## US working to reduce visitor visa wait time for Indians: Rena Bitter



US Bureau of Consular Affairs Assistant Secretary Rena Bitter noted that today more Indians can travel to the US than in any other time in history

FEBRUARY 22, 2024

**WASHINGTON, D.C. (TIP)**: The United States is working towards further reducing the wait time for visitor visas for Indians following a decrease of 75 per cent last year, according to US Bureau of Consular Affairs Assistant Secretary Rena Bitter.

In an interview with PTI, Bitter noted that today more Indians can travel to the United States than in any other time in history.

"Last year, the Embassy in India processed 1.4 million visas, explosion of an incredible number...in every category there is no wait time at all except in one area of travel where there is still some wait time and that is people travelling for the first time to the United States for tourism," she said.

"It has been reduced 75 per cent over the last year and we are working really hard on this. We recognize that it is an incredibly important bilateral relationship and the foundation of the relationship is

## A first: US company lands craft on moon

FEBRUARY 23, 2024

**WASHINGTON, D.C. (TIP)**: A private American company has scripted history by landing the first commercial spacecraft on the Moon as well as the first US vehicle on the Earth's only natural satellite in more than 50 years, joining earlier feats by India, Russia, the US and China.

Built by Intuitive Machines, the lander - named Odysseus - touched down on the moon at 6.23 pm ET on Thursday, February 22, making it the first American spacecraft on the Moon since the Apollo 17 mission in 1972. "Today, for the first time in half a century, America has returned to the Moon," Bill Nelson, NASA Administrator said.

The lander will have seven days before darkness descends on the landing site, preventing the spacecraft's

# The Unyielding Spirit of Punjab Farmers

## DEATH OF AN INDIVIDUAL IS NOT THE END OF AN IDEA

In the heartland of India, a battle is raging. The agrarian community of Punjab, resilient and united, is on a warpath, demanding fair prices for their produce and an end to oppressive government policies. The conflict has escalated as the government, seemingly serving the interests of capitalist cronies, remains adamant on enforcing controversial agricultural laws. This struggle, reminiscent of the past, echoes a powerful truth - the death of an individual does not extinguish the flame of an idea.

A year ago, the farmers took to the streets, demanding the repeal of certain agricultural laws imposed by the Modi government. The initial response from the government was repression, attempting to stifle the movement. However, the farmers, standing united and supported by their counterparts from Uttar Pradesh and Haryana, refused to back down. Faced with the strength of this collective resolve, the government succumbed to pressure, promising to reevaluate and revise its agricultural policies.

Despite assurances, the government failed to initiate substantial changes in agricultural policies. Disillusioned, the farmers resumed their struggle, realizing that the promises made were nothing more than empty words. The government's lack of action fueled the flames of discontent, prompting the agricultural community to intensify their protests.

In a disturbing turn of events, the BJP-led government, both at the central and state levels, unleashed repressive



measures against the protesting farmers. Border points between Punjab and Haryana were barricaded to thwart the march to Delhi. The use of water cannons and, shockingly, reports of firing upon peaceful farmers became tools employed by the authorities to crush the dissent.

The conflict reached a critical juncture when, as claimed by agitating farmers' leaders, a 21-year-old award-winning farmer Shubhkaran Singh was shot in the head by the Haryana police. Despite police denials of any firing, numerous farmers sustained injuries in the alleged incident. The agitating leaders also reported the disappearance of several farmers, accusing the government of using such tactics to instill fear among the protesting community.

The government's heavy-handed approach seems to be rooted in a short memory. A year ago, similar repressive measures failed to deter the farmers. The authorities forgot that the death of an individual does not equate to the death of an idea. History is replete with examples of ideas that survived the demise of their proponents.

Reflecting on history, we find poignant examples of individuals whose ideas

endured despite their tragic deaths. Mahatma Gandhi, an apostle of non-violence, was assassinated by Nathuram Godse, who subscribed to the Hindutva ideology. Yet, Gandhism remains alive, shaping the moral fabric of societies worldwide. In the United States, Martin Luther King Jr., a champion of civil rights, was assassinated, but his vision persists, inspiring movements for civil liberties, justice and equality globally.

The Punjab farmers' struggle embodies the unbroken spirit of individuals united by a common cause. The government's attempts to suppress dissent through repressive measures might temporarily subdue the protests, but history has shown that the death of an individual does not extinguish the flame of an idea. The farmers' fight for fair prices and agricultural autonomy transcends individual tragedies, evolving into a movement that refuses to be silenced. As the echoes of protests reverberate, it serves as a stark reminder that ideas born from the collective consciousness of a determined community can withstand the harshest of challenges, ensuring that their voices are not easily silenced or forgotten.

# Victory for democracy: Supreme Court of India overturns Chandigarh mayoral poll result

Exercising its power under Article 142 of the Constitution to do 'complete justice', the Supreme Court on Tuesday, February 20, overturned the result of the January 30 Chandigarh mayoral poll - which had witnessed BJP nominee Manoj Sonkar being declared the winner under controversial circumstances and named AAP-Congress candidate Kuldeep Kumar as the mayor. Ruling that the result declared by returning officer (RO) Anil Masih, a nominated councillor of the BJP, was contrary to law, the court ordered his prosecution for making the 'false' statement before the Bench that he had invalidated eight ballot papers because they had been 'defaced'. With

these eight AAP-Congress votes not being counted at that time, the poll outcome had gone the BJP's way, prompting the alliance to accuse the RO of ballot-tampering.

The Bench headed by Chief Justice DY Chandrachud asserted that in such a case, the top court was duty-bound to ensure that the process of electoral democracy was not allowed to be thwarted by subterfuge. The court's commendable intervention has undone a grave wrong. The development is a major embarrassment for the BJP, whose attempt to engineer a victory has been scuttled. The INDIA bloc, beset by differences among its constituents, finally has something to cheer about.

The AAP-Congress candidate's victory has underscored the dire need for the Opposition to get its act together in the run-up to the Lok Sabha elections.

The verdict is a stark reminder to all stakeholders - political parties, the electorate and the poll authorities at all levels - that the sanctity and fairness of the electoral exercise must always be ensured. Efforts to subvert the mandate are a blot on our democracy and should not be tolerated. Hopefully, the Chandigarh case will serve as a deterrent against the use of unfair means in elections.



Ruchira Kamboj is the Permanent Representative of India / Ambassador of India to the United Nations in New York. On presentation of her credentials to Secretary-General Antonio Guterres on 2 August 2022, she became the first lady diplomat from India to assume this position.

Ruchira Kamboj joined the Indian Foreign Service in 1987. She was the All India woman topper of the 1987 Civil Services batch as well as topper of the 1987 Foreign Service batch.

She began her diplomatic journey in Paris, France where she was posted as the Third Secretary (later Second Secretary) in the Indian Embassy to France from 1989-1991.

From Paris, she returned to Delhi where she worked as Under Secretary in the Europe West Division of India's Ministry of External Affairs from 1991-96. In this capacity, she also represented India at the 14th Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting in 1995 at Auckland, New Zealand.

From 1999-2002, she served as Deputy Secretary and later Director in charge of Foreign Service Personnel and Cadre in the Ministry of External Affairs in Delhi.

Ruchira Kamboj was posted as Counsellor at India's Permanent Mission to the United Nations in New York from 2002-2005, where she dealt with a wide range of political issues, including UN

Peacekeeping, UNSC Reform, the Middle East crisis, etc. Upon release of Secretary-General Kofi Anan's Blue Ribbon Panel Report in December 2014, she was part of the G-4 team that worked on the reform and expansion of the UNSC.

From 2006-2009, she was India's Consul General in Cape Town, South Africa. The position involved close liaison with the Parliament of South Africa. In this period, she also steered the visits of the President of India to Cape Town in 2008.

Ruchira Kamboj was picked to be the Deputy Head of the Office of the Secretary-General at the Commonwealth Secretariat, London. She was among the two Staff Officers of the Commonwealth Secretary-General in a multilateral setting, overseeing a wide range of political and economic issues, attending as well in this period the Commonwealth Heads of Government meeting in 2009 at Trinidad and Tobago.

### CHIEF OF PROTOCOL, INDIA

From 2011-2014, she was India's Chief of Protocol, the first and only woman in Government to have held this position. In this capacity, she directed all outgoing visits of the President of India, the Vice President of India, the Prime Minister of India, and the External Affairs Minister of India. She also dealt with all incoming Heads of Government and State in India.

As Chief of Protocol, she was involved in the organization of international Summits in India inclusive of the 4th BRICS Summit in New Delhi in 2012 and the 11th Council of Ministers Meeting of the Indian Ocean Rim Association at Bangalore, India in 2011. She also successfully steered the ASEAN India Commemorative Summit in December 2012 marked by the presence of 10 Heads of State and Government in New Delhi. In 2013, she directed the 11th Asia Europe Foreign Ministers' Meeting held at Gurgaon, Haryana which was attended by 52 Foreign Ministers from Asia and Europe with over 1500 participants.

### PM MODI'S SWEARING-IN CEREMONY

In her third tryst with multilateralism, she was posted as India's Ambassador to UNESCO Paris in April 2014. However, she was called back to direct the swearing-in of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, which was marked by the presence of Heads of State and Government from the SAARC countries and Mauritius. She resumed her duties in Paris on completion of this special assignment.

Ruchira Kamboj had a stellar three-year stint at UNESCO. In 2016, history was made when three Indian sites were added to UNESCO's World Heritage list



On presentation of her credentials to Secretary-General Antonio Guterres in August 2022, Ruchira Kamboj became the first lady diplomat from India to assume the position of Permanent Representative of India / Ambassador of India to the United Nations.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Ambassador Ruchira Kamboj received the Guinness World Record for most nationalities in one yoga session organized at the UN Headquarters in New York in 2023. During her stint at Unesco, she steered India to victory when Yoga was declared the Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity in 2016.

including Nalanda Mahavihara. The same year, she steered India to victory when Yoga was declared as the Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity.

In April 2016, she organized an International Conference on the Zero at UNESCO showcasing the great and glorious tradition of India in Mathematics and Science. A bust of ancient Indian mathematician Aryabhata was gifted to UNESCO.

In 2015, she was called back to assist in the organization of the 3rd India-Africa Forum Summit held in New Delhi, which was marked by the presence of Heads of State and Government of the 54-member African Union.

### HIGH COMMISSIONER TO SOUTH AFRICA

Ruchira Kamboj was the High Commissioner of India to South Africa, with concurrent accreditation to the Kingdom of Lesotho from 2017 to 2019. This stint was marked by the first-ever India-South Africa Business Summit held in Johannesburg in 2018. External Affairs Minister Sushma Swaraj participated in a unique commemoration of the 125th anniversary of the Pietermaritzburg 'incident' (involving Mahatma Gandhi), celebrating people-to-people ties between India and South Africa. The visit of PM Modi to Johannesburg in July 2018 for BRICS10 was a reaffirmation of the salience of the India-South Africa relationship and BRICS.

Ruchira Kamboj was appointed as Ambassador to Bhutan in 2019.

During her tenure, many important

initiatives were successfully undertaken in both traditional and newly identified areas of cooperation. Seven new trade routes were opened with Bhutan, including Allhay, which facilitated the movement of essential and non-essential goods during the Covid pandemic. In the IT Sector, the India - Bhutan E-Library project was completed; the connection between the National Knowledge Network of India and its counterpart, Druk-Ren was facilitated and arrangements were firmed up for a Third International Internet Gateway for Bhutan. The India - Bhutan Satellite project was due for a launch in 2022. In appreciation of the positive and contributory role played by India during Covid pandemic to strengthen India - Bhutan relations, His Majesty The King of Bhutan conferred Bhutan's highest civilian honor, the Order of the Druk Gyalpo, upon PM Modi in 2021.


Ruchira Kamboj has written several OpEds in newspapers and magazines. She has also been called upon to speak at prestigious events in India and abroad on a wide range of issues.

# Dr V.K. Raju: On a mission to eliminate childhood blindness from the world



**Founded by eye surgeon and humanitarian Dr V.K. Raju, the Eye Foundation of America has spread its work to 30 developing countries, training medical personnel to serve the needy, and spreading education on preventive eye care**

and research. It is accomplished through eye camps and brick-and-mortar hospitals in developing countries, training of medical personnel to serve the needy.

EFA's reach extends to 30+ developing countries and the USA. The Foundation has served 4 million patients and performed 350,000+ vision-saving surgeries, with over 25,000 surgeries performed on children.

Since its inception in 1979, the EFA has facilitated 600+ physician exchanges and trained 200+ ophthalmologists, equipping these medical practitioners with the tools to join the global fight against blindness.


Dr Raju has helped to build two hospitals in rural India: the Srikiran Eye Institute and the Goutami Eye Institute. Goutami has a wing dedicated exclusively to children.

The EFA has plans to build a service and research eye hospital in India where no child will be denied treatment and children from around the world can come to receive services.

But Dr Raju's impact goes beyond mere numbers. He understands that true empowerment lies in education. EFA's programs equip patients with knowledge about eye health and

hygiene, enabling them to make informed choices and prevent future complications. This ripple effect extends beyond the individual, as patients become agents of change, sharing their knowledge within their communities.

Dr Raju has also focused on preventing a lifetime of blindness in premature babies. When a baby is prematurely born, its body is not fully developed, the eyes included. ROP or retinopathy of prematurity happens when there is an abnormal development of retinal blood vessels on the retina. ROP has to be treated during the window of 3 weeks to 3 months.

Dr. Raju was born in Rajahmundry, Andhra Pradesh in India. He earned his medical degree from Andhra University and completed an ophthalmology residency and fellowship at the Royal Eye Group of Hospitals in London. He is board-certified in ophthalmology and is a Fellow of the Royal College of Surgeons (FRCS) and the American College of Surgeons. and Fellow of the American College of Surgeons (FACS).

He has resided in Morgantown, West Virginia since 1976, where he is currently a Clinical Professor of Ophthalmology at West Virginia University.

In West Virginia, Dr. Raju accepts patients who do not have medical insurance and performs surgical procedures that are not covered, often pro bono. This allows many of these patients to remain functional members of society.

Dr Raju has received many honors and awards, including 26 distinguished awards and 17 gold medals. In his adopted home state of West Virginia, he was awarded the Lions Club International (Morgantown) Jarrett Award. Morgantown Rotary honored him for community service in 2000. The award he is most proud of is the Martin Luther King Jr. Achievement Award

from West Virginia University.

The American Academy of Ophthalmology (AAO) has awarded Dr. Raju four times for his teaching and research contributions, including the Outstanding Humanitarian Award in 2002 for \$1 million of his own money that went into building hospitals in India, teaching, and providing services to needy patients.

The American Association of Physicians of Indian Origin (AAPI) awarded Dr. Raju with their prestigious Distinguished Community Service Award in 2007. President Barack Obama conferred on him the 2016 President's Lifetime Achievement Award.

The University of Toledo in Ohio inducted him into the Global Medical Missions Hall of Fame in 2007.

Dr. Raju has authored hundreds of papers and publications and is the co-author of *Musings on Medicine, Myth, and History: India's Legacy*, along with his daughter, Leela V. Raju.

Dr. Leela Raju, his daughter and fellow ophthalmologist, is the EFA's Secretary and Coordinator for Education and actively participates in its mission.

### Vision problems of children

Refractive errors (focusing defects) such as near-sightedness, far-sightedness, crossed eyes, and lazy eye (amblyopia) are seen almost in 20% of children. The majority of them can be treated. We should reach them early.

Other problems include:

- Cataracts
- Glaucoma
- Corneal problems
- Retinal and Optic Nerve problems
- Retinoblastoma—a rare cancer of the eye

Often we think that cataracts happen in older people. No. One can be born with cataracts (a genetic problem).

### 4 common vision problems in adults

- Cataracts
- Glaucoma
- Age-related Macular Degeneration
- Diabetic Retinopathy

Most of the children's vision problems are **avoidable**. They are either preventable or treatable with today's technology and resources. **Accessibility** and **affordability** are the main issues. Neglected children's vision problems can lead to permanent vision loss.

A blind child is a problem for himself, to the family, and the society.

The World Bank states, "The most cost-effective health intervention is giving vision to children". A five cents vitamin A can prevent lifelong blindness.





# With Today's Technology, Eliminating Childhood Blindness is not too Ambitious: Dr V.K. Raju

**INDRAJIT SALUJA, CHIEF EDITOR, THE INDIAN PANORAMA: ROTARY INTERNATIONAL SECURED A WORLD WITHOUT POLIO. NOW YOU AND YOUR EYE FOUNDATION OF AMERICA ARE WORKING TO ELIMINATE NEEDLESS CHILDHOOD BLINDNESS IN THE WORLD. BUT ISN'T IT AN AMBITIOUS MISSION?**

**DR V.K. RAJU:** With today's technology and resources, it is not ambitious. Let me tell you why I have chosen to focus on childhood blindness. Let's say a 67-year-old becomes blind. He or she has only a few years to live. But if a child becomes blind, he lives for seven decades without vision. We can catch them early and treat them and make them productive members of society for

decades.

As per the World Bank, 80% of our learning is through vision. Nelson Mandela said education is the greatest equalizer. But for want of a pair of glasses, which costs Rs 200-300 in India, the kids' learning is affected and they become a burden to themselves, the family, and society as a whole.

**MALNUTRITION IS SAID TO BE ONE OF THE CAUSES OF CHILDHOOD BLINDNESS IN DEVELOPING COUNTRIES.**

**DR RAJU:** On this front, India has done incredibly well in the last 30-40 years. But still, overall nutrition is not good among rural people of low socio-economic strata, especially children. So, if you want to see a world without childhood blindness, first you have to tell the governments in the world to provide proper nutrition to children.

**WHAT INSPIRED YOU TO START THE EYE FOUNDATION OF AMERICA?**

**DR RAJU:** I was working in London and went to India for a holiday. A farmer came to show me his eyes. I did not have any equipment then. So, in 1977, I held my first eye camp in Vijayawada. After seeing so many children born with congenital cataracts, next year I took along a surgical instrument (Ocutome), but faced problems with the customs. On advice of friends, we started Eye Foundation of America for credibility.

India gave me a stellar medical education almost for free and paying back like this is no big deal. We are fortunate to do this work.

**BEING A ROTARIAN, DO YOU THINK YOU CAN BRING ROTARY INTERNATIONAL TO SUPPORT YOUR MISSION?**

**DR RAJU:** They already are great supporters of my foundation and our hospitals in Andhra Pradesh. More and more people and Rotary clubs would join in South India and in Vijayawada where I work year after year. Leadership and cooperation are the road to success, as

President Jimmy Carter said in his book 'Global Health' and whom I have fortunately met.

