Why the United States never had a Woman President? Is it time for the United States to finally elect a woman President?

The United States is often hailed as the world's preeminent democracy, a beacon of human rights, equality, and justice. It is a nation that prides itself on standing for the highest democratic ideals—principles that include gender equality, a cornerstone of any just society. Yet, despite this reputation and the progress made in various fields, the United States has never elected a woman as President. This reality raises important questions about gender dynamics in American politics and the broader implications for gender equality in a country that claims to be a leader in democratic values.

A GLOBAL PERSPECTIVE ON FEMALE LEADERSHIP

To understand the significance of this issue, it is instructive to look at the progress made by other nations in electing women to the highest political offices. India, for instance, became independent in 1947 and a republic in 1950. In just a few decades of independence, India saw its first woman Prime Minister, Indira Gandhi, who led the nation through critical periods of its history. Her leadership not only marked a significant achievement for women in India but also demonstrated to the world that women could lead large, diverse democracies with competence and authority.

Similarly, Sri Lanka, another South Asian nation, elected Sirimavo Bandaranaike as the world's first female Prime Minister in 1960. Her leadership set a precedent in a region that is often characterized by patriarchal structures, proving that women could break through the highest glass ceilings in politics.

In the Middle East, Israel elected Golda Meir as Prime Minister in 1969, making her one of the earliest women to lead a modern nation-state. Her tenure as Prime Minister during a turbulent period in Israel's history further underscored the capability of women to govern effectively in challenging circumstances.

Europe, too, has seen several women rise to the highest offices of leadership. Margaret Thatcher, who served as Prime Minister of the United Kingdom from 1979 to 1990, was a transformative figure in British and global politics. Known as the "Iron Lady," Thatcher's strong leadership style and firm policies left an indelible mark on the UK and the world.

Other nations across Europe and beyond have followed suit, with women leaders such as Angela Merkel of Germany, Jacinda Ardern of New

Zealand, and Ellen Johnson Sirleaf of Liberia, among others, taking on the mantle of leadership in their respective countries. These examples highlight that the election of women to the highest offices is not only possible but has been achieved in a variety of political, cultural, and historical contexts.

THE AMERICAN ANOMALY

Given this global trend, it is perplexing that the United States, a nation with a rich history of democratic principles and gender equality movements, has yet to elect a woman President. This situation is even more puzzling when one considers that women constitute a larger share of the electorate in the United States than men. According to data from recent elections, more women vote in U.S. elections than men, yet this numerical advantage has not translated into a woman holding the nation's highest office.

One might argue that this is not a matter of outright gender discrimination but rather a result of the complex dynamics of American electoral politics. However, the absence of a woman President over more than two centuries of American history suggests that deeper issues may be at play. The fact that the United States has never had a woman President raises questions about whether gender biases, both overt and subtle, continue to influence voter behavior and the political process.

GENDER BIAS IN AMERICAN POLITICS

Gender bias in American politics can manifest in various ways. One of the most significant barriers to women achieving the presidency is the enduring stereotype that men are more suited to leadership roles, particularly in areas such as national security and economic management. These stereotypes are often reinforced by media portrayals and public discourse, which can shape voter perceptions and preferences.

Moreover, women candidates for the presidency have often faced a double standard in terms of their qualifications and demeanor. Female candidates are frequently scrutinized more harshly than their male counterparts, with their competence, likability, and even appearance

subjected to a level of scrutiny that men rarely experience. This double standard can discourage women from running for office or undermine their campaigns when they do.

Another factor to consider is the structure of the American political system itself. The two-party system, the electoral college, and the primary process all create barriers that can be difficult for any candidate to overcome, but these barriers can be particularly challenging for women. For instance, the need to secure party nominations through a primary process that often favors candidates with established networks and fundraising abilities can disadvantage women, who may have less access to these resources due to systemic gender inequalities.

THE NEED FOR CHANGE

Despite these challenges, women in the United States have proven time and again that they are fully capable of leading in every sector, from business to academia to government. Women have served as governors, senators, and representatives, and have held key cabinet positions and roles in international diplomacy. Their contributions have been instrumental in shaping the nation's policies and its future.

Yet, the presidency has remained elusive. This is not just a missed opportunity for the individual women who have run for the office; it is a missed opportunity for the nation as a whole. The election of a woman President would send a powerful message about the United States' commitment to gender equality and would serve as an inspiration to future generations of women leaders.

As we look to the future, it is essential that women in the United States continue to assert their rights and demand equal representation at all levels of government. The question is not whether a woman can become President of the United States, but when. With more women than ever before participating in the political process, running for office, and voting, the momentum is building. It is only a matter of time before the United States elects its first woman President.

It is time for American women—and all Americans who believe in equality—to emphatically demand the election of a woman to the presidency. 

90-FT-TALL HANUMAN 'MURTI' BECOMES NEW LANDMARK IN TEXAS



A 90-foot-tall bronze 'murti' of Lord Hanuman in Texas

AUGUST 22, 2024

HOUSTON, TX (TIP): A 90-foot-tall bronze 'murti' of Lord Hanuman, unveiled near here, symbolizing "a new milestone in the cultural and spiritual landscape of America," has become the latest landmark in Texas visible from miles away, and the third tallest sculpture in the US.

The Statue of Union, as it has been named, is one of the tallest statues in the world and holds several other distinctions: it is the tallest Hanuman 'murti' outside India, the tallest in Texas, and the third tallest statue in the United States, surpassed only by the Statue of Liberty in New York (151 ft) and the Pegasus and Dragon in Hallandale Beach, Florida (110 ft), the organizers said.

The 'Statue of Union' Hanuman 'murti', which was unveiled at Sri Ashtalakshmi Temple in Sugar Land, about 35-odd km from here, during a grand Prana Prathishta Mahotsav ceremony from August 15 to 18, symbolizes "selflessness, devotion, and unity," the organizers said, adding, the murti is named so to "honor Hanuman's pivotal role in reuniting Lord Ram and Sita".

"This awe-inspiring structure is the result of the visionary efforts of His Holiness Sri Chinna Jeeyar Swamiji, a Padma Bhushan awardee, and a renowned Vedic scholar, who envisioned the project as a spiritual epicenter for North America," the organizer said in a statement.

The festivities commenced on August 15, coinciding with India's Independence Day and the core of the celebrations unfolded on August 18, with the grand Pran Prathishta ceremony. "The rituals, led by Sri Chinna Jeeyar Swamiji and overseen by a multitude of Vedic priests and scholars, were a powerful display of devotion and spirituality," the statement said.

The ceremony featured a helicopter showering flowers upon the 'murti', sprinkling of sacred water, and placing of a 72-ft-long garland around Hanuman's neck amid thousands of devotees chanting the names of Shri Ram and Hanuman in unison.

The statue stands tall not only as a symbol of Hanuman's indomitable spirit but also as a new milestone in the cultural and spiritual landscape of America, embodying the principles of devotion, strength, and unity for all who come to witness its grandeur, the organizers added.

Atlanta's Bengali community unites to protest against rape and death of Kolkata doctor

AUGUST 18, 2024

ATLANTA, GA (TIP): On August 14, 2024, members of Atlanta's Bengali community gathered at Global Mall in Norcross, Georgia, to protest the shocking rape and murder of a 31-year-old doctor in Kolkata, West Bengal, now referred to as "Nirbhaya 2.0." The incident, which took place on August 9, 2024, sparked the first protest in the United States as part of a global movement demanding justice.

Around 120 to 130 people, including men, women, and children, assembled to raise their voices against the widespread violence faced by women in India. The protest began at 6:30 PM, with participants holding signs like "We Want Justice" and "Reform and Justice." This gathering served not only to honor the victim but also to call for systemic changes to ensure the safety of women everywhere.

The victim, a second-year postgraduate trainee doctor at RG Kar Medical College in Kolkata, was discovered dead in a seminar room on August 9, 2024. The autopsy confirmed that she had been raped and murdered. The suspect, a civic volunteer with the Kolkata Police disaster management force and a member of the police welfare association, is also a trained boxer with connections to senior officials. He had been stationed at a police outpost near the medical college and often acted as a liaison for certain patients. The suspect, who has been married four times, is described as a womanizer and domestic abuser. Although the Kolkata Police report that

he confessed to the crime, his mother insists he is being falsely accused.

The suspect's ties to influential officials have raised concerns about the investigation's transparency, prompting the Calcutta High Court to transfer the case to the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI). The incident has led to widespread protests and demands for better security measures for women, particularly in workplaces like hospitals.

In Atlanta, the news of this heinous act has deeply shaken the community, particularly women. Sumana Goswami, a prominent figure in the Bengali community, shared her distress with NRI Pulse, stating, "They could have simply ended her life, but they chose to rape her because they could. While crimes may not have a gender, rape unfortunately does."

Public outrage was further fueled by insensitive responses from some authorities, including Dr. Sandip Ghosh, the principal of RG Kar Medical College,

who resigned amid the protests but was controversially reappointed to another position, causing additional backlash. Instead of showing sympathy, he questioned why the victim was resting alone at night. Such comments, coupled with the political blame game, have highlighted systemic failures in protecting women.

As a result, this protest, like many others, is not just about this one tragedy but also a call for comprehensive reforms to ensure women can feel safe in all spaces. The protests are a collective demand for tangible action, stronger laws, better enforcement, and greater accountability.

The Atlanta protest concluded with a candlelight vigil, where participants sang "Aguner Parashmani," a song symbolizing resilience and hope. The gathering ended with the Indian national anthem, "Jana Gana Mana," underscoring the unity and shared commitment to justice.

Indian American police officer Amitoj Oberoi sentenced to 15 years for fatal drunk driving crash

The 31-year-old Franklin resident was sentenced Wednesday by Somerset County Superior Court Judge Jonathan Romankow. Oberoi received two concurrent terms of 15 years for first-degree vehicular homicide, stemming from the deaths of Carlos Perez-Gaytan, 24, of Franklin, and Victor Cabrera-Francisco, 20, of North Brunswick, who were passengers in his vehicle.





The essence of India's inflation problem

THE RISING PRICE OF FOOD LIES AT THE CORE OF INDIA'S INFLATION

The Economic Survey that preceded this year's Union Budget presentation makes a suggestion which has implications for inflation control. It is that the price of food be taken out of the inflation target that the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) is mandated with. In technical jargon, this would amount to targeting 'core' instead of 'headline' inflation, which is the practice now. To appreciate fully the implication of such a move, were it to be implemented, would require recognition of two aspects. These concern the recent experience with inflation in India and the current policy for inflation control.

FOOD PRICE AND INFLATION TRAJECTORY

First, of late, food price inflation has been very high by historical standards. In June, the year-on-year increase in the price of food was close to 10%. Food price inflation has been elevated since 2019. Note that this is before the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic, not to mention the Ukraine war, implying that domestic factors are at work. With food inflation high and food accounting for a large part of the consumer price index, overall inflation has been higher than usual too.

Now to the second aspect that needs to be understood. Since 2016, by an act of Parliament, controlling inflation in India has been hived-off to the RBI, which is expected to control it through variations in the interest rate, a practice termed as 'inflation targeting'. The term conveys a sense of both capacity and precision, that a central bank can choose the level of inflation. Actually, this is far from assured. The RBI has missed the targeted 4% every year in the past five years. In the United Kingdom, the Bank of England's record has been patchy too. Finally, in the United States, where the Federal Reserve aims at 2% inflation, it shot up to over 8% in 2022. Since then it has plummeted to a level close to the target. In all these economies, the recent trajectory of inflation has been undergirded by fluctuations in the price of food globally.

Two questions arise when we consider the suggestion made in the Economic Survey. First, is the move to remove the price of food from the inflation target justifiable in terms of the goals of economic policy? Second, is the RBI likely to be any more successful in controlling core inflation than it has been in its efforts to control headline inflation? The answer to both the questions is 'no'. India is an economy in which the share of food in household expenditure is close to 50%. This is very high by international standards. For instance, in the U.S., it is less than 10%.

Generally, the food share is taken as a proxy for the standard of living - and, therefore, of poverty. A high share of food in a household's expenditure leaves it vulnerable to a rise in the price of food. Given this, to ignore changes in the price of food, by adopting an inflation target which excludes it, amounts to ignoring what matters most to a very large section of the Indian population. A technical justification is given to such a proposal by asserting that food price fluctuations are 'transitory', that is, increases are inevitably followed by a downward movement. Well, this certainly is not true for the Indian economy.

Food price inflation has not been negative in any of



the 13 years since 2011-12, the base year for the current consumer price index. In fact, it may be said that "India has a food inflation problem", and the assertion that food prices may be ignored as the spikes are only transitory is not credible.

TARGETING CORE INFLATION

This takes us to the second issue - whether the RBI can be expected to be any more successful if it were to confine itself to targeting core inflation. This question may be answered quite easily. In the past 13 years, the annual average core inflation has been within the targeted 4% in only one year, that too barely.

