Section 148, he was sentenced to two-year imprisonment along with Rs 4,000 fine. All the sentences would run concurrently, the court said.

Arora now faces prospect of being disqualified from the House, but he has one month to appeal against the verdict. Under Section 8 of the Representation of the People Act, 1951, a member of the House can be barred if he is convicted of any offence, and sentenced to imprisonment for not less than two years.

The Act says that the member is to be disqualified from the date of conviction and will remain disqualified for six years.

Official sources in the Punjab Vidhan Sabha say that it is only after the court sends its order on conviction to the Speaker, or a complaint regarding his conviction is made, further course of action may be decided. The case against Arora has its genesis in a complaint filed in a court in 2013 by Deepa. He had claimed that Arora and nine others had trespassed his house and assaulted him in 2008. Both Arora and Deepa live across the road and the matter pertains to a property nearby.

In his complaint, Deepa had named Arora, his mother Parmeshwari Devi, Rajinder Singh Raja, Jagjiwan Ram, Baljinder Singh, Labh Singh, Manjit Singh (now deceased), Chitwant Singh, Kuldeep Singh and Satgur Singh. *Source: TNS*

No 'tonal shift' in relations with Canada, our stance firm, says India

EAM spokesperson Arindam Bagchi said that India hoped that Canada will take action against separatists and anti-India elements

NEW DELHI (TIP)

The Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) has maintained that the Government's position is "quite consistent" with regard to terrorism-related concerns between India and Canada.

"Whenever this issue is raised, we have highlighted how we see the problem. The core issue is the space given to terrorists, separatists and anti-Indian elements in Canada. Whether they have noted a shift or not, our position has been consistent," responded MEA spokesperson Arindam Bagchi at a media briefing when asked to react to Canadian PM Justin Trudeau stating that there has been a "tonal shift" in the Indian Government's stance on alleged extra-territorial assassinations after the US unsealed an indictment relating to an alleged assassination plot against



Gurpatwant Singh Pannun.

"We hope they will take action against such elements misusing the freedom of speech and expression in that country," added Bagchi.

In a year-end interview to a Canadian news channel, Trudeau had said Ottawa did not want to enter into a diplomatic standoff with India regarding the murder of Hardeep Singh Nijjar. "I think there is a beginning of an understanding that they can't bluster their way through this and there is openness to collaborating in a way that perhaps they were less open before," he

said. He said the US indictment appears to have convinced the Indian government to adopt a more sober tone.

The ties between India and Canada came under severe strain following Trudeau's allegations on September 18 of a "potential" involvement of Indian agents in the killing of Khalistani terrorist Hardeep Singh Nijjar on June 18 in British Columbia.

India had designated Nijjar as a terrorist in 2020. India rejected Trudeau's allegations as "absurd" and "motivated". In November, the US federal prosecutors charged that one Nikhil Gupta was working with an Indian government employee in the foiled plot to kill a Sikh separatist, who holds dual citizenship of the US and Canada. Though the separatist Sikh leader was not named, media reports identified him as Gurpatwant Singh Pannun, the leader of the Sikhs for Justice, an organisation banned in India.

India got consular access to Pannun case accused Nikhil Gupta

India received consular access on three occasions to Nikhil Gupta, who has been in a jail in the Czech capital of Prague following the US accusing him of involvement in a foiled plot to kill a Khalistani terrorist on American soil. External Affairs Ministry Spokesperson Arindam Bagchi also said India is extending necessary consular assistance to Mr Gupta.

"An Indian national is currently in the custody of the Czech authorities pending a request for extradition to the US. We have received consular access at

least on three occasions," Mr Bagchi said at his weekly media briefing in response to a question on the case involving Mr Gupta.

"We are extending necessary consular assistance as per requirement," he said.

Gupta, 52, has been accused by the US government of involvement in conspiring to kill US-based Khalistani terrorist Gurpatwant Singh Pannun.

His family approached the Supreme Court last week pleading for issuing direction to the central government to intervene in the extradition

proceedings and ensuring a fair trial in the case. "The family of this person has gone to our Supreme Court and this is a process that is going on in the Supreme Court. I do not think it will be appropriate for us to comment on issues like jurisdiction. We will wait for what the Supreme Court has to say," Bagchi said.

Four soldiers killed in Poonch terror ambush

JAMMU (TIP)

At least four soldiers were killed and three were injured when a group of terrorists ambushed two Indian Army vehicles in the Rajouri district of Jammu & Kashmir on Thursday, December 21, officials said.

The vehicles were navigating a blind curve at a spot known as Dhatyar Morh between Dera ki Gali (DKG) area and Bulfiaz when they came under heavy fire. They were carrying personnel to an active operation to nab terrorists at the DKG area, a few kilometres away.

"An operation was being conducted in general area DKG since the night of Wednesday. At approximately 3:45pm on Thursday, two army vehicles carrying troops to the operational site were fired upon by the terrorists. The fire was immediately retaliated upon by army troops," said defence spokesperson Lt Col Suneel Bartwal.

The personnel belonged to the army's 48 Rashtriya Rifles (48RR) unit.

"However, in the ongoing operation, our own troops sustained three fatal (killed in action) and three non fatal (injured) casualties," he said. An army spokesperson

later updated the toll to four, and it was not immediately clear if the fourth death was that of one of the three who had been hurt.

Colonel Bartwal said the operation was in progress and further details were being ascertained. At the time of going to print, the army had not disclosed identities or ranks of the dead or injured.

The December 21 attack was sixth since October 2021 in

the twin border districts of Rajouri and Poonch, south of Pir Panjal. In the six attacks, 29 army personnel have lost their lives, including two captains and two JCOs.

While the area involved in Thursday's incident was not as close to the Line of Control (LoC) with Pakistan as some of the other spots where the six attacks took place, intelligence officials aware of the matter said it was still a treacherous region.

"The terrain is hilly with dense jungles. The terrorists, it seems, ambushed the two vehicles with indiscriminate fire. The Gypsy that was leading the truck bore maximum brunt of the firing. The terrorists fled the spot after targeting the two vehicles," said an intelligence officer, asking not to be named. The operation at DKG that began on Wednesday, this person added, was launched following "hard intelligence" about the presence of terrorists in the area. People familiar with the matter said immediately after the attack, ambulances and reinforcements of 48RR and 43 RR were rushed to the site. "Public movement in the area has been restricted," the officer quoted above added.

The unparalleled sacrifice of Sahibzadas: A historic time for the Sikh community

As December unfolds, the Sikh community commemorates a pivotal chapter in their history, a poignant moment that resonates with the spirit of sacrifice and valor. These upcoming days hold profound significance, marking the tribute to the supreme and unparalleled martyrdom of Sahibzadas, the revered sons of Guru Gobind Singh Ji. Their sacrifice remains etched in the annals of time, an indelible testament to unwavering faith and unparalleled bravery. The legacy of Sahibzadas—Sahibzada Ajit Singh, Sahibzada Jujhar Singh, Sahibzada Zorawar Singh, and Sahibzada Fateh Singh—echoes through generations, inspiring millions with their unyielding commitment to righteousness and fearlessness. Their story isn't just a chapter in history; it is a beacon of courage that continues to guide and uplift humanity.

Chhotte Sahibzade, younger sons of Guru Gobind Singh, tenth master of the Sikhs, attained martyrdom on 26 December 1705 at a very young age of 9 and 6 only. This is known as Saka Sirhind or the Chhotte Sahibzada Saka. Every year on 24 to 26 December, Shaheedi Jor Mela, also known as Shaheedi Jor Mel/Sabha, is organized at Fatehgarh Sahib Punjab, India, to commemorate the supreme sacrifice at the place of their martyrdom.

"I have sacrificed my four sons for Sikh Panth, So, what if my four sons are dead, when thousands of my Gursikhs are alive"

These are the words of Guru Gobind Singh Ji after he lost his four younger Sahibzada. Guru Gobind Singh Ji, 10th Guru of Sikhs is known for his supreme sacrifice of his whole family just for his country and nation. As the year approaches the end, the global world Sikh community commemorates the martyrdom of youngest in the history of the world. This month is to mourn and sadness for whole nation and especially Sikh community who lost their beloved Sahibzadas to cruel rulers.

A martyr is one who chooses to suffer death rather than renounce his faith. To sacrifice one's life to uphold dharma has been an integral part of the Sikh faith. A shahid or martyr, by his supreme sacrifice for the right cause, bears testimony to its truth and to his own commitment to it. To ensure justice and to see that no one is oppressed is enjoined as a duty of every Sikh.

As says the Guru, "Listen O mind, that person who fears nothing nor gives anyone cause to fear, has alone obtained true knowledge." Sikh history is replete with incidents of martyrdom and the Sikh gurus set the example for the Sikhs by sacrificing their life. Among the supreme martyrs are four sons of Guru Gobind Singh, char sahibzade.

The "vaade sahibzade" or the older sons, aged 18 and 14, died fighting a battle at Chamkaur Sahib. The younger sons, "chotte sahibzade" attained martyrdom at the ages of six and nine.

While describing the importance of the land of Chamkaur, Allah Yaar Khan Jogi penned these immortal lines in his historical account. "Bas Ek Hii Hind Mein Tirth Hai Yatra Ke Liye, Katai Baap Ne Betey Jahan Khuda Ke Liye" There is only one place of worship in this part of the world where a father sacrificed his sons for humanity".


At the age when kids are supposed to play with toys, the younger sons of Guru Gobind Singh, Sahibzaada Fateh Singh (Age 6) and Sahibzaada Zorawar Singh (Age 9) attained martyrdom at Sirhind, Punjab. They along with their grandmother Mata Gujri Ji were tortured for days and were bricked alive.

Ajit Singh, the eldest son of Guru Gobind Singh, was born on January 25,



1687. He was taught Sikh theology, history and philosophy as well as martial arts like swordsmanship, horse-riding and archery. He fought his first battle when he was only 12 years of age. Ajit Singh laid down his life fighting heroically in the battle of Chamkaur. The second sahibzada, Jujhar Singh, born on March 14, 1691, was fearless and a great warrior. He also, like his brother, sacrificed his life, fighting for a noble cause. Zorawar Singh, the third son of Guru Gobind Singh, born on November 17, 1696, was only nine years of age when he attained martyrdom. Fateh Singh, the youngest son, was born on February 25, 1699 but lost his mother in 1700. He was very close to his grandmother, Mata Gujri, who brought him up inculcating typical Sikh values. When all appeasement failed, the then Governor of Sirhind ordered their execution by bricking them alive. Mata Gujri Ji, their grandmother, was all aware of the times ahead and with a heavy heart dressed up the young warriors like grooms. Their unshaken faith, courage, steadfastness and determination was of such high order they did not budge an inch despite several threats meted out and allurements offered over a three-day period to break their faith and spirit.

They walked backwards through the small door so they would enter the court without their head bowed towards their tormentors. Their grandmother who had accompanied them gave them courage to stay the path. There is no parallel to such martyrdom in the annals of human history.



The governor refused to do their last rites on their land and said the land would have to be bought and laid with gold coins. A local Diwan Todar Mal sold his property to do so; his successive generations are revered till today in Punjab. There is a Diwan Todar Mal Marg today in Fatehgarh Sahib. Historians

believe this is the most valuable place in the world. Diwan Todar Mal (who was himself a Hindu) had bought the place by laying 7800 gold coins on the ground. According to the price of gold, the value of these 4 square meters of land is 2,50,00,000,000 (2.5 billion). Thus, the younger sons of Guru Gobind Singh stood

strong to the true principles of Sikhism and sacrificed their lives for Humanity.

We need to even prepare ourselves to even understand the Greatness of Guru Gobind Singh Sahib. The world has never seen a man, a divine messenger, a warrior, a prophet, a poet, an emperor as great as Guru Gobind Singh Ji. We have may hear great stories of sacrifice but among all the sacrifice made by Guru Gobind Singh Ji stands tall of all. Sacrificing your whole family for your nation is something which is seen very less. Guru Gobind Singh Ji, 10th Guru of Sikhs is known for his supreme sacrifice of his whole family just for his country and nation.

Till date, the true adherent of Sikhi in Anandpur Sahib and Sirhind, commemorate these days by sleeping on the floor, without any blanket. They bare the same cold harsh winter just like the way our Sahibzaade and Mata Gujri witnessed it. Martyrs are source of inspiration and symbol of heroism, courage and extreme devotion in every religious tradition. They play influential role in deciding the fate of their communities. Their death for religious cause encourages the future generation to fight for religious cause. Martyrdom is a central concept in Sikhism. In Sikhism, martyrdom is the culmination of one's devotion and fulfillment of socio-religious obligations.