**TELL US ABOUT YOUR GOUTAMI EYE HOSPITAL**

**DR RAJU:** Goutami is in Rajahmundry district in Andhra Pradesh. It is the flagship of the Eye Foundation of America with about 14 peripheral centers. Outreach is very important in India, where 65% of people still live in villages. Goutami has a wing exclusively for children. At Goutami, we never turn down a patient. Our model is, we see 60% of the patients almost for free or subsidized and 40% are paying patients.

**BESIDES INDIA, WHICH OTHER COUNTRIES HAVE YOU GONE IN?**

**DR RAJU:** We have worked in 30 countries, most recently in Guatemala. In some places we supply educational material, in some, we do clinical work, in still others we support their programs as in Ghana. This year-end we are going to South Africa.


**WHAT LED YOU TO GUATEMALA?**

**DR RAJU:** Prof Saluja, you are the one who made that project happen through the Indian Consul General there, Amb. Manoj Kumar Mohapatra. You were there when we screened the patients in Guatemala City. We went back with another colleague of mine last November and performed eye surgeries. Amb. Mohapatra was very helpful.

**I SAW YOU EXAMINE 500 PEOPLE AT FIVE LOCATIONS IN GUATEMALA. HOW MANY SCREENINGS AND SURGERIES EFA HAS DONE SO FAR?**

**DR RAJU:** Almost 4 million people have been screened as outpatients in the peripheral hospitals and clinics and at least 350,000 operations have been done already.

**FOR THIS COLOSSAL WORK, HOW ARE YOU ABLE TO MANAGE FUNDS?**



**Dr Raju:** For the first 16 years, our Foundation did not have a fundraiser. Now we do. Last year we raised \$800,000. Here I must tell the story of Srinu Maddula. I brought him here from Vijayawada for a corneal transplant about 35 years ago when he was a toddler. He went on to finish his doctorate in pharmacy from Rutgers. Now he feels that what the eye foundation did for him, he should do more for it.

For community service projects, help comes unexpectedly. You introduced me to Blitz India editor Deepak Dwivedi and Sandeep Saxena and they introduced me to Lord Swaraj Paul and Lord Loomba in England. I was honored at the House of Lords, and we set up a chapter of our foundation there.

**WHAT ARE THE MAIN CAUSES OF BLINDNESS?**

**DR RAJU:** The most common visual problem is cataract, which is clouding of the lens of the eye. Cataract is not a disease. It can develop with age. Left untreated, cataract leads to blindness. Today very easy and successful surgeries are available to remove cataracts. You don't need to stay in the hospital, you go home the same day.

The other eye problem is glaucoma. It is caused by high eye pressure damaging the nerve connecting the eye to the brain. So, one should get checked for glaucoma every two years after the age of 40.

With diabetes, if you get regular eye exams, you won't lose sight.

**WHAT IS YOUR ADVICE TO MY READERS ABOUT KEEPING EYES IN GOOD CONDITION?**

**DR RAJU:** If your general health is good, your eye health will be good too. So, eat right, exercise, and do everything in moderation. Protect the eyes with sunglasses when you spend a lot of time outdoors. Cataract development, if at all, will be slow then.

**IS YOUR DAUGHTER DR. LEELA RAJU, YOUR NATURAL SUCCESSOR?**

**DR RAJU:** Absolutely. She is very much part of the foundation work and capable of running the show once I'm gone.

**YOU HAVE BEEN CONFERRED SO MANY AWARDS AND HONORS, NOW ANOTHER ONE BY THE INDIAN PANORAMA, HOW DO YOU FEEL?**

**DR RAJU:** Each honor means more opportunity to continue and do even more work and serve people. Yet, as we say in the Indian ethos, I am only nimitta matra (a medium) for whatever good I am able to do.





# Ranju Batra: Securing Diwali Stamp and launching Oscars of Diplomacy

**The ideals of Diwali are the ideals of the UN Charter. The Power of One awards, Ranju says, honor diplomats whose work away from the public eye can make a difference between war and peace.**

A historic number of 24 nations, led by Belarus and India as co-organizers, and United States Postal Service, came together in December 2016 at the United Nations to celebrate "Small Stamp for a Big Festival" and to honor Mrs. Ranju Batra for spearheading the seven-year-long campaign to secure the release of the Diwali Forever stamp by USPS.

Ranju felt the honor was for her journey for the Diwali Stamp seen as a metaphor for peace and harnessing its power to promote excellence in diplomacy. In fact, the ideals of Diwali are the ideals of UN Charter. Speaking to The Indian Panorama, she recalled that one diplomat dubbed her singular achievement the 'power of one'. That inspired her to launch the 'Diwali Stamp - Power of One' awards to honor exceptional diplomats.

Under the aegis of the Diwali Foundation USA that she chairs, these awards are presented every year since 2017 (barring the Covid years) to exceptional world class diplomats at the UN.

Says Ranju about honoring diplomats, "They work hard every day away from the public eye but the public needs to know that what they do is important as that could be the difference between war and peace."

The 'Diwali Stamp - Power of One' awards are supported multilaterally. For example, in 2023 the awards were co-organized and co-sponsored by over 70 member states and the European Union. The Permanent Mission of India at the UN has, of course, supports the ceremony every year.

Since 2017, 25 awards have been given to esteemed ambassadors. The honorees have included Lakshmi Puri, former Executive Director of the UN Women, former UK Ambassador to the UN Matthew Rycroft, former Permanent

Representative of Georgia to the UN Kaha Imnadze, and former Permanent Representative of Grenada to the UN Keisha McGuire.

The most high-profile diplomat to be honored to date has been the UN Secretary-General (2007-2016) Ban Ki-moon. He was honored last December along with former Permanent Representative of Bosnia and Herzegovina to the UN Amb. Mirsada Colakovic, former Permanent Representative of South Korea to the UN Amb. Kim Sook and 72nd UN General Assembly President and EU Special Representative for the Belgrade-Pristina Dialogue Miroslav Lajcak.

In his acceptance speech at the event attended by UN diplomats, envoys, civil society members and policy experts, Ban commended the work and "forward-thinking vision" of the Diwali Foundation USA "for advancing vital light in a world of increasing darkness". He said the world today "seems fractured

like never before" as he cited the COVID-19 pandemic, climate crisis and regional crisis seen in the Middle East and Ukraine.

India's Ambassador to the UN Ruchira Kamboj said that Diwali is a celebration that holds a special place in the hearts of over a billion Indians across the globe. Diwali "is more than just a festival. It is a sentiment that embodies the triumph of light over darkness, knowledge over ignorance and hope over despair", she said.

Sri Lanka's Ambassador to the UN Mohan Pieris said "Deepavali has become truly a secular festival in the world, since its message is not exclusively restricted to any religious creed."

Ravi Batra, the eminent Indian-American attorney, and Chair of National Advisory Council South Asian Affairs, and moderator of the award ceremony, said the UN transcends borders and boundaries.

The Power of One award is given to a

former permanent representative or former high-level member of UN secretariat or member state, or soon-to-be former, who has worked selflessly to help form a more perfect, peaceful, and secure world for all. Assuming eminence, these awards have come to be called the 'Oscars of Diplomacy'.

The Diwali Foundation, USA's mission is to support the UN Charter of multilateralism and enhance peace and security around the world by promoting excellence in diplomacy.

## THE DIWALI STAMP TRIUMPH

Ranju's campaign for the Diwali Stamp was fervently followed and supported by Indians in America. It was backed by many Congress members and Indian diplomats in the US. She took it up as President of the Association of Indians in America (AIA)-New York during its Silver Anniversary year, 2011-12. The entire Indian community celebrated with her when on October 5, 2016, USPS officially dedicated the stamp at the Indian Consulate in New York. Ranju's personal sale of over 170,000 stamps for First Day made the "Diwali Stamp" the best seller in USPS' over 200 years history.

Looking back, Ranju says, "The Diwali stamp issued by the USPS is equivalent to the US government issuing a passport to Diwali itself and supporting light over darkness, knowledge over ignorance." Diwali is now part of Americana. Since the Diwali stamp was issued as a Forever stamp, USPS is required to issue it annually.

Since September 2021, Ranju is an Advisor for Legal and Humanitarian Affairs to the Permanent Mission of Georgia to the UN, having previously served as an Advisor to the Permanent Mission of Ukraine from 2015.

Since 1990, she has been the Administrator of The Law Firm of Ravi Batra, founded by her husband.

# Role of Diplomacy in International Affairs: From General Douglas MacArthur to Qin Gang

**DIPLOMACY IS THE "LINES OF COMMUNICATIONS" THAT SOVEREIGN NATIONS USE TO ENGAGE IN SOVEREIGN INTERCOURSE - ACROSS A WIDE ARRAY OF MENU ITEMS THAT ARISE - BE IT DURING PEACE OR WAR.**



From time immemorial, Emperors and Kings have engaged in the comity of nations through their ambassadors passing official messages, and responses, back and forth. That practice has continued, even after 1776 and the birth of the great American Experiment.

Sovereign nations can either trade with each other, or wage war upon the other. Diplomacy, then, is a core governmental function that is necessary to assist in enhancing bilateral trade or to secure additional rights in lieu of war being engaged in futuro. Diplomacy is the "lines of communications" that sovereign nations use to engage in sovereign intercourse - across a wide array of menu items that arise - be it during peace or war.

Indeed, diplomats are issued special passports by their sending-nation state, and credentials for the welcoming-nation state. Every nation state welcoming an ambassador accepts the credentials of such ambassador, and by so doing, the two-way official lines of communication are set.

Recently, Qin Gang, the father of "Wolf Warrior" diplomacy was dishonorably retired - as he should have been - by President Xi Jinping, as he structurally violated the basic tenet of diplomacy: to make love or war, with equal sobriety, and passion for accurate reporting bilaterally. Indeed, while our President nominates ambassadors to 193 nations



around the world, it is our Senate Foreign Relations Committee that holds hearings, and if approved, the Senate confirms with its "advise and consent" power. Only after that, does our Secretary of State, much like a corporate secretary, issue credentials to the confirmed-ambassador, which will then be presented to the Head of State or Government of the receiving nation-state.

While anyone can be diplomatic, only persons representing their nation - be it a democracy, theocracy, autocracy or monarchy - is a diplomat, officially engaging in diplomacy. It is true that

private persons - such as Bill Richardson, former U.S. Permanent Representative to the UN and governor of New Mexico - can engage in "fringe diplomatic" efforts that, hopefully, assist in resolving a thorny issue between two or more nation-states. For example, Bill Richardson helped to secure the freedom of hostages from Iran, Libya, Myanmar and inter alia Russia. The list included basketball player Brittney Griner, journalist Danny Fenster, U.S. Marine veteran Trevor Reed, and inter alia Osman Khan. Khan was freed with the help of the State Department and the Richardson Center in October 2022 along with six others in exchange for two

relatives of Venezuelan President Nicolas Maduro jailed in the United States.

The Osman Khan episode is an example of hybrid-diplomacy, but the most famous example is in the movie - Bridge of Spies - wherein Tom Hanks portrays a private lawyer, James Donovan, who secured the release of hostages from then-East Germany, and years later, President John F. Kennedy, after the Bay of Pigs, again looked to James Donovan to seek the release of a few American hostages, and Donovan, well in excess of his mandate, secured the release of all Americans held by Cuba, then within USSR's core sphere of influence. A nation so close to Miami that we ought to create a process to resolve all issues, including: property claims, and the so-called "Havana Syndrome." Then, and only then, will the Monroe Doctrine be properly effectuated.

Diplomats are granted inviolability in the nation they are credentialed to, but are not above the rule of law in the nation they are sent by. That means no law enforcement can arrest them or stop them for any reason, and they have full "freedom of movement" in the nation they are accredited to.

In the tragic times of pre-World War II period of appeasement, which was driven by the strategic failure of the Great Powers to unite, Neville Chamberlain, then Prime Minister of the great British Empire, made a Peace Deal on behalf of Europe with Hitler's Third Reich - the First Reich being the medieval Holy Roman Empire, which lasted until 1806; and the Second Reich included the German Empire from 1871-1918 - by gifting Czechoslovakia to Hitler, without any right or any consent of said nation to be so subjugated! This was followed up by USSR's Stalin's Foreign Minister Vyacheslav Molotov negotiating into the wee hours of August 23, 1939 with Hitler's Foreign Minister Joachim von Ribbentrop to create the Molotov-Ribbentrop Pact, with secret protocols that became public during the Nuremberg Trials, to ensure peace between Hitler and Stalin, with each of them agreeing to fight and create agreed-to future-spheres of influence. On September 1, 1939, a week later, Hitler attacked western Poland, on September 17th Stalin invaded eastern Poland, and on September 22nd the Soviet and Nazi militaries held a joint military parade in Brest-Litovsk. The USSR-Nazi joint-war effort was short-lived, and Stalin's USSR fought Nazi Germany and suffered the largest number of casualties at over 26 million dead to defeat fascist Nazis.



Diwali Stamp - Power of One Awards, called the Oscars of Diplomacy, were instituted by Ranju Batra in 2017 to honor diplomats who uphold the spirit of Diwali. At the last awards event at the UN in December 2023, former UN Secretary General Ban Ki-moon was one of the honorees.

News 12, the main TV channel on Long Island, ran a program in May 2021 on Harry Singh's business success. The documentary-style program including an interview with him was broadcast as part of the Asian Pacific American Heritage Month.

Singh came to the US in 1983 with nothing more than a dream of a better life, the narrator started. "Today he runs a billion-dollar gas station business headquartered in Garden City."

The program then proceeded to talk about his work ethic that helped him achieve his American Dream. Bolla Market has become a popular pit stop for many motorists, their customers testify. One woman said, "The food is very good here- they have everything from breakfast, and lunch to dinner."

Harry Singh says humbly in the documentary, "I am a worker, I love what I do. I have a passion for it." The narrator goes on to add that his passion is rooted in the cultural values of his native place in Punjab. And that at age 21, he traded his small village for the Big Apple. It was to make life better, says Harry Singh. His wife, Kamljit, a nurse, shared his vision.

Singh took the opportunities that came his way, and in 1989 opened his first gas station. He shares his simple philosophy thus, "You get up in the morning, you say thank God, it is another great day in our life. Let us go and make a difference and let us make today better than yesterday."

Singh did feel discriminated against at times for his looks, and for who he was. "But I never let it take me down," he tells the News 12 reporter resolutely.

Today Bolla Oil employs 1,800 people at over 250 sites, including gas stations, convenience stores, and fuel distribution centers.

"Work hard and you get rewarded," Singh says. The narrator adds that Singh and his wife are now reaping the reward of their 33 years of hard work - a magnificent mansion in Old Westbury and a collection of exquisite cars.

While the Singhs enjoy the fruits of their labor, they believe there is more to life than material things. That is why they found a way to give their wealth a richer meaning. Elaborates Singh, "I believe God gave me a blessing to give, not take."

The Singh family created the Bolla Charity Foundation to benefit people in need. It donated a \$600,000 house in 2018 to a disabled veteran named Lance Cpl. Billy Ventura, in Selden, NY. "We should share. We can all make this world a better place to live." Singh still works seven days a week with passion and gratitude, says the narrator. "It has been an amazing ride," Singh concludes.

# Purnima Desai - The True Cultural Ambassador of India

**A multitalented personality, Purnima Desai is the founder of Shikshayatan Cultural Center and Sriniketan Foundation based in New York.**

**A** motivating and dedicated teacher in vocal and instrumental music, dance, languages, and Indian philosophy, Purnima A. Desai is the Founder and President of Shikshayatan Cultural Center and Sriniketan Foundation, based in New York.

The two philanthropic organizations, instrumental in encouraging and supporting Indian culture through music and art, promote the beauty, goodwill, and tranquility of Indian art and culture through educational workshops teaching children and women Hindi, violin, dance, poetry, and painting.

Purnima was born in a Gujarati Brahmin family in Calcutta in 1949. She studied at Shri Shikshayatan School and College there. Her father, D.P. Desai, was a lawyer who retired as a legal advisor to The Times of India group.

## CALCUTTA, HER LOVE

"Calcutta played a major role in my life. I started my cultural journey from there. At Shikshayatan, I learnt Bharatanatyam, Manipuri and Kathak. I wanted to sing also but could not afford a harmonium. Instead, my parents got me a Hawaiian guitar. I learned many Bengali songs."

After she graduated with honors in Education, her family moved to Delhi in 1968 because of the Naxalite movement. While doing her MBA there, she continued with her cultural activities, choreographed dance dramas, and became a popular face on the campus.

In 1972 she got married to Ashok C. Desai, a pharmacist by profession. For a while she worked with Sahu Jain's Jaipur Udyog Limited as a management trainee. After a year in Bombay, she moved with her family to New York in 1973.

## RAISING FAMILY IN NEW YORK

In New York, Purnima worked briefly for two top banks - CITI and Chase before taking a break to bring up her three

daughters: Kaveeta, Komal and Tejal. Then, she opted for the real estate business so she could work from home.

Returning to her passion for the arts, she joined the Gujarati Samaj of New York, where her kids would perform. Purnima also started performing there and choreographing as well. She also joined Bharatiya Vidya Bhavan and became its executive committee member.

In 1988 Purnima founded her cultural organization - Shikshayatan, which means house of learning. She named it after her alma mater in Calcutta. Such an organization was needed to impart knowledge about Indian culture to the young generation here who are deprived of the rich Indian heritage.

Shikshayatan is open to all nationalities to come together for peace, harmony, and team spirit. It has been offering lessons in vocal and instrumental music, providing a stage for young and old performers alike. She started in the basement of her home in Flushing, Queens. Initially, she taught pro bono, but had to charge a nominal fee after she started hiring teachers.

## ROLE PLAYED BY SHIKSHAYATAN

By now Shikshayatan has trained several loyal and dedicated students who have supported her organization by giving performances in churches, temples, community events, at South Street Seaport Deepavali celebrations, public libraries and schools.

Shikshayatan has a faculty of highly educated, multitalented and professional artists. Pandit Kamal Mishra has been a great asset to the organization since 1989 and has proved his multiple talents through teaching and as a performing artist.

"I'm fortunate to have had the opportunity to acquire the best from both India and the United States," says Purnima. "My gratitude for both is infinite. Now I proudly guide our young generation to balance their life and remain peaceful and profoundly

connected to both cultures."

Each year Shikshayatan showcases the talent of internationally renowned artists and recognizes their talent, contributions, and dedication to preserving the heritage of Hindustani Classical Music. At its Sangeet Mahotsav 2023, over 47 artists performed for 12 hours nonstop with a mesmerizing experience of healing ragas and Indian classical dances.