This does not surprise us, for our statistical investigation yielded two reasons why this must be so. First, a rise in the RBI's repo rate does not dampen core inflation as claimed. In fact, increasing it is seen to lead to a rise in the inflation rate. This is not without economic logic. As the higher interest rate chokes-off demand, which is how it is meant to work, firms may well raise prices to guard their profits. After all, firms face a double whammy now. Working capital costs would have increased and revenues fallen as aggregate output contracts. We found something else to be the case - that food price inflation is a determinant of core inflation, which, again, is only to be expected. After all, food prices determine wages, which are a part of a firm's costs, the other being materials. So, wages rise as there is food price inflation.

The finding that food prices affect core inflation renders this measure of it without operational significance. It also leads to a deeper understanding. As labor enters all lines of production to a greater or lesser extent, changes in the price of food determine the inflation rate across an economy. Monetary policy working via changes in the interest rate cannot control inflation as the central bank has no control over the price of food.

If all this is so widely known among discerning economists, why does economic policy in India have to persist with the idea that inflation can be left to the central bank? This is because of an ideological shift that occurred globally after the collapse of the Soviet Union. The view that got installed was that

production was to be left to the market and inflation alone was to be controlled by the central bank.

Since 1991, all political parties in India have been eager to demonstrate that they follow closely practices adopted in the West, no matter that they may be irrelevant or, worse still, damaging, to this country. Leaving food price inflation out of the inflation target is one such practice.

FOCUS ON AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTION

The rising price of food lies at the core of India's inflation. The proposal to take the price of food out of the official measure of it is no solution to the ongoing inflation. For reasons explained here, if for whatever reason the price of food was to keep rising, as it has for the last five years, the RBI will not be able to control core inflation either. The current inflation in India can only be handled through supply-side measures that raise the yield in agriculture. The challenges are serious, though not insurmountable for a country that ended chronic food shortage over half a century ago. But success would require a comprehensive approach to agricultural production, one that keeps costs in check so that supply is forthcoming at a steady price as the population and economy grow.

Taking food inflation out of the inflation target without any plan for its control would leave India defenseless against an ever-present threat to the standard of living of its population. The Economic Survey suggests that the adverse welfare effect of food price inflation may be taken care of by income transfers to households. However, if food prices keep rising faster than the overall inflation rate, as they are right now, such transfers would absorb a rising share of the Budget, leaving less and less for public goods. This is undesirable. There is no alternative to controlling the rise in the prices of all goods, which currently is the avowed policy.

Moral pressure and human rights compliance

As is commonly recognized, there are two ways in which compliance with human rights norms can be enforced. One approach is the enforcement of economic sanctions or military invasion. This is only possible in the case of powerful nations. The other strategy is through forceful condemnation which can be undertaken by non-governmental organizations or smaller nations, irrespective of their military or economic power or their lack of adequate international clout.

Though the practice of state sovereignty puts up barriers to the implementation of international human rights standards, moral pressure against the governments guilty of violating human rights sometimes succeeds in nudging them to step back. But mostly, it is seen that authoritarian regimes such as the dispensation of Vladimir Putin in Russia, Xi Jinping in China or Kim Jong-un in North Korea completely ignore the pleadings of various governments, many of whom, in reality, have their own political and economic agenda in disingenuously taking the moral high ground of an anti-war or a liberal narrative.

IMPACT OF NAMING AND SHAMING

However, Rochelle Terman, a scholar on human rights, in her recent study, 'The Geopolitics of Shaming: When Human Rights Pressure Works' - and When It Backfires' (Princeton 2024), places the idea of locating shaming in strategic contexts, thereby exploring the success of publicly identifying and condemning those guilty of human abuse. Naming and shaming, as well as the genuine intentions of lending full support to the victims have, in many instances, worked out positively as a deterrence to further violations.

Innumerable political occasions across the world corroborate the impact of naming and shaming in endorsing human rights accountability and reforms. Such campaigns, it was seen, resulted in exerting significant pressure on governments to improve their human rights records - as in the case of Myanmar and Ethiopia - leading to the release of political prisoners.

Similarly, in Columbia and Argentina, naming and shaming had a tangible impact on policy deviations to address human rights apprehensions. Dictators such as Augusto Pinochet of Chile, Slobodan Milošević from Serbia, Charles Taylor from Liberia, and Alberto Fujimori from Peru have been prosecuted for crimes against humanity after a worldwide censure of their tyranny was established. Across cultures, both traditional and modern, the violence against marginalized ethnic groups or LGBTQ individuals have led to augmented safeguards and appreciation

of basic human rights. Campaigns against such perpetrators have visibly led to increased access to justice and reparations for victims of human rights abuses.

Though naming and shaming efforts often fail, with some guilty governments resisting or denying allegations, or making only cosmetic changes, unrelenting pressure and activism does contribute to greater culpability over time. For example, in the case of Israel, universal endorsements have had negligible impact on the leadership to comply with the demands of recognized human rights institutions which promote and monitor violations. But student agitations across the world against the genocide in Palestine or, more recently, against the dictatorship in Bangladesh are indisputably acts of dissent resulting in exerting moral pressure on the Zionist lobby or on the idea of religious nationalism that often leads to authoritarianism. Such campaigns have often led to increased international scrutiny and demands for human rights improvements. It is disheartening that many nations remain bystanders, or disallow student agitations to suit their right-wing affiliations.

CONUNDRUM IN INTERNATIONAL LAW

The moot question, therefore, before us is to interrogate if the strategy of using "naming and shaming" is effective. Though a powerful tool of moral pressure that puts a country such as China, Russia, Israel or Syria in the spotlight, and condemns violations and urges reform, a conundrum in international law continues to smolder. For example, when Amnesty

International asks you to endorse a petition on behalf of a political dissident in China, or the United Nations issues a resolution convicting state violence in Syria, it amounts to shaming. Or when Russia is banned from participating in the Olympics, it becomes an international act of humiliating the violator. But what can such moral sanctions achieve when in many cases even military invasion or economic sanctions do not work?

Rather than merely exposing the violator on the global stage, one way out of the conundrum would be to ensure that human rights emerge from the inherent social and democratic institutions as well as from the innate national psyche. Human rights advocates must urge governments to build a bridge between power and law, concentrating steadfastly on popular appeals and democratic politics. The success of such an approach will depend on the intensity with which the illiberal forces are challenged by disallowing liberal ideas to be subverted.

Forces fighting for human rights must come to grips with the tendency to co-opt the forces of liberalism through a false rhetoric based on propaganda and deceptions used as trappings of manipulation for the furtherance of power, and buttressed by a sort of unconstitutional politics. Such a brand of hubris will stand vanquished when the impetus given to the growth of human rights and the furtherance of economic and social reforms disempowers the tyranny of the state.

Understandably, we live in a world beleaguered by prejudice and fanaticism, where authoritarian governments tyrannize their people, where free speech is denied with utmost insensitivity. The

very dignity of the people is repudiated and their fundamental freedoms cramped.

THE STATE AND HUMAN RIGHTS

To restore the personal liberty of all and bring the guilty to justice within the ambit of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, becomes the responsibility of the state. Such a call for the scrutiny of the various functions and policies of the state would hasten the advent of the question of human rights to the center stage and usher in an environment of peace, tolerance and understanding. To achieve this, it is pragmatic that the state takes this task as binding and sacred. In case the state shows reluctance in patronizing the cause of human rights, any kind of resistance activism would gain in its legitimacy, especially as a process of a critical, reflective and alert defense of the general public against state persecution or indifference.

Achievements and disappointments of implementing human rights are better understood within the context of liberal modernity where a repression-free state respects human rights without any bias or partiality so that rules of equal treatment stand at the forefront of its crucial concerns. This is possible when the interests of the prevailing parties in power cohere with the question of seeking human rights as fundamental to their political ideology and a zeitgeist underpinned by a conscience of a deep-rooted moral concern. The state would, therefore, need to establish stronger institutions that keep abreast of the democratic norms of protecting basic human rights, a moral and legal position based on ideologically-centered proclamations of norms and expositions.

It is imperative, therefore, to establish the undeniable centrality of human rights amidst the ever-increasing human-rights violations in a rapidly changing world, particularly in liberal systems which help to sustain full stability through generating public welfare in an egalitarian environment. To achieve this, a consolidation of the plausible foundation for human rights, of political coalitions, institutional arrangements, and political ideologies has to be mobilized as a strategy for achieving compliance and justice through holding culprits responsible. This centrality remains absent in North Korea or China, and now in many countries with right-wing governments across the world where the success of a political system depends not on purposeful prerequisite for rights, open-minded legality, or democratic culpability, but on the authoritarian ideological state apparatus geared to attain maximum power over the people.

TRYSTS AND TURNS: Political patronage emboldens offenders

LAWS ON SEXUAL MISCONDUCT SHOULD BE UNIFORMLY AND FIRMLY ENFORCED ACROSS THE COUNTRY

Mamata Banerjee, West Bengal Chief Minister and the feisty boss of the Trinamool Congress (TMC), is squarely on the back foot today. Is this the beginning of the end for this born fighter? If so, the BJP will have succeeded where Bengal-based parties have failed. The BJP is cashing in on Mamata's many mistakes in dealing with the rape-murder of a trainee doctor at RG Kar Medical College and Hospital in Kolkata to turn even some of her own party workers and supporters against her.

The doctor was shamelessly brutalized at her workplace. It almost seems that young men are on the prowl looking for opportunities to rape and kill their chosen victims. There is a loud call for more stringent laws. The question to ask is: Is the Indian state truly concerned about these girls of ours or is it led by men who believe, like Mulayam Singh Yadav, the late Samajwadi Party leader, that "boys will be boys"?

Why are boys not boys in every state of the Indian Union or in other countries of the world? The answer to this question should guide those in power to take remedial measures. Much depends on the political will to combat the menace of sexual perverts running amok. The solution does not involve formulating new laws but ensuring that existing laws on sexual misconduct are uniformly and firmly enforced.

With regard to the Kolkata case, the insidious practice of appointing 'civic volunteers' in government-run hospitals should be immediately discontinued. These workers are chosen from among the ruling party's supporters without proper verification of their antecedents, habits and proclivities. Lumpen elements who constitute the stormtroopers of every political party are allowed to slip in. The 'carte blanche' given to them to roam around in hospitals, 'helping' patients secure beds and medical attention, has led to this sad occurrence.

Regularly recruited social workers who train students for true social work should replace these 'civic volunteers', whose main job is to extract 'speed money' from patients in distress. All indications point to the sharing of the proceeds of corruption with those who have helped them secure unofficial employment.

This menace is not exclusive to Bengal or to one political party. In Gujarat, I learnt that besides teachers recruited from amongst the ideologically aligned people, the ranks of the Home Guards were chosen from the same partisan source. The Home Guards are often sent

to assist the police in law and order or traffic regulation. If such recruitment of untrained men and women is not discontinued, incidents like the one that has hit Kolkata in its solar plexus will multiply.

Another very urgent remedy to reduce cases of sexual misconduct is to send out a clear message to potential offenders that they can expect no mercy from parties in power. They will be caught by the police and sentenced by the courts. At present, there is a very wrong message being circulated that if you support or help the party in power, your time in jail will be curtailed by the easily obtained parole and even jail sentences can be prematurely terminated.

Gurmeet Ram Rahim, a self-styled godman with a large following in Haryana, was convicted of two rapes and a murder. He was released on parole for long periods coinciding with the Lok Sabha and Assembly elections. That may have helped the ruling party get a few

more votes, but it encouraged sexual offenders to go ahead with satisfying their lust.

Similarly, the dozen or so men convicted in Gujarat for rape and murder during the 2002 riots were released prematurely, thereby sending out a clear message that a partisan government would not stop aiding and abetting such offenders as long as they are the party's supporters. The Calcutta High Court fortunately intervened when the TMC was more than kind to the medical college principal, who appeared to have shut his eyes to the unlawful activities of the 'civic volunteers'. The principal should have been given a punishment posting but instead was sent to a bigger and better hospital before the court stepped in. That error of judgment was widely interpreted as an indication of the TMC's support for what was radically evil in the hospital management.

Mulayam's adage that "boys will be boys" is presently the reigning philosophy in our land. It is fortunate that educated women have revolted against this philosophy. It took the BJP leadership quite a long time to sideline Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh, a party MP who doubled as the president of the Wrestling Federation of India. He was a serial offender who ran several educational institutions in and around his home town. He commanded votes in more than three Lok Sabha constituencies. And that mattered more to the BJP than all the slogans that placed women on a pedestal and that were glibly repeated day in, day out by the party's eminent leaders.

If action had been taken earlier against Brij Bhushan, Vinesh Phogat would not have missed the trials for the Olympic wrestling slot in her preferred weight category. And we would not have had to approach the Court of Arbitration for Sport, begging for rules to be changed!

Accused has 'animal-like instinct', his psychoanalytic profile is of a pervert: CBI

KOLKATA (TIP)

The psychoanalytic profile of the arrested accused in the rape and murder of the woman doctor at the state-run RG Kar Medical College and Hospital, Sanjay Roy, indicated that he was a pervert and severely addicted to pornography, a CBI officer said on Thursday, August 22.

Quoting the doctors from New Delhi's Central Forensic Science Laboratory (CFSL), the officer also said that the civic volunteer of the Kolkata Police has an "animal-like instinct".

The body of the post-graduate trainee was found in the seminar room of the hospital on August 9. The civic volunteer was arrested the next day.