A true Sikh accepts death for the sake of religion and country as a divine blessing and divine command of the Supreme Being. He is always ready to die for upholding the eternal message of Sikh Gurus. In Sikh history, there are countless martyrs, who sacrificed their life in their struggle against foreign invaders and barbaric rulers. The Sikh martyrs had opposed the political absolutism, religious fundamentalism and violation of human rights. Sikh Gurus laid down the supreme sacrifices for the sake of victims of political tyranny and religious bigotry and they suffered unendurable persecution.

They fought for religion and liberation of vulnerable, demoralized people, suffer death in their holy struggle against political oppressors, and choose death at the time when they were asked to choose between life and death.

The story of the Sahibzadas' needs to be disseminated far and wide within India and across the world as a true example of standing up for what is just and righteous. Effort needs to be directed towards this end by the Sikh community and its institutions as also by the Indian government and other cultural bodies of the nation. There is a need of institute studies, create literature and make all efforts to disseminate the historical facts in a manner that they motivate all humanity.

Even thinking of about the courage of such young Sahibzada of guru who sacrificed their life but did not bow in front of wrong brings goose bumps and tear in the eyes of us all. In addition to mourn the martyrdom of sahibzade we should all learn from their sense of belief in God and love for country and religion that we all should also teach to our younger generation.

Sirhind Martyrdom of Mata Gujri and Younger Sahibzade

During the night flight from besieged Anandpur, 81-year-old mother of Tenth Guru Gobind Singh, Mata Gujri and her grandsons the two younger sahibzade, Zarowar Singh (Jujhar) age 9, and Fateh Singh age 6, struggled across the stormy

floodwaters of River Sarsa together. The dark raging turbulence swept away people and possessions alike and many Sikhs did not survive the crossing. Mata Gujri and the young sahibzade became separated from the rest of their family. Wet, chilled, and exhausted, they accepted help from Brahmin Gangu, a former cook servant who had been discharged from Guru Gobind Singh's household. Gangu led them to his village Saheri, not far from Morinda (present-day

district Ropar) and gave them shelter in his home. While she and her grandsons slept, Gangu pilfered her belongings looking for valuables. He found and took a bag of coins Mata Gujri had carried with her. He buried them and then when she discovered the theft, to cover his actions he fabricated a story about thieves heard prowling about. Not believing the story, she confronted him asking him to return her money. Gangu became angry, protested his innocence and accused her

of being ungrateful and then turned her out into the streets with her grandsons.

Capture

Hopeful for a reward, Gangu ran immediately to the local chaudhri official and told him that Guru Gobind Singh's mother and her grandsons had just arrived at his home, seeking shelter. He convinced the official that they would be rewarded by the Mughal authorities in Miranpur for the capture of the Guru's

mother, and together they informed officers Jani Khan and Mani Khan of Mata Gujri's and the Guru's sons whereabouts. On December 8, 1705 A.D., the officers captured and arrested Mata Gujri and the younger sahibzade and carried them to Sirhind. Still hoping for reward, Gangu accompanied them.

Imprisonment

On December 9, 1705 A.D., Nawab Wazir Khan, the head official of Sirhind, imprisoned Mata Gurjri and the younger sahibzade. Despite the chilly winter weather, he locked the old women and her young grandsons in an open summer tower or Thanda Burj, meaning "cold tower," built to escape the searing heat of the summer months. Exposed to the elements with only the clothes they wore, the grandmother and her little grandsons had little protection from sun, wind, or nighttime temperatures. Their cruel captors gave no food or drink to warm or sustain them. Curious local folk gathered to gawk at them. Sachanand Khatri, whose offer of his daughter as wife to one of Guru Gobind Singh's elder sons had been repeatedly spurned, turned his anger towards the younger sahibzade vengefully declaring them to be the offspring of a poisonous serpent who would grow to be as dangerous as their father if allowed to live.

Separation

Wazir Khan ordered the sahibzade brought before him but wished Mata Gujri to be kept confined in the tower, hoping that separation would increase their vulnerability to his ploys. The Ranghar, or governor, of Murinda went to fetch them, cunningly assuring Mata Gujri that he would return the children safely. She hid her grandsons behind her not wanting to let them go. The elder took the younger one's hand and bravely declared they should meet their enemy, Wazir Khan. Once he had separated the Sahibzade from their grandmother, the Ranghar, hoping to shake their resolve, told them their father and elder brothers had been killed. The sahibzade accused the Ranghar of lying, insisting their father the Guru to be invincible.

Test of Faith

When the younger sahibzade stood before Wazir Khan, he told them their troubles would be over if they accepted Islam. He promised them riches and rank if they would denounce their father's faith. He made it clear, however, that they had no other choice, and should otherwise surely face death. The two innocent children faced their adversary courageously, vowing to remain steadfast in their faith. Advising them to consider carefully, the Wazir ordered them returned to the open air tower, informing them their death sentence would be carried out in two days time if they did not repent.

Martyrdom

As the date of execution neared, Mata Gurji comforted her grandsons, rallying their spirits with stories of their father's heroic deeds. She reminded them of how their Grandfather Ninth Guru Teg Bahadar fearlessly faced his own martyrdom, and of their illustrious ancestor Fifth Guru Arjun Dev's unfailing spirit when martyred.

On December 11, 1705 A.D., Wazir Khan offered the sahibzade a second opportunity to renounce their faith and embrace Islam. When they refused, he

ordered that they be bricked up alive. Nawab Sher Muhammed of Malerkotl registered a formal protest, insisting that the Quran did not condone the murder of innocents. Ignoring his advice, the Wazir implemented his order. The sahibzade remained faithful as brick cemented upon brick rose about them, forming a wall which rose chest high to suffocate them. As their air supply diminished, the wall gave way and collapsed.

On December 12, 1705 A.D., the Wazir gave the sahibzade one final opportunity to convert to Islam. The stalwart sons of Guru Gobind Singh withstood temptation, declared their undying devotion to the Khalsa Panth and denounced the Wazir's forcible attempts to sway them. Determined to see them die, the Wazir, ordered the heads of the innocent 7- and 9-year-old sahibzade to be severed from their bodies. When Mata Gujri learned of her grandsons' fate, she collapsed. Guru Gobind Singh's mother could not be revived. Four days and nights of exposure to the elements in the open tower and the shock of hearing that her beloved grandsons had been cruelly beheaded proved fatal.

On December 13, 1705 A.D., merchant Seth Todar Mal of Sirhind obtained permission to perform last rites when he offered to cover the ground where the bodies lay outside the fort wall with gold coins. The merchant respectfully cremated the bodies of Guru Gobind Singh's mother and young sons.

Historic Commemorative Shrines

The place where the bodies of Mata Gujri and the sahibzade lay overnight is known as Bimangarh. Three shrines near Sirhind are dedicated to their memory: Gurdwara Burj Mata Gujri, Gurdwara Shahid Ganj and Gurdwara Fatehgarh.

'Veer Baal Diwas': A tribute to younger sons of Guru Gobind Singh

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on January 09, 2022, declared that December 26 shall henceforth be marked as "Veer Baal Diwas" to pay homage to the courage of the "Sahibzades", four sons of Guru Gobind Singh, the last Sikh guru. While all four were martyred, the date has been chosen as it was the day observed as the martyrdom day of the Sahibzadas Zorawar Singh and Fateh Singh, who were killed at the tender age of six and nine in Sirhind by Mughal forces.

Announcing his decision in a series of tweets, Prime Minister Modi said: "Today on the auspicious occasion of the Parkash Purab of Sri Guru Gobind Singhji, I am honoured to share that starting this year, December 26 shall be marked as 'Veer Baal Diwas.' This is a fitting tribute to the courage of the Sahibzades and their quest for justice."

On December 26, 2022, Prime Minister Narendra Modi participated in a historic programme marking 'Veer Bal Diwas' at Major Dhyan Chand National Stadium in Delhi. During the programme, the Prime Minister attended a 'Shabad Kirtan' performed by about three hundred Baal Kirtanis. The Prime Minister also flagged off a march-past by about three thousand children in Delhi on this momentous occasion.

On 9th January 2022, the day of the Prakash Purab of Sri Guru Gobind Singh Ji, the Prime Minister had announced that 26th December would be observed as 'Veer Bal Diwas', to mark the martyrdom of sons of Sri Guru Gobind Singh - Sahibzadas Baba Zorawar Singh Ji and Baba Fateh Singh Ji.

Addressing the gathering, the Prime Minister remarked that India is celebrating the first Veer Bal Diwas, today. It is a day of a new beginning for the nation when we all come together to bow our heads for the sacrifices laid down in the past. "Shaheedi Saptah and Veer Bal Diwas is not just a cauldron of emotions but a source of infinite inspiration", the Prime Minister said.

The Prime Minister said that Veer Bal Diwas will remind us Age does not matter when it comes to extreme valour and sacrifice. Veer Bal Diwas will remind us of the immense contribution of ten Sikh gurus and the sacrifice of the Sikh tradition for protecting the honour of the nation. "Veer Bal Diwas will tell us what is India and what is its identity and every year, Veer Bal Diwas will inspire us to recognize our past and make our future. This will also remind everyone about the strength of our young generation", the Prime Minister Added. The Prime Minister paid grateful tributes to the Veer Sahibzades, Gurus and Mata Gurjari. "I consider it to be the good fortune of our government that we got the opportunity to declare 26th December as Veer Bal Diwas", he said.

The Prime Minister pointed out that the thousand-year-old history of the world is filled with chapters of gruesome cruelty. He mentioned that wherever we come across the violent faces of cruelty, it is the character of our heroes that overshines them throughout the pages of

history. The Prime Minister recalled that whatever happened in the wars of Chamkaur and Sirhind can never be forgotten. He further added that these incidents occurred only three centuries ago on the soil of this land. "On one hand there was the mighty Mughal Sultanate blinded by religious fanaticism, while on the other hand there were our Gurus gleaming in the knowledge and living by the ancient principles of India", the Prime Minister continued, "On one hand there were heights of terror and religious fanaticism, while on the other hand, there was the pinnacle of spirituality and kindness to see God in every human being. The Prime Minister further informed that in the midst of all this, the Mughals possessed an army of millions, while the Veer Sahibzades of Guru had their courage. They did not bow down to the Mughals even though they were alone. This is when the Mughals walled them in alive. It is their bravery that has been a source of inspiration for centuries.

The Prime Minister said that any country with such a glorious history must be full of self-confidence and self-respect however, he lamented, concocted

narratives were taught, and created a sense of inferiority in the country. Despite this local traditions and society kept these tales of glory alive. The Prime Minister emphasised the need to get free from the narrow interpretation of the past in order to move forward. That is why, said the Prime Minister, the country has taken the pledge of removing all traces of slave mentality in the Azadi ka Amrit Kaal. "Veer Bal Diwas is like a life force for the Panch Prans", the Prime Minister added.

The Prime Minister also highlighted the importance of determination and bravery of Veer Sahibzade as they showed the tyranny of Aurangzeb and his people that the young generation was not ready to buckle under the cruelty and stood firm to protect the morale of the country. This establishes the role of the young generation in the destiny of a nation. The Prime Minister said today's young generation is also taking India forward with the same determination. This makes the role of Veer Bal Diwas on every 26th December all the more important, he said.

Paying tribute to Sikh Guru Parampara the Prime Minister said that it is not just

a tradition of spirituality and sacrifice but also a source of inspiration for the concept of Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat. The biggest example is the cosmopolitan and inclusive character of Sri Guru Granth Sahib where preachings and commentary of saints from all over India are included. The life journey of Guru Gobind Singh Ji also exemplifies this trait, the Prime Minister said. Referring to the fact that 'Panch Pyare' came from all parts of the country, the Prime Minister exuded pride that one of the original Panch Pyara was from Dwarka, land from where the Prime Minister also hails.

The Prime Minister said, "Resolution of 'Rastra Pratham'- country first, was the unshakable resolve of Guru Gobind Singh Ji". Shri Modi corroborated the point by recounting the immense personal sacrifice of his family. "This tradition of 'Nation First' is a huge inspiration for us", the Prime Minister stressed.