## SERVICE THROUGH SRINIKETAN FOUNDATION

In 2015, Purnima started Sriniketan Foundation to fulfill the dream of her late father. "After the death of my mother, he was alone. So, he told me to do something for seniors so that they don't feel lonely."

Sriniketan Foundation's objective is 'Building Awareness on the Importance of Happy, Heavenly, Progressive, Peaceful and Blissful Living Style through Mind, Body and Soul Evolution.' The Foundation promotes spiritual growth by organizing lectures, discourses, seminars, workshops, concerts, fun fairs, competitions, comedy shows and creative outlets.

"My heartfelt purpose is keeping people healthy physically and spiritually and to help the less fortunate people," says Purnima.

She attributes many of her qualities to her close association with her grandfather, L.K. Desai, and grandmother, Mani Desai. "My grandfather was highly educated, and he worked with Sardar Patel."

Money, name, or fame - she wants nothing, just wants to work selflessly. She elaborates, "I don't want to ask for money for Sriniketan or Shikshayatan. They should earn on their merit. If I get some funds unasked from genuine people, then I am blessed. I have organized free musical programs for senior citizens."

Purnima has celebrated many festivals of India, and anniversaries of saints, sages, and patriotic leaders to disseminate knowledge about India. She has been blessed by spiritual masters like Mata Amritanandamayi, Morari Bapu; dignitaries and diplomats including Hillary Clinton and Dr Karan Singh; and renowned artists such as Sonal Mansingh, Padmini Ramachandran, Archana Joglekar, Pt Ramesh Narayan; astrologers and healers like Swami Chakradhari and Shakuntala Devi.

# The Indian Panorama at 18: A Chronicle of Perseverance and Triumph

**A**s The Indian Panorama marks its 18th year of publication, it is a moment of reflection and celebration. 



**NEW YORK (TIP):** New York City Mayor Eric Adams and NYC Health + Hospitals, on February 23, announced free, in-person, and virtual tax preparation services for New Yorkers as part of the New York City Department of Consumer and Worker Protection's (DCWP) NYC Free Tax Prep initiative.

In partnership with BronxWorks, Grow Brooklyn, Urban Upbound, and Code for America's GetYourRefund initiative, free tax preparation is available for New Yorkers who earn \$85,000 or less annually and file as a family, or those who earn \$59,000 or less annually and file as an individual or couple without dependents. Select NYC Health + Hospitals sites offer support in Spanish, Chinese, and Bengali, and virtual tax preparation is available in Spanish as well.

"Every day, we work to make this city more livable for working-class New Yorkers, and by offering free tax preparation at NYC Health + Hospitals sites, we are again delivering for families across the five boroughs," said Mayor Adams. "Services are available online, in-person, and in multiple languages, making it easy for families to file their taxes and keep money in their pockets. We went to Albany to secure the first increase in the city's Earned Income Tax Credit in 20 years, and we are thrilled to offer New Yorkers NYC Free Tax Prep to help them receive their fair share this tax season."

For in-person services, individuals should schedule an appointment in advance and bring identification and proof of income. For virtual services, individuals can upload their documents and meet virtually with a tax preparer to review their tax return before submission. A full checklist of the documents needed to file taxes is available online.

NYC Free Tax Prep provides free, professional tax preparation that can help New Yorkers keep their full refund, including valuable tax credits, like the recently enhanced New York City Earned Income Tax Credit. NYC Free Tax Prep Services include:

**In-Person Tax Preparation:** At in-person tax prep sites, knowledgeable Internal Revenue Service (IRS) certified Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) or Tax Counseling for the Elderly (TCE) volunteer preparers help filers complete an accurate tax return. More than 130 sites across the city will be open throughout the season.

**DROP-OFF SERVICE:** With drop-off service, filers can drop off their tax documents and pick up the completed return later.

**VIRTUAL TAX PREPARATION:** Virtual Tax Preparation is an online service where an IRS-certified VITA or TCE volunteer preparer will video conference with filers to help prepare their tax return using a secure digital system. Filers can submit photos or scans of tax documents to the preparer, confirm their identity, and complete their return by video call with a preparer. Filers will need access to a computer, tablet, or smartphone; a stable internet connection; and the ability to download secure video conference software.

**ASSISTED SELF-PREPARED:** Assisted Self-Preparation allows filers to complete their tax return online on their own, and an IRS-certified VITA/TCE volunteer preparer will be available by phone or email to answer questions. Filers will need access to a computer, tablet, or smartphone; a stable internet connection; an email address; and their 2022 adjusted gross income or self-select PIN.

NYC Free Tax Prep Services are available now at over 130 VITA and TCE sites around the city. The IRS will accept returns through April 15, 2024. New Yorkers can call 311 or visit the NYC Free Tax Prep website and use DCWP's interactive map to search for the most convenient free tax site near them.

# Indian American professor Anantha Chandrakasan named MIT's first chief innovation and strategy officer

BOSTON (TIP) : Indian American professor Anantha Chandrakasan, dean of the School of Engineering and the Vannevar Bush Professor of Electrical Engineering and Computer Science, has been named as MIT's first chief innovation and strategy officer. He will continue to serve as dean of engineering, a role he has held since 2017.

As chief innovation and strategy officer, Chandrakasan will work closely with MIT President Sally Kornbluth to advance the ambitious agenda that she has laid out in the first year of her presidency, according to a press release.

He will collaborate with key stakeholders across MIT, as well as external partners, to launch initiatives and new collaborations in support of these strategic priorities.

In his new role, Chandrakasan will help develop and implement plans to advance research, education, and innovation in areas that Kornbluth has identified as her top priorities - such as climate change and sustainability, artificial intelligence, and the life sciences. He will also play a leading role in efforts to secure the resources needed for MIT researchers to pursue bold work in these key areas.

"I am thrilled and honored to help advance President Kornbluth's vision for MIT in this new role," Chandrakasan says. "Working closely with faculty, staff, and students across the Institute, I am excited to help shape and launch initiatives that will accelerate research and innovation on some of the world's most urgent needs. My hope is to enable our researchers with the support, resources, and infrastructure they need to maximize the impact of their work."

"I was immediately impressed by Anantha's can-do attitude and his clear interest in working with us to develop and advance our priorities for the Institute," Kornbluth says.

"With his signature energy, creativity, and enthusiasm, he has a gift for organizing complex initiatives and ideas and making sure they move forward with alacrity. Combined with his strategic

insight, deep knowledge across many subject areas, and terrific record in raising funds for important ideas, Anantha is uniquely suited to serve MIT in this new role, and I'm delighted he has agreed to take it on."

Working closely with MIT's existing programs in entrepreneurship, Chandrakasan will develop strategies to accelerate innovation across the Institute, the release stated. These efforts will aim to grow and support these programs while identifying new opportunities to support student and faculty entrepreneurs and maximize their impact.

In addition to examining ways to advance research, entrepreneurship, and collaborations, Chandrakasan will work with Provost Cynthia Barnhart and Chancellor Melissa Nobles to advance new educational initiatives. This will include developing new programs and tracks to optimize students' preparation for a variety of career paths.

"In many ways, this role is a natural extension of the significant work Anantha has already been doing to help shape strategic priorities on an Institute level," Barnhart says. "All of MIT stands to benefit from his extensive experience launching and building new programs and initiatives."

As dean of engineering since 2017, Chandrakasan has implemented a variety of interdisciplinary programs, creating new models for how academia and industry

can work together to accelerate the pace of research.

This has resulted in the launch of initiatives including the MIT Climate and Sustainability Consortium, the MIT-IBM Watson AI Lab, the MIT-Takeda Program, the MIT and Accenture Convergence Initiative, the MIT Mobility Initiative, the MIT Quest for Intelligence, the MIT AI Hardware Program, the MIT-Northpond Program, the MIT Faculty Founder Initiative, and the MIT-Novo Nordisk Artificial Intelligence Postdoctoral Fellows Program, the release stated.

Chandrakasan has also played a role as dean in establishing a variety of initiatives beyond the School of Engineering. He was instrumental in the 2018 founding of the Schwarzman College of Computing, the most significant structural change to MIT in nearly 70 years.

He also has served in leadership roles on MIT Fast Forward, an Institute-wide plan for addressing climate change; as the inaugural chair of the Abdul Latif Jameel Clinic for Machine Learning in Health; and as the co-chair of the academic workstream for MIT's Task Force 2021.

Before becoming dean, Chandrakasan led an Institute-wide working group to guide the development of policies and procedures related to MIT's 2016 launch of The Engine, and also served on The Engine's inaugural board.

Prior to becoming dean in 2017, Chandrakasan served for six years as head of the Department of Electrical Engineering and Computer Science (EECS), MIT's largest academic department. As department head, he led the development of initiatives that continue to have an impact across MIT.

He created Rising Stars in EECS, an academic career workshop that rotates amongst various universities and has become a model for similar efforts in other disciplines.

Under his leadership, EECS also launched the SuperUROP program as well as Start6, which has since become StartMIT, a program supporting students interested in entrepreneurship, the release stated.

## Indian American economist Daleep Singh set to return to White House

WASHINGTON, D.C. (TIP): Indian American Economist Daleep Singh, a key architect of the Biden administration's economic sanctions on Russia, is coming back to the White House, according to a media report.

Singh, who served in the Treasury Department in the Obama administration, will return to his previous role as deputy national security adviser for international economics taking over from Mike Pyle who leaves at the end of the month.

Daleep Singh's return as the deputy national security adviser for international economics "will allow him to pick up where he left off in April of 2022 - looking for innovative ways to punish Russia and help support Ukraine," the report suggested.

The position, which reports to both the NSC and the National Economic Council, is one of the most important in the White House.

As part of the portfolio, Singh will help coordinate the US position at both the G7 and G20 summits.

This year the G7 leaders will meet in June in Italy. The G20 summit is scheduled to occur in Brazil in November after the presidential election.

With a \$95 billion foreign aid package stuck in Congress, Biden officials are exploring how they can help Ukraine without Congressional authorization, the report stated.

# Dr Samir Shah is the first Indian origin Chairman of BBC

**THE 72-YEAR-OLD HAS NOW BEEN CONFIRMED IN THE 1,60,000 POUNDS PER YEAR AND FOUR-YEAR TERM ROLE TO TAKE CHARGE FROM MARCH 4.**

LONDON (TIP): India-born media executive Dr Samir Shah was on Thursday confirmed as the new BBC chairman after his selection cleared the stages of scrutiny to be approved by King Charles III this week.

Shah, who has worked in UK broadcasting for over 40 years, was picked as the government's preferred candidate in December last year and went on to be quizzed by cross-party MPs of the House of Commons Media Culture, Media and Sport Select Committee for his pre-appointment scrutiny.

The 72-year-old has now been confirmed in the 1,60,000 pounds per year and four-year term role to take charge as the public broadcaster's first Indian-origin Chair from March 4 and running until March 2028.

"With a career spanning more than 40 years in TV production and journalism, Dr Shah has a wealth of experience to bring to the position of BBC Chair," said UK Culture Secretary Lucy Frazer as she announced his selection.

"He has a clear ambition to see the BBC succeed in a rapidly changing media landscape, and I have no doubt he will provide the support and scrutiny that the BBC needs to meet the challenges and opportunities of the

future," she said.

Shah, who was honored with a CBE (Commander of the Order of the British Empire) by Queen Elizabeth II in 2019 for services to television and heritage, will replace Richard Sharp who had been forced to resign after a communication with former prime minister Boris Johnson came under scrutiny.

The government has said that Shah's knowledge of BBC and his belief in its role as a national broadcaster alongside his extensive work to promote diversity in broadcasting will be invaluable in helping to ensure that BBC reflects, represents and serves communities across the whole of the UK.

"BBC is, without doubt, one of the greatest contributions we have made to global culture and one of our strongest calling cards on soft power. If I am able to

put what skills, experience, and understanding of public service broadcasting I have built up during my career to help this brilliant organization meet the complex and diverse challenges it faces over the coming years, it would be an honor," said Shah.

"BBC has a great place in British life and a unique duty to reach a wide audience right across the country and I will do all I can to ensure it fulfills this in an increasingly competitive market," he said.

Born in Aurangabad, Shah came to England in 1960 and has previously been the head of current affairs and political programs at BBC.

Before taking up the role as BBC Chair, he was the CEO of Juniper - an independent television and radio production company, since 1998.

He was elected a fellow of Royal Television Society in 2002 and appointed visiting professor of creative media at Oxford University in 2019 and the University of Nottingham appointed him to a special professorship in Department of Post-Conflict Studies.

Besides, the Oxford University alumnus is a race relations expert who co-authored the government's Commission on Race and Ethnic Disparities report in 2021.

## Indian American man arrested in connection with father's murder in New Jersey

The tragic incident unfolded on Friday, February 16, 2024, when the Paramus Police Department responded to a call about a potential homicide at 693 Bruce Drive. Upon arrival, officers discovered the lifeless body of Manuel V. Thomas in the basement of the residence. Manuel Thomas had sustained multiple stab wounds and was pronounced dead at the scene.

Melvin Thomas was swiftly identified as a suspect and taken into custody by Paramus police officers.

# The message from two SC verdicts

**THE RULING PARTY'S CONFIDENCE SHOULD NOT PROMPT ITS SUPPORTERS TO SHAKE FOUNDATIONS OF INDIAN DEMOCRACY**

**"The Election Commission of India (ECI) was a fiercely independent institution when it was helmed by TN Seshan. Herein lies the sad story of Indian institutions. The character of most of these institutions changes with the person at the top. The court's order on electoral bonds is a wake-up call for the ECI. Indian elections are free and fair. But the first-past-the-post system seeks its credibility entirely from the institution that conducts the polls. And if the conductor falters, the process gets easily accused of manipulation."**

The Supreme Court's judgments on the electoral bonds and the Chandigarh mayoral election are epoch-making. There cannot be a graver offence to democracy than anonymous election funding. Anonymity is synonymous with deception and corruption. While nameless funders possibly conceal their business and personal objectives, only transparency can help make the voter do a cost-benefit analysis between a funder and the funded political entity. So, it is imperative for the voter to know who is funding his or her chosen candidate.

A local poll to elect a mayor became a test case, and the court has majestically ensured that the Indian system passes it to prove that it still works.

By delivering a verdict annulling the electoral bond scheme, the apex court Bench headed by Chief Justice of India DY Chandrachud has saved the constitutional foundations of the Republic. This ruling, while enhancing the SC's stature as the final institutional bulwark of constitutional morality, also points fingers at other constitutional bodies that have begun to behave like government appendages.

The Election Commission of India (ECI) was a fiercely independent institution when it was helmed by TN Seshan. Herein lies the sad story of Indian institutions. The character of most of these institutions changes with the person at the top. The court's order on electoral bonds is a wake-up call for the ECI. Indian elections are free and fair. But the first-past-the-post system seeks its credibility entirely from the



institution that conducts the polls. And if the conductor falters, the process gets easily accused of manipulation.

That is something the Indian democracy can ill afford, particularly in the context of all the barbs of it being an elected autocracy hurled by the Western academia and its media.

Equally important is the SC verdict reversing the Chandigarh mayoral poll result. Presiding officer Anil Masih was caught on camera blatantly defacing ballot papers to make valid votes for the AAP-Congress candidate invalid. This was nothing short of 'murder of democracy', no doubt.

A local poll to elect a mayor became a test case, and the court has majestically ensured that the Indian system passes it to prove that it still works. But how many such tests and shocks can the system withstand before it capitulates is a question that the votaries of the strong government need to ask themselves. A strong government derives its strength from the people's conviction, not from arm-twisting tactics of its storm-troopers.

Despite the two setbacks from the top court, the BJP is on an unassailable electoral upswing. The consecration of the Ram Temple in Ayodhya has created such a groundswell of religious goodwill for PM Modi among temple-going ordinary Hindus that it is now a mundane exercise for him to convert it into political capital for the polls. Then, of course, there is the added advantage of the Opposition remaining a house divided. Going by the last election's schedule, there are less than 50 days left for the first phase of polling. Yet, the Opposition has not firmed up poll tie-ups.

All those who may call the Indian democracy names after the elections should seriously look at the sorry state of the Opposition right now. As of today, it is not clear whether AAP and the Congress will have an alliance in Punjab. Even in Delhi, where a 4-3 formula of seat-sharing is being talked about, there is no official announcement so far. The Samajwadi-Congress alliance in Uttar Pradesh is the only one that has been sealed. Meanwhile, Rahul Gandhi has taken a break from his yatra to lecture at Cambridge, as if Oxbridge scholars' votes count in Amethi or Wayanad.

The urgency of a group preparing to take on a juggernaut is glaringly missing in the terribly slow pace at which Opposition parties move. Incidentally, the Left, which is the fulcrum on which the Opposition in Delhi turns, has announced its candidates, including the one who would take on Rahul, if he contests from Wayanad. But a political understanding with Mamata Banerjee that could have altered the scene in West Bengal is still eluding the Congress as the BJP tries to project itself as her biggest challenger in the state.

Unless there is an unseen anti-incumbency storm gathering amongst the masses, there is no chance of a serious challenge to PM Modi's electoral pole position in these circumstances. The possibility of a third term for Modi looks strong. However, that confidence should not prompt his followers to shake the foundations of Indian democracy - which is the message from the SC verdicts.

A recent issue of The Economist magazine has a brilliant leader on the perils of national conservatism. In the context of the American elections, the magazine talks about Trump's aides

# What farmers want is the freedom to sell their produce

**POLICY-MAKING IS EASY. WHAT'S DIFFICULT IS THE CREATION OF PHYSICAL AND IT INFRASTRUCTURE**

**"Policy-making is the easy part. What's difficult is the creation of physical and IT infrastructure. The hardest part is the task of making it work on the ground. The recent bestowal of the Bharat Ratna on former Prime Ministers Charan Singh and PV Narasimha Rao and scientist-administrator Dr MS Swaminathan was a tribute to the entrepreneurial spirit of the Indian farmer.

All three were deeply invested in and committed to agriculture as well as farmers' welfare. Swaminathan's contribution is well-known and acknowledged, but it is equally important to understand the political economy in which the Green Revolution was successful. It was Charan Singh who explained to Nehru the pitfalls of the Soviet and Chinese types of 'collective farming'. He was clear that farmers were fiercely independent cultivators and were vehemently opposed to any centralized plan of 'land pooling and cooperative farming', which the Planning Commission was enamored of.