"The man showed no repentance and narrated the entire episode giving every minute detail without hiccups. It appeared that he had no remorse," the official of the central probe agency said.

Several pornographic contents were found in the mobile phone that Roy was using and later seized by the Kolkata Police before the investigation was handed over to the CBI on an order of the Calcutta High Court.

The CBI officer said that pieces of evidence, both technical and scientific, "very much support" that the accused was present at the crime scene.

Referring to the CCTV footage collected from the hospital, he said Roy could be seen near the chest department ward at around 11 am on August 8.

"Footage showed him entering the same building again at around 4 am on August 9. Certain technical and scientific evidence corroborated

that," he said.

The officer did not want to divulge anything about the DNA tests conducted on Roy.

He also refused to comment on the ongoing buzz that there was no gang rape in the case.

The CBI officers have visited Roy's residence in Bhowanipore, spoke to his family, neighbours and also to his colleagues in the Kolkata Police.

WHO ARE GODFATHERS OF SANJAY ROY; UNDER WHOSE PATRONAGE DID KOLKATA HORROR ACCUSED BECOME SO ARROGANT

The Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) officers investigating the rape and murder of a woman doctor of state-run R.G. Kar Medical College & Hospital in Kolkata are now tracking the details of the past antecedents of crime against women of the sole arrested accused in the case, Sanjay Roy.

Sources said that during the investigation, the sleuths have come across information about several instances of Sanjay Roy, a civic volunteer, harassing or sexually abusing women. However, no case was launched or action initiated against him. The investigating officials are trying to track the godfathers of Roy, whose patronage stopped any sort of disciplinary action against him in such cases, as a result of which he became so arrogant. There are also records of Roy remaining in an intoxicated state while on duty.

Roy was arrested by the Kolkata Police, which was initially investigating the doctor rape and murder case before the charge of the investigation was handed over to the CBI on the order of the Calcutta High Court.

Since the time he was arrested, questions started surfacing on how the accused, as a mere civic volunteer, enjoyed certain privileges and freedom of movement like regular police personnel. He used to reside at a police barrack at Ultadanga in North Kolkata, which is meant for regular police personnel in the permanent payroll with other allied financial emoluments.

Questions were raised on why this gross irregularity could remain unnoticed by the senior officials of the state police or why any regular resident of the barrack did not bring the matter to the notice of the higher authorities.

Information also surfaced then that despite being a civic volunteer, which is nothing but a contractual post, Roy often used to identify himself as an assistant sub-inspector of police attached to the armed police division of the state police.

The body of a female doctor was found in suspicious circumstances in the seminar hall of the R.G. Kar Medical College and Hospital on August 9. So far only one person has been arrested in the case.

CBI sees cover-up bid, says crime spot altered

KOLKATA (TIP)

The CBI on Thursday, August 22, alleged in the Supreme Court that there was an attempt to cover up the rape and killing of the Kolkata doctor by the local police as the crime scene was altered by the time it took over the probe. In its status report filed in the Supreme Court, the CBI said the parents of the victim were initially informed that it was a case of suicide. Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, representing the CBI, also flagged the delay in filing the FIR. He told a Bench headed by Chief Justice DY Chandrachud that senior doctors of the hospital as well as the victim's colleagues had asked for videography, which meant even they felt that there was a cover-up.

"We initiated the probe on the fifth day. Before that, whatever was collected by the local police was given to us. The investigation itself was a challenge because the scene of offence was altered. The FIR was registered only after the (victim's) cremation at 11:45 pm on August 9. "First, the parents were informed by the deputy superintendent (of the hospital) that she was not well. When they reached the hospital, they were told that she had committed suicide," Mehta told the Bench.

Senior advocate Kapil Sibal, representing the West Bengal Government, countered Mehta's claims, saying everything at the crime scene was recorded on video and that nothing had been tampered with.

Meanwhile, the CBI on Thursday sought permission

from a Kolkata court to conduct a polygraph test on former principal of the medical college Sandip Ghosh and four other doctors, who were on duty on the date of the incident. The agency claimed due to inconsistencies in Ghosh's responses during questioning, they wanted to conduct a polygraph test on him.





SC defers till Sept 5 hearing on Arvind Kejriwal's plea for bail

The Supreme Court on Friday, August 23, deferred till September 5 hearing on Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal's pleas seeking bail and challenging the arrest by the CBI in the alleged excise policy scam.

A bench of justices Surya Kant and Ujjal Bhuyan allowed the CBI to file its counter-affidavit and gave two days' time to Kejriwal to file a rejoinder.

Senior advocate Abhishek Singhvi, appearing for Kejriwal, said the CBI filed a counter-affidavit in only one of the pleas and it was served upon them at 8 pm on Thursday.

ASG SV Raju said they will file the counter in another plea in one week. The bench then posted the matter for further hearing on September 5.

On August 14, the top court refused to grant interim bail to Kejriwal in the case and sought a response from the probe agency on his plea challenging his arrest. Kejriwal was arrested by the CBI on June 26.

The chief minister, who was arrested by the ED on March 21, was granted bail by the trial court in the money-laundering case on June 20. However, the trial court's order was stayed by the high court.

On July 12, the Supreme Court granted him interim bail in the money-laundering case.

NC ties up with Congress for all 90 seats in J&K polls

SRINAGAR (TIP)

National Conference (NC) president Farooq Abdullah on Thursday, August 22, said that his party has finalised an alliance with the Congress for all 90 assembly seats in Jammu & Kashmir, and added that they were open to also bringing the Peoples Democratic Party (PDP) on board after the elections, indicating the possibility of the three INDIA bloc members coming together in the Union territory's political arena.

The former J&K chief minister made the announcement hours after Leader of Opposition (LoP) in the Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi and Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge met him and his son, NC vice president Omar Abdullah, in Srinagar.

"We had a good meeting in a cordial atmosphere. The alliance is on track, and it will run smoothly. The alliance is final, and it will be for all 90 seats. Our common program is to fight together and defeat the divisive forces in the country," Abdullah

said, and added that the two parties will soon formalise a seat-sharing pact.

The first assembly elections in Jammu & Kashmir in a decade will be held in three phases on September 18 and 25, and October 1. They will be the first assembly

polls in the restive region since its special status and statehood were scrapped five years ago and are likely to be the last step before the Union territory's statehood is restored. "Statehood is very important for all of us. This has been promised to us.

This state has witnessed bad days, and we hope it will be restored with its full powers. For that, we stand together with the INDIA bloc," Abdullah said, adding that former MLA and CPI(M) leader Mohammed Yousuf Tarigami also extended support to them. Congress general secretary and former president of J&K unit Ghulam Ahmad Mir said the two parties took different factors into consideration before sealing the alliance: "We resolved almost all hurdles and both the parties even agreed to some sacrifices for the sake of a fruitful coalition."

Speaking on condition of anonymity, a senior Congress leader said: "The NC will likely get around 50 seats and the Congress between 35-38 seats. Some allies will also be accommodated."

The NC and Congress formed a post-poll alliance in 2008, with Omar Abdullah leading the coalition government as the chief minister. The two parties did not tie-up for the 2014 polls and contested all seats separately.

PM Modi arrives in Ukraine as India aims to provide support for peace, stability

NEW DELHI (TIP)

Prime Minister Narendra Modi arrived in Ukraine on Friday, August 23, becoming the first Indian head of government to travel to the country for a visit that is being closely watched for any steps that will be taken by New Delhi to help end the conflict triggered by Russia's invasion in 2022.

Following his engagements in Poland on Thursday, Modi made a journey by train that lasted about 10 hours to reach Ukraine early on Friday morning. There was no official word on his arrival and the Indian side had said there would be few updates about the visit because of stringent security protocols associated with a trip to an active warzone.

Indian TV channels beamed footage of Modi's motorcade driving through the deserted streets of Kyiv to draw up at a hotel. Modi travelled to Ukraine a little more than a month after his visit to Russia for the annual summit with President Vladimir Putin during July 8-9.

The visit coincides with Ukraine's National Flag Day, and President Volodymyr Zelenskyy's office said his talks with Modi will focus on bilateral and multilateral cooperation. It was also expected that a number of documents would be signed by the two countries.

Ahead of his arrival in Kyiv, Modi said during a media interaction in Warsaw on Thursday that India stands ready to work with friendly countries to provide all support for early restoration of peace and stability in Ukraine.

"It is India's firm belief that no problem can be solved on the battlefield. In any crisis, the loss of lives of innocent people has become the biggest challenge for the whole of humanity," he said, speaking in Hindi. "We support dialogue and diplomacy for the early restoration of peace and stability. For this, India, along with friendly countries, is ready to provide all possible support", he said.

The Ukrainian side, which has been looking to India taking on a greater role in ongoing peace efforts because of the country's proximity to Russia, said President Volodymyr Zelenskyy's 10-point peace formula will be one of

the main topics of discussion during Modi's visit that is expected to last about seven hours.

Ukraine has also said it believes India, as the voice of the Global South, should enhance its efforts to bring about a "just and lasting peace".

Modi joins the leaders of Indonesia, Hungary, South Africa and Turkiye in visiting both Russia and Ukraine during the war and is among the handful of Asian leaders who have travelled to Kyiv since the Russian invasion in February 2022. The visit is being seen as part of India's attempts to balance between the country's longstanding strategic relationship with Russia and expectation from the West, especially the US, that New Delhi should do more to back efforts aimed at bringing Moscow and Kyiv to the negotiating table.

However, India has ruled out any mediatory role and indicated it can help by passing messages between Russia and Ukraine.





Hollywood actor, film director and producer Meg Ryan was honoured by the Sarajevo Film Festival with the Honorary Heart of Sarajevo for her contribution to the film industry.

Ryan was one of four film authors who received the award, alongside US and Palestinian film directors Alexander Payne and Elia Suleiman and U.S. actor and producer John Turturro.

"It's an award in recognition of outstanding contribution to the world of cinema, to her incredible talents," festival director Jovan Marjanovic said before handing Ryan a silver heart-shaped award.

Ryan symbolically presented a special screening of her 1998 hit romantic comedy "You've Got Mail" at an open air cinema, the same place where it was first screened at the festival in 1999.

At the masterclass moderated by Oscar-winning Bosnian film director Danis Tanovic, Ryan talked about "What Happens Later", her second feature that she directed, wrote and co-starred with David Duchovny, which was also screened at the festival.

She said that she ventured into acting to pay for her journalism studies, and that she was an "untrained actress".

"I had a beginner's mind, which I see now as a very valuable thing, there is certain naivety, innocence that is important when you are an artist," she said.

The Sarajevo Film Festival, a movie showcase spreading from Vienna to Istanbul, was created by a group of film enthusiasts towards the end of the Bosnian war 30 years ago. It will showcase 240 films in total this year.

Bennifer is officially over again

Jennifer Lopez and Ben Affleck, the Hollywood stars who rekindled their romance and married two decades after a high-profile split, are getting a divorce, TMZ and other media outlets reported on Tuesday, August 20. Lopez, singer of "Love Don't Cost a Thing," submitted divorce papers in Los Angeles County Superior Court on Tuesday, Aug 20, TMZ said.

The filing came two years to the day after the pair held a lavish wedding celebration in Georgia. They had initially exchanged vows in July 2022 at a Las Vegas wedding chapel.

Spokespeople for Lopez and Affleck did not immediately respond to requests for comment.

In the early 2000s, the pair dubbed "Bennifer" were the most talked about couple in the celebrity world in a relationship marked by his-and-her luxury cars and a large 6.1-carat pink diamond engagement ring. They abruptly called off their wedding in 2003 and split up a few months later.

Lopez married Latin singer Marc Anthony, her third husband, just five months after her 2004 split with Affleck.

Affleck, director and star of Oscar-winning film "Argo," went on to marry, and later divorce, actress Jennifer Garner.

Lopez and Affleck started dating again in 2021, months after she and baseball star Alex Rodriguez called off their engagement and ended a four-year relationship.

Lopez said later that the initial breakup with Affleck "was the biggest heartbreak of my life."

"I honestly felt like I was going to die," she said in an interview with Apple Music in November 2022. "But now, 20 years later, it does have a happy ending."



Matthew Perry's master bedroom suite was a 'disaster' after his death:

Matthew Perry's bedroom at Pacific Palisades house was found in a "disaster" condition after police arrived there and discovered the "Friends" actor's body in his hot tub on October 28 last year.

According to a source who has access to the crime scene photos from the police probe, "The master suite looked like someone was in the middle of a long bender. Clothes everywhere, towels on the floor, just dirty." "it was a disaster," the insider told The Post.

However, the rest of the property was really clean and tidy, the legal source informed, adding, "Like maybe the cleaning lady wasn't allowed in those bedrooms."

Perry died due to an overdose of ketamine. In his hot tub, he was discovered floating face down.

Kenneth Iwamasa, his longtime staff member, is one of the five persons who have been detained by the authorities in connection with his death.

Iwamasa is charged with giving



Perry at least 27 shots of ketamine in the final five days of his life, three of which are said to have caused Perry's "serious bodily injury" and eventual "death."

On July 7, he entered a guilty plea to a single charge of conspiring to supply ketamine that causes death.

Court records show that Iwamasa obtained ketamine for Perry from a number of sources, spending over \$55,000 on the drug over the course of the roughly month-long period before the actor passed away.