Modi commented that the future of India's coming generations will depend upon their source of inspiration. Recounting innumerable examples of inspiring children like Bharat, Bhakt Prahlad, Nachiketa and Dhruv, Bal Ram, Luv-Kush and Bal Krishna, the Prime Minister said that from ancient times to the modern period brave boys and girls have been a reflection of India's valor.

The Prime Minister said with assurance that the new India is correcting the mistakes of the bygone decades by restoring its long-lost legacy. Adding that any country is identified by its principles, the Prime Minister highlighted that when the core values of a nation go through a transformation, the future of the nation changes with time. He emphasised that the values of a nation can be preserved only when the present generations have clarity about the history of the land. "The youth always seek a role model to learn and find inspiration. That's the reason we believe in the ideals of Lord Ram, find inspiration from Gautam Buddha and Lord Mahavir, and make an attempt to live through the sayings of Guru Nanak Dev Ji, while also studying the ways of Maharana Pratap and Chhatrapati Veer Shivaji", the Prime Minister remarked. Highlighting the culture and traditions of India that believes in religion and spirituality, the Prime Minister said that the ancestors of our land gave shape to an Indian culture that associates with festivals and beliefs. The Prime Minister said that we need to make that consciousness eternal, and that is why the country is trying to revive the glory of the history of the freedom struggle during the Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav. Work is going on to take the contribution of brave men and women and the tribal community to every person. He expressed happiness about the huge participation from every part of the country in the competitions and events organised for Veer Bal Diwas. He reiterated the need to take the message of the life of Veer Sahibzadas to the world with full determination.

22nd December. #Fighter #FighterOn25thJan."



Cameron Diaz ‘angry’ over rumors that Jamie Foxx was ‘crazy’ on Netflix film set

Cameron Diaz appeared on a recent episode of the “Lipstick on the Rim” podcast and pushed back against rumors that Jamie Foxx was “crazy” on the set of their Netflix movie “Back in Action” (via People). Foxx was in the midst of production when he was hospitalized for a medical emergency. “I really hate all of the things that were being said about our set at the time,” Diaz continued. “You just want to scream at the top of your lungs, like, ‘What are you talking about?’ ... Jamie is, like, the cheerleader for the entire crew. Everybody loves him. We have so much fun on the set with him and he’s just a professional on every level.”

Diaz said she “had a blast” working with Foxx on “Back in Action,” which is notable for being her first leading role in nearly a decade.

“Jamie is the best. I love that guy so much. He’s such a special person and he’s so talented, so much fun,” Diaz said. “The hiccups that happened throughout production are the natural kinds of things that happen. But nothing got delayed other than, obviously, toward the end. And that’s something that is not my place to speak about.”

Diaz declined to discuss Foxx’s medical incident, but she said that the Oscar-winning actor is “thriving” now.

“When I see and hear people trying to take another person down like that ... [Jamie is] so classy. He’s like, ‘Nope. Just let them [talk],’” Diaz added. “Still, it just really made me angry.”

“Back in Action” reunites Diaz and Foxx, who worked together on 1999’s sports drama “Any Given Sunday” and 2014’s “Annie” remake, which was Diaz’s final film role until now. Seth Gordon (“Horrible Bosses”) is directing the movie from a script he wrote with Brendan O’Brien (“Neighbors”). The film is expected to be released in 2024.

George Clooney says ‘Friends’ didn’t bring joy to Matthew Perry



Actor George Clooney says Mathew Perry wasn't happy while being on 'Friends'.

In an interview, George shared what Mathew was like off camera as he reflected on their friendship.

"I knew Matt when he was 16 years old. We used to play paddle tennis together... And he was a great, funny, funny, funny kid," George revealed to Deadline.

George, who made an appearance as Dr. Michael Mitchell on the hit sitcom, shared that Mathew would tell him how much he wanted to be on a sitcom when hanging out with fellow actors Richard Kind and Grant Heslov.

"I just want to get on a sitcom, man. I just want to get on a regular sitcom and I would be the happiest man on earth," Mathew said, according to George.

Despite that, the 'Ocean's Eleven' star noted that Mathew didn't feel content even when he landed the role of the funny pal on 'Friends', which also starred Jennifer Aniston, Lisa Kudrow, Courteney Cox, David Schwimmer and Matt LeBlanc.

"He got on probably one of the best ever," George said of the show, reports aceshowbiz.com.

"He wasn't happy. It didn't bring him joy or happiness or peace."

The 'ER' alum continued: "And watching that go on on the lot—we were at Warner Brothers, we were there right next to each other—it was hard to watch because we didn't know what was going through

him. We just knew that he wasn't happy."

When it comes to Mathew's addiction struggles, George said: "I had no idea he was doing what, 12 Vicodin a day and all the stuff he talked about, all that heartbreaking stuff."

He added: "It also just tells you that success and money and all those things, it doesn't just automatically bring you happiness. You have to be happy with yourself and your life."

Prior to his death in October due to the acute effects of ketamine, Mathew once said that he didn't want to be remembered just as a 'Friends' star.

The Los Angeles County medical examiner's office said in an autopsy report last week that Perry, who publicly struggled with drinking and drug use for decades, died from the "acute effects" of ketamine, an anesthetic with psychedelic properties.

Perry was found unresponsive in a hot tub at his home in Los Angeles on Oct. 28. He was 54.

The medical examiner's office said that drowning, coronary artery disease and the effects of an opioid, buprenorphine, had contributed to his death.

But the autopsy ascribed his death primarily to "the acute effects of ketamine." Ketamine is a powerful anesthetic that has become increasingly popular as an alternative therapy for depression, anxiety, post-traumatic stress disorder and other hard-to-treat mental health problems. It is also used recreationally.



Christmas: Celebrating the birth of Jesus



As we near the end of 2023, we approach the holiday season. It means welcoming the most joyous festival of the year - Christmas. It is marked annually on December 25, and the celebrations begin on December 24, known as Christmas eve. The day commemorates the birth of Jesus Christ and is celebrated as a religious and commercial holiday. It is one of the most sacred days in Christianity and is spent singing carols, eating delicious food, exchanging gifts, visiting friends, spending time with family, and so much more. People also decorate their homes by hanging mistletoes and wreaths on their doors and placing a Christmas tree inside their homes adorned with ornaments and lights. Though the festival holds significance in the Christian community, it is marked with enthusiasm by non-Christians.

Christmas marks the birth of Jesus Christ, who was born in Bethlehem to his parents, Joseph and Mary. It is believed that Christ was conceived through the Holy Spirit and was born when Mother Mary was still engaged to Joseph. However, there is no proof that he was born on December 25, as the Gregorian calendar did not exist back then. The Bible also doesn't mention the exact date.

Various countries around the world have different names for festivals. It is referred to as Yuletide in Germany, Navidad in Spanish, Natale in Italian, and Noël in French.

The festival of Christmas is more than a religious day. It also commemorates the nativity of Jesus and attempts to attain purity and devotion. People believe that on this day, God sent his son on earth to redeem people from their sins and show them the right path.

There are several rituals associated with Christmas. Apart from bringing home a Christmas tree and decorating it with ornaments, people sing carols, hang mistletoes to symbolise love, donate to the needy, attend midnight mass at the Church on Christmas eve, exchange gifts, bake cookies and spend the day with loved ones.

Another popular ritual involves children leaving warm milk and cookies for Santa at night in the hope of receiving gifts from him. For a long time, Christmas has been associated with the mythical figure of Santa Claus. He is based on the traditions associated with Saint Nicholas, a 4th Century Saint. It is believed that Santa Claus lives in the North Pole with his many helper elves. Each year, on Christmas Eve, Santa Claus rides on his sleigh from the North Pole to give gifts to children.

History

The first time the birth of Jesus Christ was attributed to the date December 25 was in the 4th century, according to early Roman history. Early celebrations of Christmas are thought to have derived from Roman and other European festivals that marked the end of the harvest, and the winter solstice.

Some customs from those celebrations



that have endured include decorating homes with greenery, giving gifts, singing songs, and eating special foods.

The holiday developed further with the legend of St. Nicholas. Although much of his history is unconfirmed, the man who became St. Nicholas lived in the 4th century and is believed to have been a

bishop in Asia Minor.

Many miracles attributed to him are dubious at best. Nevertheless, some countries named him their patron saint. He also is considered the patron saint of, among others, children (for protecting them), sailors (whom he reputedly saved at sea), and the poor (to whom he

generously gave gifts).

In his honor, the Feast of St. Nicholas was marked on December 6 and gifts given the night before. The tradition was well established in many European countries by the 12th century. Eventually, because St. Nicholas' Day and Christmas Day are so close together, their traditions generally were combined.

St. Nicholas took on different personas in different countries. For example, The Netherlands have Sinter Klaas; Father Christmas gives gifts in Great Britain; Père Noël does the same in France; and in Germany St. Nicholas has had many names including Klaasbuur, Burklaas, Rauklas, Bullerklaas, and Sunnercla, although Father Christmas is becoming more popular. In the United States, the Dutch settlers' Sinter Klaas evolved into Santa Claus.

How Did Christmas Start?

The middle of winter has long been a time of celebration around the world. Centuries before the arrival of the man called Jesus, early Europeans celebrated light and birth in the darkest days of winter. Many peoples rejoiced during the winter solstice, when the worst of the winter was behind them and they could look forward to longer days and extended hours of sunlight.

In Scandinavia, the Norse celebrated Yule from December 21, the winter solstice, through January. In recognition of the return of the sun, fathers and sons would bring home large logs, which they would set on fire. The people would feast until the log burned out, which could take as many as 12 days. The Norse believed that each spark from the fire represented a new pig or calf that would be born during the coming year.

The end of December was a perfect time for celebration in most areas of Europe. At that time of year, most cattle were slaughtered so they would not have to be fed during the winter. For many, it was the only time of year when they had a supply of fresh meat. In addition, most wine and beer made during the year was finally fermented and ready for drinking.

In Germany, people honored the pagan god Oden during the mid-winter holiday. Germans were terrified of Oden, as they believed he made nocturnal flights through the sky to observe his people, and then decide who would prosper or perish. Because of his presence, many people chose to stay inside.

Saturnalia and Christmas

In Rome, where winters were not as harsh as those in the far north, Saturnalia—a holiday in honor of Saturn, the god of agriculture—was celebrated. Beginning in the week leading up to the winter solstice and continuing for a full month, Saturnalia was a hedonistic time, when food and drink were plentiful and the normal Roman social order was turned upside down. For a month, enslaved people were given temporary freedom and treated as equals. Business and schools were closed so that everyone could participate in the

holiday's festivities.

Also around the time of the winter solstice, Romans observed Juvenalia, a feast honoring the children of Rome. In addition, members of the upper classes often celebrated the birthday of Mithra, the god of the unconquerable sun, on December 25. It was believed that Mithra, an infant god, was born of a rock. For some Romans, Mithra's birthday was the most sacred day of the year.

Is Christmas the Day Jesus Was Born?

In the early years of Christianity, Easter was the main holiday; the birth of Jesus was not celebrated. In the fourth century, church officials decided to institute the birth of Jesus as a holiday. Unfortunately, the Bible does not mention date for his birth (a fact Puritans later pointed out in order to deny the legitimacy of the celebration). Although some evidence suggests that his birth may have occurred in the spring (why would shepherds be herding in the middle of winter?), Pope Julius I chose December 25. It is commonly believed that the church chose this date in an effort to adopt and absorb the traditions of the pagan Saturnalia festival. First called the Feast of the Nativity, the custom spread to Egypt by 432 and to England by the end of the sixth century.

By holding Christmas at the same time as traditional winter solstice festivals, church leaders increased the chances that Christmas would be popularly embraced, but gave up the ability to dictate how it was celebrated. By the Middle Ages, Christianity had, for the most part, replaced pagan religion.

On Christmas, believers attended church, then celebrated raucously in a drunken, carnival-like atmosphere similar to today's Mardi Gras. Each year, a beggar or student would be crowned the "lord of misrule" and eager celebrants played the part of his subjects. The poor would go to the houses of the rich and demand their best food and drink. If owners failed to comply, their visitors would most likely terrorize them with mischief. Christmas became the time of year when the upper classes could repay their real or imagined "debt" to society by entertaining less fortunate citizens.