It was during Rao's tenure that India joined the World Trade Organization and signed the Agreement on Agriculture. Till then, India's policy regime had restricted imports. Under Rao, India looked to agri-exports as an important foreign exchange earner. With budgetary and institutional support to APEDA (Agricultural and Processed Food Products Export Development Authority), he helped Indian agriculture become globally competitive, though domestic trade

continued to be operated through restrictive trade practices that were good for the procurement agencies and registered traders of the Agricultural Produce Market Committees (APMCs), but not for the farmers.

Perhaps the most meaningful policy intervention made by him was the establishment of the Small Farmers' Agri-business Consortium (SFAC) in 1994. The organization has now been tasked with the establishment of the national electronic market for agriculture. A transformative initiative was launched by PM Narendra Modi on April 14, 2016: the SFAC-backed Electronic National Agriculture Market (eNAM), a 'phygital' (physical plus digital) market. This is a single-window portal with a physical back end that provides actionable information, physical infrastructure, trade options and electronic settlement of payments.

Today, thanks to this initiative of the SFAC, 10.7 million farmers have the freedom, flexibility and facilities to transact across 1,389 regulated wholesale markets in 23 states and four union territories (UTs) in their own language on their mobile phones. Another 1.7 lakh integrated licenses have been issued by the participating states and UTs, but of even greater significance is the active participation of around 3,500 Farmer Producer Organizations (FPOs), for their transactions reflect granular support for this platform. As of January 2024, business of over Rs 3 lakh crore has been

transacted on this platform.

It is imperative to share the backstory of this successful intervention. When the APMCs were introduced in the 1950s, the farmer needed protection against distress sale. The APMCs were designed to ensure 'price discovery' and provide a platform for procurement by state agencies under the MSP regime. However, in this process, they also created a special class of intermediaries: the trader who had a license to operate in the particular mandi with its notified command area.

However, as India became an IT superpower and agriculture moved from a peasant to a market mode of production, there was a need to change the restrictive rules of trade. Institutions like the SFAC were established to leverage technologies and financial instruments to improve the terms of trade for marginal and small farmers. From providing venture capital funds to agri-business entrepreneurs to the creation of infrastructure, the SFAC broke new ground in the establishment of FPOs, market intelligence, warehousing and procurement support. No wonder the mandate for the establishment of the eNAM was also given to the SFAC.

To set the ball rolling, the Agriculture Ministry gave a grant of Rs 30 lakh per mandi for equipment or infrastructure, such as computer hardware, Internet facilities and assaying equipment, among others, in those regulated mandis for the installation of the e-market platform.

This was enhanced to Rs 75 lakh in 2017 for the creation of additional infrastructure like cleaning, grading and packaging facilities and a bio-composting

unit. While in the first three years, about 200 mandis were brought under its purview, the pace picked up with 415 mandis by May 2020, another 260 by July 2022, yet another 101 by March 2023, and 28 by the end of the last calendar year. The number has been growing every quarter.

Policy-making is the easy part. What's difficult is the creation of physical and IT infrastructure. The hardest part is the task of making it work on the ground. The SFAC identifies and supports an IT expert (mandi analyst) for initial handholding for a period of one year for each mandi integrated with eNAM. They report to the state coordinator(s), each of whom handles the day-to-day coordination for 50 mandis each. They are also responsible for providing pro bono training to all stakeholders in the eNAM system: farmers, traders, commission agents and mandi officials.

What next? Rather than rest on its laurels, the eNAM is setting newer and higher standards. Its revised mandate includes the expansion and consolidation of the eNAM by opening a platform beyond the APMC/Regulated Market Committee mandis to ensure competitive price realization for farmers. There is increased emphasis on warehouse-based sale and through eNAM. In the final analysis, it is price discovery and the freedom to sell that will usher in greater prosperity for the farmer.

# The season of defections is here

Very soon, the BJP ranks will be stacked with Congress leaders seeking a lucrative future. After former Maharashtra Chief Minister Ashok Chavan left the Congress and joined the BJP, former Madhya Pradesh CM Kamal Nath seems ready to jump the 'sinking ship'.

The inability of INDIA parties to look beyond their noses has virtually sealed their fate.

Nath had handed over Madhya Pradesh to the BJP on a platter due to his misreading of the voters' preferences and mishandling of other anti-BJP parties.

Chavan's standing in Maharashtra politics was visibly on the decline. He had even lost his Nanded seat to the BJP's Prataprao Govindrao Chikhalkar in the 2019 Lok Sabha elections. His father, Shankarrao Chavan, was a highly respected politician who had served as the CM and Union Home Minister. Shankarrao had scruples about corruption which his son did not share.

Chavan has been nominated to the Rajya Sabha by his new-found friends. He will have to compete for a ministership with other turncoats from Maharashtra like Narayan Rane, who was another 'candidate' for probes by investigation agencies had he not crossed over a few years ago.

The migration of the inglorious from the Opposition to the ruling party has picked up steam before the Lok Sabha polls. Is the BJP's goal a Congress-mukt polity or an Opposition-mukt one? Starting with those with skeletons in their cupboards, others who hanker for the spoils of office or just want to feel important will gravitate to the winning side. Greed is the guide. The BJP capitalizes on this.

Recently, the AAP-Congress combine was assured of victory in the

Chandigarh mayoral poll with 20 votes out of 36. The returning officer invalidated eight votes to ensure the BJP's win. The Supreme Court had to intervene and order the prosecution of the returning officer. It declared the AAP-Congress candidate as the winner. Before the SC verdict, the BJP, the party that had once proclaimed that it was 'different', carried out 'Operation Lotus' to make three AAP councilors switch camps.

Poaching legislators is not new to our democracy. The BJP has sharpened this unethical method to a fine art after tasting blood. In Karnataka, it displaced the Congress government by successfully luring a good number of its legislators to change sides. In Maharashtra, this game is being played out even today. The voters who voted against the BJP have been short-changed. They vote for a particular party on ideological grounds but cannot be sure that those whom the party has chosen to represent them will continue to reflect their aspirations, once elected.

This is a structural weakness of Indian democracy. It needs to be urgently addressed. No legislator or corporator should be allowed to cross over mid-

term. If he has concerns about the policies of the party on whose ticket he was elected, he should resign from the Assembly and re-contest on the ticket of his new party. If he is popular in his constituency, he may well win again, but at least those who voted for him or her on ideological grounds will not be let down.

Since the BJP's new tactic of remaining in power at any cost, fair or foul, has obviously kicked in, it is urgent to restore our good name in the democratic world by devising a mechanism to combat this menace of 'Aaya Rams' coming and 'Gaya Rams' going for reasons far removed from dissatisfaction with the policies followed by the party which they have decided to discard.

The inability of INDIA parties to look beyond their noses has virtually sealed their fate. After the votes are counted and Modi is back in North Block for another term of five years, expect Opposition leaders to face the music in a much more defined degree. The ED, the CBI and other Central agencies will make their lives uncomfortable. Only those who cross over can expect to be absolved of their sins.

If the BJP gets a two-thirds majority in Parliament, the Constitution will be subject to revision. Women, in particular, will have to conform to a rigid standard of morality. Live-in relationships, which are now common among the urban liberated youth, will be frowned upon, like we have seen in Uttarakhand, whose holier-than-thou Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhami has introduced the Uniform Civil Code

(UCC), which restricts choices in love and marriage.

I have no objection to the UCC as long as the objective is to ensure that women are treated on a par with men. The rights of the woman in inheritance of her father's property and her right to choose her life partner should be upheld. There are myriad related issues like divorce and adoption, but the right to inheritance and the right to choose one's spouse are paramount.

It is not wise to advise the BJP to desist from accepting tainted members of Opposition parties in its fold. The BJP is on a roll. Modi consecrated the Ram Mandir at Ayodhya, secured the release of eight former Navy personnel sentenced to death by a court in Qatar for alleged spying, and inaugurated a Hindu temple in a Muslim-majority country (UAE).

Unfortunately, there are counter-balancing issues. The farmers' agitation for legal guarantee for procurement at the MSP is one such issue. If the demand is conceded, it will compromise fiscal responsibility. The unabated violence in Manipur is another. The BJP knows the people responsible for the raging fire, but its hands are tied. If the incompetent CM Biren Singh is replaced, the Meitei vote will be in doubt. Reservation for Marathas is yet another issue that defies accepted solutions. It is not going to be an easy ride!

There are many other such problems that Modi will have to solve, but he is postponing action till the Lok Sabha polls are over.

# 33 non-profit bodies to participate in second India Giving Day in US

**WASHINGTON, D.C. (TIP):** As many as 33 top Indian American nonprofit organizations are participating in the India Giving Day on March 1, during which organizers expect to raise money for important social welfare programs in India.

"The number (results) we're going to announce at the end of India Giving Day

is going to be significantly larger than last year. That's because we have a track record as we've been working all year long and people are excited," Alex Counts, executive director of the India Philanthropy Alliance and India Giving Day told PTI in an interview.

India Philanthropy Alliance is a network of non-profit organizations that mobilize people and funding in the US for high-impact development programs in India.

The second edition of the annual India Giving Day organized by India Philanthropy Alliance has launched a nationwide campaign to generate awareness among Indian Americans and "friends of India" in the US to donate generously on this important day dedicated to raise funds for a host of critical social and economic issues in India.

The inaugural edition last year raised USD 1.3 million in one day. All funds raised through India Giving Day will be used to support programs based in India or to build a more robust fundraising operation in the US to benefit India, Counts said.

"The three (issues) that were most common, perhaps almost exclusive

issues last year were education for the poor, healthcare for the poor, wellbeing and third was we put a broad category of livelihoods, the ability of people to generate economic sustainability for themselves through good jobs and entrepreneurship," he said.

"Those remain central to what we're doing. This year we're adding a few more. We're adding a few organizations that work in environmental preservation and climate change. We have a couple of groups that work in animal rights and animal welfare. We are expanding with more cultural organizations. Most of our money will be going towards these three -- health education and livelihood," Counts said.

Urging Indian Americans and "friends of India" to donate generously, Counts said: "Give when you have surplus. If someone is just living paycheck to paycheck and is struggling economically, they can give in other ways. They can give their time. I wouldn't want them to be giving financially. But for those who have been fortunate enough who've worked hard to develop some surplus financial resources, giving can be something that's done in a communal and collective way."

He said that for many who are part of India Giving Day, it is where they were born or where their parents were born. Giving is an opportunity to really change that society for the better, to give new opportunities for healthcare, education, environment preservation, livelihoods.

"It's an opportunity to do it joyfully, to do it communally and to do it when you choose organizations that are really well designed," the executive director of the alliance said. India, he asserted, has some of the best NGOs in the world and they do all or most of their work in India.

"So you're not talking about organizations that are kind of poorly organized. The 33 groups we have here are some of the best non-profits in the entire world. So when you work with them, you really have confidence that it'll bring change," Counts said.

"I just ask people to also just do it, give what you can, give it joyfully, where you let others see what you're giving and inspire them to give and know that if you choose groups that are well trained and well and they can execute, you're going to change India as a result," Counts said in response to a question, he added.

# Inspired by the Sikh notion of oneness, says Indian American running for Congress

**WASHINGTON, D.C. (TIP):** Krystle Kaul, a noted Indian American defense and national security expert, says her running for the US Congress is inspired by the Sikh tradition of oneness and a strong sense of giving back to the community.

"I am half Kashmiri Pandit and half Punjabi Sikh. I am very proud of both of my cultural backgrounds. Growing up in America, being bicultural is something unique and something that I have embraced. My grandparents and my parents have embedded that in me. I am proud to stand today as the first ever Kashmiri Pandit to stand for Congress and also as the only Sikh woman to currently run for Congress in the country," Krystle told PTI in a recent interview.

Kaul, who speaks nine languages - English, Hindi, Urdu, Punjabi, Spanish, Italian, Arabic, Dari and Kashmiri -- is running from the 10th Congressional District of Virginia. The incumbent Jennifer Wexton, a Democrat, is not seeking re-election, therefore making it an open seat.

"My Nani (grandmother) Vimal Chaddha Malik used to take me to Glen Cove Gurdwara in Long Island, New York. There I would serve langar. I learned a lot about Sikh traditions and the notion of oneness. I'm proud of that. That's something that has given me a very strong sense of community and giving back and is one of the core values that I embrace in my bid for Congress," she said.

"At the core of the tenets of Sikhism is this idea of feeding your community, of service, of making sure that everyone has what they need and that is reflective. If you go to Amritsar, for example, to the Golden Temple, you see that everyone gets fed at the Golden Temple. The halwa

there is also the best in the world, I think," she said.

"It's just a really beautiful concept to see in the community there on a micro level and one that can be scaled internationally and that can be embraced here in Virginia District 10. So again, I'm very proud of both sides of my heritage being Hindu and Sikh, and very proud of the fact that I stand again as the only Sikh woman running for Congress in the country today because we need representation and that's important," Kaul said.

Notably, Dalip Singh Saund was the first Indian American, a Sikh, to be elected to the US House of Representatives from the 29th Congressional District of California for three terms beginning in 1957.

In the current Congress, there are five Indian Americans in the House of Representatives: Dr Ami Bera, Ro Khanna, Raja Krishnamoorthi, Pramila Jayapal and Shri Thanedar. Jayapal is the first ever and only Indian American woman to be elected to the House of Representatives.

Dalip Singh Saund is often a name that gets forgotten, Krystle said.

"Today we focus heavily on the five Indian American members who were in Congress, but preceding all of them was this one Sikh man who came in as an outlier and was able to get the mass community support in his district at a time when we were such a new immigrant community in this country. That's something that I'm proud of and one that I think is very notable," she said.

Despite doing well in various fields in the US, the Sikh community is not seen much in politics, she noted. "The Sikh community has done very well as the Indian American community, but as a subgroup. In terms of education, in terms of business and engineering, and

IT and medicine across the board," she said.

"This group definitely needs representation. Of course, there have been a lot of cases of discrimination against Sikhs, which is very unfortunate," Kaul said.

Responding to a question, Krystle said there have been a lot of cases of discrimination against Sikhs, which is very unfortunate. "I've seen it in my district, I've seen it in Virginia, and I've seen it at a national level. I say repeatedly, it doesn't matter (how much is) your bank balance, it doesn't matter how prominent you are, if you're a Sikh man, you wear a turban. It's a visible thing that you wear and something that can be used against you in terms of a hate crime," she pointed out.

There is a need to create more awareness and understanding that this is something that is part of a religion and one that should be respected, she said.

"That is through education, through awareness, and that comes from representation. When you have people in Congress who say, hey, I stand up proudly to be a Sikh and this is not okay, you cannot do this. That's when people start to listen. I think that's something that I want to advocate," she added.

Kaul said her campaign is doing good and she is running a genuine, authentic and grassroots campaign. "I have the most cash on hand today. I came out very strong in Q4 with USD 567,000 in cash on hand surpassing all candidates by a lot. They told me I couldn't do it. They often underestimate you as a woman, as a woman of color and particularly as they see women. I worked really hard," she said.

"Along with cash on hand, I also have a very strong and growing team. I have a team that's right now 85 plus and growing. A lot of great top firms, and

amazing staff that I have on hand, but also a volunteer team that exceeds 50 in several districts, in several states and also nationally who are really inspired. A lot of them are young Indian American girls in particular, which I'm really proud of, a lot of young Sikh girls for example," Kaul said.

"I also have a very multicultural growing volunteer base of Latinos, people from different communities," she said, asserting that it "showcases a strong base".

She said she spoke at the Sikh International Film Festival in New York where she got to interact with filmmakers, the heads of Sikhs for America, the Punjabi Chamber of Commerce, and the Sikh Chamber of Commerce.

"I've got a lot of support from very many prominent Sikhs, again locally and nationally. And that has also felt great just from a community standpoint and one that is tied to my cultural roots," she said. (Source: PTI)

## Nikki Haley makes a compelling pitch to South Carolina voters ahead of key primary in home state

**CHARLESTON, SC (TIP):** Indian-American presidential candidate Nikki Haley on Friday, February 23, made a compelling argument to fellow Republicans in South Carolina, on the eve of the crucial primary elections, with many of her supporters saying that she is the best bet for the US right now.

Several Indian Americans who attended her political rally in her home state of South Carolina on the eve of the Republican presidential primary said that Haley would be the best person to lead the United States.

With fingers crossed, given that former president Donald Trump is leading by over 22 percentage points, these Indian Americans were confident that Haley, 52,

would continue her presidential campaign after Saturday and go up to the GOP convention.

Even as Haley, a two-time former governor of South Carolina, has bridged the gap -- once was more than 30 per cent -- with Trump in South Carolina, the national media has virtually written her off and believes that the former president and her ex-boss would be the eventual nominee of the Republican Party.

Haley and her team do not believe so. "In a general election, you're given a choice. In a primary election, you make your choice," she said.

"This is the time for us to make our choice," Haley, a former US ambassador to the UN, told her supporters

numbering a couple of hundred at the Patriots Point site in Charleston, South Carolina ahead of Saturday's Republican primary.

"We can either do more of the same, and more of the same is not just Joe Biden, more of the same is Donald Trump, or we can elect a new generational leader that will lead us forward with solutions for the future," she said, asserting that she is not leaving the race.

"Some people in the media thought I would drop out of the race. Well, I'm not. Far from it," she said. Haley said it is time to bring back normalcy to the US.

## India, US deliberate on student mobility, legal migration

India and the US discussed the mobility of students and professionals and safe and legal migration at the 11 Consular Dialogue in New Delhi on Feb 23.

They also discussed ways of enhancing cooperation on a wide range of issues such as extradition, protection of vulnerable women and children and enabling smooth travel of their respective nationals, said an MEA statement.

For the US side, the issue of massive illegal migration from India via chartered flights to Nicaragua has become an issue. Last year, US border authorities reported that nearly one lakh Indians were arrested while trying to enter the US illegally.

The Indian delegation was led by MEA's Joint Secretary KJ Srinivasa and the US delegation by Rena Bitter, Assistant Secretary in the Department of State. "The dialogue reinforced the strong people-to-people ties and cooperation that both nations share across consular issues of mutual interest. They welcomed the launch of a pilot in the US to adjudicate domestic renewals of certain categories of visas as proactive steps toward strengthening connections between people of the two nations," said the statement.

# Trinamool snubs Congress alliance efforts, to contest all Lok Sabha seats in Bengal

NEW DELHI (TIP)

Trinamool Congress leader Derek O'Brien on Friday, Feb 23, reiterated his party's stand to go solo in the upcoming Lok Sabha elections in West Bengal. The TMC leader said that there has been 'no change' in the party's stand of contesting all 42 Lok Sabha seats in West Bengal, a few in Assam and one seat in Meghalaya. The remark came amid reports that the Congress party had revived talks with the Mamata Banerjee-led TMC for an alliance in the state.