Charges were also filed against drug dealer Erik Fleming, Salvador Plasencia, Dr. Mark Chavez, and Jasveen Sangha, the so-called "ketamine queen."

Federal prosecutors claimed in a criminal complaint that Iwamasa disposed off drugs, syringes, and other paraphernalia before dialing 911. Additionally, he phoned Sangha, purportedly to seek her advice before getting rid of the drugs.

The insider claimed, "It looks like the bathroom and bedroom had been ransacked," stressing that "someone tried to cover it up" as "something very bad had happened".

PUTIN: KYIV TRYING TO STRIKE NUCLEAR PLANT

MOSCOW (TIP): Russian President Vladimir Putin on August 22 accused Ukraine of trying to strike Russia's Kursk nuclear power plant in an overnight attack and said Moscow had informed the UN nuclear safety watchdog about the situation. Acting Kursk Governor Alexei Smirnov told Putin that the situation at the Kursk plant, which has four Soviet graphite-moderated RBMK-1000 reactors, was "stable". "The enemy tried to strike at the nuclear power plant during the night today," Putin told a meeting of senior officials about the situation in Russian border regions. (Reuters)

ISRAELI STRIKES LEAVE 50 DEAD IN GAZA; TRUCE DEAL REMAINS ELUSIVE

CAIRO/JERUSALEM (TIP): Israeli airstrikes across Gaza killed at least 50 Palestinians in the past 24 hours, Palestinian health officials said on August 21, after US Secretary of State Antony Blinken ended his latest visit to the region with a truce deal still elusive.

As last-ditch diplomacy continued to halt the 10-month-old war between Israel and Hamas, the Israeli military said jets hit around 30 targets throughout the Gaza Strip including tunnels, launch sites and an observation post.

It said troops killed dozens of armed fighters and seized weapons including explosives, grenades and automatic rifles. Later in the day, the Israeli military struck a school and a nearby house in Gaza City, killing at least three people and wounding 15, the territory's Civil Emergency Service said.

The military said, in a statement, it had hit Hamas militants operating at a command center located inside a compound that had previously served as a school.

The conflict churned on as Blinken wound up his ninth troubleshooting visit to West Asia since the Gaza war erupted last October with still no sign that deep differences between the sides over how to end the war could be reconciled.

A Greek-flagged oil tanker was adrift in the Red Sea on Wednesday after repeated attacks that started a fire on the vessel and caused the ship to lose power, the UK maritime agency said.

The Israeli military said on August 21 it had bombed Hezbollah weapon storage facilities in Lebanon's Bekaa Valley overnight, and Hezbollah said it had carried out a drone attack on military posts in a kibbutz in northern Israel in retaliation. Israel also said it had killed a militant in Sidon, southern Lebanon, who worked with Iran's Revolutionary Guards and the Tehran-aligned Hezbollah. Hezbollah said it had retaliated for the strike on the Bekaa by firing Katyusha rockets at an Israeli military logistics site in the Israeli-occupied Golan Heights and by later firing a swarm of drones on military posts in the kibbutz of Amiad in northern Israel. (Reuters)

Zelenskyy visits area bordering Russia amid offensive in Kursk

KYIV (TIP): President Volodymyr Zelenskyy announced the capture of another Russian village as he visited a border area from which Ukrainian forces entered Russia over two weeks ago, but Moscow said its troops had taken a village in east Ukraine.

Kyiv also said it had mounted a drone strike on an air base in southern Russia, its latest counterattack as Russian forces slowly advance in eastern Ukraine 2-1/2 years after Moscow's full-scale invasion.

Russia said its troops had beaten back an attempt by a Ukrainian force to infiltrate its border in a different region to Kyiv's initial incursion into Russia on August 6.

The raid took place about 240 km from the site of the Ukrainian incursion into Kursk region in western Russia, suggesting that the Kyiv government may be aiming to take the war to more border areas.

Authorities in Kursk said they had begun installing concrete shelters to help protect civilians amid the Ukrainian incursion.



The Russian defence ministry said on August 22 its forces had captured the village of Mezhove in Ukraine's eastern Donetsk region.

Zelenskyy said he had met his top commander, Colonel General Oleksandr Syrskyi, during his visit to the border region of Sumy. Official video footage showed them shaking hands and embracing but did not make clear when the visit took place. (Reuters)

China lodges 'serious protest' with US over top American officials meeting Dalai Lama

BEIJING (TIP): China on August 22 lodged a "serious protest" with the US after a top Biden administration official met the Dalai Lama and reaffirmed Washington's commitment to advancing the human rights of Tibetans and supporting efforts to preserve their distinct historical, linguistic, cultural, and religious heritage.


The Dalai Lama, 89, is recuperating in New York since he underwent a successful knee replacement surgery on June 28.

Uzra Zeya, the US Under Secretary of State for Civilian Security, Democracy, and Human Rights and Special Coordinator for Tibetan Issues, travelled to New York for an audience with the Dalai Lama and conveyed Biden's message to the Tibetan spiritual leader, a State Department statement said.

The Tibetan spiritual leader's meeting with the top US State Department official comes months after Biden signed into law a bill which enhanced US support for Tibet to promote dialogue between China and the Dalai Lama towards a peaceful resolution of the dispute over the status and governance of the remote Himalayan region.

Reacting to Uzra Zeya's meeting with the Dalai Lama, Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesperson, Mao Ning, told a media briefing here that the 14th Dalai Lama is not a pure religious figure, still less a figure promoting "non-violence" and "peace", but a political exile engaged in anti-China separatist activities under the cloak of religion.

"China firmly opposes any country



allowing the Dalai Lama to make visits under any pretext and opposes government officials of any country meeting with the Dalai Lama in any form," she said.

"We've made a serious protest with the US. The appointment of the so-called "US Special Coordinator for Tibetan Issues" constitutes an interference in China's internal affairs. China has never recognised it," Mao said of the region, which China refers to as "Xizang".

"We urge the US to fully understand the gravity and sensitivity of Xizang-related issues, be fully aware of the Dalai group's anti-China and separatist nature, honour the commitments the US has made to China on issues related to Xizang, truly respect China's core interests and major concerns, not allow the Dalai Lama to engage in political separatist activities in

the US, have no contact with the Dalai Lama in any form, and stop sending the wrong message to the world," she said.

China had opposed the "Resolve Tibet Act" passed by the House of Representatives last February and cleared by the Senate in May and described it as "destabilising". "Honoured to meet with His Holiness the @DalaiLama, a global figure for compassion and nonviolence. I conveyed greetings from @POTUS, wishing a smooth recovery and reaffirming the United States' unwavering support for the Tibetan community," Zeya, an Indian-origin-American diplomat, said in a post on X through her official handle.

Earlier in May 2022, Zeya had called on the Dalai Lama at his residence in Dharamsala, the seat of power of the Tibetan government in exile, during her official visit to India and Nepal. (PTI)

French destroyer in EU mission rescues 29 mariners from oil tanker stricken in Red Sea attacks

DUBAI (TIP): A French destroyer rescued 29 mariners from an oil tanker that came under repeated attack in the Red Sea, officials said on August 22, while also destroying a bomb-carrying drone boat in the area.

Yemen's Houthi rebels are suspected to have carried out the assault on the Sounion. The attack, the most serious in the Red Sea in weeks, comes during a months-long campaign by Houthis targeting ships over the Israel-Hamas war in the Gaza Strip that has disrupted a trade route through which \$1 trillion in cargo typically passes each year.

The Sounion is now at anchor in the Red Sea and no longer drifting, the European Union's Operation Aspides said. However, it wasn't clear if the vessel was still ablaze. The vessel had been staffed by a crew of Filipinos and Russians.

Military officials did not name the French destroyer involved in the rescue. In the attack Wednesday, men on small boats first opened fire with small arms about 140 km (90 miles) west of the rebel-held Yemeni port city of Hodeida, the British military's United Kingdom Maritime Trade Operations centre said.

Four projectiles also hit the ship, it added. It wasn't immediately clear if that meant drones or missiles.

The Houthis did not immediately claim responsibility for the attacks, though it can take them hours or even days before they acknowledge their assaults. However, they did



acknowledge US airstrikes in Hodeida that the American military's Central Command said destroyed a Houthi surface-to-air missile and radar system.

The Houthis have targeted more than 80 vessels with missiles and drones since the war in Gaza started in October. They seized one vessel and sank two in the campaign that also killed four sailors.

Other missiles and drones have either been intercepted by a US-led coalition in the Red Sea or failed to reach their targets.

The rebels maintain that they target ships linked to Israel, the United States or the UK to force an end to Israel's war against Hamas in Gaza. However, many of the ships attacked have little or no connection to the conflict, including some bound for Iran.

As Iran threatens to retaliate against Israel over the assassination of Hamas leader Ismail Haniyeh in Tehran, the US military told the USS Abraham Lincoln aircraft carrier strike group to sail more quickly to the area. Early Thursday, the US military's Central Command said the Lincoln had reached the Mideast's waters, without elaborating.

America also has ordered the USS Georgia-guided missile submarine into the Mideast, while the USS Theodore Roosevelt aircraft carrier strike group was in the Gulf of Oman.

Additional F-22 fighter jets have flown into the region and the USS Wasp, a large amphibious assault ship carrying F-35 fighter jets, is in the Mediterranean Sea. (AP)

Spanish woman believed to be the oldest person in the world dies at age 117

MADRID (TIP): Maria Branyas, an American-born Spaniard considered the world's oldest person at 117 years old, has died, her family said on August 21.

In a post on Branyas' X account, her family wrote in Catalan: "Maria Branyas has left us. She has gone the way she wanted: in her sleep, at peace, and without pain." Gerontology Research Group, which validates details of people thought to be 110 or older, listed Branyas as the oldest known person in the world after the death of French nun Lucile Randon last year.

The next oldest person listed by Gerontology Research Group is now Japan's Tomiko Itooka, who is 116 years old.

Branyas was born in San Francisco on March 4, 1907. After living for some years in New Orleans, where her father founded a magazine, her family returned to Spain when she was young. Branyas said that she had memories of crossing the Atlantic Ocean during World War I.



Her X account is called "Super Catalan Grandma" and bears the description: "I am old, very old, but not an idiot." At age 113, Branyas tested positive for COVID-19 during the global pandemic, but avoided developing severe symptoms that claimed tens of thousands of older Spaniards.

At the time of her death she was living

in a nursing home in Catalan town of Olot.

Her family wrote that Branyas told them days before her death: "I don't know when, but very soon this long journey will come to an end. Death will find me worn down from having lived so much, but I want to meet it with a smile, feeling free and satisfied." (AP)

ROCKET ENGINE EXPLODES DURING TEST AT SCOTTISH SPACEPORT

LONDON (TIP): A rocket engine exploded in flames during a test at the SaxaVord Spaceport in Scotland, which last year became Britain's first licensed vertical rocket launch site.

BBC footage showed a large explosion late on August 21 at the site in the Shetland Islands off the northern coast of Scotland.

It spewed great plumes of fire and smoke into the air.

The site had been evacuated prior to the test and no one was injured, SaxaVord and its German partner, Rocket Factory Augsburg (RFA), said in separate statements.

"This was a test, and test campaigns are designed to identify issues prior to the next stage," a spokesman for SaxaVord said. "We will work with RFA to understand and learn from the causes and support them as they move forward to the next phase of their preparations."

RFA said it was trying to gather information to resolve what happened following an "anomaly" during the test, one of a number of trials in the run-up to a launch.

The launch pad had been "saved and is secured", it added.

SaxaVord, which hopes to become the first British site to undertake a vertical satellite launch into space, received a key safety license from regulators in April, paving the way for a launch later this year.

The space market is forecast to be worth over a trillion-dollars by 2030 as companies around the world plan to deploy thousands of internet-beaming satellites. (Reuters)

UK TECH TYCOON MIKE LYNCH MISSING AFTER YACHT SINKS



PALERMO (SICILY) (TIP): One man died and six people were missing, including British tech entrepreneur Mike Lynch, after a luxury yacht was struck by an unexpectedly violent storm and sank off Sicily on August 21.

The British-flagged "Bayesian", a 56-metre-long sailboat, was carrying 22 people and was anchored just off shore near the port of Porticello when it was hit by ferocious weather, the Italian coast guard said. Witnesses said the yacht vanished quickly beneath the waves shortly before dawn. Fifteen people escaped before it went down, including Lynch's wife, Angela Bacares. — Reuters

SRI LANKA ANNOUNCES VISA-FREE ACCESS TO INDIANS, NATIONALS FROM 34 OTHER COUNTRIES FOR 6 MONTHS

COLOMBO (TIP): The Sri Lankan government has announced visa-free access to citizens from 35 countries, including India, the UK and the US to the island nation for six months, media reports said on August 21.

The Cabinet made the decision which will be in effect from October 1, 2024, the Daily Mirror newspaper reported quoting Adviser to the Ministry of Tourism, Harin Fernando.

The policy is for six months, Fernando said.

Countries on the list include India, the UK, China, the US, Germany, the Netherlands, Belgium, Spain, Australia, Denmark, Poland, Kazakhstan, Saudi Arabia, the UAE, Nepal, Indonesia, Russia, and Thailand.