When Christmas Was Cancelled

In the early 17th century, a wave of religious reform changed the way Christmas was celebrated in Europe. When Oliver Cromwell and his Puritan forces took over England in 1645, they vowed to rid England of decadence and, as part of their effort, cancelled Christmas. By popular demand, Charles II was restored to the throne and, with him, came the return of the popular holiday.

The pilgrims, English separatists that came to America in 1620, were even more orthodox in their Puritan beliefs than



Cromwell. As a result, Christmas was not a holiday in early America. From 1659 to 1681, the celebration of Christmas was actually outlawed in Boston. Anyone exhibiting the Christmas spirit was fined five shillings. By contrast, in the Jamestown settlement, Captain John Smith reported that Christmas was enjoyed by all and passed without incident.

After the American Revolution, English customs fell out of favor, including Christmas. In fact, Christmas wasn't declared a federal holiday until June 26, 1870.

Who Invented Santa Claus?

The legend of Santa Claus can be traced back to a monk named St. Nicholas who was born in Turkey around A.D. 280. St. Nicholas gave away all of his inherited wealth and traveled the countryside helping the poor and sick, becoming known as the protector of children and sailors.

St. Nicholas first entered American popular culture in the late 18th century in New York, when Dutch families gathered to honor the anniversary of the death of "Sint Nikolaas" (Dutch for Saint Nicholas), or "Sinter Klaas" for short. "Santa Claus" draws his name from this abbreviation.

In 1822, Episcopal minister Clement Clarke Moore wrote a Christmas poem called "An Account of a Visit from St. Nicholas," more popularly known today by its first line: "Twas The Night Before Christmas." The poem depicted Santa Claus as a jolly man who flies from home to home on a sled driven by reindeer to deliver toys.

The iconic version of Santa Claus as a jolly man in red with a white beard and a sack of toys was immortalized in 1881, when political cartoonist Thomas Nast drew on Moore's poem to create the image of Old Saint Nick we know today.

Christmas carol

A Christmas carol is a carol (a song or hymn) on the theme of Christmas, traditionally sung at Christmas itself or during the surrounding Christmas



holiday season. The term noel has sometimes been used, especially for carols of French origin. Christmas carols may be regarded as a subset of the broader category of Christmas music.

Carols were first sung in Europe thousands of years ago, but these were not Christmas carols as we know them.

These were pagan songs sung at winter solstice celebrations, as people danced around stone circles. The word carol comes from the old French word 'carole', which meant a popular circle dance accompanied by singing.

The ancient Roman pagan festival of Saturnalia, which honoured the agricultural god Saturn, took place near the winter solstice. Due to when this holiday occurred, Saturnalia celebrations are said to be the source of many of the traditions we now associate with Christmas, such as wreaths, candles, feasting and gift-giving.

It was only later that carols began to be sung in church and to be specifically associated with Christmas.

In the 9th and 10th centuries, Northern European monasteries developed the Christmas hymn into a sequence of rhymed stanzas. The Parisian monk Adam of Saint Victor began to derive

music from popular songs in the 12th century, which introduced something closer to the traditional Christmas carol.

Early Christianity turned the pagan solstice tradition into a celebration for Christmas and gave people Christian songs to sing. In 129, a Roman Bishop said that a song called Angel's Hymn should be sung at a Christmas service in Rome.

Christmas celebrations

Nowadays, the most common is the exchange of gifts and cards with beloved ones, Christmas dinner, Christmas carols and other celebrations alongside local traditions, bringing together each place's custom to this time of the year.



15 KILLED AS GUNMAN GOES ON RAMPAGE IN PRAGUE VARSITY, SHOT

PRAGUE (TIP) : A gunman killed at least 15 people and wounded 24 others at a Prague university on December 21 before he was "eliminated", marking the country's worst-ever mass shooting. The Czech police responded to the shooting at Charles University's faculty of arts building in Jan Palach Square shortly after 3 pm (1400 GMT). The police said the father of the shooter - a student at the faculty - was found dead earlier on Thursday.

Gun crime is relatively rare in the Czech Republic. In December 2019, a 42-year-old gunman killed six persons at a hospital waiting room in the eastern Czech city of Ostrava before fleeing and fatally shooting himself, the police said.

In 2015, a man fatally shot eight persons and then killed himself at a restaurant in Uhersky Brod.

"We always thought that this was a thing that did not concern us. Now it turns out that, unfortunately, our world is also changing and the problem of the individual shooter is emerging here as well," Prague Mayor Bohuslav Svoboda said.

Petr Nedoma, director of the Rudolfinum Gallery at a concert hall across Palach Square, told Czech TV he saw the shooter. "I saw a young person on the gallery who had some weapon in his hand, like an automatic weapon, and shooting toward the Manes Bridge. Repeatedly, with some interruptions, then I saw as he shot, put hands up and threw the weapon down on the street, it lay there on the pedestrian crossing," he

Israeli strikes on Gaza intensify even as truce talks grow 'serious'

ISRAELI AIR STRIKE AT THE GATES OF THE RAFAH CROSSING TO EGYPT ON THURSDAY MORNING HAD KILLED FOUR PEOPLE INCLUDING BASSAM GHABEN, DIRECTOR OF THE GAZA SIDE OF THE ISRAELI-CONTROLLED KEREM SHALOM BORDER CROSSING

GAZA (TIP): Fighting in the Gaza Strip escalated on December 21 with what residents described as some of the most intense Israeli bombardment of the war, even as the enemies held what Washington called "very serious discussions" on a new truce.

Bombing was at its most intense over the northern part of the Gaza Strip where orange flashes of explosions and black smoke could be seen as morning broke from across the fence in Israel. Planes roared overhead and the booms of air strikes thundered every few seconds, punctuated by rattling gunfire.

In the south, where hundreds of thousands of people are sheltering from war that has laid much of Gaza to waste, Hamas said an Israeli strike killed the commander of the main checkpoint opened just days ago to let in aid.

Residents in Jabalia in the north of the Strip close to the Israeli border said the area was now completely cut off with Israeli snipers now firing on anyone trying to escape.

"It was one of the worst nights in terms of the occupation bombings. Also we could hear heavy fighting despite that," said one Jabalia resident who asked not to be identified for fear of reprisal.

With Gaza's communications links shut down for a second day, the resident spoke to Reuters by phone using an electronic SIM card to access the Israeli mobile



network across the fence.

Gazans say such cuts to communication links have typically heralded Israeli assaults.

Ismail Haniyeh, leader of Hamas, the Iran-backed militant group that controls Gaza, was in Egypt for a second day on Thursday for negotiations, a rare personal intervention which in the past has signalled important stages in diplomacy. Islamic Jihad, another militant group, said its leader was also headed there. The talks appear to be the

most serious since a week-long ceasefire collapsed at the start of the month, but the public positions of the opposing sides are far apart. Israel says it will negotiate only on a temporary pause in fighting to free hostages; Hamas says it is interested only in negotiations that will lead to a permanent end to fighting.

"These are very serious discussions and negotiations, and we hope that they lead somewhere," White House spokesperson John Kirby told reporters aboard Air Force One on Wednesday. (Reuters)

Lava flows from Iceland volcano slow as heavy snow sets in



REYKJAVIK (TIP): Lava flows from a volcano in Iceland were slowing on December 20 as heavy snows cloaked the area, reducing visibility of an eruption that for now looks set to spare a nearby town that was evacuated following weeks of earthquakes.

The eruption late on Monday on the Reykjanes peninsula in southwest Iceland spewed lava and smoke more than 100 metres (330 feet) into the air in a dramatic finale to weeks of waiting after the alarm was first raised over the seismic activity.

The government has said flights were unlikely to be impacted, easing worries of a repeat of the international travel chaos caused by the ash from another Icelandic volcanic eruption in 2010 just as the busy holiday travel season kicks in.

"It is difficult to see exactly what is going on, but when you get some glimpses through the snow it is obvious that it is just less and less lava flow," said Halldor Geirsson, associate professor at

southwest of capital city Reykjavik, allowing them back intermittently to check on homes put at risk by the tremors.

Meanwhile, gases associated with the eruption briefly spiked on the peninsula on the southwestern tip of Iceland, which also accommodates the island's main international airport, which remained open though some flights suffered delays due to the heavy snowfall, an airport spokesman said.

The level of sulphur dioxide in the air near the town of Keflavik, where the airport is located, rose from 0.2 micrograms per cubic meter at 0650 GMT to above 1,300 an hour later, according to Iceland's environmental agency.

The levels soon returned to normal. Sulphur dioxide can be harmful to health at high concentrations and officials had cautioned that gas pollution could occur in the area of nearby Reykjavik late on Tuesday or Wednesday morning.

The government has said the eruption does not present a threat to life. (Reuters)

the Institute of Earth Sciences at the University of Iceland.

The eruption in the Svartsengi volcanic system might end over the weekend or next week, he added, or lava flows could continue at a slow rate for weeks or months similar to what happened at the nearby Fagradalsfjall system in 2021.

"I would think the most likely scenario is that it just stops," he said. "But if that happens, the pressure will start building again in the magma chamber, which is likely to trigger another eruption after a few weeks."

Authorities last month evacuated the nearly 4,000 inhabitants of the fishing town of Grindavik about 40 km (25 miles)

North Korea, Russia clash with US, South Korea and allies over Pyongyang's latest missile launch

UNITED NATIONS (TIP): North Korea and Russia clashed with the United States, South Korea and their allies at an emergency UN Security Council meeting on December 19 on Pyongyang's latest intercontinental ballistic missile launch, which it called "a warning counter-measure" to threats from the US and other hostile forces.

North Korean Ambassador Kim Song said this is "the most dangerous year" in the military-security landscape on the Korean Peninsula, pointing to stepped up US-South Korean military exercises and the US deployment of nuclear-powered submarines and other nuclear assets to the area that have raised a "nuclear war danger".

The US and nine allies pointed to five North Korean ICBM launches, over 25 ballistic missiles launches and three satellite launches using ballistic missile technology this year, violating multiple Security Council resolutions and threatening "the peace and stability of its neighbours and the international community".

In a statement read just before the council meeting by US deputy ambassador Robert Wood, surrounded by diplomats from the other countries, the 10 countries condemned the latest ICBM launch on December 17 and all launches before it.

North Korea's Song urged the international community to think about North Korea's security concerns, calling its counter-measures an "absolutely reasonable, normal and reflective response" in exercise of its legitimate right to self-defence.

He warned the US and South Korea



that if they continue "with their reckless and irresponsible military threat", North Korea's armed forces "will never remain an onlooker to it and the provokers will be held entirely responsible for all the consequences".

North Korea will also "continue to build up its strategic power of a more advanced type to contain and control any threat from the US and its followers with immediate, overwhelming and decisive counter-measures", Song warned.

The Security Council imposed sanctions after North Korea's first nuclear test explosion in 2006 and tightened them over the years in a total of 10 resolutions seeking — so far unsuccessfully — to cut funds and curb its nuclear and ballistic missile programmes.

The last sanctions resolution was adopted by the council in December 2017. China and Russia vetoed a US-sponsored resolution in May 2022 that would have imposed new sanctions over a spate of intercontinental ballistic missile launches. And the two veto-wielding council members have blocked any council action, including media statements, since then.

The 10 countries — Albania, Ecuador, France, Japan, Malta, South Korea, Slovenia, Switzerland, the United Kingdom and the United States — said silence from the Security Council "sends the wrong message to Pyongyang and all proliferators."

They urged North Korea to abandon its unlawful nuclear and ballistic missile programs, "and instead invest in feeding the people in North Korea" and engage in diplomacy. They also urged all Security Council members to overcome their prolonged silence and uphold the nuclear nonproliferation regime.

Russia's deputy UN ambassador Anna Evstigneeva called attempts to condemn Pyongyang "a one-sided approach".

She warned that the situation is escalating "to a dangerous brink", pointing to both Pyongyang and Seoul justifying their hostile moves as self-defense. And she accused the United States of deploying its massive military machine in the region, saying this looks "more and more like preparations for an offensive operation", even though the US says it has no hostile intentions.

Evstigneeva said Russia again calls for a peaceful settlement of all issues on the Korean Peninsula through political and diplomatic means "without external pressure".

Wood, the US deputy ambassador, countered that US military exercises are defensive and it's North Korea that has violated UN sanctions — not South Korea, Japan or the US.


And he said the United States has tried repeatedly to have an unconditional dialogue with Pyongyang but it has refused. (AP)

Group turned away at Mexican holiday party returned with gunmen killing 11, say investigators

MEXICO CITY (TIP): Survivors of a Sunday massacre in central Mexico told investigators that a group of people turned away from a holiday party returned later with gunmen who killed 11 and wounded 14, authorities said on December 19.