"A few weeks ago...West Bengal chief minister Mamata Banerjee stated that TMC is fighting all the 42 seats in Bengal. We are also in the fray in a few seats in Assam and the Tura Lok Sabha seat in Meghalaya. There is no change in this position," Derek O'Brien stated.

Earlier on Feb 23, the Congress said that the seat-sharing talks between the party and TMC were back on track after the latter had initially claimed that it would go solo in the LS elections in April-May.

The Congress has recently sealed an alliance in Uttar Pradesh with the Samajwadi Party. In the 80 Lok Sabha seats in Uttar Pradesh, the Congress will contest 17 seats and the Samajwadi Party will contest 63 seats.

Raebareli, Amethi, Fatehpur Sikri, Saharanpur, Prayagraj, Maharajganj, Varanasi, Amroha, Jhansi, Bulandshahr, Ghaziabad, Mathura, Sitapur, Barabanki, Kanpur, Bansgaon and Deoria will be contested by the Congress party. The rest are with SP.

In Maharashtra, the party is in alliance with Uddhav Balasaheb Thackeray's Sena and Sharad Pawar's NCP. Talks on finalising LS seats are currently underway between Congress and its INDIA bloc allies in the state.

Out of the seven Lok Sabha seats in Delhi, AAP will reportedly contest four and Congress will contest three.

Mamata Banerjee had last month said the talks with the Congress failed after the latter refused an offer she made.

She also pointed to delays in finalising a seat-sharing agreement. She had also vowed to not ally with the Congress till it is an alliance with her bitter rival CPI(M).

Congress leader Adhir Ranjan Chowdhury had claimed the TMC offered only two seats to his party. Later, Derek O'Brien claimed the politician was one of the main reasons for the party's decision to contest the Lok Sabha polls alone.

Reacting to Trinamool Congress MP Derek O'Brien's remark that his party will contest the upcoming Lok Sabha elections alone, Jairam Ramesh said on Saturday that the Congress's discussions with the TMC for an alliance in West Bengal are underway. Downplaying the leader's remark, the politician said heated discussions keep taking place between the two parties but "we respect Mamata Banerjee".

Jairam Ramesh made the remark on the sidelines of Rahul Gandhi's Bharat Jodo Yatra in Uttar Pradesh's Moradabad.

"Discussions are underway. Our doors are always open for TMC. Mamata Banerjee and TMC have said that they want to strengthen the INDIA Alliance and the biggest motive is to defeat the BJP," he told ANI.

## INDIA dividing on caste lines, its leaders will struggle to save deposits, says PM Modi

NEW DELHI (TIP)

In his sharpest attack on the INDIA bloc, Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Friday said the bloc leaders "will struggle to save their deposits in the upcoming General Election" even as he accused them of dividing people on caste lines.

In a no-holds-barred criticism of the Opposition, the PM singled out the Congress and said, "The members of Congress royal family are calling the youth of Banaras 'nashedi' (drunken/intoxicated). Those who are themselves not in 'hosh' (senses) are calling our youngsters 'nashedi'. What kind of language is this?" the PM said, addressing constituents of his Lok Sabha segment Varanasi. The PM said INDIA leaders were busy dividing the society on caste lines and predicted their defeat in the 18th General Election.

"These days, there is one more reason behind the anxiety and anger of INDIA leaders. They are unable to stomach the new look of Kashi and Ayodhya. Look at how they attack Ram Mandir in their speeches, the kind of utterances they use to undermine the Ram Mandir. I did not know that the Congress hated Lord Ram so much," PM Modi said. He slammed dynastic parties and said such parties "cannot look beyond their families and vote banks". "That is why they ally before every election and

when the result is 'neel battey sannata' (zero divided by zero equals nothing), then they abuse one another and part ways. But they do not know this is Banaras. Everyone is a guru here. Here the machinations of the INDIA alliance

will not work," PM Modi said. He said the entire Uttar Pradesh should know that the INDIA alliance was the "same old stuff in a new package".

"This time they will have to struggle hard to even save their deposits," the PM said.

Earlier in his speech, he termed the recent remarks made by Rahul Gandhi as "shocking".

"You will be shocked to learn what did the royal family of the Congress say? They are saying UP youth are 'nashedi'. What kind of language is this? They have spent two decades abusing Modi but now they have started venting frustration on people of UP," the PM said, adding family-based parties of the Opposition should know that the youth of UP were working hard to build a developed state and golden futures.

Rahul, during his Bharat Jodo Nyay Yatra in Varanasi, had said, "The youth here are inebriated, lying on the streets, dancing at night. The future of the youth of UP is intoxicated."

On a visit to his parliamentary seat, the PM addressed an event to commemorate the 647th birth anniversary of Sant Ravidas and also unveiled his statue, engaged the winners of the 'Sansad Sanskrit Pratiyogita' at BHU, and inaugurated projects worth over Rs 13,000 crore.

## AAP, Cong finalise 4:3 seat-sharing formula for Lok Sabha seats in Delhi

The Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) is likely to contest four of the seven Lok Sabha seats in Delhi and leave the remaining three to its alliance partner, the Congress, as part of a seat-sharing agreement being finalised by leaders of the two parties, people aware of the matter said.

Citing the discussions between the two sides, a Congress leader said an agreement had been arrived between the two sides on the formula and the talks on the seats to be contested by the two parties were in the final stages. According to one arrangement being discussed, the Congress may contest East, Chandani Chowk and North East Lok Sabha seats; while AAP may contest New Delhi, West Delhi, South Delhi and North West Lok Sabha seats.

AAP minister Atishi declined to comment on the details of the negotiations. "The talks are on and we are hopeful of closing the deal," she said.

A senior Delhi Congress leader said the 4:3 formula was final but there could be some changes to the seats contested by the two sides.

All of the seven Lok Sabha seats in Delhi are currently held by the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) which has been winning all the seats since 2014.

In 2019 when the AAP and the Congress contested the Lok Sabha elections separately, the Congress was second on five seats and the AAP was second on two.

The AAP had come to the negotiating table with an offer of just one seat for the Congress, citing its alliance partner's track record in previous assembly and municipal elections.

"Congress has zero Lok Sabha seats in Delhi, it has zero seats in Delhi assembly. Out of 250 wards, the Congress won only 9 seats in the (2022) MCD election," AAP national general secretary (organisation) Sandeep Pathak said on February 13.

## Probe agencies being misused to 'extort' donations for BJP: Cong

### NEW DELHI (TIP)

The Congress on Friday, Feb 23, alleged that probe agencies were being misused to "extort" donations for the BJP from private companies and demanded a Supreme Court-monitored probe into what it called "hafta-vasooli" by the government.

Addressing a press conference, Congress general secretary in-charge communications Jairam Ramesh alleged that at least 30 companies, which donated a total of nearly Rs 335 crore to the BJP between financial years 2018-19 and 2022-23, faced investigation by central agencies during that period.

Ramesh said Congress general secretary in-charge organisation K C Venugopal on Friday wrote to Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman over the issue and asked why the government should not be open to a Supreme Court-monitored probe into the donations received by the BJP.

Congress leader Rahul Gandhi in a post on X said, "Do you know about the Prime Minister's 'Donate, take bail

and business' scheme? In the country, the Prime Minister is doing business like 'vasooli bhai' by misusing ED, IT and CBI."

He said reports have revealed that 30 companies that faced investigation by various agencies, which have become "recovery agents" now, donated Rs 335 crore to the BJP during the investigation.

"The donation business is going on so shamelessly that the owners of a distillery in MP donated to the BJP as soon as they got the bail. Benefitting the company of a friend by dishonesty and adopting different rules for others? 'Illegal donations' and 'Electoral Bonds' given to BJP under Modi rule are the guarantee of 'Ease of Doing Business,'" Gandhi said in his post in Hindi, using the hashtag "#HaftaVasooliSarkar".

Ramesh asked if the government would come up with a "white paper" on the BJP's finances, not just the sources but how corporate firms were "coerced" to donate by misusing investigative agencies against them.

"If you have nothing to hide, then are you willing to present a point-by-point rebuttal on the 'chronology' of events which led to the filling of BJP's treasury?" he asked.

## Farmer's death: Unions reject Rs 1-cr relief, want FIR first

### PATIALA (TIP)

Farmer leaders participating in the "Delhi Chalo" agitation under the banner of the Samyukta Kisan Morcha (Non-Political) on Friday, Feb 23, said the cremation of Shubh Karan Singh, who died amid clashes between Haryana Police and Punjab farmers, will not take place till the Punjab government registers a case against those responsible it.

The development came hours after Punjab chief minister Bhagwant Mann announced a compensation of Rs 1 crore and a government job for Shubh Karan's sister.

Subh Karan Singh, 21, a native of Bathinda, died on Wednesday at Khanauri border point on the Punjab-Haryana border amid clashes between Haryana Police and Punjab farmers.

The incident took place when the farmers rushed to the barricades, several layers of which had been erected by Haryana authorities to prevent farmers from proceeding with their march and clashed with police.

According to the medical superintendent of Rajindra Hospital, Patiala, Subh Karan had an injury to his head. The post-mortem was delayed as the farmers pressed for acceptance of their demands.

Addressing a press conference at Government Rajindra Hospital, Patiala, Kisan Mazdoor Sangharsh Committee general secretary Sarwan Singh Pandher said that the post-mortem of the 21-year-old farm protester will not be conducted till the Punjab Police register an FIR against Haryana Police. Punjab chief minister had asserted that stringent action would be taken against those responsible for Shubh Karan's death. But now the officials are saying that it was not possible, he said.

"We have told the (Shubh Karan)



family that it may take two days or 10 days. For us money is not important. We are demanding that an FIR be lodged and then cremation will take place," he said and accused Punjab government officials of "pressuring" Shubh Karan's family into agreeing to the cremation. Toeing the line, Charanjit Singh, father of Shubh Karan, said: "Till Punjab Police register a case against Haryana Police officials, we won't allow the administration to conduct the post-mortem. Money doesn't matter to us, justice does."

Replying to a question, Jagjit Singh Dallewal, leader of SKM (Non-Political) that is spearheading the 'Delhi Chalo' march along with the Kisan Mazdoor Sangharsh Committee, claimed the Bathinda senior superintendent of police has said that police could not register a case against Haryana security personnel.

"If you cannot register a case, then how can you call yourself 'Punjab de rakhe' (Punjab's protector)," Dallewal said, adding the police officer told them that if they registered a case, then Haryana security personnel would also do so.

Replying to another question, Dallewal said, "A youth died during our

agitation. Our priority is to ensure justice for him. We are concentrating on it. It is up to the Punjab government how soon it will give justice to us."

Punjab CM Mann on Friday announced compensation and a job for Shubh Karan's sister.

"The family of Shubh Karan Singh, who got martyred during the farmer's movement at Khanauri border, will be given financial assistance of ?1 crore by the Punjab government and a government job to his younger sister. Due legal action will be taken against culprits," he said in a post on 'X' in Punjabi.

Farmers leaders were also demanding "martyr" status for Shubhkar Singh.

Thousands of farmers from Punjab are protesting at two interstate borders with Haryana to press their demands to the Centre.

Among the major demands of the farmers are a legal guarantee for the Minimum Support Price (MSP) on all crops and a complete loan waiver for all farmers. For this, the farmers are marching towards the national capital but are currently facing stiff barricading at the Haryana borders.







For those who know about flamenco guitar or gipsy guitar, the nickname "Tomatito" has a lot of resonance. It belongs to José Fernández Torres. With an artistic career that covers five decades, Tomatito has achieved a high level of recognition and appreciation from the public. This is not only well deserved, but also justifies his influence on the musical genre of flamenco guitar.

Being the son of another famous flamenco guitarist, El Tomate - and having Miguel Tomate as his grandfather - young José Fernández was exposed to the beauty, metric scope, harmony and melody that comprise flamenco music throughout his childhood and infancy.

In a way, you could say that being a flamenco guitarist runs through your veins - it's in your genes. His uncle, Miguel Vega de la Cruz, better known to the public as El Niño Miguel, provided the young José with an example of the levels of success that could be achieved within flamenco music.

Today, this talent can also be seen in Tomatito's son, José del Tomate, who most recently accompanied his

father on his international tours.



**LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD**

Rufus Reid, Gala honoree

At the event, award-winning jazz bassist, educator, and composer Rufus Reid will be honored with its Lifetime Achievement Award. An active presence in the jazz world since the 1970s, Reid has

recorded over 500 albums and can be heard on recordings with Dexter Gordon, Andrew Hill, The Thad Jones/Mel Lewis Quartet, Kenny Barron, Stan Getz, J.J. Johnson, Lee Konitz, and Jack DeJohnette, among others.

His reputation as an educator is equal to that of his musical achievements. Reid's book, *The Evolving Bassist* (Myriad Limited, 1974), remains the industry standard for double bass methodology. Reid and Dr. Martin Krivin created the Jazz Studies and Performance Bachelor of Music Program at William Paterson University, a program offering the first professional academically accredited Bachelor of Music in Jazz Studies in the tri-state area.

Reid received the prestigious John Simon Guggenheim Memorial Foundation Fellowship and the MacDowell Colony Grant. His 2014 release, *Quiet Pride - The Elizabeth Catlett Project*, received two Grammy Nominations for Best Large Jazz Ensemble and Best Instrumental Composition.

The prestigious Wharton Arts Lifetime Achievement Award distinguishes individuals who, during their lifetime, have made creative contributions of outstanding artistic significance to the performing arts and represent a beacon of inspiration to Wharton Arts' students.

Previous Wharton Arts Lifetime Achievement honorees were Jamie Bernstein, John Debney, Paul Shaffer, and Angel Blue.

George Marriner Maull, Gala honoree

In addition to the Lifetime Achievement Award, Wharton Arts will honor George Marriner Maull with its Education Award at the Gala. Maestro Maull's musical affiliations in New Jersey began with his joint appointment in 1979 as Assistant Conductor of the New Jersey Symphony Orchestra and founding Music Director and Conductor of the New Jersey Youth Symphony (NJYS). He led NJYS, now a program of Wharton Arts, for eighteen seasons until 1997, including three performances at Carnegie Hall and on four European tours: Belgium and The Netherlands (1983), Belgium and England (1985), Romania and Hungary (1987), and Poland (1989).

Under his leadership, NJYS received First Prize at both the 1983 and the 1985 European Music Festival for Youth in

Belgium, and was the subject of a 1987 WNET New York Channel 13 documentary entitled 'Art Effects: Young & Noteworthy.'

Today, Maull is the Artistic Director of The Discovery Orchestra and three-time Emmy-nominated public television personality, touching the lives of millions of individuals nationwide and abroad by helping them to heighten their classical music listening pleasure through his Discovery Concerts distributed by American Public Television (APT) and APT Worldwide. These programs, including his signature listening course, 'Fall in Love with Music,' are available to stream on Amazon Prime and PBS Passport. His public radio show, 'Inside Music,' is broadcast on second and fourth Saturdays each month at 7:30 p.m. on WWFM, 89.1 The Classical Network in Princeton. Maull believes that everyone has the innate ability to become a virtuoso music listener.

The New Jersey Symphony (NJS) presents two performances of Carl Orff's spectacular choral masterpiece, 'Carmina Burana': Friday, March 1, 2024, at 8 pm and Sunday, March 3 at 3 pm, both at the New Jersey Performing Arts Center (NJPAC) in Newark.

**CARMINA BURANA**

Orff's 'Carmina Burana' pulses with springtime life, the text of this cantata taken from the bawdy writings of medieval monks who had more on their minds than scripture. Meanwhile, Kodály's Dances of Galánta overflows with Hungarian flavor and memorable tunes, inspired by the folk music of the composer's childhood. Between these, a work of exquisite musical reflection by Bach, his concerto for oboe d'amore, the duskier cousin of the modern oboe.

'Carmina Burana' uses texts, written in Latin, German and old French, from a manuscript found in a Bavarian monastery in 1847 that date back as far as the 11th century.



Iñárritu, marking a major collaboration between two powerhouse talents in the industry. The eagerly anticipated project, which is reportedly in development under the banners of Warner Bros. and Legendary Pictures, has already generated considerable buzz among movie enthusiasts and industry insiders alike. This will mark Alejandro's first English 2015 smash *The Revenant*. While specific plot details for the upcoming film remain undisclosed, rumors of Warner Bros. and Legendary negotiating to acquire the project are circulating online as per Deadline. This marks Iñárritu's return to English-language cinema since the 2015 hit *The Revenant*, starring Leonardo DiCaprio, nearly a decade ago.

Tom Cruise, who recently inked a deal with Warner Bros. Discovery to develop both original and franchise films in 2024, appears to be in a favorable position.



## 'ISIS BRIDE' LOSES APPEAL TO REGAIN UK CITIZENSHIP

LONDON (TIP): Shamima Begum, the London-born Bangladeshi-origin woman, who fled the UK as a 15-year-old schoolgirl to join the Islamic State (ISIS) terrorist network, on February 23 lost yet another legal bid to regain her British citizenship and return to the UK from Syria. Previously in 2022, the UK Supreme Court upheld the decision to bar the now 24-year-old from returning to the UK.

After a series of legal battles, Begum, known as 'ISIS bride', lost a challenge at the Special Immigration Appeals Commission in February last year and then took her case to the Court of Appeal. (PTI)

## BRITISH SHIP STRUCK BY MISSILE OFF YEMEN COAST

DUBAI (TIP): A cargo ship was set on fire off the southern coast of Yemen after being struck by a missile on February 22, which has prompted US-led naval forces to respond, British maritime agencies reported. The UK-owned, Palau-flagged ship was en route to Egypt from Thailand, according to maritime security firm Ambrey and ship tracking data.

Islander is the name of the vessel, two shipping sources said. US-led coalition forces are responding to the incident, which involved two missiles being fired at the ship 70 nautical miles southeast of Aden, Yemen. Iran-aligned Houthi militants in Yemen have launched repeated drone and missile strikes in the Red Sea since November. — Reuters

# New Israeli settlements in West Bank are illegal and inconsistent with international law: Antony Blinken

CHARLESTON (US) (TIP): The new Israeli settlements in the West Bank are illegal and inconsistent with international law, US Secretary of State Antony Blinken has said, reversing a Trump-era policy.

Blinken, at a joint press conference with the Argentine Foreign Minister Diana Mondino in Buenos Aires, said he was disappointed with Israel's latest plans for settlement expansion.

"We have seen the reports, and I have to say we're disappointed in the announcement. It's been long-standing US policy under Republican and Democratic administrations alike that new settlements are counterproductive to reaching an enduring peace," Blinken said in response to a question.