Other countries include Malaysia, Japan, France, Canada, the Czech Republic, Italy, Switzerland, Austria, Israel, Belarus, Iran, Sweden, South Korea, Qatar, Oman, Bahrain and New Zealand.

Earlier, controversy surrounded increased fees for on-arrival visas in Sri Lanka, which were being handled by a foreign company.

Visitors from India, China, Russia, Japan, Malaysia, Thailand, and Indonesia received tourist visas free of charge to Sri Lanka. (PTI)

7 DIE IN NEPAL LANDSLIDES; 4 OF FAMILY BURIED ALIVE IN BAJHANG DISTRICT

KATHMANDU (TIP): Seven persons were killed in separate incidents of landslides that were triggered by incessant rain in the western part of Nepal in the last 24 hours, police said on August 20.

Four members of a family were buried alive in the Bajhang district as a landslide swept a house in the Bungal municipality-10 on Sunday night, according to the police.

Those killed included 50-year-old Kali Dhami, her daughter-in-law and two grandchildren aged six and three, said the police. Meanwhile, six members of the family managed to escape nature's fury.

In another incident, a landslide buried a temporary shelter in Majha gaon of the Nalgad municipality-2 in Jajarkot district on Monday, killing three members of a family.

According to the police, the family had been living in the temporary shelter after their house had collapsed in the earthquake last year.

More than 1,800 people have lost their lives in a decade, owing to the monsoon's fury in the Himalayan nation. (PTI)

Pakistani YouTuber arrested for fanning 'religious hatred', 'defaming institutions'

LAHORE (TIP): A staunch critic of the Pakistan Army and YouTuber has been arrested in the Punjab province of Pakistan for allegedly fanning 'religious hatred' and 'defaming institutions', especially the military, on social media, authorities said on August 22.

The arrest of Orya Maqbool Jan, a known political commentator, comes a week after intelligence agencies allegedly abducted another YouTuber and comedian for criticising the Shehbaz Sharif-led government.

The Federal Investigation Agency (FIA) cybercrime wing said it raided Jan's residence in Lahore on Thursday and arrested him for stoking religious hatred against an 'important personality' and institutions.

Jan, a columnist, poet, playwright and former civil servant, has a



following of over a million subscribers on his YouTube channel. Last year he was detained by intelligence agencies for several days for openly criticising the role of the powerful military in politics and for supporting jailed

former prime minister Imran Khan.

Following the arrest of Khan, the founder supremo of the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) party last August, a number of journalists and YouTubers in the country faced arrests, violence and threats amid mass protests.

Earlier last week, another Pakistani YouTuber and comedian Aun Ali Khosa was allegedly abducted by intelligence agencies for singing a song critical of the Shehbaz Sharif government and its backers. He, however, had returned home, his lawyer said on Monday.

Khosa was among the three other social media activists from Khan's PTI, who had recently been picked up, allegedly by intelligence agencies. The other two were Naeem Ahmad Yasin and Arsalan Akbar and their families have claimed they are 'missing'. (PTI)

UN team in B'desh to talk modalities of rights probe



DHAKA (TIP): A United Nations team will meet Bangladesh's interim government and other stakeholders from August 22 to discuss the process to investigate alleged human rights violations during the recent deadly violence in the country, officials said.

About 300 people, many of them university and college students, were killed during protests before the events spiralled into demonstrations to oust long-serving former PM Sheikh Hasina.

The UN office in Bangladesh said in a media advisory that the team from the UN High Commissioner for Human Rights will be visiting Dhaka from

September 22-29.

"The purpose of this visit is to understand their priorities for assistance in promoting human rights," said the media advisory, adding Bangladesh's interim government had requested the UN to probe the killings during the protests.

Kamala Harris remembers her mother as she accepts Democratic Party's nomination'

"It is important to note that this visit is not an investigation, but rather it will focus on discussing the process for investigating human rights violations in light of the recent violence and unrest." (Reuters)



Plaint filed in Int'l Crimes Tribunal against Sheikh Hasina

DHAKA (TIP): A complaint was filed on August 20 with Bangladesh's International Crimes Tribunal (ICT) against deposed premier Sheikh Hasina and 26 others, including former ministers of her cabinet, for committing alleged genocide and crimes against humanity.

Md Abul Hasan, the father of Shahriar Hasan Alvi, who was killed during the recent anti-discrimination students' movement, filed the complaint against 27 people, including 76-year-old Hasina and her cohorts and 500 unnamed others with the investigation agency of the ICT, state-run BSS news agency reported.

The other prominent accused in the complaints are former ministers Obaidul Quader, Rashed Khan Menon, Hasanul Huq Inu and former inspector general of police Abdullah Al Mamun, it said.

Hasina fled to India on August 5 after resigning from her post amidst unprecedented anti-government student-led protests. — PTI

Vermicelli Pulao

FOR ROASTING:

- 1 tsp ghee / clarified butter, 1 cup vermicelli / semiya

FOR MASALA PASTE

- handful coriander, handful mint / pudina 1 chilli

OTHER INGREDIENTS:

- 2 tbsp ghee / clarified butter, 2 bay leaf, 3 pod cardamom, 1 inch cinnamon, 4 clove, 1 star anise, 1 tsp cumin / jeera, 15 whole cashew / kaju, 1 onion, finely chopped, 1 tsp ginger garlic paste, $\frac{1}{2}$ capsicum, finely chopped, $\frac{1}{2}$ carrot, finely chopped, 2 tbsp peas / matar, 5 beans, finely chopped, $\frac{3}{4}$ tsp garam masala, $\frac{3}{4}$ tsp salt, $1\frac{1}{2}$ cup water, 2 tsp lemon juice

INSTRUCTIONS

- Firstly, take 1 tsp ghee in a pan and roast 1 cup vermicelli.
- Roast on low flame until it turns golden brown. You can use roasted vermicelli in place, however, I still recommend roasting for non-sticky pulao. Keep aside.
- In a small blender take handful coriander, mint and 1 chilli.
- Blend to smooth paste adding water as required. Keep aside.
- In a large kadai, heat 2 tbsp ghee and sauté 2 bay leaf, 3 pod cardamom, 1 inch cinnamon, 4 clove, 1 star anise, 1 tsp cumin and 15 whole cashew.
- Roast on low flame until spices turn aromatic and cashew turn crunchy.
- Now add 1 onion, 1 tsp ginger garlic paste and sauté well.
- Further add $\frac{1}{2}$ capsicum, $\frac{1}{2}$ carrot, 2 tbsp peas and 5 beans.
- Stir fry for 2 minutes without overcooking vegetables.
- Add in prepared masala paste, $\frac{3}{4}$ tsp garam masala and $\frac{3}{4}$ tsp salt.
- Sauté well until all spices are well combined.
- Pour in $1\frac{1}{2}$ cup water and get the water to a rolling boil.
- Add in roasted vermicelli and give a good mix.
- Cover and simmer for 7 minutes or until water is absorbed completely.
- Now mix gently, making sure vermicelli is well cooked.
- Cover and rest for 5 minutes. This helps to get non-sticky semiya.
- Finally, just before serving vermicelli pulao, squeeze 2 tsp lemon juice.



Red meat linked with increased diabetes risk: Lancet study

Consuming red meat is related to a higher risk of type 2 diabetes, according to an analysis of more than 19 lakh adults from 20 countries across world regions, including southeast Asia, providing the "most comprehensive evidence to date."

Published in The Lancet Diabetes and Endocrinology journal, the analysis found that a habitual consumption of three types of meat and their daily amounts - 50 grams of processed meat, 100 grams of unprocessed red meat and 100 grams of poultry - was related to 15 per cent, 10 per cent and eight per cent increases in risk of developing type 2 diabetes, respectively.

The international team of researchers from the US, UK, Brazil, Mexico, among others, said that intake of meat exceeds recommended levels in many regions of the world and has been correlated with non-communicable diseases, including type 2 diabetes.

However, all the existing evidences are largely based on studies from high-income countries, mainly in North America and Europe, they said.

For this study, the researchers included 31 cohorts from the InterConnect project, data for which was compiled from scientific studies and online registries, including unpublished information. Of the total 19,66,444 participants, more than a lakh developed type 2 diabetes during follow-up, typically lasting 10 years.

"The positive associations of unprocessed red meat and processed meat with incident type 2 diabetes were



significant in the region of the Americas (13 per cent and 17 per cent, respectively), in the European region (six per cent and 13 per cent), and in the Western Pacific region and east Asia (17 per cent and 15 per cent)," the authors wrote.

They also estimated that replacing 50 grams of daily intake of processed meat with 100 grams of unprocessed red meat lowered the risk of type 2 diabetes by seven per cent on an average.

Further, diabetes risk was found to fall by 10 per cent on replacing 50 grams of processed meat daily intake with 100 grams of poultry a day.

The researchers, however, found no evidence that replacing unprocessed red meat with poultry helped in cutting down diabetes risk.

Too much chicken can sneak in extra fat and sugar into your diet

Chicken breasts are most people's go-to option for daily protein intake. For some people, chicken makes up for the most part of their diet for health reasons. However, a recent study reveals that consumption of too much chicken may not be as healthy as we think.

Chicken breast and ketchup – too much of it – might be the reason for overconsumption of fat and sugar. The surprising details were revealed in a study. Ice-cream, pizza and cheese are known for not being too healthy already. But when it comes to consuming chicken and harmless servings of ketchup, we never thought that we were, in fact, sneaking in extra fat and sugar in our diet.

In a media release, Professor Christopher Taylor, director of medical dietetics at the School of Health and Rehabilitation Sciences at The Ohio State University and lead study author said that while chicken breast is known as a lower saturated fat food, we must know that foods with lower saturated fats can also slowly add saturated food to the diet.

The study was conducted on 35,000 U.S. adults to research the unhealthy eating habits in people. The study also helps in spreading awareness about the unexpected daily sources of sugar and fat that we add to the diet. Professor Christopher Taylor further added that while chicken breast and ketchup are not poor food choices, we should know how they work.

The study noted down cheese, pizza, ice cream, and eggs as top contributors of saturated fat to the body. Cold cuts, substitutes for cream, fried potatoes, and whole milk are also high in saturated fat content. Beverages and desserts such as soft drinks, tea, fruit drinks, cakes, and pies are the sources of added sugars to the body. Tomato-based condiments, cereal bars, energy drinks, and yeast breads also contribute to added sugars in the body.



AI scientists are producing new theories of how the brain learns

Five decades of research into artificial neural networks have earned Geoffrey Hinton the moniker of the Godfather of artificial intelligence (AI). Work by his group at the University of Toronto laid the foundations for today's headline-grabbing AI models, including ChatGPT and LaMDA. These can write coherent (if uninspiring) prose, diagnose illnesses from medical scans and navigate self-driving cars. But for Dr Hinton, creating better models was never the end goal. His hope was that by developing artificial neural networks that could learn to solve complex problems, light might be shed on how the brain's neural networks do the same.

Brains learn by being subtly rewired: some connections between neurons, known as synapses, are strengthened, while others must be weakened. But because the brain has billions of neurons, of which millions could be involved in any single task, scientists have puzzled over how it knows which synapses to tweak and by how much. Dr Hinton popularised a clever mathematical algorithm known as backpropagation to solve this problem in artificial neural networks. But it was long thought to be too unwieldy to have evolved in the human brain. Now, as AI models are beginning to look increasingly human-like in their abilities, scientists are questioning whether the brain might do something similar after all.

Working out how the brain does what it does is no easy feat. Much of what neuroscientists understand about human learning comes from experiments on small slices of brain tissue, or handfuls of neurons in a Petri dish. It's often not clear whether living, learning brains work by scaled-up versions of these same rules, or if something more sophisticated is taking place. Even with modern experimental techniques, wherein neuroscientists track hundreds of neurons at a time in live animals, it is hard to reverse-engineer what is really going on.

One of the most prominent and longstanding theories of how the brain learns is Hebbian learning.

WhatsApp will soon allow users to choose a default theme for the app

WhatsApp is working on a new feature for the app that will allow users to select a default theme for the app. This theme will be independent of the theme setting of the phone. Till now, the WhatsApp theme is in sync with the default theme of the phone. So if the device is on dark theme, the app also turns dark, and if the phone's setting is on a light theme, then WhatsApp also runs the same theme. However, with the upcoming features, users will be able to customise the theme for the app individually.

The feature is still in beta and was spotted by WABetaInfo. It is part of the WhatsApp beta for Android 2.24.18.6 update. There is no timeline when this feature will roll out to the stable version. However, users running WhatsApp on the beta version should now be able to see the feature in settings.

WABetaInfo has also shared a screenshot of the upcoming features. With the feature rolling out, WhatsApp will likely get a fresh look by updating its signature green colour across two distinct themes. In the light theme, the familiar green will be replaced with black, lending the app a sleek, modern, and minimalist appearance. On the other hand, in the dark theme, the primary colour will switch to white, creating a bold contrast that not only enhances readability but also adds a contemporary edge to the app's overall aesthetic.