Navigio Agustín Gallardo Romero, a Guanajuato state prosecutor, said nine men and two women were killed. The state prosecutor's office had revised the death toll down to 11 Monday night from 12, explaining that there was confusion with a victim from a separate case at the hospital.

Authorities recovered shells from seven different guns at the scene, Gallardo said in a recorded video message. He said investigators are focusing on a group that operates in the area without providing more detail.



Families carried the caskets of some of the victims through the streets of Salvatierra on Tuesday.

Guanajuato has been the scene of bloody turf battles between the Jalisco cartel and local gangs backed by the

Sinaloa cartel. The state has long had the highest number of homicides in Mexico.

On Monday, Mexico's President Andres Manuel López Obrador called for Guanajuato's state prosecutor to step down. (AP)

BEIJING WARNS MANILA AGAINST S CHINA SEA 'MISCALCULATION'

BEIJING/MANILA (TIP): Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi warned the Philippines that any miscalculation in their escalating dispute in the South China Sea would bring a resolute response, and urged dialogue to address "serious difficulties" between the two neighbours.

Beijing and Manila have traded sharp accusations in recent months over a succession of run-ins in the South China Sea, including charges that China rammed a ship earlier this month carrying the Philippine armed forces chief of staff.

China in turn has accused the Philippines of trespassing on its territory. The souring of relations coincides with Manila's moves to boost military ties with Japan and the US, its former colonial power and defence ally of seven decades. — Reuters

DEATH TOLL IN CHINA'S EARTHQUAKE RISES TO 131; VICTIMS PULLED TO SAFETY IN SUBFREEZING WEATHER

HAIDONG, QINGHAI (TIP): Braving below-freezing conditions, rescuers pulled to safety victims of an earthquake that rocked a remote area in China's northwestern Gansu province more than a day ago, while survivors faced months of uncertainty ahead without permanent shelter.

The 6.2-magnitude earthquake jolted Jishishan county near the border straddling Gansu and Qinghai provinces a minute before midnight on December 19, sending frightened residents out of homes into the cold in the dead of the night, damaging roads, power and water lines as well as agricultural production facilities, and triggering land and mudslides.

In Gansu, 113 people had been found dead as of 9 a.m. on Wednesday (0100 GMT), and 782 were injured, authorities said.

The death toll in neighbouring Qinghai province rose to 18 with 198 injured as of 5:30 a.m. on Wednesday.

Seventy-eight people have been found alive in Gansu, where rescue operations ended on December 19 afternoon, Chinese media said, as focus shifted to treating the wounded and resettling residents as a months-long winter loomed. It was not immediately clear whether the search in Qinghai had ended or not. In Gansu, more than 207,000 homes were wrecked and nearly 15,000 houses collapsed, affecting more than 145,000 people. More than 128,000 emergency supply items including tents, quilts, tent lights and folding beds, were delivered while food such as steamed buns and instant noodles were provided to the victims. (Reuters)

INDIA PUSHES FOR INCLUSIVE GOVT, WOMEN'S RIGHTS IN AFGHANISTAN

KABUL (TIP): Describing the situation in Afghanistan as still one of concern, India has said the formation of an inclusive and representative government structure, combating terrorism, and preserving the rights of women, children, and minorities in Afghanistan was an "immediate priority" for it.

Addressing a Security Council meeting on the topic of 'Situation in Afghanistan' on December 20, India's Permanent Representative at the UN Ruchira Kamboj said as a neighbour to Afghanistan, a friend to its people and as a country with direct stakes in ensuring peace and stability in Afghanistan, India was still concerned over the situation in the country.

"Our common and immediate priorities include providing humanitarian assistance to Afghans, formation of an inclusive and representative government structure, combating terrorism and drug trafficking, and preserving the rights of women, children and minorities," Kamboj said. India has not yet recognised the Taliban set-up and has been pitching for the formation of a truly inclusive government in Kabul, besides insisting that Afghan soil must not be used for any terrorist activities against any country.

Since seizing power in August 2021, the Taliban government has not honoured their earlier promises to give women the right to work and study. (PTI)

Imran Khan's participation in elections uncertain as Pakistan court dismisses his plea in Toshakhana case

ISLAMABAD (TIP): A high court in Pakistan on December 21 dismissed Imran Khan's plea seeking suspension of the trial court's verdict in the Toshakhana corruption case, in a fresh setback to the jailed former prime minister whose participation in the February 8 general elections is now uncertain.

On August 5, the 71-year-old former cricketer-turned-politician was convicted by the Islamabad-based trial court in the Toshakhana case which was about the concealment of details of state gifts.

The verdict meant the founding chairman of the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) party was disqualified from contesting elections for five years.

Khan challenged his conviction in the Islamabad High Court (IHC) which on August 28 suspended his three-year sentence and granted him bail. However, his conviction has not been set aside so far, making him ineligible for any public office.

The ex-premier subsequently filed a plea in the IHC seeking suspension of the trial court verdict in the case.

On Thursday, the Islamabad High Court (IHC) dismissed his plea seeking suspension of the trial court's verdict in the Toshakhana case.

In a nine-page detailed verdict, IHC Chief Justice Amir Farooq and Justice Tariq Mahmour Jahangiri ruled that



the instant application is not maintainable and is accordingly dismissed. "In the instant case, no specific plea was raised and subsequent application has been made to cover up the omission. Even no extraordinary or exceptional circumstances were mentioned in the earlier application though they existed in the form of the notification dated 08.08.2023 when the application for suspension of the sentence was filed," the verdict said.

"Bare reading of the application for

suspension filed by the appellant shows that it was for suspension of the sentence only," it said.

It said Khan had invoked a specific provision in his petition but did not "specifically pray in the same for suspension of the conviction".

The dismissal of the plea comes at a crucial juncture as Khan's party announced that he would contest election from three constituencies, which may not be possible until his conviction by the trial court is either suspended or overturned by the high court.

Separately, the IHC issued a notice to the Federal Investigation Agency on Khan's plea against an in-camera trial in the cipher case. The case pertains to a diplomatic document that was allegedly mishandled, constituting a violation of the secret laws of the country.

After issuing notices and hearing arguments by Khan's lawyer, the court adjourned the hearing till Friday.

Apart from Khan, former foreign minister Shah Mehmood Qureshi is also accused in the case. Both leaders are in the Adiala Jail where they were indicted for a second time on December 13.

Khan, who served as prime minister of Pakistan from August 2018 to April 2022, was removed through a vote of no-confidence in April 2022. More than 150 cases have been filed against Khan since his ouster from power. (PTI)

She said, "As Regional Director for WHO South-East Asia for the last decade, it has been my vision to address priority health issues through eight flagship programmes, and promote health and well-being for everyone, everywhere."

The Regional Director said Bhutan's efforts and achievements in the last decade have been exceptional – eliminating polio, maternal and neonatal tetanus, eliminating measles and rubella, taking the lead in WHO South-East Asia Region for addressing mental health and making efforts to eliminate cervical cancer by expanding HPV vaccination and screening.

Poonam Khetrapal Singh became the first Indian to be elected as the Regional Director of WHO South-East Asia. After a five-year term beginning February 2014, she was unanimously re-elected by the 11 Member countries of the Region, home to one quarter of the world's population, for another five-year term from February 2019.

During her decade-long term, the Region eradicated polio and eliminated maternal and neonatal tetanus. Bhutan and four other countries eliminated measles and rubella. The Region's share in global measles deaths dropped from

40% in 2014 to 8% by the end of 2021.

Countries initiated mainstreaming screening, diagnosing and treatment for non-communicable diseases at the primary health care level and rolled out multi-sectoral responses to address key risk factors for non-communicable diseases.

Between 2010 and 2021, the Region recorded 69% decline in maternal mortality, the steepest globally; 45% decline in under five mortality, 39% decline in neonatal mortality and 54% decline in stillbirths. Availability of doctors, nurses and midwives increased by over 30.6% since 2014.

Singh identified elimination of neglected tropical diseases (NTD) as a regional flagship.

Six countries have eliminated at least one NTD. Two countries eliminated malaria. Three eliminated mother-to-child transmission of syphilis and HIV. Four countries achieved hepatitis B control through vaccination. (TNS)







Mughlai Chicken

Ingredients

500 gms Chicken1 cup Hung Curd2-3 Green Chillies (Chopped)Salt as per taste2 tbsp Ghee2 small Tomato (Chopped)1 tbsp Ginger-Garlic paste1 tsp Cumin Powder1/2 tsp Garam Masala2 medium Onion (Roughly Sliced)4-5 Soaked Almonds1 tsp Red Chilli Powder1 and 1/2 tsp Coriander Seeds1 tsp Sugar

Method

- Start by heating ghee/oil in a handi or a large bottomed pan. Then add roughly chopped onion, fry until they turn golden and brown.
- Once done, add in the ginger garlic paste and fry again for a few mins or until the raw smell disappears.
- Now add in the chopped tomatoes, green chillies and

- continue frying until the tomatoes turn soft and mushy. Then add the dry masalas- chilli powder, turmeric powder, cumin powder, salt and half of the crushed coriander seeds mix and stir fry for 2-3 mins.
- Add in the chicken pieces and mix everything well with the masala.
- Continue stirring for 3-4 mins. The chicken will slowly start releasing water. Now cover and cook the chicken for 15-20 minutes on medium heat.
- When the chicken is almost cooked reduce the heat to low.
- Add in the whisked hung curd, nut paste, sugar, kasoori methi and the rest of the coriander seeds and mix everything well.
- Add garam masala powder and give it a good stir. Check the seasoning, add salt and sugar if required. Cook for another 8-10 minutes, stirring frequently.
- Sprinkle some coriander leaves on the top and serve it hot with rice, roti or any bread of your choice.





JN.1 variant has high immune-escaping capability: Lancet

Compared to BA.2.86, the JN.1 variant has high immune-escaping capability that made it dominant in France, a new research published in The Lancet journal has stated.

Titled 'Fast evolution of SARS-CoV BA2.2.86 to JN.1 under heavy immune pressure', the study revealed that JN.1 contained spike mutation L455S that turned BA.2.86 into a heavy immune evasive variant (JN.1). Immune escape is a phenomenon when the immune system is incapable of responding against an infectious agent. The research claims that high ACE2 (acts as a door for Covid to infect cells) binding affinity and distinct antigenicity could enable BA.2.86 to escape immune evasive mutations and high transmission capability. It states that JN.1 has inherited BA.2.86 antigenic capabilities. Antigenicity refers to the capacity of viruses to bind to specific antibody molecules.

JN.1 is a new sub-lineage of BA.2.86, also known as Pirola. The research also underscores the importance of monitoring strains with high antigenicity in the light of evolutionary patterns of BA.2.86 to JN.1 and BA.2.875 to CH.1.1 and XBB.

The World Health Organisation (WHO) on Tuesday classified the JN.1 coronavirus strain as a "variant of interest" and said current evidence shows risk to public health was low from the strain.

At least two experts told Reuters that while the strain can evade the immune system and transmit more easily than other currently circulating variants, it has not shown any signs of more severe disease. While there might be more cases with the variant, JN.1 doesn't pose a greater risk, said Andrew Pekosz, a virologist at the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health.

JN.1 was previously classified a variant of interest as part of its parent lineage BA.2.86, but WHO has now classified it as a separate variant of interest.

WHO said current vaccines would continue to protect against severe disease and death from JN.1 and other circulating variants of the Covid-19 virus.

The US Centres for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) said earlier this month the subvariant JN.1 makes up about an estimated 15% to 29% of cases in the United States as of December 8, according to the agency's latest projections.



Google Play Store's new option lets you delete apps from other Android devices

Google is adding a new option in Play Store, which will let users uninstall apps from their other Android devices remotely.

According to the Google System Updates changelog, the Play Store is now rolling out a new option for removing apps from "other connected" Android devices, reports 9to5Google.

Google only provides a brief explanation, but it does state that it is supported across all instances of Android (Auto, PC, Phone, TV, and Wear).

"(Auto, PC, Phone, TV, Wear) New feature to help you uninstall apps on connected devices," Google said.

Google's new remote uninstall feature is hidden beneath the surface of the Play Store's version 38.8 (which has not yet been widely distributed).