"They're also inconsistent with international law. Our administration maintains a firm opposition to settlement expansion. And in our judgement, this only weakens — it doesn't strengthen — Israel's security," said the top American diplomat, a day after Israel's far-right Finance Minister Bezalel Smotrich indicated that more than 3,000 new residences would be added to settlements.

The statement comes as the Biden administration's latest shift away from the pro-Israel policies pursued by former president Donald Trump.

The Trump administration reversed the US policy to declare that settlements did not violate international law. In 2019, under Trump, then-Secretary of State Mike Pompeo claimed that "the establishment of Israeli civilian settlements in the West Bank is not, per se, inconsistent with international law".

Blinken's statement was defended by



the White House in Washington DC.

"(We have) seen those reports and, frankly, disappointed in the announcement. It's been long-standing US policy under both Republican and Democratic administrations that new settlements are counterproductive to the cause of peace. Frankly, they're also inconsistent with international law. And this administration maintains our firm opposition to settlement expansion," John Kirby, a White House spokesman, told reporters.

The New York Times reported that in November 2019, the then Secretary of State, Mike Pompeo, under then-president Donald Trump reversed four decades of US policy by saying that settlements did not violate international law.

"State Department lawyers never issued a new legal determination that buttressed that policy change and Blinken's shift back to the old policy is consistent with a long-standing legal finding of the department," the daily reported.

"We are simply reaffirming the

fundamental conclusion that these settlements are inconsistent with international law. This is a position that has been consistent over a range of Republican and Democratic administrations. If there's an administration that is being inconsistent, it was the previous one," Kirby told reporters.

In Buenos Aires, Blinken said he had seen reports about the post-war Gaza plan.

"I haven't seen the plan, so I want to reserve judgment until we see the details. Having said that, you know that there are certain basic principles that we set out many months ago that we feel are very important when it comes to Gaza's future, including that it cannot be a platform for terrorism," he said.

"There should be no Israeli reoccupation of Gaza. The size of Gaza's territory should not be reduced. So, we want to make sure that any plan that emerges is consistent with those principles. There are other principles, but those are three of the most important ones," Blinken said.

"At the same time, we have many countries in the region that are working together on a plan for post-conflict Gaza. I think that's very important, and I've spent some time with some of our Arab partners, including recently on the margins of the G20, talking about just as we did when we were at the Munich Security Conference together. So, it's important that we have, again, a necessary plan, but one also that's consistent with basic principles that I think many countries share about what has to be Gaza's future," said the Secretary of State. (PTI)

## UK government revamps logo with King Charles III's chosen domed crown

LONDON (TIP): In a move that symbolises a new royal era for the country, the UK government has updated the logo on its official GOV.UK digital services used across all departments for official day-to-day business with the chosen crown of King Charles III.

When the 75-year-old acceded to the throne in September 2022, he chose to use the Tudor Crown in his Royal Cypher, marking a shift away from the St Edward's Crown used by his late mother Queen Elizabeth II.

The design of the Tudor Crown can be distinguished by its slightly more domed appearance, which will now become the iconic image across British government notices.

"Following the accession of His Majesty The King, we are updating the symbols of state to reflect the new design of the Tudor Crown," Deputy Prime Minister Oliver Dowden said as he announced the change on February 18.

"The digital realm is now an integral part of our lives, and as His Majesty's Government we take pride in this change to GOV.UK today, honouring the chosen crown of our King," he said.

The GOV.UK logo begins its transition this week to recognise the chosen crown of the King on its homepage and sitewide menu bar. The transition is covered within the usual operating costs of the GOV.UK website, the UK Cabinet Office said.

It added that it is important people are aware of this change given that GOV.UK digital services are used by millions of people every single week – from passport and tax services to other official government information.

"GOV.UK is an essential part of living, studying and working in the UK. It is used by millions of people weekly for both routine and sometimes life-changing reasons such as getting access to benefits or finding a job," said Alex Burghart, parliamentary secretary for the cabinet office.

"Whilst we are importantly updating the GOV.UK logo to reflect the new monarch's choice of crown, this site remains the same trusted and official

digital home of the UK government," he said.

While the new domed shape can be easily identified, the public are encouraged to report any misleading and fraudulent GOV.UK styled websites via its dedicated reporting page during the course of the transition.

The new logo has been created collaboratively between the Government Digital Service (GDS), the Government Communication Service (GCS) and the Royal Household and the majority of changes to replace the St Edward's Crown with the Tudor Crown logo on GOV.UK are expected to have taken place by March 1. (PTI)

# Angry French farmers with tractors are back to Paris for another protest

**PARIS (TIP):** Angry farmers were back to Paris on their tractors February 23 in a new protest demanding more government support and simpler regulations, on the eve of a major agricultural fair in the French capital.

Dozens of tractors drove peacefully into a neighbourhood on the capital's west side carrying flags from Rural Coordination, the farmers' union that staged the protest.

The protesters then posed with their tractors on a bridge over the Seine River with the Eiffel Tower in the background.

The latest protest comes three weeks after farmers lifted roadblocks around Paris and elsewhere in the country after the government offered over 400 million euros (USD 433 million) to address their grievances over low earnings, heavy regulation and what they describe as unfair competition from abroad.

"Save our agriculture," the Rural Coordination said on X. One tractor was carrying a poster reading: "Death is in the field."

The convoy temporarily slowed traffic on the A4 highway east of the capital, and on the Paris ring-road earlier on Friday morning.

French farmers' actions are part of a broader protest movement in Europe against EU agriculture policies, bureaucracy and overall business conditions.

Farmers complain that the 27-nation



bloc's environmental policies, such as the Green Deal, which calls for limits on the use of chemicals and on greenhouse gas emissions, limit their business and make their products more expensive than non-EU imports.

Other protests are being staged across France as farmers seek to put pressure on the government to implement its promises.

Government officials have held a series of meetings with farmers unions in recent weeks to discuss a new bill meant to defend France's "agricultural sovereignty".

The government's plan also includes hundreds of millions of euros in aid, tax breaks and a promise not to ban pesticides in France that are allowed elsewhere in Europe, which French farmers say puts them at an unfair disadvantage.

French President Emmanuel Macron is to visit Paris Agricultural Fair on Saturday, where he is planning to have a "big debate" with farmers, supermarket CEOs and members of environmental groups, his office said.

Paris Agricultural Fair is one of the world's largest farm fairs, drawing crowds every year. (AP)

# India in touch with Moscow for early 'discharge' of nationals working for Russian Army

**MOSCOE (TIP):** India on February 23 said it was in touch with Moscow for early "discharge" of Indians working as support staff to Russian Army and urged its nationals to stay away from the conflict zone in Ukraine.

The comments by External Affairs Ministry spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal came following a report that some Indians are working as support staff to the Russian Army in the conflict zone.

"We are aware that a few Indian nationals have signed up for support jobs with the Russian army," Jaiswal said.

**He said the Indian embassy in Moscow has regularly taken up this matter with the relevant Russian authorities for their "early discharge".**

"We urge all Indian nationals to exercise due caution and stay away from this conflict," he said.

According to media reports, several



Indians have been working as security helpers in the Russian military, and they were forced to fight with Russian soldiers in certain areas along Russia's border with Ukraine.

All India Majlis-E-Ittehadul Muslimeen (AIMIM) leader Asaduddin

Owaisi had urged the external affairs ministry to rescue the Indians.

"Sir @DrSJaishankar kindly use your good offices to bring these men back home. Their lives are at risk & their families are justifiably worried," Owaisi said on X on Wednesday.

## CHINA BUILDING VILLAGES ON DISPUTED BHUTAN BORDER

**BEIJING (TIP):** China is reportedly pressing ahead with the construction of border villages in the disputed territory with Bhutan, despite the ongoing border talks between the two countries. At least three villages have been built in the mountainous region separating the two countries, the Hong Kong-based South China Morning Post reported on February 19.

The rapid expansion began as a poverty alleviation scheme but serves a dual national security role, the report quoted the ruling Chinese Communist Party officials as saying.

In a disputed remote village inside a border zone that has long been disputed by China and Bhutan, 18 new residents were waiting to enter their newly built houses. (PTI)

## AT LEAST 26 MEN MASSACRED IN PAPUA NEW GUINEA TRIBAL VIOLENCE, POLICE TELL AUSTRALIAN MEDIA

**MELBOURNE (TIP):** At least 26 men were massacred in tribal violence in Papua New Guinea, Australian media reported on February 18.

A tribe, their allies and mercenaries were on their way to attack a neighbouring tribe when they were ambushed on Sunday in the remote highlands of South Pacific's Enga, Royal Papua New Guinea Constabulary Acting Superintendent George Kakas told Australian Broadcasting Corp.

Kakas initially said 53 had died. But security forces later revised the death toll down to 26, ABC reported. It was not immediately clear whether any of the ambushers might be among the dead.

Bodies were collected from the battlefield, roads and the riverside, then loaded onto police trucks and taken to the hospital. Kakas said they were still counting "those who were shot, injured and ran off into the bushes."

Papua New Guinea is a diverse, developing nation of 10 million mostly subsistence farmers with 800 languages in a strategically important part of the South Pacific.

Internal security has become an increasing challenge for its government as China, the United States and Australia seek closer security ties.

Australian Prime Minister Anthony Albanese said his government was ready to assist Papua New Guinea, which is Australia's nearest neighbour and the largest single recipient of Australian foreign aid. "That is very disturbing news that has come out of Papua New Guinea," Albanese said before the death toll was revised down. (AP)

**TALIBAN EXECUTE 2 CONVICTS IN PUBLIC**

**KABUL (TIP):** The Taliban carried out a double public execution at a stadium in south-eastern Afghanistan on February 22. Thousands watched the killing of two convicted men, as their victims' relatives fired the gunshot. The Taliban's Supreme Court had ruled that the pair were responsible for the stabbing deaths of two victims in separate attacks.

It identified the two as Syed Jamal from central Wardak province and Gul Khan from Ghazni. Meanwhile, the United Nations criticised the Taliban and called on the country's rulers to halt such practices. — AP

**LANDSLIDE IN EASTERN AFGHANISTAN LEAVES AT LEAST 5 PEOPLE DEAD, 25 MISSING**

**ISLAMABAD (TIP):** A landslide triggered by heavy rain and snowfall buried more than two dozen houses in a remote village in eastern Afghanistan, killing at least five people and leaving more than 20 others missing, a provincial official said February 18.

The landslide, which occurred Sunday night, destroyed or damaged more than two dozen houses in Noorgram district, according to Samiulhaq Haqbayan, the Taliban-appointed director of information and culture in Nuristan province.

Rescuers have so far recovered five bodies and a search is underway for at least 25 others, including women and children, who are trapped under the destroyed houses, Haqbayan said.

The landslide occurred after heavy rains and snowfall that are still ongoing, he added.

Nuristan province, which borders Pakistan, is mostly covered by mountainous forests. (AP)

**THAILAND EX-PM THAKSIN SHINAWATRA GETS PAROLE**

**BANGKOK (TIP):** Thailand's billionaire ex-PM Thaksin Shinawatra was released on parole on February 18 after six months in detention, his first day of freedom in his homeland 15 years after fleeing in the wake of his overthrow in a military coup.

The 74-year-old tycoon, whose family's party is back in power, was granted parole despite having not spent a single night in prison for a sentence that had in August been commuted from eight years to one year by the country's king. — Reuters

**Shehbaz set to be PM, Zardari Prez candidate**

**ISLAMABAD (TIP):** The Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz and the Pakistan Peoples Party have struck a power-sharing deal to form a coalition government led by ex-prime minister Shehbaz Sharif, a move that could effectively keep their arch-rival Imran Khan out of power after the controversial elections.

Both the PML-N and the PPP won fewer seats in Parliament than candidates backed by jailed former Prime Minister Imran Khan in an election mired in controversies, including vote rigging. Khan, who could not contest the February 8 elections due to his convictions in some cases, including that of corruption, has been barred from holding any public office for 10 years.

At a joint news conference here late February 19 night after marathon negotiations, Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) Chairman Bilawal Bhutto-Zardari announced that Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) president Shehbaz Sharif, 72, will assume the role

of the prime minister once again. Similarly, PPP co-chairman Asif Ali Zardari, 68, will be the joint candidate for the president's office.

Last week, the PML-N, in a surprise move, announced that the party supremo and three-time former premier Nawaz Sharif has nominated his younger brother Shehbaz as a candidate for the slot of prime minister. Nawaz, 74, was earlier confident of securing a record

fourth term. — PTI

**MANDATE THIEVES MUST RESIGN: IMRAN**

Jailed former Pakistan PM Imran Khan's party on Wednesday rejected the attempts by two of its arch-rivals to form a coalition government. Khan warned that robbing its public endorsement by the "mandate thieves" will result in the worst political instability and told them to resign.

**Pakistan to probe trolling of officials over 'rigging' in February 8 polls**

**ISLAMABAD (TIP):** Pakistan's caretaker government has constituted a joint investigation team, including from the ISI, following a massive social media campaign against officials and functionaries of the top poll body alleging their involvement in the reported rigging of elections, according to media reports on February 22.

The report is to be submitted in 15 days. The joint investigation team (JIT) will look into the relevant people who have trolled government officials and the Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) functionaries and "identify and prosecute the culprits" under the relevant laws.

The JIT formation comes in the wake of the consistent allegations by the jailed former prime minister Imran Khan-led Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) party that the government officials and also those from the ECP were involved in what Khan described as "Mother of All Rigging," which he claimed enabled his arch rivals to steal his party's mandate.

Two weeks after the voting day, Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) and the Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) struck a power-sharing deal to form a coalition government led by ex-prime minister Shehbaz Sharif, a move that could effectively keep Khan out of power.

Both the PML-N and the PPP won fewer seats in Parliament than candidates backed by Khan's PTI in an election mired in controversies, including vote rigging, PTI has alleged and unleashed a substantial campaign on social media claiming that the powerful establishment was hand in gloves with the perpetrators of rigging.

"As per a notification issued by the interior ministry, the JIT was formed under Section 30 of the Prevention of Electronic Crimes Act (PECA) 2016 and an additional director general of the Federal Investigation Agency (FIA) will be its convener," Dawn.com reported.

Other members will be from the Inter-Services Intelligence (ISI), the Intelligence Bureau (IB), the National Database & Registration Authority (Nadra), and the Pakistan Telecommunication Authority (PTA). It could also hire IT experts if required to probe the "malicious" social media campaign.

According to the terms of reference of the JIT, it will identify and prosecute individuals involved in social media campaigns against government officials for their alleged role in irregularities on the day of polling.

It will also propose measures to counter such campaigns in the future. The JIT has 15 days to submit its report to the relevant office. (PTI)

**Indian diplomat for better connectivity with Sri Lanka**

**COLOMBO (TIP):** Indian High Commissioner Santosh Jha has made his first official visit to Sri Lanka's Northern Province and stressed the need for improved connectivity between the two countries.

The newly-appointed Indian envoy completed his three-day maiden visit to the island nation's north on February 18, the Indian High Commission said in a statement on Sunday. He participated in diverse engagements during the visit, attesting to the "deep-rooted nature of the bilateral partnership as also India's firm commitment to deepening socio-economic and cultural ties with Northern Province," it said.

Jha emphasised connectivity while visiting the Kankesanthurai (KKS) Port and the Talaimannar Pier and spoke of the need for expeditious resumption of ferry services between the two countries.

During his visit to the Palaly Airport, he explored means to strengthen air connectivity through infrastructure development at the airport, the statement said.

In 2023, Sri Lanka sought Indian financial assistance to extend the runway at the Palaly airport after India's Alliance Air began Chennai-Palaly flights.

"The High Commissioner offered prayers at the historic Ram Sethu (Adam's Bridge). He also visited the ancient Thiruketheeswaram temple, which was renovated with grant assistance from the Government of India," the statement said. In India's endeavour to contribute towards addressing the energy needs of islands off Jaffna, Jha assessed the readiness for early rollout of the Hybrid Renewable Energy Systems Project in Nainativu Island. (PTI)

# LEADING INDIAN DRONE MANUFACTURER ENTERS US MARKET

**WASHINGTON, D.C. (TIP):** India's drone industry has "leapfrogged" in the last 10 years, gaining pace after the COVID-19 pandemic, the CEO of a leading Indian drone manufacturer has said as his company has showcased its products in the highly competitive US market.

Indian drone manufacturing company IdeaForge, ranked fifth globally in the dual-use category of civil and defense, is entering the American drone market at a time when there is a reluctance to buy or acquire those made in China.

Ankit Mehta, the CEO of IdeaForge, told PTI Videos in an interview that the Indian drone industry has "leapfrogged in the last 10 years with an enabling environment from the Indian government." He said the sector gained pace after the COVID-19 pandemic.

"I think before the pandemic, the rules and regulations around drones were fairly stringent, and they did not allow a lot of flexibility in terms of use and deployment," Mehta said.

"But since the pandemic, the floodgates, in a way, have opened the adoption of technology, which has become wholehearted. Now people want to deploy drones for as many use cases as possible," he said.

Drones had very restrictive regulations earlier, he said. "Now those regulations have become a little bit more relaxed in terms of allowing the use of drones under a regulated environment, which is conducive for operations."

"Therefore, we are seeing a lot of intent in terms of adopting the technology, and we are seeing a lot of regulatory support for doing that," Mehta said.

"We also have in India a production-linked incentive scheme for drones. We have the fact that there is a ban on import of technology from outside so that Indian companies can develop the technology and be overall in an environment where we can demonstrate the capability of what Indian companies can do in this space," he said.

Asserting the distinctiveness of Indian drones, he said, "I think Indian drones are very unique in the sense that they've been built in some of the harshest environments and the highest altitude requirements in the world."

"With the operations being conducted in India at 6,000 meters plus altitude due to the various regions we have in our country in the Himalayas, to operate in extremely low temperatures like minus 30 degrees Celsius and also looking at drones that can operate in deserts in Rajasthan," he said.

"So, we are essentially a country that has a very large number of terrain conditions and weather conditions we have to cater to when we are looking at drones. We also have a lot of use cases and applications that exist simultaneously in one place," he said.

Giving examples of applications around traffic management, crowd management, counterinsurgency, counter-terrorism, and border management Mehta said, "All of these challenges are quite acute, and there are a lot of challenges around not having proper land records, and many such applications are being developed in India, and they're being used and deployed at scale."

Mehta is travelling to various cities in the US for product demonstrations to

export different kinds of drones to the country. One of which was held in the Washington DC National Capital region here on Thursday.

"We are seeing a lot of excitement about what we have on offer. The autonomy we offer again is very, very interesting and exciting for people, and we are currently engaging in getting as many demonstrations as we can and getting more real-world experience in the hands of the users over here. So that can localize our products better as well as give a flavor of our technology to everybody here," Mehta told PTI.