A similar feature was also spotted last month. WhatsApp was reported to be



developing chat themes that allow iPhone users to choose from five preset colours for their chat bubbles and wallpaper, including classic green, white, blue, pink, and purple.. Additionally, WhatsApp is reportedly working on a feature to change the app's accent colour, offering the same color choices as the chat themes, allowing for customisable in-app buttons. While these features aren't publicly available yet, their presence in beta indicates a potential upcoming release.

In April this year, WhatsApp started to go green. No, not in the environmental preservation kind of a way. The text, bubbles and accent on the app all turned green. For iPhone users, in particular, this just happened overnight. It was not a change users asked for, and there was quite a bit of conversation around it on social media.

These new customisation options could position WhatsApp more favourably against competitors like

Telegram, which already offers a variety of personalisation features. By providing users with greater control over the app's appearance, WhatsApp seems to be aiming to attract and retain those who prioritise a personalised messaging experience.

WhatsApp is introducing a significant privacy feature designed to address one of the platform's most persistent issues--spam.

The new feature, available in the beta version 2.24.18.2 for Android, introduces a Username PIN system aimed at improving user security and curbing unwanted messages, according to GSM Arena.

This new functionality allows WhatsApp users to set a four-digit PIN in addition to their username.

The PIN serves as an extra layer of security, ensuring that users who have not interacted with you previously cannot send you messages solely by knowing your username.

This measure is expected to significantly reduce spam and enhance privacy for WhatsApp users, according to GSM Arena.

"Once implemented, this feature should greatly cut down on spam, which has been a prevalent issue on WhatsApp," said a spokesperson for the company, according to GSM Arena.

The PIN feature will require anyone who wishes to message you for the first time to know both your username and the PIN you have set.

Chandrayaan 4-5 design complete; 70 satellites likely to be launched in 5 yrs: ISRO chief

ISRO chairman S Somanath has said the space agency has completed the design for the next round of moon missions – Chandrayaan 4 and 5 – and is in the process of seeking government approval for the same.

The Chandrayaan-4 mission includes bringing back moon rocks and soil to earth after a soft landing on the lunar surface, launching a spacecraft from the moon, demonstrating a space docking experiment in lunar orbit and getting the samples back to earth.

"We have a series of missions to go to the moon. Chandrayaan-3 is over. Now, design for Chandrayaan 4 and 5 has been completed and we are seeking approval of the government," Somanath told reporters here on the sidelines of an event organized by the All India Council for Technical Education and Indian Space Association.

Earlier, the ISRO officials had said that



the targeted launch for Chandrayaan-4 mission was 2028.

Somanath also said that the space agency was planning to launch 70 satellites over the next five years, including a constellation of low earth orbit satellites to meet the requirements of different ministries and departments of the government.

These 70 satellites include four for the NAVIC regional navigation system to

provide positioning, navigation and time service, INSAT 4D weather satellites, the Resourcesat series of satellites, Cartosat satellites for remote sensing and high resolution imaging, he said.

Somanath said the space agency was also planning to develop the Oceansat series of satellites and technology demonstration satellites 01 and 02 to demonstrate electric propulsion systems, and quantum key distribution technologies.

The ISRO was also developing data relay satellites for the Gaganyaan mission, high throughput satellites for providing internet connectivity and GSAT satellite which was getting ready for shipping to the US for launch on a Falcon rocket of SpaceX, he said.

Somanath said the space agency was also planning to launch a series of earth observation satellites over the next five years.

'Complex, expensive': Further tranches of sovereign gold bonds unlikely

Further tranches of sovereign gold bonds are unlikely, said sources to Business Today TV. SGBs are government securities denominated in grams of gold and are substitutes for physical gold.

According to sources, "SGB is a complex and expensive instrument".

SGBs are issued by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) on behalf of the Indian government.

Meanwhile, earlier this month, the RBI announced the final redemption price at Rs 6,938 per gram – 122 per cent higher – for SGBs that were issued on August 5, 2016. The gold bonds were issued at a price of Rs 3,119 in August 2016 by RBI. The final redemption date was August 5.

The price of Sovereign Gold Bonds is based on the average closing price of 999 purity gold as published by the India Bullion and Jewellers Association Limited for the week before the subscription period, according to RBI guidelines. Investors buy SGBs at the issue price in cash and redeem them for cash upon maturity. The central bank issues these bonds on behalf of the government.

SGBs, issued by the government, have an 8-year tenure. The SGB August 2016 issue is reaching maturity, requiring redemption. Unlike the optional redemption by the RBI at the end of the fifth year, this bond's redemption is mandatory.

Walmart tears up China online strategy with JD.com stake sale

NEW YORK (TIP)

Walmart's stake in Chinese e-commerce firm JD.com was once central to its China strategy. Now it is tearing up that playbook by unloading its entire \$3.74 billion stake in one of China's biggest online retailers, in another example of the volatile nature of its relationship with China.

The unshackling from JD.com is emblematic of the broader strategic withdrawal of the world's largest retailer from markets where profitability has proven elusive. It follows the retailer's exits from several big markets over the past few years, including Japan, Britain, Brazil and Argentina, which industry-watchers have attributed to Walmart's difficulty in competing with nimble local rivals. When Walmart took its initial investment in JD.com in 2016 it was struggling to scale its own e-commerce platform, Yihaodian, and gain a foothold in China's rapidly growing online shopping market.

At the time, David Cheesewright, then CEO of Walmart International, positioned the \$1.5 billion deal as a move to improve Walmart's competitiveness in China's cutthroat retail sector and boost sales in its underperforming physical stores. The deal, which was one of the biggest investments in a Chinese retailer by a U.S. company, included the opening of a Sam's Club China store on JD.com and access to JD.com's distribution network for same- and next-day deliveries, a joint announcement from the companies said.

The company's reliance on JD.com to drive sales, however, has diminished since the pandemic, when home-bound Chinese consumers gravitated to Sam's Clubs so they could stock up for possible lockdowns and make fewer trips to the store. This trend has continued even post-pandemic, Walmart executives have said, with memberships at Sam's Club hitting a record high in Walmart's most recent quarter. Sam's Club, which opened its first store in Shenzhen in 1996, is the top warehouse club chain in China. Half of Walmart's China sales come from online channels, the company has said, which include sales from JD.com, JD Daojia and its Sam's Club app.



Walmart on Tuesday said its decision to sell its JD.com stake "allows us to focus on our strong China operations for Walmart China and Sam's Club, and deploy capital towards other priorities." Some of Walmart's other international priorities include doubling the amount of merchandise it sells in foreign markets to \$200 billion in the next four years. The company is also working toward an initial public offering of its digital payments platform PhonePe and Flipkart marketplace in India. The divestiture of JD.com is also notable as a big first move by Kathryn McLay, who took over as CEO of Walmart's international division last year, and it occurs as U.S.-China trade tensions, coupled with geopolitical uncertainties, have made China a more challenging trade partner. Several Western firms, including Walmart, are increasingly shifting investments and sourcing away from China to other developing countries, including India, Pakistan and Bangladesh, to improve their supply-chain resilience.

Govt flags e-commerce risk to 100 million retailers

Unfettered growth of e-commerce in India may cause "huge social disruption", impacting the livelihood of 100 million small retailers across the country, Union commerce and industry minister Piyush Goyal said on Wednesday, August 21, accusing multinationals such as Amazon of resorting to unfair practices such as predatory pricing to gain market share. His comments are likely to cause concern among large e-commerce companies, Indian as well as foreign, as well as investors that have pumped billions of dollars into them.

Commenting on Pahle India Foundation's report "Net Impact of E-Commerce on Employment and Consumer Welfare in India", Goyal said that the study has prompted "us to start assessing the subject" based on data and empirical evidence. "I'm being contrarian... we have seen this happened in the West. I dare say, Europe, America, all have seen the consequences of this,"



he said referring to the disappearance of so-called Mom-n-Pop or kirana stores. Cautious about its disruptive potential, Switzerland initially discouraged e-commerce and later allowed it in a limited way, he added. While Goyal did not elaborate, it is likely that he was referring to the new laws governing e-commerce that will come into effect in the European country from next year, that recognize e-commerce platforms as "deemed suppliers" -- a move that is likely to have far-reaching impact on them.

"I'm not wishing away e-commerce. It's there to stay... Since this is a study about the impact it should be dispassionate. It should come out with even more details..." he said emphasising the social need to venture out for shopping and eating out with friends instead of "becoming a country of couch potatoes" watching OTT and ordering in every day.

"But, I don't deny that e-commerce has a role. But, we'll have to think very carefully and cautiously what that role is. Is predatory pricing policy good for the country where Amazon says we are going to invest a billion dollars in India, and we all celebrate. We forgot the underlying story that the billion dollars is not coming in for any great service or any great investment to support the Indian economy. They made a billion dollars loss in their balance sheet that year. They have to fill in that loss. And how did that loss get caused? They paid Rs 1,000 crore to professionals. I don't know who these professionals are..." he

said.

"I'd love to know which chartered accountants, professionals, lawyers get Rs 1,000 crore unless you are paying all the top lawyers to block them so that nobody can fight a case against you."

The minister continued in the same vein: "If you make Rs 6,000 crore loss in one year, does that not smell of predatory pricing to any of you? They are, after all an e-commerce platform. They are not allowed to do B2C (business to consumer)."

Indian laws only allow multinational e-commerce companies to operate platforms that connect sellers to buyers. They cap the stake the companies can have in the sellers. Foreign investment in retail and e-commerce are both issues of significant political relevance in India. It is widely believed that small traders and retailers constitute the core electoral base of the Bharatiya Janata Party which heads the NDA coalition governing the country.



Sikh History This Week

AUGUST 23 TO AUGUST 29

23rd August



1507 Guru Nanak visits the house of God from river Bein.

In the morning, Guru Nanak went to the river Bein to take a bath but didn't return. Everyone thought he had drowned. But apparently, he visited the house of God where he spent three days before returning to our world. While there he was offered a cup of nectar and was ordered to drink it. Guru Nanak was terrified. All he could see was the blinding light and all he could hear was God's commanding voice. God ordered Guru Nanak Dev to return back to the world and spread the message of love and peace. God said he had appointed Guru Nanak Dev as His messenger. He returned at the same place he had disappeared from three days earlier. The people were horrified by the miracle of his disappearing in the river and reappearing from the same place three days later.

1978 Baba Nischal Singh Ji, a devoted member of Panthic Saewaks, passed away.

24th August



Guru Gadi, Fifth Patshah, Guru Arjan Dev Ji. GURU ARJAN DEV (1563-1606) Guru Arjan, the 'Prince of Martyrs' and the 'Prophet of Peace', proffered his precious life to nurture the glory that was to be the Sikh Panth. The Fifth Master's life was marked by divine bliss and sublime sacrifices, born of a sweet acceptance of God's Will. Gifted with a quintessential poetic afflatus, and immeasurable imaginative sympathies, the Guru gave the movement of Sikhism a definite direction, perspective and program. He made the new faith coeval or coextensive with the whole gamut of existence and raised its exquisite edifice on values for which there is neither death nor change.

Guru Arjan Dev adorned the sacred throne of Guru Nanak from Sept. 1, 1581 to May 30, 1606. Born at Goindwal on April 15, 1563, he was the youngest and noblest son of Guru Ram Das and Mata Bibi Bhani. On 23 Hadh sunmat 1636, he married Ganga Devi, daughter of Krishan Chand of Mau village. He had an innate

poetic sensibility which was exquisitely displayed in the epistles that he sent to his father from Lahore. They are deeply expressive of the pangs of separation and the exuberance of Love. The Fourth Master's decision to make Guru Arjan his spiritual heir was bitterly opposed by Prithvi Chand who contended that being the eldest son, he alone was entitled to the Guruship. Thus, he could never reconcile himself to his younger brother's installation as Guru.

1820 Sardar Hari Singh Nalwa reaches Kashmir and was appointed Nazim (Governor). He remained in this position for less than two years. During his reign, he freed agricultural labour from Begar and encouraged the shawl and wood carving industries by giving loans in cash and kind. He encouraged cultivating of saffron. The land revenue was reduced from Rs. 61 lakhs to Rs. 13 lakhs. It was enhanced later when agriculture production improved. Kashmiri shawls and woollen work were exported to Europe.

25th August



1581 Jotti Jot, Fourth Patshah, Guru Ram Das Ji.

The Fourth Master, ascended the holy gaddi (throne) of Guru Nanak in 1574 and continued to adorn the exalted office till 1581. Though he was the son-in-law of Guru Amar Das, being married to his daughter Bibi Bhani, yet he revered the Third Master as a Guru with an unwavering fervor. Inebriated with the nectar of the divine Nam, he spurned delights, and spent all his time in an ecstatic communion with the Lord through moments of deep meditation.

Originally called Jetha Ji, Guru Ram Das was born in a Sodhi family at Lahore in 1534. His parents died when he was just a child. He was, therefore, brought up by his maternal grandparents. He had an opportunity to visit Goindwal, the seat of the Third Master, at a time when the bawali was being dug through voluntary labor. He immersed himself in this labor of love with such a rare verve and dedication that he won the Guru's appreciation and recognition. The Third Master was so highly pleased with the disciple that he gave his daughter Bibi Bhani to him in marriage. Nevertheless, he served Guru Amar Das with as much love and devotion as ever before. It was in 1574 that he was invested with Guruship and named Guru Ram Das.