After enabling the feature, the Play Store's "Manage Apps" section can display apps installed on a different Android device from the one you're currently using, and the app can be deleted from the other device from that UI, the report explained. The feature also allows you to arrange the list of apps installed on your other devices by storage used, the report added. Meanwhile, Google has introduced more repair features for Pixel devices that will give users peace of mind if their phone needs to be fixed. The tech giant released a tool to help users diagnose problems with their Pixel phones. Users can launch the app by dialling #*#7287#*, which allows users to check whether their phone is working properly before or after a repair.

Myntra's MyFashionGPT predicts the clothes you need, runs on Microsoft Azure

Online fashion retailer Myntra has revealed more about its collaboration with Microsoft, which helped integrate generative AI into its shopping app in an attempt to change the way Indians shop for clothes. The new feature, MyFashionGPT, allows shoppers to search using natural language instead of keywords, opening up new possibilities for product discovery.

Powered by Microsoft's Azure OpenAI Service, MyFashionGPT understands open-ended questions like "show me clothes for a beach vacation" and returns relevant items spanning categories of beachwear, hats, sunglasses and more. This unshackles shoppers from the limitations of conventional search that relies on matching specific keywords already present in a product catalogue. Myntra revealed that it had organised a hackathon in February to explore how it could harness generative AI to solve this "unsolved search problem" in online fashion. ChatGPT's generative AI tech quickly emerged as the top candidate.

Azure OpenAI Service gave the team the flexibility to compare different large language models and choose the best fit for Myntra's use case. Myntra says that over the next few weeks, multiple teams refined the backend systems and user interface ahead of the launch alongside the platform's End of Reason Sale in May. Seamless integration with existing Azure infrastructure accelerated deployment.

AI in healthcare 'double-edged sword', can fool clinicians with data

AI models in health care are a double-edged sword, with models improving diagnostic decisions for some demographics, but worsening decisions for others when the model has absorbed biased medical data, suggests a study.

Given the very real life and death risks of clinical decision-making, researchers and policymakers are taking steps to ensure AI models are safe, secure and trustworthy — and that their use will lead to improved outcomes.

However, the new study, published in JAMA, finds that even with provided AI explanations, clinicians can be fooled by biased AI models.

"The problem is that the clinician has to understand what the explanation is communicating and the explanation itself," said Sarah Jabbour, doctoral candidate in computer science and engineering at the College of Engineering at the University of Michigan.

The team studied AI models and AI explanations in patients with acute respiratory failure.

"Determining why a patient has respiratory failure can be difficult. In our study, we found clinicians baseline diagnostic accuracy to be around 73 per cent," said Michael Sjoding, Associate Professor of internal medicine at the varsity's Medical School.

"During the normal diagnostic process, we think about a patient's history, lab tests and imaging results, and try to synthesise this



information and come up with a diagnosis. It makes sense that a model could help improve accuracy," he added.

The team designed a study to evaluate the diagnostic accuracy of 457 hospitalist physicians, nurse practitioners and physician assistants with and without assistance from an AI model.

Each clinician was asked to make treatment recommendations based on their diagnoses. Half were randomised to receive an AI explanation with the AI model decision, while the other half received only the AI decision with no explanation.

Clinicians were then given real clinical vignettes of patients with respiratory failure, as well as a rating from the AI model on

whether the patient had pneumonia, heart failure or Chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD).

In the half of participants who were randomised to see explanations, the clinician was provided a heatmap, or visual representation, of where the AI model was looking in the chest radiograph, which served as the basis for the diagnosis.

The team found that clinicians who were presented with an AI model trained to make reasonably accurate predictions, but without explanations, had their own accuracy increase by 2.9 percentage points. When provided an explanation, their accuracy increased by 4.4 percentage points.

"Through this partnership, people will have at their fingertips the ability, regardless of musical background, to create fun, clever, and personalised songs with a simple prompt," Microsoft said in a blogpost.

"Suno has been a leader in AI music technology, pioneering the ability to generate complete songs — lyrics, instrumentals, and singing voices — from a single sentence," it added.

To create your music, open Microsoft Edge, visit copilot.microsoft.com and ensure you're signed in with your Microsoft Account, then enable the Suno plugin or click on the Suno logo that says, "Make music with Suno".

After that ask Copilot to create a song for you such as, "Create a pop song about adventures with your family".

"We believe that this partnership will open new horizons for creativity and fun, making music creation



accessible to everyone," Microsoft said.

This experience has now started to roll out, and the company said it will ramp up in the coming weeks.

Meanwhile, Microsoft has announced a number of new features which will be added to its Copilot service soon, including OpenAI's latest models.

The company said soon Copilot will get support for GPT-4 Turbo, alongside an updated DALL-E 3 model.

Patent dispute: Apple to halt sales of its newest watches in US

If two of the latest Apple Watches are on your holiday shopping list, don't dawdle for much longer because the devices won't be available to buy in the US later this week if the White House doesn't intervene in an international patent dispute.

Apple plans to suspend sales of the Series 9 and Ultra 2 versions of its popular watch for online US customers beginning Thursday afternoon and in its stores on Sunday. The move stems from an October decision by the International Trade Commission restricting Apple's watches with the Blood Oxygen measurement feature as part of an intellectual property dispute with medical technology company Masimo.

The White House had 60 days to review the ITC order issued on Oct 26, meaning Apple could have kept selling the two affected models in the US through Christmas. But the Cupertino, California, company said in a Monday statement that it is pausing sales early to ensure it complies with the ITC order.

If the ITC's sales ban isn't overturned, Apple pledged to "take all measures" to resume sales of the Series 9 and Ultra 2 models in the US as soon as possible.

The Apple Watch SE, which lacks the Blood Oxygen feature, will remain on sale in the US after Christmas Eve. Previously purchased Apple Watches equipped with the Blood Oxygen aren't affected by the ITC order. *Source: AP*

RBI introduces card tokenisation facility at bank level

The RBI has introduced a Card-on-File (CoF) token facility at the level of banks and other institutions to provide convenience for cardholders to get tokens created and linked to their existing accounts with various e-commerce applications.

At present, a CoF token can only be created through the merchant's application or webpage.

For a CoF, a token is a 16-digit number unique for a combination of card, token requestor and merchant. Through tokenisation, the actual card details are replaced with token credentials that can be used only with the intended merchant.

"It has been decided to enable Card-on-File Tokenisation (CoFT) directly through card-issuing banks/institutions also. This will provide cardholders with an additional choice to tokenise their cards for multiple merchant sites through a single process," the RBI said in a circular. Generation of CoF tokens for a card, through the card issuer, can be enabled through mobile banking and internet banking channels.

In October, the RBI had said tokenisation has improved transaction security and transaction approval rate.

The RBI introduced CoFT in September 2021 and began implementation from October 1 last year. *Source: PTI*

UK inflation falls by more than anticipated to 2-year low of 3.9% in Nov

LONDON (TIP)

Inflation in the UK as measured by the consumer prices index eased back to its lowest level in more than two years, official figures showed on December 20, in a development that is likely to bolster speculation that the Bank of England may start cutting interest rates sooner than expected.

The Office for National Statistics said inflation dropped to 3.9 percent in the year to November, its lowest level since September 2021, from 4.6 percent the previous month. That decline was bigger than anticipated in financial markets.

The agency said the biggest driver for the fall was a decrease in fuel prices after an increase at the same time last year. Food price inflation also contributed to the decline.

Last week, the Bank of England left its main interest rate at a 15-year high of 5.25 per cent, where it has stood since August following the end of nearly two years of hikes. Bank Gov. Andrew Bailey said interest rate policy would likely have to remain restrictive for an extended period of time." The Bank of England has managed to get inflation down from a four-decade high of over 11 per cent but still has a way to go to get to its target of 2 per cent.

Higher interest rates targeted a surge in inflation, first stoked by supply chain issues during the coronavirus pandemic and then Russia's invasion of Ukraine, which pushed up food and energy costs.

While the interest rate increases have helped in the battle against inflation, the squeeze on consumer spending, primarily through higher mortgage rates, has weighed on growth in the British economy. There are growing worries that rates will stay high for too long, unnecessarily damaging the economy.

Samuel Tombs, chief UK economist at Pantheon Macroeconomics, said November's surprisingly sharp fall in inflation reinforces the likelihood that the central bank will begin to reduce interest rates in the first half of 2024, far earlier than it has been prepared to signal so far.



US business activity picks up in December: S&P Global survey

U.S. business activity picked up in December amid rising orders and demand for workers, which could further help to allay fears of a sharp slowdown in economic growth in the fourth quarter.

S&P Global said on Friday that its flash U.S. Composite PMI Output Index, which tracks the manufacturing and services sectors, increased to a five-month high of 51.0 this month from 50.7 in November. A reading above 50 indicates expansion in the private sector.

All the improvement came from the services sector, with manufacturing activity declining further. The survey followed upbeat news on the labor market in November. The holiday shopping season also got off to a strong start, with retail sales outperforming expectations in November, data showed on December 21.

The run of better-than-expected data prompted the Atlanta Federal Reserve to boost its gross domestic product growth estimate to a 2.6% annualized rate from a 1.2% pace. The economy accelerated at a 5.2% rate in the third quarter.

"The early PMI data indicate that the U.S. economy picked up a little momentum in December," said Chris Williamson, chief business economist at S&P Global Market Intelligence. "Looser financial conditions have helped boost demand ... and have also helped lift future output expectations higher."

Google is paying \$700 million to settle antitrust charges over Play Store

Google has agreed to pay \$700 million and offered several other concessions to nearly 102 million customers in the US as part of an antitrust payout over fees the tech giant charged through its app store. Most of that money will be given to people who purchased something through Google's Play Store. Google also committed to changing how apps are downloaded and paid for on Android phones.

Although the tech giant struck the deal with state attorneys in September, the settlement's terms were revealed late on Monday. As per settlement terms, Google will deposit \$630 million into a fund that will dole out compensation to the US customers funnelled into a payment processing system that state attorneys general alleged drove up the prices for digital transactions within apps downloaded from the Play Store, Washington Post reported. Google will place an additional \$70 million into a separate fund that the states will use to take care of penalties and other costs, the report further said.

According to the court filing, about 70 million consumers, or more than 71% of those covered by the settlement will receive at least \$2 and may get additional payments based on their spending on the Play Store between August 16, 2016 and September 30, 2023. The estimated 102 million US consumers who made in-app purchases during that time frame are supposed to be automatically notified about various options for how they can receive their cut of the money.

The tech giant also agreed to make it easier for consumers to download and install Android apps from other outlets besides



its Play Store for the next five years and will refrain from issuing security warnings, or "scare screens," when alternative choices are being used. "We brought this lawsuit because it is illegal to use monopoly power to drive up prices and limit consumer choice," Colorado Attorney General Phil Weiser said in a statement, per the Post.

Google, for its part, seems to be taking the development in stride. "We're pleased to resolve our case with the states and move forward on a settlement that includes ... growing our commitment to app store choice," among other improvements, Wilson White, the company's VP for government affairs and public policy, wrote on Monday in a blog post. The deal still has to get the green light from US District Judge James Donato.

In addition to a holy bath, Lord Krishna's puja may end with aarti being performed at home.

Since Ekadashi is celebrated, it is vital that devotees who fast on this day eat no grains like rice, wheat or barley.

Many planned celebrations were carried out to teach today's young people the importance of Dharma by explaining Gita on this special day.

Things To Remember

On Gita Jayanti, there are certain things you need to remember:

- With a pious heart, you need to acknowledge Srimad Bhagavad Gita on Gita Jayanti Day, and also perform LORD Krishna's Darshan.
- Pray for intelligence to him afterwards.
- Whenever necessary, implement the Shlokas in life to receive their essence. You can get ideas from Shlokas that can easily eradicate numerous



- problems in your life.
- According to belief, worshipping Conch along with Mokshada Ekadashi Vrat on the Gita Jayanti day is also beneficial. The sound of the conch eliminates the harmful vibrations after worship and allows Maa Lakshmi to appear. It is believed that after being satisfied, Lord Vishnu showers his grace.
- You can also perform an authentic Vishnu Puja online to get blessings from the Lord.
- On this day, it is considered holy to worship the gigantic form of Lord Krishna. Those who do the same will achieve peace, and all their pending works will be successfully resolved.
- Whichever family has differences, on the day of Gita Jayanti, the members must start reciting the Path of Gita.