"For example, one of our products, Netra V 4 Pro, is a one-of-a-kind product that, in less than six kilograms, offers more than 90 minutes of flying time in the real world along with payloads. That is something that is not very common," he said.

"It is almost three times more than what is usually available in the market. In that sense, there is a lot of delight in when they actually see a product perform in that kind of condition, in that kind of real-world performance," he added.

Following one of the product demonstrations here, along with his team, Mehta said the idea is to showcase their technology over here and to look at what kind of uses the technology can put over here.

IdeaForge, set up in 2007 by a group of Mumbai IITians, can bring the experience they are gaining in India, he said.

"We have had our customers use our drones in over 420,000 missions within IdeaForge drones, flying almost every five minutes in India," he said.

"It's really a rich experience that we

can bring to the table here, and we see a lot of commonalities with respect to very low temperatures, very high temperatures, and some high-altitude areas over here as well," Mehta said.

"What we are building here to deploy at scale in India could be very, very useful in these environments as well," he added.

When asked about India purchasing armed drones from General Atomics for its armed forces at the cost of nearly USD 4 billion, Mehta said it would need sustained long-term investment from relevant sectors, including the Indian Government, to reach that level of manufacturing such drones.

"Manpower is definitely not a debate because India does have some of the best talent. In fact, a lot of our best talent is here building a lot of these technologies," Mehta said. (PTI)

Artificial sources of UV radiation, like tanning beds, are also harmful.


Daily sunscreen goes a long way toward shielding you from UV rays. But there are several other ways you can protect yourself. Keep reading for helpful skin-saving strategies. They'll come in handy on your next beach vacation and for other outdoor activities.

## Cover yourself with clothing and a hat

Covering your skin with protective clothing and a hat can help safeguard you from UVA and UVB rays. But certain clothes provide more protection than others. You can look for garments with an ultraviolet protection factor (UPF), which shows how much the fabric protects your skin from UV rays. For example, a shirt with a UPF 50 rating blocks roughly 98% of the sun's UV rays. The Skin Cancer Foundation (SCF) requires a minimum UPF of 30 to grant its seal of recommendation for effective sun protection.

## Wear sunglasses

UV radiation can also damage your eyes, eyelids, and the sensitive skin around your eyes. Luckily, wearing sunglasses can shield these areas and reduce the risk of



conditions such as cataracts.

But like your clothing, not all eyewear is created equal when it comes to blocking sunlight. For example, studies suggest that goggles and large sunglasses may be more effective at protecting your eyes from UV rays than smaller sunglasses. One way to check the effectiveness of your sunglasses is with the eye-sun protection factor (ESPF®). The ESPF measures how well lenses block the transmission of light and UV reflection. If your sunglasses don't have an ESPF rating, you can check for other factors. The American Academy of Ophthalmology recommends looking for sunglasses that block 99% to 100% of all types of UV light.

## Use an umbrella

Umbrellas are not just for the

rain. Using an umbrella or parasol can stop direct UV rays from hitting your skin. But research shows that they don't block scattered or diffused UV rays, which may be common at the beach. So this shade-producing tool is most effective when you use it in combination with other sun-protecting strategies, like wearing sunscreen and protective clothing.

## Eat foods that provide sun protection

# Chicken Manchurian

## Ingredients

250 gm chicken, 1 tablespoon all purpose flour, 1/4 cup refined oil, 1/4 teaspoon crushed green peppercorns, 1/4 teaspoon, chopped green chilli, 120 ml chicken stock, 1/4, teaspoon ground black pepper, 30 ml water, 1 tablespoon corn flour, 1 beaten egg, 1/4 teaspoon crushed ginger, 1/4 teaspoon crushed garlic, 1 handful chopped into cubes cilantro, 10 ml light soya sauce, 1/4 teaspoon sugar, 1 finely chopped spring onions

## Method

To prepare this delicious Chicken Manchurian recipe, take a bowl and add corn flour, flour, salt and pepper along with the beaten egg in it. Mix all these ingredients properly and prepare a batter. Next, dip the chicken pieces in the batter one by one. Make

- sure it is properly coated.
- Meanwhile, heat oil in a pan over medium flame. Once the oil is sufficiently hot, place the coated chicken pieces in the oil and deep fry till they turn golden brown in colour. Once done, drain the excess oil and keep aside till further use. Now, to prepare the manchurian sauce, heat oil in another pan over medium flame. Once the oil is hot enough, add the garlic and ginger in it. Fry till it becomes slightly brown in colour. Now add in green chilies and cilantro leaves. Sauté these for about a minute or so.
- Then, bring the flame to low and add in the chicken stock, soya sauce, salt, sugar and pepper. Allow this mixture to simmer and cook for 5 minutes. Once done, add in corn flour along with water in it and bring the mixture to a boil.
- The last step is to place the fried chicken pieces into the manchurian sauce. Bring the flame to medium low and allow the dish to cook for close to 5 minutes. Once done, turn off the flame and transfer the Chicken Manchurian into a serving bowl.

## SNORING

One common indicator of high blood pressure is snoring, especially if it's accompanied by pauses in breathing, known as sleep apnoea. Snoring occurs when the airway becomes partially blocked, causing vibrations in the throat tissues. However, in individuals with hypertension, snoring can signal more than just sleep apnoea; it may also indicate restricted blood flow due to narrowed blood vessels, a hallmark of high blood pressure.

## INSOMNIA

While many factors can contribute to insomnia, such as stress, anxiety or poor sleep hygiene, hypertension can disrupt the body's natural sleep-wake cycle, making it difficult to fall asleep or stay asleep throughout the night.

## RESTLESS SLEEP

Additionally, frequent awakenings or restless sleep may be indicative of hypertension-related issues, as elevated blood pressure levels can trigger the body's 'fight or flight' response, causing arousal from sleep.



## EXCESSIVE URINATION

Furthermore, nocturia, or excessive urination during the night, can be a symptom of hypertension. Elevated blood pressure levels can put strain on the kidneys, leading to increased urine production and the need to wake up multiple times to urinate.

## HEADACHE

Moreover, experiencing headaches upon waking or during the night can also be a sign of nocturnal hypertension. Headaches caused by high blood pressure tend to be most intense in the morning, as blood pressure naturally rises during sleep and peaks in the early morning hours.

Monitoring these signs and symptoms, especially when occurring together, can help individuals identify potential issues with nocturnal hypertension and seek appropriate medical attention to manage their blood pressure levels and mitigate associated risks.

# Risk-reducing mastectomy may lower breast cancer mortality in some women

Risk-reducing mastectomies (RRM) in women with a BRCA1 or BRCA2 genetic variant may significantly reduce the risk of being diagnosed with breast cancer and also lower the probability of death.

The study, published in the British Journal of Cancer, examined how RRM affects the rate of death of women with a pathogenic variant but no cancer diagnosis.

Women who have an inherited BRCA1 or BRCA2 variant, have an 80 per cent risk of developing breast cancer over the course of their lifetime.

Research has shown that an RRM reduces the risk of breast cancer by




90 percent. "The decision to have a risk reducing mastectomy is often difficult for a woman to make, and the more evidence we are able to provide them with when they are making that decision, the more informed their care plan will be,"

said Prof Kelly Metcalfe of the Lawrence Bloomberg Faculty of Nursing, from University of Toronto, Canada.

Metcalfe said that in Canada, 30 per cent of women with a pathogenic variant opt for this surgery. It is, Metcalfe said, one of the most effective ways of preventing breast cancer in women with this risk profile.

Through a pseudo-randomised trial, Metcalfe, and her team, followed over 1,600 participants from a registry of women with a pathogenic BRCA 1/2 variant from nine different countries over the course of six years, with half of the women having a risk-reducing mastectomy.

## Rare fat molecule helps drive cell death: Study

Researchers revealed that a rare sort of lipid plays a vital role in ferroptosis, a type of cell death described by Columbia professor Brent Stockwell.

The findings shed new light on how cells die during ferroptosis, potentially improving understanding of how to prevent ferroptosis in contexts where it is harmful, such as neurodegenerative diseases, or induce it in contexts where it could be beneficial, such as using it to kill dangerous cancer cells.

The study discovered that a diPUFA phospholipid, an uncommon type of lipid with two polyunsaturated fatty acyl tails, was present in a variety of situations where ferroptosis occurred, including aged brains and Huntington disease-affected brain tissue. The finding indicated that the lipid is efficient at promoting ferroptosis.

The research was conducted by professors in Columbia's Department of Biological Sciences, Department of Chemistry, and the Columbia University Irving Medical Centre.

Stockwell first discovered ferroptosis in 2012, when he found that certain cells were dying because their lipid layers were collapsing - an unusual form of cell death that differs from the most common kind, which begins with the cell forming blisters on its outer surface. Since that discovery, researchers in Stockwell's lab and elsewhere have continued to investigate ferroptosis, discovering that it can occur naturally in ageing cells, in pathological contexts, and can be induced to treat disease.

Another paper out this month with several co-authors found that a gene named PHLDA2 can sometimes promote ferroptosis by attacking a different lipid and that this gene can block some tumours from forming.

Together, these papers show that specific lipids promote ferroptosis, so defining the driver lipids in specific cancers is important.

## Cryogenic engine for Gaganyaan missions now human-rated: ISRO

ISRO has accomplished a major milestone in the human rating of its CE20 cryogenic engine that powers the cryogenic stage of the human-rated LVM3 launch vehicle for Gaganyaan human spaceflight missions, with the completion of the final round of ground qualification tests.

'ISRO's CE20 cryogenic engine is now human-rated for Gaganyaan missions,' the space agency said on X.

Rigorous testing demonstrates the engine's mettle, it said, adding the CE20 engine identified for the first uncrewed flight LVM3 G1 also went through acceptance tests.

The February 13 final test was the seventh of a series of vacuum ignition tests carried out at the High Altitude Test Facility at ISRO Propulsion Complex in Mahendragiri to simulate flight conditions, it said. The ground qualification tests for the human rating of the CE20 engine involved life demonstration and endurance tests, and performance assessment under nominal operating conditions as well as off-nominal conditions with respect to thrust, mixture ratio and propellant tank pressure, it said.

Astronomers have discovered the fastest-growing black hole ever recorded — the most luminous known object in the universe that is devouring the equivalent of one Sun every day.

The researchers at The Australian National University (ANU) noted that the black hole with a mass roughly 17 billion times that of the Sun, has set a record that may not ever be beaten.

"The incredible rate of growth also means a huge release of light and heat," said study lead author Christian Wolf, Associate Professor at ANU.

"So, this is also the most luminous known object in the universe. It is 500 trillion times brighter than our sun," Wolf said in a statement.

A black hole is a region of spacetime where gravity is so strong that nothing, including light, can escape it.

Christopher Onken, co-author of the study published in the journal Nature Astronomy, noted that it was a surprise that the blackhole remained undetected until now, given what we know about many other, less impressive ones.

The blackhole was first detected using a 2.3 metre telescope at the ANU Siding Spring Observatory near Coonabarabran in New South Wales (NSW).

The research team then turned to one of the largest telescopes in the world – the European Southern Observatory's Very Large Telescope in Chile – to confirm the full nature of the black hole and measure its mass.

"The light from this black hole has travelled over 12 billion years to reach us," said Professor Rachel Webster from the University of Melbourne said.

"In the adolescent universe, matter was moving chaotically and feeding hungry black holes. Today, stars are moving orderly at safe distances and only rarely plunge into black holes," Webster said.

The intense radiation comes from the accretion disc — made of rapidly rotating gas — around the black hole, which is the



holding pattern for all the material waiting to be devoured, the researchers said.

"It looks like a gigantic and magnetic storm cell with temperatures of 10,000 degrees Celsius, lightning everywhere and winds blowing so fast they would go around Earth in a second," Wolf said.

"This storm cell is seven light years across, which is 50 per cent more than the distance from our solar system to the next star in the Galaxy, alpha Centauri," he added.

## No more stalking, WhatsApp might soon stop you from taking screenshots of other profile photos


In the last few months, Meta-owned WhatsApp has been taking steps to improve its overall experience. Be it working on a chat lock for the web version of WhatsApp or to let users connect with others without sharing their phone numbers, the messaging platform is taking steps to ensure enhanced privacy for users. And now, a report by WABetaInfo says that WhatsApp will soon ban users from taking screenshots of profile photos of other users.

Until now, WhatsApp had the option of hiding profile pictures from strangers, but there was no option to stop other users from taking a screenshot of your profile photo. But if reports are to go by, this will be changed soon.

### WhatsApp working on new privacy feature

As per the WABetaInfo report, WhatsApp is currently experimenting with a novel feature designed to stop users from capturing screenshots of others' profile pictures, commonly referred to as display pictures. This latest addition to the instant messaging platform aims to enhance user privacy by curbing the unauthorized downloading and sharing of personal photos.

The report further says that the recent WhatsApp



beta for Android, accessible on the Google Play Store, introduces a notification when users attempt to screenshot someone else's profile picture. The notification reads 'Can't take a screenshot due to app restrictions,' as in an image shared by the publication.

However, it's important to note that users may still capture a photo of another person's profile picture using a secondary device, such as a phone or camera. Hence, users must still be cautious about their display photos, even after the update rolls out.

With that being said, the intention behind limiting

screenshot capabilities for profile pictures is clear – WhatsApp aims to mitigate the risks of impersonation and harassment. Although the screenshot block feature is currently available to a select group of beta testers, it is expected that this feature will be rolled out to all users in the upcoming weeks.

This move aligns with WhatsApp's earlier decision in 2019 to prevent users from downloading profile pictures of others. Additionally, the Meta-owned messaging app is actively developing a specialised fact-checking chatbot to address the challenges posed by deepfakes and AI-generated misinformation.

### Chat lock feature by WhatsApp

Earlier, WABetaInfo had reported that WhatsApp was working on a new feature for web users that will enable them to lock certain chats. Until now, WhatsApp web users had no option to lock certain chats and all the chats of the messaging platform would be open whenever a user logged in from a desktop or laptop.

However, users will soon be able to lock away certain chats that can only be accessed by a specific pin. This means that users will have a secure place for storing all their WhatsApp conversations.

## CAs from UK, Canada may be allowed to practise in India

Chartered accountants (CAs) from the UK and Canada might be allowed to practise in India on a reciprocal basis, with the apex body ICAI making the proposal to the government.

ICAI President Ranjeet Kumar Agarwal said the proposal would be implemented strictly on the reciprocal basis that CAs from India will also be allowed to practise in the United Kingdom and Canada. It will be the first time that an overseas CA will be allowed to practise in India.

The proposal is part of India's ongoing negotiations for Free Trade Agreements (FTAs) with the UK and Canada.

Agarwal also said a similar arrangement is being looked at with Australia. Once the reciprocal system is implemented, the CAs from the foreign countries will have to be registered with the ICAI, which will be regulating them.

"It will be on a reciprocal basis and not on standalone basis. If they agree, it will be a win-win for both countries... we are very much hopeful...in the UK, there is an ageing population and most of the work has shifted from the UK to India..." Agarwal, who took over as the President of the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI) on February 12, said.

To a query about what could be the impact of CAs from foreign countries practising in India, he said, India is a developing country and they are developed countries, referring to the UK, Canada and Australia.

## Byju's shareholders remove CEO, company calls vote 'invalid'

More than 60 percent of shareholders of edutech Byju's on Feb 23 voted for removal of founder CEO Byju Raveendran and his family over alleged "mismanagement and failures" at what was once India's hottest tech startup, but the company dug in its heels, calling the voting done in the absence of founders as "invalid".

Prosus - one of the six investors who had called the extraordinary general meeting (EGM) - in a statement said "shareholders unanimously passed all resolutions put forward for vote."

"These included a request for the resolution of the outstanding governance, financial mismanagement and compliance issues at Byju's; the reconstitution of the board of directors, so that it is no longer controlled by the founder of T&L; and a change of leadership of the company."

Raveendran and his family stayed away from the EGM, calling it "procedurally invalid." However, the outcome of the vote

# UAE removed, Kenya and Namibia added to global money laundering list

Global anti-money laundering watchdog the Financial Action Task Force (FATF) said Friday that it had removed the United Arab Emirates from its "grey list" of countries subject to increased monitoring, while Kenya and Namibia were added.

Countries on the list have "strategic deficiencies" in their efforts to counter money laundering and terrorist financing, but are cooperating with the FATF to correct the problems and are subject to increased monitoring.

FATF head Raja Kumar said that Kenya and Namibia suffered deficiencies in their anti-money laundering systems and that action plans had been developed to remedy them.

A total of 21 nations are on the grey list.

In addition to the UAE, Barbados, Gibraltar and Uganda were removed from the grey list.

"They've all taken substantial steps to improve the AML-CFT safety systems and address all items on their action plans," said Kumar, referring to anti-money laundering and combatting the financing of terrorism.

UAE foreign minister, Sheikh Abdullah bin Zayed Al Nahyan, welcomed the FATF decision and said the changes will "strengthen the country's leading status and competitiveness, and advance its position globally as an economic, trading and investment hub," according to the country's official news agency, WAM.



In recent decades the UAE has sought to use its location in the Gulf to become a financial, trade and travel hub linking Asia and Europe. It was put on the FATF's grey list in 2022 over concerns about murky financial transactions and a flood of Russian money into the country.

More than 200 countries and jurisdictions have pledged to implement the recommendations of the FATF.

The FATF also has a "black list" of nations which are considered high-risk jurisdictions.

Countries are urged to apply countermeasures against Iran and North Korea to protect against money laundering and the financing of

terrorism and weapons proliferation.

Meanwhile, countries are requested to apply enhanced due diligence concerning Myanmar.

The FATF also repeated its condemnation of Russia for its invasion of Ukraine two years ago.

It suspended Russia's participation in the body last year and said its members are taking proactive measures to protect the global financial system given Moscow's growing financial links to countries subject to FATF countermeasures.

## Nvidia tops \$2 trillion valuation in first for chipmakers

Nvidia added \$277 billion in stock market value on Thursday, Feb 24, Wall Street's largest one-day gain in history after the heavyweight chipmaker's quarterly report beat expectations and reignited a rally fueled by optimism about artificial intelligence.

The company's stock soared 16.4% to close at \$785.38, a record-high close, lifting its market capitalization to \$1.96 trillion after its January-quarter report late on Wednesday showed demand for its specialized chips used in AI computing continued to outpace analysts' already-high expectations.

The Santa Clara, California-based company's results fed new fuel to a global rally in technology stocks linked to AI, propelling the S&P 500, Europe's STOXX 600 and Japan's Nikkei share average to record highs.