Guru Ram Das's contribution to Bani is considerable. His compositions throb with love for fellowman and yearning for God.

They inculcate in the people the adoration of God and the Guru. Rightly does the Master image an ideal man as one who had drunk deep at the fount of Nam and whose eyes are aglow with the love of the Lord. He sought a consummation of the human personality through God-realization.

1637 Bhai Gurdas Ji passed away. He was a true GurSikh, who was a close brother of Bibi Bhani Ji. He adopted the Sikh faith from Fourth Patshah, Sri Guru

Ram Das Ji, in 1636 and learned the essence of GurSikhism from the Fifth Patshah, Sri Guru Arjun Dev Ji. Bhai Gurdas eventually became a full-fledged GurSikh preacher and effectively propagated the GurSikhism tenants. He preached concentrated in Lahore, Agra, Kanshi and surrounding region.

1977 Jarnail Singh Bhindranwale assumed responsibility of Chief sewadar of Damdami Taksal.

26th August

1507 Guru Nanak returned from the house of God and issued first commandment at Sultanpur.

Guru Nanak returned from the house of God. Three days earlier he went to river Bein to take a bath but didn't return. As such he was presumed drowned. However, he returned from the same spot that he had disappeared three days earlier and stated the first commandment that God was one, the parent of us all. People need not quarrel over religion, for God is neither Hindu nor Muslim. He is one God of the whole universe and no one should forget Him even for a moment. He said that God was beyond time, beyond births and deaths, that God was without fear and enmity. He was the creator of all the worlds in this Universe.

1679 Janam Din Bhai Daya Singh, one of the first five Sikhs initiated members of the Khalsa order.

Bhai Daya Singh Ji was born in Lahore to father Sudu Khatri and mother Dayali. On the 1699 Baisakhi day, Bhai Daya Singh was the very first to answer Guru Gobind Singh Ji's call for Sis Baeta. He was one of the first five selected GurSikhs to be initiated into the Khalsa order established by Guru Gobind Singh on the Vaisakhi of 1699. He was 30 years of age at this time. He passed away in 1708 besides the banks of Godawari in Nanded. Bhai Daya Singh was the recognized leader among the Panj Payaras.

1980 With the protection of Baba Nihal Singh, Krishan Kaur Khalsa was the first woman to perform kirtan, in recent time, within the confines of Sri Harmandir Sahib. Vikram Singh Khalsa was performing kirtan on the Gurupurab for the birthday of Guru Ram Das Ji. This kirtan was for a Bhog on the roof of the Harmandir Sahib — not in the main hall. When he finished, he motioned for Krishna Kaur Khalsa to play. As she began some SGPC sevadars moved to stop her but Baba Nihal Singh and some other Nihungs stood in their way and protected her right to perform kirtan within the confines of the Harmandir Sahib. Still no Sikh woman has performed kirtan in the main darbar.

27th August

1922 Piara Singh Langeri, ex-Ghadrite, participated in the General meeting of the Akali Dal. He influenced the Sikhs to take up arms and became an integral part of the Babbar Akali Jatha, under Jathedar Krishan Singh Gargaj.

28th August

1921 SGPC, headed by S. Kharak Singh endorsed the policy of non-cooperation with the British government.

1923 The Nation newspaper was purchased by the Sikhs to project and protect Sikh interests.

1958 Akali Conference Baba Bakala demands the formation of Punjabi Suba.

1977 General House of the Akali Dal approved the famous 1973 Anandpur Sahib's resolution.

1977 Sikh Dharma International Headquarters was established.

29th August

1923 Sacrilege of Guru Granth Sahib at jaito by the British.

Janmashtami: Celebrating the birth of Lord Krishna

Krishna Janmashtami also known as Krishnashtami, Srikrishna Jayanti or sometimes merely as Janmashtami, is an annual celebration of the birth of the Hindu deity Krishna, the eighth avatar of Lord Vishnu. Krishna belonged to the Vrishni clan of Yadavas from Mathura (Uttar Pradesh) and was the eighth son born to the princess Devaki and her husband Vasudeva. Lord Krishna reciprocates in unique, personal ways with every devotee who offers Him love. He is the most adorable, mischievous son, the most romantic lover, the most compassionate friend as described in ancient scriptures.

Krishna Janmashtami falls on the eighth day of the dark fortnight in the month of "Bhadrapada" in India. This year, Janmashtami will be celebrated on August 26. According to Hindu mythology, Krishna is the eighth avatar of Lord Vishnu and also the eighth child of Devaki and Vasudev.

Devotees mark this auspicious occasion by observing a fast and praying to Lord Krishna. People adorn their homes with flowers, diyas and lights. Temples are also beautifully decorated and lit.

According to Vedic chronology, this year will mark the 5,251th birthday of Krishna. The festival is especially observed in Mathura, Vrindavan and Dwarka, where the God was believed to be born and spent his growing years.

History and significance

According to Hindu mythology, Krishna is the eighth avatar of Lord Vishnu and also the eighth child of Devaki and Vasudev. He was born on Janmashtami to destroy and defeat the demon king of Mathura, Kansa, who was also Devaki's brother. The demon king had captured and kept Devaki and Vasudev in prison because of a prophecy that claimed that the couple's eighth son would cause Kansa's downfall. Due to this, he killed off six of their children.

It is believed that at the time of their seventh child Balram's birth, the foetus magically transferred from Devaki's womb to Princess Rohini's. When Krishna was born, the entire palace fell into a deep slumber. The prison gates magically opened and Vasudev carried Krishna to Nand Baba and Yashoda in a basket on his head. He crossed the river Yamuna to reach Vrindavan and handed Krishna to them. Vasudev returned to the palace with a baby girl.

When Kansa tried to kill the baby girl, she transformed into Goddess Durga and warned him of his death. Krishna grew up in Vrindavan and subsequently killed his uncle.

Celebrations

Janmashtami is a huge festival in India as it marks the victory of good over evil. On this day, devotees fast and read the Bhagavad Gita as well. They pray to Lord Krishna and distribute sweets. At midnight, priests open the drapes and reveal Krishna's beautifully decorated deity adorned with new clothes.

People also mark the day by celebrating the "Dahi Handi" festival. It is quite popular in the states such as Gujarat and Maharashtra. Young boys come together to make a human pyramid and aim to break an earthen pot filled with dahi or curd. The pot is hung very high from the ground and the festival highlights the mischievous and playful personality of Lord Krishna. It is believed that he loved "makkhan" or butter very much and used to steal it, thus earning him the name "Makkhan Chor".

Krishna Janmashtami puja procedure

household is cleaned and decorated. On the day of Krishnashtami, the devotees wake up early in the morning and take a holy bath. Then the puja altar is set up. Preferably, the puja altar can be set up in the puja room itself. If you are planning for an elaborate puja, you can organize the puja altar in the main hall also.

Sri Krishna's idol is the central attraction of the Krishnashtami puja. Some people use the regular idol or picture they have in their puja room. Some people buy a new image of Krishna every year for the puja. Depending on which material the Krishna idol is made of, you can plan for a holy bath for the idol; or can simply decorate the idol with flowers, clothes, and ornaments.

In many Hindu households, people draw the images of little footprints leading from the main door to the puja room. This practice symbolically represents Sri Krishna's little feet bringing him into the household to bless the puja and the residents of the house. Krishna's visit to every home during the puja is said to fill the home with prosperity and happiness.

Light the lamp and offer incense to the Lord. Offer Chandan and kumkum. Offer special homemade prasad. Curd/yoghurt, ghee, butter, and other milk products and milk-based sweets are especially suitable to offer to Lord Krishna. Do not forget berries and other fruits. Sing the songs of Krishna and chant some shlokas and mantras related to Krishna. Wave camphor and conclude the puja. Share the prasad with the gathering and family as a mark of Krishna's blessings.

but in the name of the people. For a simple reason, in our system of justice, a harm against any one of us is a harm against all of us. And I would often explain this to console survivors of crime, to remind them, no one should be made to fight alone. We are all in this together, and every day in the courtroom, I stood proudly before a judge, and I said five words, "Kamala Harris, for the people". And to be clear, my entire career, I've only had one client, the people, and so on behalf of the People, on behalf of every American, regardless of party, race, gender or the language your grandmother speaks, on behalf of my mother and everyone who has ever set out on their own unlikely journey, on behalf of Americans like the people I grew up with, people who work hard, chase their dreams and look out for one another; on behalf of everyone whose story could only be written in the greatest nation on Earth, I accept your nomination, President of the United States of America."

Promising to be the President for all Americans, Harris said " and with this election, our nation has a precious, fleeting opportunity to move past the bitterness, cynicism and divisive battles of the past, a chance to chart a new way forward, not as members of any one party or faction, but as Americans, and let me say, I know there are people of various political views watching tonight, and I want you to know I promise to be a president for all Americans, you can always trust me to put country above party and self, to hold sacred America's fundamental principles, from the rule of law to free and fair elections to the peaceful transfer of power.

Harris kicked off her speech by offering her thanks to President Biden, calling his character "inspiring," and she predicted history would look favorably upon his record in office.

"Let us show each other and the world who we are and what we stand for: freedom, opportunity, compassion, dignity, fairness and endless possibilities," she said. "I stood up for veterans and students being scammed by big for-profit colleges who are workers who are being cheated out of their wages, the wages they were due for seniors facing elder abuse. I fought against the cartels who traffic in guns and drugs and human beings who threaten the supply security of our border and the safety of our communities. And I will tell you, these fights were not easy, and neither were the elections that put me in those offices. We were underestimated at practically every term, but we never gave up, because the future is always worth fighting for, and that's the fight we are in right now, a fight for America's future. Fellow Americans, this election is not only the most important of our lives, it is one of the most important in the life of our nation, in many ways".

Lambasting her opponent Donald Trump, Harris said, "

Donald Trump is an unserious man. But the consequences of putting Donald Trump back in the White House are extremely serious. He did the opposite. "And let me be clear, after decades in law enforcement, I know the importance of safety and security, especially at our border last year, Joe and I brought together Democrats and conservative Republicans to write the strongest border bill in decades. The Border Patrol endorsed it, but Donald Trump believes a border deal would hurt his campaign, so he ordered his allies in Congress to kill the deal..... Amazing hill stations like Chakrata, Mukteshwar, Dhanaulti and Munsiyari make Uttarakhand a sought after tourist destination for leisure trips. Here's a list of destinations in Uttarakhand that every nature lover would love to visit.

CHAKRATA

Having breakfast with the view of snow-covered Himalayan peaks on a lazy morning while soft rays of winter sun embrace your body and soul while cool breeze kisses you is something city people always crave for. Chakrata located at a distance of 330 km from Delhi, is a tiny hamlet which is a perfect place to do so. There are two routes to drive from Delhi to Chakrata, one is via Panipat and Kurukshetra and the second one is via Loni and Saharanpur, which supposedly is more beautiful and has less traffic.

Chakrata is a small cantonment town in Dehradun district resting at an elevation of about 7500 ft. The town gets a magnificent view of the snow covered Himalayas and is covered in deodar, Himalayan oak and rhododendron forest. Many day trips to places like Deoban, Koti, Kanasar can be done with Chakrata as base. There are some easy treks also around Chakrata that your hotel guys can arrange for you. There are not many hotels in the area so make sure to book your accommodation in advance. Chakrata is a year round destination; the winter season is perfect to experience snow, greenery is at its



best during the monsoon season and the summer season too is quite pleasant.

AULI

Auli is one of the most beautiful places of Uttarakhand. Bordered by snow-covered Himalayan peaks, Auli is enveloped in dense golden oak and pine forest with green meadows and slopes ranging from a height of 2519 m to 3049 m. It is considered to be a world-class spot for skiing. GMVN winter resort here provides skiing facility, besides ski training for aspirants. Almost from

everywhere in Auli, you can enjoy stunning views of the lofty mountain ranges—Nanda Devi, Mana Paravat and Kamat. The golden rays of sun on the snow-laden peaks fill the atmosphere with a divine glow. The 3rd highest peak of the world—Nanda Devi gleams like the crown of the region. There is an open cable-car to go up to the spot where skiing is done. Even if you do not want to ski, you have plenty of things to do. Climb up the slopes, play with snow, ride a sledge and who knows you might feel like trying skiing too. The best time to

visit Auli is in between December and March.

CORBETT

Spread across an area of 520.8 sq km, Jim Corbett National Park is located in Nainital district of Uttarakhand. It is the oldest national park, and is named after Jim Corbett who was the main person behind this establishment. The park is divided in 5 zones—Bijrani, Jhirna, Durgadevi, Dhikala, Sitavani—and is inhabited by royal Bengal tiger, leopard, jungle cat, barking deer, hog deer, cheetal, sloth bears, otters, Himalayan goral, Indian pangolins, langur and many other wild animals. Many rare birds can also be spotted in the region.


Gorgeous Corbett National Park is one of the favourite destinations equally for wildlife lovers and weekenders. It is just 235 km away from capital city and can be reached in couple of hours. It features splendid landscapes and offers a good amalgam of hills, rivers, forests, marshlands and grasslands. The park is open from the months of November through June. The park is kept closed in the monsoon season as the roads inside the park get washed away due to rain. After the monsoon season, repair work starts and ends only by November.