Significance Of Mokshada Ekadashi

There was a king called Vaikhanasa, who governed the city of Gokul, according to mythological beliefs. He once dreamed that his dad had suffered in hell after his death, and the king prayed for his improvement. The King was afraid to see his father's awful state.

The king invited learners to his kingdom immediately and asked for his dream secret. The Brahmins recommended that he go to Muni's Ashram, called Parvat and ask him for his father's remedy.

The king went to Muni's Ashram and told him everything about his dream. The Muni responded that his dad was in hell due to his previous life's ill deeds. In

this pretext, Mokshada Ekadashi's fast to deliver his father from hell had to be observed by the king.

The king observed fast, devoted himself to due rituals, donated and did everything else as Muni instructed. As a result, his father quickly came to Moksha.

DEC 22 - DEC 28

DECEMBER 22

December 22, 1783 - Following a triumphant journey from New York to Annapolis, Maryland, George Washington, victorious Commander-in-Chief of the American Revolutionary Army, appeared before Congress and voluntarily resigned his commission.



Birthday - Italian composer Giacomo Puccini (1858-1924) was born in Lucca, Tuscany. Widely considered the greatest Italian opera composer, he is best known for popular works such as Madama Butterfly and La Boheme.

Birthday - "Lady Bird" Johnson (1912-2007) was born in Karnack, Texas (as Claudia Alta Taylor). She was beside her husband Lyndon Johnson on board Air Force One when he was sworn in as the 36th U.S. President following the assassination of President John F. Kennedy. She proved to be a gracious First Lady, remembered for her anti-litter campaign, asking citizens to help "Beautify America."

DECEMBER 23



December 23, 1947 - The transistor was invented at Bell Laboratories by John Bardeen, Walter Brattain and William Shockley, who shared the Nobel Prize for their invention which sparked a worldwide revolution in electronics.

December 23, 1948 - Hideki Tojo was hanged for war crimes. He had been Japanese prime minister from 1941-44. Following Japan's defeat in World War II, he was arrested as a war criminal, tried by a military tribunal and sentenced to death. He was hanged along with six other Japanese wartime military leaders at Sugamo Prison in Tokyo, with the sentence carried out by the U.S. 8th Army.

December 23, 1987 - Dick Rutan and

Jeana Yeager set a new world record of 216 hours of continuous flight around the world without refueling. Their aircraft Voyager traveled 24,986 miles at a speed of about 115 miles per hour.

Birthday - Mormon prophet Joseph Smith (1805-1844) was born in Sharon, Vermont. He founded the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.

Birthday - Japanese Emperor Hirohito (1901-1989) was born in Tokyo. He was Japan's wartime Emperor and was allowed to remain in his position after the war.

DECEMBER 24



December 24, 1942 - The first surface-to-surface guided missile, later known as the V-1 Flying Bomb, was launched by German rocket engineer Wernher von Braun. Called "Buzz Bombs" for the loud buzzing sound of their motor, they were used by Nazi Germany against Britain beginning in September 1944.

December 24, 1943 - General Dwight D. Eisenhower was appointed Supreme Commander of the Allied Expeditionary Force preparing for D-Day.

December 24, 1990 - On Christmas Eve, the bells of St. Basil's Cathedral in Moscow rang for the first time since the death of Lenin.

December 24, 1992 - Casper Weinberger and five other Reagan aides involved in the Iran-Contra scandal were pardoned by President George Bush.

Birthday - Howard Hughes (1905-1976) was born in Houston, Texas. He was a movie producer, aviator and industrialist whose legendary desire for privacy generated many rumors and much curiosity. Perhaps best remembered for designing an eight-engine flying boat, nicknamed the Spruce Goose, which was to carry 750 passengers, although it only made one brief test flight.

DECEMBER 25

December 25th - Christmas Day, commemorating the birth of Jesus of Nazareth. Although the exact date of his birth is not known, it has been celebrated on December 25th by the Western (Roman Catholic) Church since 336 A.D.

December 25, 1926 - Hirohito became Emperor of Japan.

December 25, 1989 - In Romania, a television broadcast of a Christmas symphony was interrupted with the announcement that Nicolae Ceausescu

and his wife had been executed following a popular uprising. A pro-democracy coalition then took control. Ceausescu, a hard-line Communist, had been ousted from power after ordering his black-shirted state police to suppress a disturbance in the town of Timisora, resulting in the deaths of an estimated 4,500 persons.



Birthday - Isaac Newton (1642-1727) was born in Woolsthorpe, Lincolnshire, England. He was a mathematician, scientist and author, best known for his work Philosophiae Naturalis Principia Mathematica on the theory of gravitation. He died in London and was the first scientist to be honored with burial in Westminster Abbey.

Birthday - American nurse and philanthropist Clara Barton (1821-1912) was born in Oxford, Massachusetts. She served as a nurse during the Civil War and in 1881 founded the American Red Cross.

Birthday - The founder of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan, Mohammed Ali Jinnah (1876-1948) was born in Karachi.

Birthday - Film actor Humphrey Bogart (1899-1957) was born in New York City. Best known for The African Queen, The Maltese Falcon, Casablanca and To Have and Have Not.


DECEMBER 26

December 26, 2004 - An estimated 230,000 persons were killed and 1.5 million left homeless when a magnitude 9.3 earthquake on the seafloor of the Indian Ocean set off a series of giant tsunami waves that smashed into the shorelines of a dozen countries including Indonesia, Sri Lanka, Thailand, India and Somalia.

December 27, 1927 - Josef Stalin consolidated his power in Soviet Russia by expelling rival Leon Trotsky from the Soviet Communist Party.


December 27, 1945 - The International Monetary Fund was established in Washington, D.C.

It consists of 13,677 islands along the equator between the Indian and Pacific oceans, and a population of over 150 million.

December 27, 1996 - A genocide trial began concerning the killing of an estimated 800,000 Tutsis in Rwanda. In 1994, a bloody civil war had broken out between the two main ethnic groups, the Hutu and the Tutsi. After the Hutu army seized power it had waged a campaign of "ethnic cleansing" against the Tutsi population.

Bikaner: The desert town

Located in the midst of Thar Desert, Bikaner is a "cultural paradise and a traveller's haven". Bikaner with its magnificence in architecture, art and culture is filled with colour, festivity and cultural marvels. The city will mesmerize you with the camels sauntering the beautiful sand dunes, its ancient palaces and forts. Rightly called as one of the three great desert kingdoms of Rajasthan, the dazzling city boasts of old-world charm, opulent havelis and depicts a pleasing bygone era of the Rajputs. Best known as the "camel country" for breeding some best-known riding camels, Bikaner also happens to house one of the only two models of the biplane used by the British in World War 1.

Sand Dunes and the Desert Safari are among major attractions. Bikaner is also famous for hosting the international Camel festival which draws tourists from the world over. Other attractions here include experiencing delicacies such as Thandai, Bhujias, shopping for the fascinating Ivory and Lacquer items or simply witnessing the immense heritage taking the form of wall paintings and arts and crafts in the area.

Junagarh Fort

The Junagarh Fort of Bikaner is a magnificent structure around which the city of Bikaner grew up. The fort was initially called Chintamani and later renamed the Junagarh or Old fort in the 20th century. The foundations of the Junagarh fort was built in 1478 by Rao Bika. However, it existed just as a stone fort then. The present grand structure was inaugurated on 17th February 1589.

The palaces inside the fort, the gardens, balconies, kiosks, etc., depict a composite architectural style influenced by the different rulers' cultural differences and foreign inspirations.

The unique monuments on display in the fort represent 16 generations of rulers in Bikaner starting from the late 16th century.

Karni Mata Temple

The Karni Mata Temple, also popularly known as the Nari Mata Temple or 'Rat Temple', is a 600-year-old temple located around 30 km from Bikaner in a small town of Deshnoke in Rajasthan. What is unique about this temple is the fact that 25,000 black rats live, and are worshipped, in the temple. Infact, the food that is eaten by them is



considered to be holy and is later served as 'prasad'.

These holy rats are known as kabbas, and people from all over the world travel great distances to come and visit the temple to pay their respects to these rats. Numerous tales and legends are associated with the temple and the rats that live here, but no one knows the exact history of this unique shrine.

The Karni Mata Temple is also noteworthy for its architecture that has been influenced by the Mughal style of construction. The beautiful temple is adorned with a fantastic marble facade and marble carvings that further add to the charm of this place. While the entire concept of this temple may seem as gross or weird to some, it is a unique experience altogether and is something you should not miss out.

Lallgarh Palace

Lallgarh Palace, a breathtaking Rajasthani Palace, is located in the beautiful city of Bikaner, Rajasthan in India. It was constructed for the Maharaja of Bikaner, Maharaja Ganga Singh, between 1902 and 1926. The palace built in European architecture style has now been opened up for tourists as a Heritage Hotel and the entire estate comes under the National Heritage

Trust. The estate also houses a museum named Shri Sadul Museum, where you can find traces of Rajasthani Royalties and get an insight into their extravagant lifestyle.

Built with red sandstone bought from the Thar Desert, the colours of the beautiful structure when they change shades as the day progresses. If you wish to stay at the Lallgarh Palace Hotel, you'll be amazed at the massive size of the rooms you'll be living in and the regal hospitality you'll be receiving. One of the estate wings has been maintained only for the Royal family of Bikaner. The other two wings are for The Lalgarh Palace Hotel and the Lakshmi Niwas Hotel.

Gajner Palace

Gajner Palace is located in the city of Bikaner on the banks of Gajner Lake. This regal palace was built by Maharaja Ganga Singh as a hunting lodge for him and his family but was converted to a hotel in 1976. Gajner Palace offers you a variety of leisure activities from boat rides to desert safaris. Built as a traditional Rajasthani Palace, it is an architectural beauty that now is modernised to host guests. The entire vicinity is filled with lush green trees while the glorious palace itself offers

recreational activities like billiards, lawn tennis, cycling, bird watching and wildlife safaris.

National Research Centre On Camel



Colorado Supreme Court bars former president Donald Trump from running for President over 2021 Capitol riots

The Colorado Supreme Court upheld a trial judge's decision that Trump engaged in the January 6, 2021, insurrection and also overturned her conclusion that the ban does not apply to the presidency.

The landmark decision from the divided top state court marks the first time a court has found Trump ineligible to return to the White House due to his conduct surrounding the January 6, 2021, attack on the US Capitol, CBS News reported.

Never before has a court determined that a presidential candidate is disqualified under the Civil War-era provision clause, it said. (Source: PTI)

Pilot program allowing H-1B holders to renew visas without leaving US clears White House review; to benefit Indians

States, a departure from the standard process requiring renewal from outside the country.

ELIGIBILITY AND APPLICATION DETAILS:

SCOPE: Limited to H-1B visa renewals.

REQUIREMENTS: Applicants must meet specific criteria, including prior visa issuance by Mission Canada (from January 1, 2020, to April 1, 2023) or Mission India (from February 1, 2021, to September 30, 2021), among others.

Application Process: Applicants can apply online at travel.state.gov.

Aim of the Pilot: The pilot aims to test the feasibility of resuming domestic visa renewals and to assess its effectiveness in reducing global visa wait times. This move is aligned with the Administration's commitment to improving federal service delivery and supporting U.S. industry partners.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE:

Period: Online applications accepted from January 29, 2024.

Limits: Weekly limits on applications based on the region of prior visa issuance.

Processing Time: Expected to be 6-8 weeks from the receipt of required documents.

Fees: Non-refundable and non-transferrable \$205 MRV fee.

REQUIREMENTS FOR PARTICIPATION:

Includes criteria such as in-person interview waiver eligibility and maintaining H-1B status.

DOCUMENTATION NEEDED:

A completed DS-160 form, a recent photograph, passport, Form I-797, and I-94.

IMPORTANT NOTES:

Visa issuance through this program is not guaranteed.

Ineligible or incomplete applications will face refusal under INA section 221(g).

This pilot is a temporary arrangement, and participation is voluntary.

The pilot program cleared the Office of Information and Regulatory Affairs review on December 15, the final regulatory hurdle before publication.

The development comes months after the White House announced a pilot program for domestic renewal of certain categories of H-1B visas during the state visit of Prime Minister Narendra Modi in June this year.

It would allow H-1B holders to renew their visas by mailing them to the State Department rather than travel outside the US and face uncertain wait times to secure an appointment at an American consular office before returning.