Traders exchanged \$65 billion worth of Nvidia's shares on Thursday, accounting for almost a fifth all trading in S&P 500



stocks. Nvidia's one-day increase in stock market value was the largest in Wall Street's history, easily beating a record \$196 billion gain by Meta Platforms on Feb. 2 after the Facebook parent declared its first dividend and posted robust results.

The rise in Nvidia's market value on Thursday eclipsed the entire value of Coca-Cola, at \$265 billion.

Its gain made Nvidia the U.S. stock market's third-most valuable company, pulling ahead of Amazon.com and Alphabet after jockeying with the two tech powerhouses in recent weeks.

The full moon day that falls in the month of Maghi (that is the month of January or February in the English calendar) is known as Maghi Purnima according to the Hindu Panchang. Maghi Purnima has special significance from a religious and spiritual point of view according to Hindu scriptures. Bathing, charity and chanting on this auspicious day of Purnima, are said to be very virtuous and fruitful. Magh bath is also very important on this day.

The special bath, which takes place in the month of Magha, normally starts from the full moon of the Posh month and continues till Maghi Purnima. For the Triveni Sangam bath, Maghi Purnima is the last day that follows after performing Kalpas in the pilgrimage place of Teerthraj Prayag. According to the beliefs of Sanatan Dharma, the grace of Lord Madhav that is Shri Krishna showers on the people who take baths during the month of Magha. Also, they will be blessed with happiness, prosperity, children and salvation.

Bathing, charity and chanting on this date are said to be very virtuous and fruitful. Magh bath also has special significance on this day.

#### Significance of Maghi Purnima

According to the Hindu texts and scriptures, it is said that bathing in the holy river on the eve of Maghi Purnima is considered really auspicious. After taking the bath and then giving alms is considered to wash away all your sins of the present life and past sins.

Additionally, on the day of Purnima, Lord Vishnu and Lord Hanuman are worshipped to receive their blessings. Also, it is believed that on this day all the wishes of the devotees who worship Lord Vishnu and Lord Hanuman are fulfilled.

According to mythology, Magh Purnima is considered a holy day to perform various spiritual and religious rituals and ceremonies. It is also believed that during this month the deities descend from heaven to spend some time on earth and stay on the banks of the river Ganges. The popular 'Magh Mela' and 'Kumbh Mela' are also organised during this month, where hundreds of devotees from all over the country come to take the auspicious plunge in the holy river of the Ganges in the beaming rays of Maghi Purnima.

#### Astrological Significance Of Magha Purnima

The day of Maghi Purnima is also significant in astrology. On this day, the Sun enters Capricorn and the Moon moves into the Cancer constellation, according to legend. Hence, it is believed that taking a holy dip on Maghi Purnima will solve all difficulties associated with the Sun and Moon. From a scientific standpoint, the month of Magha is also helpful. This month is thought to aid the human body in adjusting to the changing seasons. As a result, bathing on Maghi Purnima will provide the body with strength and power.

Moreover, if Pushya Nakshatra falls on the same day as the Magh Purnima Ganga Bath Purnima, then the day becomes more auspicious. Interestingly, in the regions of Tamil Nadu, on the day of Magha Purnima, a known float festival is organised.

#### Maghi Purnima Vrat Katha

According to the legend, a Brahmin known as Dhaneshwar used to reside in Kantika Nagar. He used to beg for dakshina and donations for his livelihood. In spite of sheer poverty, both husband and wife were happy in their own little world. The only thing that made both Brahmin and his wife unhappy was that they didn't have any kids. One day his wife went to the city to beg for alms, but everyone refused to give alms to her as she did not have any children, which broke her heart and made her very sad and gloomy. Seeing her grief and distress, someone told her to worship Maa Kali for 16 days. The Brahmin couple worshipped Maa Kali for continuous 16 days. Seeing their penance and severe devotion, goddess Kali blessed them and gave a boon to Brahmin's wife that she will conceive and she became pregnant. But, told the Brahmin's wife that according to her capacity, she should light a lamp on every full moon

day and she should go on adding one lamp on every full moon day. In this way, she should keep on increasing the number of lamps on every full moon day till there are at least 32 lamps. The Brahmin brought raw mango fruit from the tree for his wife to worship. His wife performed the puja as a result of which she became pregnant. On every full moon, she kept lighting the lamp as per the instructions of Mother Kali. By the grace of Mother Kali, a son was born to her, who was named Devdas. When Devdas grew up, he was sent to Kashi to study at his maternal uncle's house. An accident happened with mother and nephew in Kashi, due to which Devdas got married by fraud.

Devdas did not want to marry so requested to stop this marriage as he was young but still he was forced to get married. After some time Yamraj came to take his life in the form of Kaal, but on that day the Brahmin couple had kept a fast of Purnima, so Kaal could not harm Devdas. Since then it is said that fasting on the day of Maghi Purnima leads to freedom from all troubles and fulfills all wishes.

are performed on Magha Purnima. On this day Lord Vishnu should be worshipped, Shraddh-tarpan and donated to poor people.

The worship method of Maghi Purnima Vrat is as follows:

- On the day of Maghi Purnima, one should take a bath in a holy river, reservoir, well or stepwell before sunrise in the morning. After bathing, offer arghya to the Sun God while reciting the Surya Mantra.
- After taking a bath, one should worship Lord Madhusudan/Lord Krishna by taking a vow of fasting. During the mid-day period, poor people and Brahmins should be given food and donations and dakshina.
- Sesame and black sesame should be specially donated to charity. In the month of Magha, havan should be done with black sesame seeds and ancestors should be offered with black sesame seeds.
- Gayatri Mantra or 'Om Namo Narayan' mantra should be chanted 108 times continuously.



# Sikh History This Week

FEBRUARY 23 TO FEBRUARY 29

## 23rd February

1881 Sardar Ajit Singh was born at Khatkadh kala, Jalandhar.



1921 Gurudwara Luliani Sahib was forcibly taken over and brought under the control of SGPC.

## 24th February

1922: A diwan held at Ghurial on the concluding day of 101 Akhand Paths.



1929: An All Party Conference was organized at Sri Akal Takhat, Amritsar for release of Sardar Sewa Singh Thikriwala. Political activities in PEPSU (Patiala and East Punjab States Union) centered around economic and social but certainly not on religious considerations. The problem of antagonistic relations between the landlords and tenants was so enormous that it almost defied a solution. The biggest issue, absentee land-lordism in PEPSU, made the struggle between "Haves" and "Have nots" more bitter and even violent. All important posts were exclusively reserved for a few families that were near and dear to the Maharaja.

## 25th February



1710 Baba Banda Singh Bahadur was victorious over Sirhind. Born on Katak Sudhi 13 sunmat 1727 to Rajput father Ramdev who was a resident of the Rajori

village in Jammu. He was named Lashman Dev by his parents. Since childhood, he exhibited extremely fondness for sanskrit literature and hunting. However, he plunged into deep remorse after killing a pregnant deer. As a result he discarded all his hunting tools and became a disciple of Vaesnav JankiPrasad. He shed all his material wealth, started onto the seekers path for enlightenment, and adopted the new name, Madho Dass.

## 26th February



1630 Seventh Patshash, Guru Har Rai Ji was born at Kirtapur in the house of Baba Gurditta, eldest son of Guru Hargobind, and Mata Nihal Kaur. He was the second grandson of Guru hargobind, the first being Baba Dhir Mal. Today is the actual date of birth, although it is observed on a different date by Guru Khalsa Panth.



1822: General Hari Singh Nalwa reached Hajara with his forces. He was born to father, Sardar Gurdyal Singh Uppal and mother, Mata Dharam Kaur at Gujrawala in 1781. Besides being a valiant soldier, Sardar Hari Singh Nalwa also served as Governor of Kashmir, Hjara, and

Peshawar. He joined Maharaja Ranjit Singh's forces in his early youth and established himself to be one of the most popular Khalsa generals. Among the Sirhadhi Pathans, his name brought immediate fear and respect. He is part of their folklore to this day. He won numerous wars for the Khalsa Panth and died, on Vaisakh 19 sunmat 1894, in the battle near Sirhadhi Jamraud. A place is established within Jamraud fort in remembrance of PanthRattan Sardar Hari Singh Nalwa.

1923 Kishan Singh Gargaj was arrested from Pindori Mahal. He was the chief architect of the Babbar Akali Movement, who had steered the Babbar Akalis clear of the murderous assaults. But after his arrest, the Babbars resorted to indiscriminate murders. Their objective was to expel the British rulers by violent means.

## 27th February

1926: Six Babbar Akalis were hanged to death in Lahore Central Jail, under the First Babbar Akali Conspiracy case, by the orders of Lord Reading and Malcolm Hailey.


1966: Master Akali Dal demanded the formation of Sikh Homeland.

1712: Bahadur Shah died. A war broke out among his sons. Baba Gurbakhash Singh, alias Banda Bahadur, took advantage of the situation and appeared once again in the plains. His first victory was against Islam Khan, the Governor of Lahore. The next to fall was the zone of Sirhind. But this victory was again, short lived.

the people-to-people ties, the business travel and the family ties.

All these things are important to us and in Washington we are doing a lot of work to support this post (Indian) so they can meet the exploding demand," she added.

Asked about the plans for H1B visa, Bitter said the pilot programme which is underway to permit Indians living in the US to renew their H1B visa without travelling abroad will conclude in February.

"There is special place for Indian skilled workers in United States, they contribute so much to our economy. Indian embassy issued 34 per cent more H1B visas last year which is also the maximum in the history of the post. We take this issue seriously and this was a huge topic of conversation between Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi and US President Joe Biden during their meeting last year.

"We introduced a pilot programme in January for revalidation of 20,000 Indian skilled workers in the United States. The pilot programme will conclude at the end of this month. It is going really well and once we complete the pilot period we will reevaluate and see what comes next to make it as easy as possible for Indians working in the US," she said.

The H-1B visa is a non-immigrant visa that allows US companies to employ foreign workers in specialty occupations that require theoretical or technical expertise. Technology companies depend on it to hire tens of thousands of employees each year from countries such as India and China.

The pilot programme was started months after the

White House announced the plan during the state visit of Prime Minister Modi in June last year.

Talking about student visas, Bitter said, "one in four international students studying in United States is from India. It is incredible because it is not only they are getting top notch education which we are really proud of but they are also enriching our classrooms with their unique perspective and the key points that they bring to our classrooms.

"They make our students smarter too...So we are really excited about that. This is really important programme for us to make sure that Indian students have access to education in the United States and we have all pieces in place going forward to ensure that we meet the demand," she added.

The number of Indians who travelled to the United States for higher education increased by 35 per cent and resulted in an all-time high of 2,68,923 students in the academic year 2022-23.

Last year, the US consular team in India issued over 1,40,000 student visas - more than in any other country in the world setting a record for the third year in a row.



FEBRUARY 23 - FEBRUARY 29


**FEBRUARY 23**

February 23, 1942 - During World War II, the first attack on the U.S. mainland occurred as a Japanese submarine shelled an oil refinery near Santa Barbara, California, causing minor damage.

February 23, 1991 - In Desert Storm, the Allied ground offensive began after a devastating month-long air campaign targeting Iraqi troops in both Iraq and Kuwait.



Birthday - African American educator and leader W.E.B. Du Bois (1868-1963) was born in Great Barrington, Massachusetts.



Birthday - Historian William L. Shirer (1904-1993) was born in Chicago, Illinois. As a news reporter stationed in Europe, he witnessed the rise of Adolf Hitler and reported on the surrender of France. Following the war he wrote the first major history of Nazi Germany, *The Rise and Fall of the Third Reich*.

**FEBRUARY 24**

February 24, 1582 - Pope Gregory XIII corrected mistakes on the Julian calendar by dropping 10 days and directing that the day after October 4, 1582 would be October 15th. The Gregorian, or New Style calendar, was then adopted by Catholic countries, followed gradually by Protestant and other nations.

February 24, 1867 - The House of Representatives voted to impeach President Andrew Johnson. The vote followed bitter opposition by the Radical Republicans in Congress toward Johnson's reconstruction policies in the South. However, the effort to remove him failed in the Senate by just one vote.



Birthday - Admiral Chester Nimitz (1885-1966) was born in Fredericksburg, Texas. He commanded Allied naval, land and air forces in the South Pacific during World War II, and signed the Japanese surrender document on September 2,

1945.

**FEBRUARY 25**

Birthday - Millicent Fenwick (1910-1992) was born in New York City. She championed liberal causes, serving as a member of the U.N. General Assembly and as a U.S. Congresswoman.

**FEBRUARY 26**

February 26, 1848 - The Communist Manifesto pamphlet was published by two young socialists, Karl Marx and Friedrich Engels. It advocated the abolition of all private property and a system in which workers own all means of production, land, factories and machinery.



February 26, 1994 - Political foes of Russian President Boris Yeltsin were freed by a general amnesty granted by the new Russian Parliament.


Birthday - American frontiersman "Buffalo Bill" Cody (1846-1917) was born

in Scott County, Indiana. He claimed to have killed over 4,000 buffalo within 17 months. He became world famous through his Wild West show which traveled throughout the U.S. and Europe for 30 years.

**FEBRUARY 27**

February 27, 1950 - The 22nd Amendment to the U.S. Constitution was ratified, limiting the president to two terms or a maximum of ten years in office.

February 27, 1991 - In Desert Storm, the 100-hour ground war ended as Allied troops entered Kuwait just four days after launching their offensive against Saddam Hussein's Iraqi forces.



Birthday - American poet Henry Wadsworth Longfellow (1807-1882) was born in Portland, Maine. Best known for *Paul Revere's Ride*, *The Song of Hiawatha*, and *The Wreck of the Hesperus*.

**FEBRUARY 28**

February 28, 1986 - Swedish Prime Minister Olof Palme (1927-1986) was assassinated in Stockholm while exiting a movie theater with his wife.

February 28, 1994 - NATO conducted its first combat action in its 45 year history as four Bosnian Serb jets were shot down by American fighters in a no-fly zone.

## MI win final-ball thriller over DC in WPL

**S**kipper Harmanpreet Kaur's half-century anchored the chase while Sajeevan Sajana hit a last-ball six to power Mumbai Indians to a four-wicket win over Delhi Capitals in their Women's Premier League opening match here on Feb 23. Chasing 172, Mumbai Indians fought till the end and with five runs to win off the last ball, Sajana hit a six off Alice Capsey to power the defending champions to victory.

For Mumbai Indians, skipper Harmanpreet scored 55, while wicketkeeper-batter Yastika Bhatia cracked eight fours and two sixes to make 57 from 45 balls. Amelia Kerr (24) put on 44 vital runs for the fourth wicket with Harmanpreet.

Earlier, Delhi Capitals scored 171/5 with England batter Capsey top-scoring with a fine 75. Capsey smacked eight fours and three sixes to make 75 from 53 balls, while opening batter and skipper Meg Lanning made 31. Jemimah Rodrigues hit a quickfire 42 off 24 balls with five fours and two sixes.

# Root remains unbeaten as India bowl out England for 353

RANCHI (TIP)

Joe Root remained unbeaten on 122 as India bowled out England for 353 in their first innings on the second day of the fourth Test here on Saturday, Feb 24.

Former England skipper Root scored 10 boundaries during his unconquered 274-ball innings.

Resuming at the overnight score of 302 for seven, Root and Ollie Robinson completed their century stand for the eighth wicket to take England forward.

In the process, Robinson (58 off 96) hit his maiden Test half-century.

Ravindra Jadeja (4/67) picked up all the three remaining wickets in the morning session of the second day. Debutant Akash Deep (3/83) impressed on the first day, while Mohammed Siraj (2/78) picked up two wickets.

India are leading the five-Test series 2-1.

On Feb 23, Joe Root rescued England with a century on the opening day of the fourth Test against India here today, steering the tourists to a respectable 302/7 after Akash Deep took early wickets.

The right-hander responded to the backlash against England's Bazball approach after their drubbing by 434 runs in the third Test with an unbeaten 106 not out which brought England back into the game from a precarious 112/5 at lunch.

Root's own dismissal in Rajkot —

playing a reverse scoop against Jasprit Bumrah — was seen as symptomatic of what is wrong with England's ultra-aggressive batting.

Ollie Robinson was also unbeaten after a useful cameo of 31, relieving the pressure on Ben Stokes, who was earlier left to rue his decision to bat as England lost the top half of their batting order in the frenetic first session.

The hosts' 2-1 cushion in the five-match series allowed them to rest pace spearhead Bumrah, and Akash Deep became the fourth Indian to make his debut in the series.

The right-arm seamer impressed immediately, sending opener Zak Crawley's off-stump cartwheeling in his second over but his celebrations

were cut short when the no-ball siren went off. The 27-year-old seamer soon got over that disappointment by striking twice in three balls.

Akash dismissed Ben Duckett caught behind for 11 with an angled delivery that prompted a tentative prod from the opener.

Akash waited for confirmation that he had not overstepped and beat his chest in celebration. Two balls later, Ollie Pope fell lbw for a duck.

Crawley went after Mohammed Siraj, hitting the bowler for three fours in a row and following that up with a huge six. Enter Akash, who ended Crawley's run-a-ball 42 by hitting the top of his off-stump.

## India pacer Mohammed Shami ruled out of IPL, to undergo ankle surgery in UK

NEW DELHI (TIP)

Senior pacer Mohammed Shami has been ruled out of next month's Indian Premier League owing to a left ankle injury, for which he will undergo a surgery in the UK, a BCCI source told PTI on Thursday, Feb 23.

The 33-year-old, who is not part of the ongoing Test series against England, last played for India in the ODI World Cup final against Australia in November.

"Shami was in London in last week of January to take special ankle injections and he was told that after three weeks, he can start light running and take it from thereon.

"But the injection hasn't worked and now the only option left is surgery. He will shortly leave for UK for surgery. IPL seems out of question," a senior BCCI source said on the condition of anonymity.

Shami, who was one of the architects of India's stupendous World Cup campaign with 24 wickets, played through pain as he had problems with his landing but



didn't let it affect his performance. Shami, who was recently conferred with the Arjuna Award, has 229 Test, 195 ODI and 24 T20 wickets in his decade-long career.

The development raises a question mark about the injury rehabilitation management programme planned by the National Cricket Academy (NCA) for Shami.

Now it is highly unlikely that the pace bowling artist would be able to make a comeback before India's Test matches at home against Bangladesh and New Zealand (October-November).

His target could be the marquee away series against Australia. People in the know of things believe that the NCA's conservative line of thinking has not worked in Shami's case.

"Shami should have gone directly for surgery and that should have been NCA's call. Just two months of rest and injections wouldn't have worked well and that's what has happened. He is an asset and the Indian team would need him in Australia," the source said.