MUKTESHWAR

It just takes 7 hrs from Delhi to reach Mukteshwar via Gajraula, Rampur, Haldwani and Bhowali. Summer months (March to July) are the best months to visit Mukteshwar. If you want to experience snow, visit during Jan or Feb when the whole area is covered in snow and looks stunningly beautiful. If you happen to visit this place around the month of June, the harvesting season, you'd find many fruits like peaches, plum and apricot. And if you still did not have your fill, Mukteshwar has many fruit orchards and you might get lucky to get offered the fruits just plucked from the trees by villagers. The taste of crunchy fresh peaches plucked from a road side tree of an orchard that belonged to a generous local who gladly offered us to pluck as many as we want, is still fresh in my mouth. Mukteshwar has recently got very popular among those looking for holidays in offbeat destinations and hence there is a wide range of options to stay starting from camps to budget hotels to boutique hotels.

AUGUST 23



August 23, 1927 - Italian immigrants Nicola Sacco and Bartolomeo Vanzetti were electrocuted inside a prison at Charlestown, Massachusetts. They had been convicted of a shoe factory payroll robbery during which the paymaster and a guard had been killed. Following their convictions, all appeals for a new trial had failed, despite the lack of hard evidence and a later admission by a known criminal that he had participated in the robbery with an organized criminal gang. The days and weeks leading up to their execution aroused worldwide protests amid accusations of unfair treatment because they had radical political views and were Italian.

AUGUST 24



August 24, 79 A.D. - Vesuvius, an active volcano in southern Italy, erupted and destroyed the cities of Pompeii, Stabiae and Herculaneum.

August 24, 1572 - Thousands of Protestant Huguenots were massacred in Paris and throughout France by Catholics, in what became known as the St. Bartholomew's Day Massacre.



Neeraj Chopra finishes 2nd in Lausanne Diamond League

Star Indian javelin thrower Neeraj Chopra finished second in the Lausanne Diamond League as he recovered in time to produce a season's best effort of 89.49m in his last attempt on Thursday, August 22.

The 26-year-old Chopra was at fourth spot till the fourth round before sending his spear to 85.58m in his fifth attempt. He saved the best for the last as his sixth and final attempt measured 89.49m, which was better than his performance in the Paris Olympics.

He was in danger of missing the sixth throw but his fifth round effort of 85.58m saved him. Only the top three after five rounds get their respective final attempts.

Two-time world champion and Paris Olympics bronze medallist Anderson Peters of Grenada won the event with his second round monster throw of 90.61m while Julian Weber of Germany took the third spot with 87.08m.

"The feeling wasn't great at first, but I'm happy with my throw, especially the second (career) best throw on my last attempt. It was a tough start, but the comeback was really nice and I enjoyed the fighting spirit I showed," Chopra said after the event.

"Even though my early throws were



around 80-83m, I pushed hard in the last two attempts finishing strong. Competing at this high level, it's important to stay mentally tough and fight through."

Nursing a long-standing groin injury, Chopra claimed a silver in the Paris Olympics on August 8 with an 89.45m throw, having won a historic gold in the Tokyo edition of the Games three years ago.

Pakistan's Arshad Nadeem had beaten

Chopra for the gold in Paris with an Olympic record throw of 92.97m.

Peters, who had struggled to find his form last year, led the competition from beginning to end and he stamped his class with the 90m-plus throw in the last round. He has a personal best of 93.07m which he had produced in 2022.

With seven points from Thursday's second-place finish, Chopra will be on joint third spot with Weber on Diamond League standings with 15 points. Peters

jumped to top spot with 21 points.

Czech Republic's Jakub Vadlejch, who finished seventh (82.03m) on Thursday, is in second spot with 16 points.

On Saturday, Chopra had confirmed his participation at the Diamond League meeting in Lausanne, leaving a decision on a possible surgery after the end of the season.

Chopra was the Diamond League champion in 2022 and finished second behind Jakub Vadlejch of Czech Republic in the winner-takes-all DL final in Eugene, USA, last year.

This season's DL finals will be held in Brussels on September 14. He needs to finish in the top-six of the Diamond League meetings series standings to qualify for the season finale.

There is another DL meeting -- in Zurich on September 5 -- which has a men's javelin throw event in its roster.

Chopra had won the Lausanne leg of the Diamond League in 2022 and 2023, but could not do so this time. In fact, Chopra is yet to win a DL meeting this year. He finished second behind Vadlejch in Doha on May 10.

Chopra has been managing his groin injury since winning the gold in the Budapest World Championships last year.

Women's T20 World Cup moved out of Bangladesh

The International Cricket Council (ICC) today moved the upcoming Women's T20 World Cup from Bangladesh to the UAE, saying it "wasn't feasible" to conduct the event there after governments of a number of participating countries advised against travelling to the unrest-hit nation.

The event, which is scheduled to take place from October 3 to 20, will now be staged in Dubai and Sharjah, with Bangladesh retaining the hosting rights, ensuring that it receives its share of the revenue.

"It is a shame not to be hosting the Women's T20 World Cup in Bangladesh as we know the Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) would have staged a memorable event," ICC Chief Executive Geoff Allardice said in a statement which avoided any direct mention of the violence and tension in the South Asian nation.

Allardice said the BCB explored "all avenues to try and enable the event to be hosted" there. "...but travel advisories from the governments of a number of the participating teams meant that wasn't feasible. However, they will retain hosting rights. We look forward to taking an ICC global event to Bangladesh in the near future," he said.

Smith, Brook lead England charge

Jamie Smith's unbeaten 72 propelled England to a 23-run lead over Sri Lanka on Day 2 of the opening Test at Old Trafford where only 57 overs were bowled after the first session was washed out and bad light stopped play.

Harry Brook's 56 guided England within reach of Sri Lanka's first innings total and the hosts were at 259/6 with Smith at the crease alongside Gus Atkinson when the teams returned to the pavilion as the skies darkened amid a light drizzle.

After posting 236 in the first innings on Wednesday, Sri Lanka could not use their fast bowlers at the end of Day 1 due to bad light as England scored 22 runs off spin in four overs. But after an early lunch due to the wet outfield today, the tourists took full advantage of the cloudy conditions to pick up three wickets in the first hour that put England on the backfoot.

Asitha Fernando opened the bowling on Day 2 and trapped Ben Duckett leg-before in his second over with an inswinging delivery. He then broke through stand-in skipper Ollie Pope's defence to hit the top of off stump while his left-arm fast bowling counterpart Vishwa Fernando had Dan Lawrence — opening in place of the injured Zak Crawley — caught behind for 30.

Three Indian-origin girls named in Australia's U19 women's squad

Cricket Australia (CA) on Thursday, August 22, announced their squad for the upcoming Women's Under-19 Tri-series involving New Zealand and Sri Lanka, set to take place from September 19 in Brisbane.

The Youth Selection Panel has selected 15-player squads for each format (T20 and 50-over) for the Tri series in Brisbane and Gold Coast. Former Australian player Kristen Beams has been named as the head coach of the squad. In this 14-day tri-series, Australia will play four T20s and two One-Day matches.

The squad comprises three Indian origin players in Ribya Syan, Samara Dulvin, and Hasrat Gill. "Their inclusion reflects the growing diversity within Australian cricket and the significant contributions of

players with Indian heritage," CA said in their statement.

Four Indian women wrestlers become U17 world champions

In a sparkling show by India's women wrestlers at the Under-17 World Championships, four grapplers annexed the titles in Amman (Jordan) on August 22, and at least two more are in gold medal contention.

Aditi Kumari (43kg), Neha (57kg), Pulkit (65kg) and Mansi Lather (73kg) won world titles in their respective categories with remarkable ease.

Kajal (69kg) and Shruti Patil (46kg) will also compete in the gold medal bouts on Friday after making the finals.

India can bag more medals as Raj Bala (40kg) will compete in the bronze playoff while Muskan (53kg) and Rajnita (61kg) are still in contention for podium finishes by making the repechage round.

India are now certain to win the women's team trophy despite not fielding a wrestler in the 49kg weight class.

Aditi emerged champion after blanking Maria Louiza Gkika of Greece 7-0 in the title clash.

Neha overpowered Japan's So Tsutsui as she stood out with her double-leg attacks. Neha hardly gave a chance to her rival in the gold medal bout.

Pulkit faced Daria Frolova, who is competing as a neutral athlete, and won 6-3. She was leading 5-0 but



conceded a pushout point and caution late in the bout that allowed Frolova to gain three points. Frolova made a desperate attempt to get the winning move but Pulkit defended well in the final 20 seconds to claim the title.

Mansi raced to a 5-0 lead against Hanna Pirkaya and then found a way to pin her rival, ending the bout in style. India also won two bronze medals in the Greco-Roman category with Ronak Dahiya and Sainath Pardhi (51kg) ending on the podium.

Vinesh Phogat's brand value skyrockets after Paris Olympics 2024

Vinesh Phogat had a memorable, but disappointing Paris Olympics 2024 campaign. It was supposed to be a moment of redemption, but it became a stuttering end to her glittering career. With Antil Panghal in her weight category, she had to drop down to 50 kg and qualified for the Paris Olympics 2024.

According to Economic Times, Vinesh's performances in Paris caught the entire's nation's attention and her endorsement fee has also taken a huge surge. She reportedly charged Rs 25 lakh for each endorsement deal before Paris 2024, and has increased it in the region of Rs 75 lakh and 1 crore for a single brand.

Vinesh also returned to India to a rousing welcome. He was feted by several supporters and khap panchayats as she made her way to her village Balali. Hundreds of supporters were outside the IGI airport and welcomed her to the beats of dhol, as she made her way out.

With at least silver expected, tragedy struck ahead of the gold medal bout. In the weigh-in for the final, Vinesh was 100 gm overweight and was therefore disqualified. Stunned by the decision, she appealed to the CAS, and also announced her retirement. The CAS verdict also didn't go to her side.

SEBI bans Anil Ambani...

SEBI has imposed a penalty of 25 crore on Ambani and restrained him from being associated with the securities market including as a director or Key Managerial Personnel (KMP) in any listed company, or any intermediary registered with the market regulator, for a period of five years.

Also, the regulator barred Reliance Home Finance from the securities market

for six months and slapped a fine of ₹6 lakh on it. Anil Ambani suffers another setback as SC sets aside arbitral award of ₹8,000 crore in favor of Reliance firm

In its 222-page final order, SEBI found that Anil Ambani, with the help of RHFL's key managerial personnel, had orchestrated a fraudulent scheme to siphon-off funds from RHFL by disguising them as loans to entities linked to him. Although the Board of Directors of RHFL had issued strong directives to stop such

lending practices and reviewed corporate loans regularly, the company's management ignored these orders.

This suggests a significant failure of governance, driven by certain key managerial personnel under the influence of Anil Ambani. Given these circumstances, the company RHFL itself should not be held equally responsible as the individuals involved in the fraud.

Further, the remaining entities have played the role of being either recipients of illegally obtained loans or conduits to enable illegal diversion of monies from RHFL, the regulator noted. SEBI said its findings have established the "existence of a fraudulent scheme, orchestrated by Noticee No. 2 [Anil Ambani] and administered by the KMPs of RHFL, to siphon off funds from the public listed company (RHFL) by structuring them as 'loans' to credit unworthy conduit borrowers, and in turn, to onward borrowers, all of whom have been found to be 'promoter linked entities' which means entities associated with Noticee 2 [Anil Ambani]."

Mr. Ambani used his position as 'chairperson of the ADA group' and his significant indirect shareholding in the holding company of RHFL to orchestrate the fraud. SEBI, in its order on Thursday (August 22, 2024) noted the cavalier approach of the company's management and promoter in approving loans worth hundreds of crores to companies that had little to no assets, cash flow, net worth, or revenue.

This suggests a sinister objective behind the 'loans'. The situation becomes even

more suspicious when considering that many of these borrowers were closely linked to the promoters of RHFL. Eventually, most of these borrowers failed to repay their loans, causing RHFL to default on its own debt obligations. This led to the company's resolution under the RBI Framework, leaving its public shareholders in a difficult position.

For example, in March 2018, RHFL's share price was around ₹59.60. By March 2020, as the extent of the fraud became clear and the company was drained of its resources, the share price had plummeted to just ₹0.75. Even now, over nine lakh shareholders remain invested in RHFL, facing significant losses.

The 24 restrained entities include former key officials of Reliance Home Finance Ltd (RHFL) - Amit Bapna, Ravindra Sudhalkar and Pinkesh R Shah -- and Sebi has imposed fine on them for their role in the case. Also, the regulator levied a fine of ₹25 crore on Ambani, ₹27 crore on Bapna, ₹26 crore on Sudhalkar and ₹21 crore on Mr. Shah.

Additionally, the remaining entities including Reliance Unicorn Enterprises, Reliance Exchange next Lt, Reliance Commercial Finance Ltd, Reliance Cleangen Ltd, Reliance Business Broadcast News Holdings Ltd and Reliance Big Entertainment Private Ltd have been imposed a penalty of ₹25 crore each. These fines have been levied on them for either receiving the illegally obtained loans or acted as intermediaries to facilitate the illegal diversion of funds from RHFL.