In countries like India, the largest source of H-1B workers, high visa wait times have added uncertainty to travel plans for those workers and their employers.

An estimated 75 per cent of the H-1B visas granted in a year are known to go to workers from India, hired by

some of the largest US tech giant such as Amazon, Microsoft, Google and Facebook.

Due to heavy visa backlogs, some H-1B workers have pursued work-arounds such as travelling to nearby countries with fewer backlogs to secure appointments.

The average wait time to secure a visa appointment for travel to the US fell to 130 days last year, a drop of 70 days from fiscal year 2022.

The State Department considers acceptable wait times to be closer to 90 days. (Source: IANS)

French President Emmanuel Macron to be India's Republic Day chief guest

guest for the Republic Day with a little more than six weeks to go for the event after the US didn't take up the invitation, reportedly due to Biden's focus on domestic politics, including the annual state of the union address and his re-election bid in 2024.

There was speculation in diplomatic circles about the Indian side reaching out to other world leaders in recent days, with the names of UK Prime Minister Rishi Sunak and the heads of state of some West Asian countries doing the rounds.

There was no word from Indian officials regarding Macron's presence at the Republic Day celebrations, though the people cited above said the French president is expected to attend the event and that a formal announcement was expected soon.

The French presidents who were guests at the Republic Day celebrations were Jacques Chirac (1976 and 1998), Valéry Giscard d'Estaing (1980), Nicolas Sarkozy (2008) and François Hollande (2016). Macron's presence at next year's event will also make France the country whose leaders have been chief guest at the event the maximum number of times. Until now, France and the UK were tied with five invitations each.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi was the chief guest at the Bastille Day or French national day celebrations in Paris in July this year when an Indian tri-services contingent also participated in the parade.

The development also comes at a time when France has reportedly submitted its bid to India's defense ministry for selling 26 Rafale-Marine combat jets in a deal estimated to be worth Rs 50,000 crore. These jets are meant to bolster the Indian Navy's combat capabilities and the Indian Air Force already operates 36 Rafale jets acquired under a Rs 59,000-crore deal finalized in 2016.

Macron has a close relationship with Modi and France has emerged as one of India's closest partners in Europe. Both countries are also part of trilateral partnerships with several countries that are focused on cooperation in areas such as maritime security and resilient supply chains.

France is the only European power with significant naval assets in the Indian Ocean region because 93% of its exclusive economic zone (EEZ) of more than 11 million sq km is in the Indo-Pacific. The navies of India and France exercise regularly and cooperate closely on maritime security.

The two countries have also worked closely together on issues such as counter-terrorism and climate change at the United Nations. (Source: HT)

Rudy Giuliani files for bankruptcy after \$148m defamation verdict

his finances under the supervision of the bankruptcy court".

Mr Giuliani, 79, said earlier this year that he was having financial difficulties because of his increasing legal fees and expenses.

Last week, an eight-person jury ordered him to pay \$20m to Georgia poll workers Ruby Freeman and her daughter Wandrea "Shaye" Moss.

The pair said Mr Giuliani's false claim that they tampered with votes had a traumatizing impact on their lives. Ms Freeman said she would "always have to be careful" because of lingering fears she might be recognized publicly.



Ms Freeman and Ms Moss were also awarded more than \$16m each for emotional distress. Another payment of \$75m in punitive damages was ordered to be split between them.

Addressing reporters outside the court after he was ordered to pay the sum, Mr Giuliani said: "I don't regret a damn thing."

On Wednesday, a judge ordered him to start paying the two women immediately and expressed concern he might not comply with the judgement.

It is unclear how the bankruptcy declaration will impact on the payments, but US bankruptcy law does not allow the dissolution of debts stemming from "wilful and malicious injury" inflicted on another party.

The bankruptcy filing lists nearly 20 creditors, including Ms Freeman, Ms Moss and Hunter Biden who sued him in September.

Other creditors include the Internal Revenue Service (IRS), which he owes more than \$700,000 in income tax, and two voting software companies that sued him over his false claims of election fraud.

A law firm that previously represented Mr Giuliani, Davidoff Hutch & Citron LLP, is also included. The firm sued Mr Giuliani for \$1.4m in unpaid legal fees in September.

Mr Giuliani still faces an indictment in Georgia on racketeering and conspiracy charges as well as a \$10m lawsuit by a former business associate over sexual harassment claims. (Agencies)



UNITED NATIONS (TIP): Members of the United Nations Security Council observed Tuesday a minute of silence to mourn and honor Kuwait's late Amir Sheikh Nawaf Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah. The UN lowered its flag to half-mast at its New York headquarters in honor of the late Amir on Monday, December 18.

The UN paid tribute to the late Amir describing him as a distinguished statesman, who contributed to the growth

of understanding and cooperation in the Gulf and beyond, and pursued strengthened relations in support of peace and stability in the region and around the world.

The ruling emir of the oil-rich nation Kuwait, Sheikh Nawaf Al Ahmad Al Sabah, has died at the age of 86, just over three years after assuming power, Kuwaiti state TV announced.

His cause of death has not been revealed although the ruling emir was hospitalized last month "due to an emergency health problem" but was later reported to be in stable condition.

The small Mideast nation, which is the holder of the world's seventh-largest oil reserve, borders Iraq to the north and Saudi Arabia to the south, has seen internal power struggles behind palace doors. Kuwait state television broke into programming with Quranic verses just before a somber official made the announcement.

"With great sadness and sorrow, we - the Kuwaiti people, the Arab and Islamic nations, and the friendly peoples of the world - mourn the late His Highness the emir, Sheikh Nawaf Al Ahmad Al Jaber Al Sabah, who passed away to his Lord today," said Sheikh Mohammed Abdullah Al Sabah, the minister of his emiri court, who read the brief statement.

"I am proud to serve our immigrant communities and we will lead to fight for the rights and supports that immigrant New Yorkers need."

MOIA delivered key resources to immigrant communities, including:

Releasing Informational Videos to Assist Asylum Seekers Navigate the Federal Immigration Process: In response to more than 150,000 migrants arriving to New York City, MOIA created

informational videos to assist asylum seekers when navigating the federal immigration process. The instructional videos covered topics such as: "ice check-ins, immigration documents, and going to court."

Creating the Asylum Seeker Legal Assistance Network: In the absence of a national strategy to support asylum seekers with their legal needs as they enter the country, MOIA launched the Asylum Seeker Legal Assistance Network (ASLAN), a \$5 million investment to expand non-profit organizations' capacity to provide immigration legal assistance for newly arrived asylum seekers. Through this network the contracted partners provided a combination of orientation sessions, legal screenings, application assistance, pro se assistance clinics, self-help materials, and other services.

Funding the Asylum Seeker Resource Satellite Sites: To continue to support asylum seekers with in-person social service, MOIA extended funding to the asylum seeker resources satellite sites.

India on song as Vastrakar exploits variable bounce

Seamer Pooja Vastrakar and off-spinner Sneh Rana showed enough craft to exploit a pitch offering variable bounce to bundle out Australia for a modest 219 in their first innings on the opening day of their one-off Test in Mumbai on December 21.

In their first essay, India raced to 98/1 at stumps as openers Smriti Mandhana (43 not out) and Shafali Verma (40) added 90 runs at the Wankhede Stadium.

But India's march to ascendancy began through Vastrakar (4/53) who teamed up with Rana (3/56) and Deepti Sharma (2/45) to halt Aussies' innings in 77.4 overs despite a fifty by Tahlia McGrath.

However, Australia made a poor start as they lost opener Phoebe Litchfield in the first over itself after a mix-up with her partner Beth Mooney. Four deliveries later, Vastrakar produced a peach of a delivery to remove Ellyse Perry (4) and reduced Australia to 7/2 inside the first two overs. Vastrakar beat the defence of star all-rounder Perry by getting the ball move and disturb the stumps. But McGrath (50) came out firing on all cylinders to put pressure back on India, making most of the errors in line and in the field. McGrath was hard on anything that had width, racing to her third fifty in five Tests with eight fours while also utilising two lifelines in the form of dropped catches when she was on 18 and 45.

Samson, Arshdeep help India seal series against South Africa

Sanju Samson's mature maiden ODI hundred and wiliness of a young set of bowlers on a sticky surface formed a heady concoction in India's 78-run win over South Africa in the third and final match Thursday, December 21. India, thus, bagged the rubber 2-1, their second series triumph on these shores since 2018. Samson's measured 108 (114 balls) and Tilak Varma's patient 52 (77 balls), his first fifty in this format, guided India to a competitive 296 for eight. Their 116-run alliance for an enterprising fourth wicket stand was a treat to watch. South Africa challenged the tourists through a fifty by Tony de Zorzi (81, 87 balls) but were eventually bowled out for 218 in 45.5 overs. Left-arm pacer Arshdeep Singh marshalled Indian bowlers with a satisfactory haul of four for 30.

South Africa made a bright beginning to their chase with De Zorzi and Reeza Hendricks (19) adding 59 runs in just 8.2 overs as the former took a heavy toll on pacer Mukesh Kumar in the power play.

However, Arshdeep elicited an edge from Hendricks to activate KL Rahul behind the stumps, signalling the end of the opening partnership. Left-arm spinner Axar Patel castled Rassie van der Dussen with a ball that came along his arm to reduce the hosts to 76 for 2.

But it followed a period of stability as De Zorzi and captain Aiden Markram (36) added 65 runs for the third wicket to keep India at bay. De Zorzi's footwork was precise and he used the depth of the crease wisely to gather runs, especially against spinners Axar and Washington Sundar. But just as the partnership was blooming, Washington, who replaced Kuldeep Yadav for this match,

dislodged Markram. Markram's attempt to reverse sweep Washington brought disaster as Rahul snaffled the ballooning ball behind the wicket. South Africa's hopes of adding flesh to the chase suffered an even bigger jolt when Arshdeep won a leg-before appeal against De Zorzi via the DRS.

The left-armer jagged the ball into the Protea opener and the low-ball thudded onto his front pad as the Indian camp went up in appeal, which eventually brought the desired result. Heinrich Klaasen (21, 22 balls) failed to negotiate a climbing ball from pacer Avesh Khan and he played it with hard hands. Sai Sudharsan completed a super acrobatic catch inside the ring to dismiss Klaasen, reducing the Proteas to 174 for five in the 33rd over. With the asking rate mounting ever so steadily, even David Miller could not carry South Africa past the target.

Earlier, Samson found a perfect

sidekick in Varma to place India in a position of strength. Samson and Varma came together when India were slightly wobbling at 101 for three after being asked to bat first.

But the pair showed excellent situational awareness and sussed up the conditions to a nicety. Their partnership was all about pragmatism without letting go of any opportunity to unfurl a big shot.

Usually a free-flowing hitter, Samson shelved his macho intentions for a large part of his innings, concentrating on singles and twos as the Boland Park deck had this slight bite on it. But the right-hander intermittently brought out his T20 avatar into play when he smashed pacer Nandre Burger for a six over mid-wicket or while executing an exquisite inside-out loft over cover off left-arm spinner Keshav Maharaj for a four.

Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh's aide wins WFI poll, Sakshi Malik quits wrestling

Rio Olympic bronze medallist Sakshi Malik on Thursday, December 21, announced her retirement from the sport, protesting against Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh loyalist Sanjay Singh winning the Wrestling Federation of India (WFI) election for the top job, here.

Sanjay, a close associate of outgoing WFI chief Brij Bhushan became the new WFI president with his panel winning 13 of the 15 posts in the elections here on Thursday, December 21.

"We fought from our heart, but if a man like Brij Bhushan, his business partner and a close aide is elected as the president of WFI, I quit wrestling," said a teary-eyed Sakshi, and kept her shoes on the table in a dramatic announcement.

"We wanted a female president but that did not happen," the 31-year-old, who is also a CWG gold medallist, added.

Ahead of the elections, Olympic medal-

winning grapplers Bajrang Punia and Sakshi had repeatedly requested Sports Minister Anurag Thakur to stop anyone associated with Brij Bhushan from contesting the WFI polls.

Consequently, neither Brij Bhushan's son Prateek nor son-in-law Vishal Singh entered the fray.

Bajrang and Vinesh Phogat, who addressed media after elections, did not say whether they will retire from the sport.

"It's unfortunate that government did not stand by its word that no Brij Bhushan loyalist will contest WFI election," Bajrang said.

"Upcoming women wrestlers will also face exploitation," Vinesh added.


